

Councillors and staff at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup wish all residents a safe and relaxing festive season and the very best for the New Year.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

At the November Council meeting, Council considered a request from residents to reconsider the location of the Broomehill Waste Transfer Station in an effort to reduce the visual impact from the road.

Initially it was understood by Council that given the length of time it has taken to obtain the necessary Works Approvals from the Department of Environmental Regulation, any change to the project would result in significant delays, which would in turn impact on the Country Local Government Funds allocated to the project and also the next round of funding.

Further information has since been received from the Department of Environmental Regulation to indicate the process for altering the location of the Transfer Station is not as tedious as originally advised.

Council has subsequently determined to move the location of the Transfer Station to a site 135m north of the Tieline Rd entrance to the site. Additional costs of around \$25,000 will be incurred by Council for additional fencing, clearing, survey costs, road construction and cartage of fill.

Council considered the adoption of a policy for mandatory training for Chief, Deputy and brigade fire control officers, to ensure the people appointed to these positions are appropriately qualified. Prior to adoption, Council has forwarded the draft policy to the brigades for comment. Anyone requiring a copy of the draft policy is welcome to contact Pam at the Shire. Any feedback should be received (in writing) to the Shire by Friday 6th December.

UNIVERSITY BLOCK TREES

Residents will have noticed that the sugar gums and pine trees around the University Block in Broomehill have been removed recently. This action was taken as the trees were not healthy, and during a recent period of high winds, were a cause for concern when branches dropped dangerously close to power lines and homes in the area.

Contractors have been engaged to grind the stumps, and this will be completed when they are next in the area.

NEW LAWS FOR DOG OWNERS

From 1 November 2013 amendments to the *Dog Act 1976* came into effect. Microchipping has been introduced for all dogs from the following dates:

- From 1 November 2013, dogs must be microchipped when they are registered for the first time, or when a change of ownership occurs.
- By 30 November 2013 all dangerous dogs, which includes restricted breeds and commercial security dogs, must be microchipped.
- By 1 November 2015, all dogs must be microchipped.

'THE RIDE' MOVIE

During November, the Shire played host to a screening of 'The Ride' at the Broomehill Hall. This was an inspirational documentary charting the journey of four disabled Western Australian men as they swapped their wheelchairs for quad bikes for a ride 4500km across Australia, visiting their individual crash sites where they incurred their spinal injuries. Jim Cairns, one of the men featured in the movie, and the producer of the documentary, Sandra Cook, gave freely of their time to share their experiences with those who attended the screening. Copies of the movie will shortly be available for loan from both libraries. Many thanks to those who attended on the night, and also to the Shire of Gnowangerup for the loan of their outdoor cinema system, the Tambellup CRC for the backup projector and the Tambellup Primary School for the PA system.

BROOMEHILL ARCHIVE REPOSITORY/SHERIDAN MEMORIAL GARDEN OPENING

The official openings of the Broomehill Archive Repository and Sheridan's Memorial Garden were conducted on Wednesday 6th November, with the Hon. Terry 'Tuck' Waldron in attendance to cut the ceremonial ribbons. The garden, which was the first order of business, presented beautifully on the day, and thanks go to Council's Parks and Gardens team for their efforts leading up to the opening. The Broomehill Primary School Middle Room students performed two items for the crowd, and did a great job. Members of the Sheridan family were in attendance for the opening of the garden, which is named in recognition of their great grandmother, Kathleen Sheridan, who was a leading figure in the early days of the Broomehill community.

The Broomehill Archive Repository is a project of the Southern Link Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (VROC), which comprises the Shires of Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet. This organisation allows for the member councils to collaborate on projects which will have regional benefits. The Archive Repository provides a storage space with the appropriate climatic environment necessary for the secure storage of long term records, and all four Councils will utilise the facility. Many people took the opportunity on the day to have a look around the Repository, which, once records have been lodged, will not be open to the public at all. The renovation also provided the opportunity to refurbish the reception, library and staff amenity areas, which are now bright, modern and functional.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The Local Emergency Management Committee recently conducted a discussion exercise to test the effectiveness of the Shire's Emergency Management Arrangements, and the response of local emergency services. The exercise, which was lead by Sgt Simon Bickers from Tambellup Police, centred on a hypothetical 'bad weather day' in Broomehill, with a fire started by lightning on the golf course heading towards the town. The 'incident' necessitated a town evacuation, and closure of all roads leading in and out.

Those attending were asked to consider a multitude of issues, including what each agency's response would be, where an evacuation centre would be set up, where would supplies come from given road closures were in place, management of the 'fire' from a brigade perspective and the available resources, the effects of a possible escalation of the 'incident', communications, power outages, and community recovery after the 'incident'.

The exercise provided valuable insight into a situation which we hope we will never have to deal with, but it is reassuring to note that plans are in place for our communities that can be activated when required to deal with an emergency situation.

Agencies represented at the meeting included the local fire brigades, ambulance, police, Red Cross, CWA, schools, Department of Agriculture and Food WA, Department for Child Protection and Family Support and the Shire.

COUNCIL WORKS

The construction crew has been working on Tambellup West Rd during the past month, to complete a number of projects including the reconstruction of a section through the Water Reserve, repairs to the floodway pavement to the east of this section, and the continuation of gravel widening of a 4km section further west. Sealing of this last project, and bitumen repairs on Tambellup West Rd and Gnowangerup -Tambellup Rd will be completed during December.

The widening of the next section of Broomehill-Kojonup Rd has continued, with all gravel works completed. Final trimming and sealing will be carried out early in the new year.

The maintenance crew has been working alongside the construction crew, installing headwalls, signage and guideposts in the vicinity of new works.

The maintenance graders have been working in the south east and north west sectors of the Shire, as well as assisting with gravel works on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Tuesday 24 December 2013** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Thursday 2 January 2014**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period. Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 20 December 2013. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on **Thursday 26 December** and **Thursday 2 January.** The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on **Thursday 26 December**.





RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2013** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2014** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is **prohibited**.

Residents needing to undertake **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit.

PROTECTIVE BURNING is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2013.

Aldridge calls for review of Patient Assisted Travel Scheme

The Royalties for Regions-funded Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS) is in need of review, according to Nationals Member for the Agricultural Region Martin Aldridge MLC.

Mr Aldridge called for a review of PATS in a speech to Parliament today, highlighting that whilst PATS is an essential service for people in regional WA, limitations exist in its flexibility and ability to provide adequate support to patients

Mr Aldridge said PATS was widely acknowledged as an essential travel subsidy scheme to regional medical patients, however, was designed for a different era in medical service

"We need to address the discrepancy between the real cost of contemporary transport and accommodation and the extent PATS currently supports patients," Mr Aldridge said.

"I suggest it would be immensely challenging for anyone to find commercial accommodation for the current \$60 per night allowance offered by PATS."

Mr Aldridge raised a number of examples during his speech outlining deficiencies in the

He used the example of regulatory issues that mean a patient's treatment was declared ineligible after travelling from Narrogin to Perth and subsequently discovering there was a specialist only eight kilometres closer, in Bunbury.

Mr Aldridge suggested that the review should cover several aspects of the scheme:

- The level of funding applicable to transport and accommodation
- The eligibility measures used in applying PATS funding
- The need to consider exceptional circumstances for some patients
- The types of specialist medical services covered under the scheme

"In my opinion, PATS should have the ability to be more responsive to the needs of regional patients," Mr Aldridge said.

Addressing these key areas would go a long way to improving the PATS service and making sure patients in regional WA have access to the medical specialists they need."

WOULD UP TO \$200 PER CHILD HELP PAY FOR THEIR SPORTING CLUB FEES?

KidSport will assist <u>eliqible</u> families to receive up to \$200 annually for each of their children aged between 5 – 18 years, to subsidise fees to join a sport and recreation club. Eligible families include those with health care cards or pension concession cards, or those referred by other community groups such as schools, juvenile justice teams, government agencies and health practitioners. These groups are known as referral agents.

The process for accessing KidSport is simple!

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Sports – Sport and sports days provided much of the settler's entertainment. On 1st January 1884 TN found the New Year's Day sports at Albany very dull after all that had been said about them beforehand. At Eticup in 1886 possibly on Sunnyside land - the New Year Sports consisted of a cricket match and other games. People started to arrive at 8am and continued till sundown with a dance at Nelson's in the evening. The 1887 sports were postponed until 17th January and the day went off very well. TN won the Old Man's Race again against Patrick Carmody, singing Billie and John Connors, noting that Carmody and Connors were both younger than him. On 11th December 1890 a MrRolands came to Goblup collecting money for the New Years sports which all at Goblup except TN and Sherwood attended. On 19th April 1892, all the family and the men, except TN and Mrs Norrish and two of the Chinese, went to the Sports Day in Broome Hill. The sports on the 3rd April 1893 were stopped by rain. On 22nd June 1897 all went to the Sports Day in Broome Hill in honour of the Queen's long reign. It was Sports Day again on 27th December although TN went home early to look after the place. All went to the sports on Boxing Day in 1898.


Stamp, Jack – Possibly worked for J.F.T. Hassell as he came to Sunnyside on behalf of Hassell to see the sheep belonging to the Bank, and stayed for several days. On 7th he went with TN to Henry Quartermaine's and stayed overnight. Next day they counted the bank sheep – 779- all but 40 looked middling. On the 9th he went TN's son George to see the flock at Annice's and on the 10th counted Peter's flock – 708.

Stanbury, T.H – Clerk of the courts, Katanning. He visited Sunnyside on 30th July 1898 at the same time as (possibly with Blanche Van Zuilecom and two of her brothers.). He visited again with R.H. Jones in the evening three times in August/September and on 1st October 1898 and 3rd December 1898 attended meetings of the Agricultural Society with W.K. Adams (Resident Magistrate in Katanning), on the first occasion regarding the Show shed and yards.

Stanford, Alphonso Horne & Johnston, George Alexnader – In partnership in 1906 bought a General Merchant's business in Broome Hill on the east side of the railway line, across from the Station. In 1911 Stanford & Johnston shifted into the new Broome Hill General Store in the Jones' buildings but handed over to the Clune Brothers in 1912. Stanford was a member of the Progress Assocition, on the Board of Health, Secretary of the Anglican Church and a member of the Broome Hill Rifle Club.

Steere, E.W – Accompanied TN to Boylup on 7th September 1890 to buy 20 sheep at 10/- per head from Flynn's flock. Came to Goblup on 30th December 1895 to look at the land to be rung (ringbarked). He was cutting chaff at Sunnyside in May 1898 and in July came for his engine. He stayed overnight and left for Katanning next day to pull up trees. On 30th July 1907, Sloggett went to Steere's to get two young pigs, one to be one of the five that TN had exchanged for and old pig some time previously.






