The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 21 March 2013 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council accepted the resignation of Cr Kym Crosby from the position of Deputy President at the February Council meeting. Cr Garry Sheridan was nominated and accepted the position.

Council considered a proposal for the replacement of the niche wall at the Tambellup Cemetery. A hexagonal shelter will be installed, and the brick niche wall constructed within the shelter perimeter. Work will commence in the near future.

Following concerns expressed by residents, Council has agreed to the replacement of the slab path on the western side of Taylor St. The slabs will be removed in the near future and replaced with compacted gravel in the interim. The full replacement of the path will be considered as part of the 2013-2014 draft budget process.

#### RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are advised the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **15 FEBRUARY 2013** and continues through until **15 APRIL 2013** inclusive. You are required to obtain a permit prior to lighting <u>any</u> fires during this period. #### HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the Shire is <u>98251042</u>. The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. If you would like to register to receive notification of harvest bans by SMS, please contact Pam at the Shire office on 98253555.

#### WORKS

Contractors have commenced the clearing of roadside debris from the June 2012 storms. One crew is working from north to south on the western side of Great Southern Highway, and the other is working from south to north on the eastern side of the highway. This activity is funded by the State Government through Western Australian Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements funding. Road construction projects continued through February, with sealing works on a section of Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd completed, and gravel works on another section completed ready for sealing. The works crew will then move over to Broomehill-Kojonup Rd to complete gravel works on the next section to be widened. Resealing of a section of Pootenup Rd and sealing of shoulders and clearing of roadside vegetation on a section of Tambellup West Rd has been completed. Additional clearing is in progress in preparation for the reconstruction of a 4.5km section of Tambellup West Rd, in the vicinity of the water reserve.

The maintenance crew is working on repairing of headwalls and signage, and the maintenance graders have been working towards the south western part of the shire.

As always, if you are travelling in the vicinity of road works, we ask that you travel with caution and observe warning signage in the area.

#### **BUDGET 2013/2014**

Council is about to commence the first stages of the preparation of the 2013/2014 budget. As part of that process, community and sporting groups are invited to submit requests to Council for consideration in the budget. Submissions are to be in writing and forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by close of business on Thursday 28th March 2013.



#### What *Royalties for Regions* is delivering to Broomehill and Tambellup



The Royalties for Regions plan was created by The Nationals in 2008 and is delivering direct funding to Broomehill and Tambellup. Projects include:

The consortium will help organisations through the application process, as well as provide valuable business support and advice to those who are funded.

#### WOULD UP TO \$200 PER CHILD HELP PAY FOR THEIR SPORTING CLUB FEES?

KidSport will assist <u>eligible</u> families to receive up to \$200 annually for each of their children aged between 5 - 18 years, to subsidise fees to join a sport and recreation club.

Eligible families include those with health care cards or pension concession cards, or those referred by other community groups such as schools, juvenile justice teams, government agencies and health practitioners. These groups are known as referral agents.

#### The process for accessing KidSport is simple!

Kids and parents/guardians can complete the application by picking one up from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup office or their website. The parent/guardian fills in the application and takes it to be validated at the <u>local government they reside in</u>. A photocopy of the health care card or pension concession card must be attached.

Alternatively, referral agents may assist in filling out the application, complete their section on the back and give it to the parent/guardian to sign. The parent/guardian will take the voucher to the sport or recreation club for processing when registering their children. The club will then invoice the Shire. It's that easy! - To find out who the Referral Agents are in your community please contact the Shire.



#### FREE Emergency Care and Injury Management Workshops in the Great Southern

#### **Broomehill Historical Notes**

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Sheep Dipping - Although WHG mentions dipping sheep, it was not until 1898 that TN refers to the subject. On the 8th January that year, Inspector of Sheep Ticks, J Gibbons, attended the Road Board meeting in Broome Hill and started his inspections of all stations in the area. On the 10<sup>th</sup> January Sunnyside sheep proved to be clean but two Goblup flocks had ticks and were quarantined. The next day ticks were found in unshorn sheep at Eticup. On 13th January at Albany TN saw JFT and AY Hassell and WHG about dipping sheep for tick. They sent four telegrams about the scarcity of water at Broome Hill and JFT Hassell received a reply (content unknown), but the next day back at Broome Hill the Inspector did not think the replies (others received) gave him power to stay the dipping. TN asked Postmaster Morgan and Alf Nelson to write letters about the scarcity of water but by 22<sup>nd</sup> January the Inspector had not received a reply and TN had a letter from JFT Hassell with instructions not to

Dip Goblup sheep if he considered there would be a shortage of water. In the meantime, Richie Norrish had dipped 35 lambs and 5 culls from Sunyside in the large boiler at Goblup prior to trucking them to Albany. Finally on the 27<sup>th</sup> January, Inspector Gibbons was able to to give the Brome Hill district exemption from dipping until sufficient rain set in. On 1<sup>st</sup> February 1898 TN went into Broome Hill to bring home the sheep dip that Stenhouse had built for him at a cost of £5.15.0. Stenhouse is unidentified.

Sheridan, Kathleen – Mrs Sheridan and her husband Frederick, came to Broome Hill in 1905 to be licensees of the Imperial Hotel for the lessee, Albert McKenzie. Unfortunately Frederick died the same year, but Kathleen continued as licensee. On 23rd August 1907 she accompanied J Lush out to Sunnyside to witness TN's will. In 1909 Mrs Sheridan took over the lease of the hotel for 4 years and in June 1910 she purchased Town Lots I.8, I.9 and I.10 in Ivy Street from JFT Hassell. On the 23rd August that year she also purchased Town Lot I.4 in Jasper Street from Hassell and had the Sheridan Hall built, that is the galvanized iron section of the Shire Hall. The Hall was used for roller skating, cinema and dancing. Mrs Sheridan moved out to her farm, Windemere, 1911, leaving someone else in charge of the hotel. Later she moved up to Katanning. The Sheridan Hall was leased by the Broome Hill Public Hal Committee in 1915 and bought by the Road Board in 1917.

**Sherwood** – Arrived from Albany on 24<sup>th</sup> August 1883 with John Green and the carpenters to work on the new house, Sunnyside and remained until October. On 1<sup>st</sup> January 1891 all the family except TN and Sherwood went to the New Year's Day Sports.

**Shilling. P** – Called at Goblup on 13<sup>th</sup> July 1879 with two horses and was there again on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2891 with a cart and two horses looking for his horse. The next day he was still there as he had not got the horse. On the 8<sup>th</sup> November that year he borrowed a saddle from TN to look for his horse.

**Shilling, Thomas** – On 30<sup>th</sup> April 1883 arrived with two loads of timber from the 10 mile. A Chinese drove the second load.


