#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council adopted the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Strategic Community Plan 2012-2022. The document is available on Council's website - www.shirebt.wa.gov.au . Council appreciates the input from community members who attended the workshops in Broomehill and Tambellup and also those who provided feedback to the draft document.

Council agreed to make a donation of \$100 to the Katanning Senior High School Student Leadership Group for the 2012 Spirit Day event.

Council agreed to engage Howard and Heaver Architects to provide design and contract documents, and tender and project management services for the Tambellup Independent Living Seniors Accommodation project.

#### **MOSQUITOES**

Mosquito numbers within our Shire are always an issue. Council baits pools of water and will undertake regular fogging of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health has advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. (The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.)

Aaron is happy to answer any gardening queries you might have. Start time is 8.00am; come for a little while or stay for the day. Tea and coffee will be available all day, BYO picnic lunch. All welcome - the more the merrier!

#### RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2012** and continues until **15 APRIL 2013** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

1 NOVEMBER 2012 and continues through until
14 FEBRUARY 2013 inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited; however, if residents need to do PROTECTIVE BURNING during the Prohibited Burning Period, they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. PROTECTIVE BURNING is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2012. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers.

#### DOG OWNERS – REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations are due for renewal at <u>31<sup>st</sup></u> <u>October</u> each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.







#### FUNDING AVAILABLE

#### **Expression of Interest for Feral Animal Control**

There is currently a funding round available which we could offer subsidies for feral animal controls such as fox/rabbit baiting, further shooting programs. We previously had a subsidy available for fox baiting, but had a very poor response, so this year I am asking for expressions of interest before applying for funding. If you are interested in developing, adding to or increasing your feral animal control, please contact me as I will not be applying for the funding if I don't get enough interest.

#### FUNDING AVAILABLE Revegetation and Fencing

We are currently seeking people who are interesting in undertaking revegetation programs. The new round of Southern Incentives has been released. This program is funded through South Coast Natural Resource Management and is targeting revegetation sites directly. If you have a site you would like to revegetate for biodiversity, we can offer seed/seedlings and fencing of the site. Please contact me for further information to complete an application form.

#### FUNDING AVAILABLE – Biodiversity, Sandalwood and Fodder Shrub Revegetation

We currently have a project running in conjunction with North Stirlings Pallinup which will provide landholders with funding to implement one or more of the three types of vegetation programs available. There will be biodiversity native revegetation, biodiverse sandalwood stands or forage/fodder shrubs (saltbush, tagasaste, acacia etc) on offer. This is a very rare opportunity to obtain funding for a potentially commercial output. You will need to complete an expression of interest to be considered in this funding program. Please contact me for more details.

<u>FUNDING AVAILABLE - Golden Wattle Eradication Project - We</u> will have funding available through the Biodiversity Fund from South Coast NRM to utilise a contractor to remove golden wattle from private property. AS the contractors have just completed the works in the reserves, we will be undertaking further works this time next year. If you have golden wattle on your property and would like some help to remove it. Please contact us. This applies for small landholders also as we would like to do our best to really address the problem in the Tenterden town site. Feel free to contact me if you would like to find out how we will be going about this funding program.

Fauna Survey - We have been successful in a bid for funding through DEC's Environmental Community Grants to undertake some on the ground surveys to assess populations of western brush wallabies and other smaller mammals that may be present. We are hoping to connect populations with vegetation types/sizes to allow us to prioritise fencing programs for the future armed with knowledge of what can sustain fauna populations.

#### Fertiliser Trial Site

We have completed another pasture cut and fertiliser application on the two sites that are being assessed. There were some dramatic visual results from the tall wheat grass site in Ongerup. This project funded through South Coast NRM's Caring for our Country program has been turning up some interesting results in timing of fertiliser application along with rates. We will be undertaking another pasture cut later in the year on both the kike and TWG sites, and are hoping to undertake a small scale pro-jib trial on the kikuyu next year.

#### Kelly's Snippets - DAFWA - 0417 837 983

Locusts 2012 - Landholders are being urged to inspect their properties for locust activity and prepare for control during spring. Autumn inspections by DAFWA staff have shown high density hatchings may occur in parts of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire. Hatchings may also occur in other parts of our district. Locusts emerge at a variable rate so landholders should be checking their properties from now on to determine when to carry out control. DAFWA will undertake surveillance to assist landholders make timely decisions about control, however it is the responsibility of landholders to manage locusts. For fact sheets on the identification, monitoring and control of locusts, including with-holding periods for registered chemicals, contact Kelly. Flystrike - Planning ahead is the key to preventing flystrike in your flock this Spring. For information on management, treatment and tools go to www.flyboss.org.au

Fly resistance testing - Given the discovery of resistant sheep blowfly's in NSW, the NSW DPI and AWI are funding a project to determine the extent of the problem. If you are interested in this project and/or you would like to participate (and get your property's fly resistance status), contact Kelly. Information courtesy of Sheeps Back Network.

Improving your Pastures - Nitrogen fertilizer can be used to boost Spring pasture production this year but only when pasture growth rates start to increase and has best value if you can monitor and manage intensive spring grazing. This tactic has some pre-requisites including having a pasture that is 60% annual ryegrass and 40% capeweed, clover and some weeds. If you have paddocks with this pasture composition and you would like to know more about the use of nitrogen on pastures in Spring, contact Kelly.

Drench resistance testing - If you think you may have an issue with resistant worms in your sheep, now is the time to test for drench resistance. This test is conducted in lambs older than 12 weeks but younger than 6 months of age (and preferably the lambs haven't had a drench in their life) and it starts with a worm egg count to see if there are enough worms to be able to get an accurate drench resistance test result. If you're interested to know more, contact Kelly.

Title: "SPRING FOX BAITING A SMART MOVE"

Commitment from farmers in Spring to continue their coordinated efforts to give the 'Red Card to Rabbits and Foxes' is urged, since the program's expansion from targeting Autumn focus to include a Spring fox baiting program.

"Spring presents a prime opportunity to bait foxes while food demands are high due to the raising of cubs and the inexperience of the young animals," RCRF Coordinator Sally Thomson explained.

"The Spring program will complement over 30,000 fox baits that were laid in Autumn this year as part of the Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes drive to protect agricultural and bio-diversity assets.

"The single most influential factor regarding effective pest control is still the ability of the community to take a coordinated approach, so that widespread baiting occurs at the same time.

"The advantage of spring baiting is that the foxes remain close to the den until October-November, so landholders can directly target their baiting sites compared to autumn baiting when these pests are highly mobile," she said.

Fox cubs are typically born in August-September and are generally weaned at 6-8 weeks of age, when they regularly surface from the den and begin to source their own food.

They generally abandon the dens around 10 weeks of age, and remain in a juvenile social group until they seek their own territory at around 5 months of age.

Their lack of experience makes them highly vulnerable to human control efforts such as 1080 baiting during this time.

"A number of certified commercial soft-bait products are available to landowners, and it is important to know what active ingredient is being used, how attractive the baits to the target species, as well as characteristics like water-fastness in rain events," Ms Thomson said.

Landowners gain accreditation to lay 1080 baits on their properties through a simple online application process that provides information and training to ensure safe use and handling of the poison.

Bio-Security Officers located at the Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA) District Offices continue to support farmers with S7 poison approvals.

Once accredited, farmers simply send their completed one-page application form together with a farm map to their DAFWA District Office for

Authorisation vouchers are then issued, which the landholder takes to their regular ag-supply shop and can purchase baits.

Rabbit baiting is most effective during summer and autumn when feed supply is low and populations are consolidating.

Planning for the RCRF Autumn program is underway, involving coordinated baiting and shooting campaigns to control fox and rabbit populations across the agricultural region to protect agricultural and biodiversity assets. #### Farmers reminded to monitor for locusts

Simon Merewether, APL operations manager, Department of Agriculture and Food

Farmers are urged to start monitoring their paddocks for emerging locusts, with hatchings already reported in the Yilgarn and Lake Grace shires. The hatchings are in line with the department's predictions for early season emergence, particularly in the southern and south-eastern parts of the agricultural region.

Autumn monitoring by the department indicated high density hatchings may occur in parts of the Ravensthorpe, Jerramungup, Gnowangerup, Esperance (Cascades), Kent, Broomehill-Tambellup, Lake Grace and Katanning shires.

The bulk of the insects are expected to emerge during late September and early October. Emerging locusts will only be about the size of a small ant but will hop when disturbed.

Control of locusts on-farm is a landholder responsibility and it is in their economic interest to do so. There are registered chemicals available commercially and the department can provide advice on control options.

The department will undertake surveillance to assist landholders to make timely decisions on control. If while doing monitoring farmers come across hatching egg beds they can assist the department's surveillance efforts by reporting this to their local DAFWA office (Katanning, Albany or Esperance). Where agreed, the department will offer services for a locally co-ordinated approach for landholder control in recognised high density areas.

#### THE NATIONALS WA FIGHT FOR FUTURE OF GRAIN FREIGHT NETWORK

5 September 2012

The Nationals WA candidate for the Agricultural Region, Martin Aldridge has joined Nationals' MPs in supporting a two year trial for tier 3 lines, following the Transport Minister's decision to close the lines by June 2013.

"The Nationals WA support the Parliamentary Committee recommendation to retain the lines until 2014 to allow CBH/WATCO to demonstrate the efficiencies of their new business model," Mr Aldridge said.

"We are urging the Minister to reconsider his decision and are continuing to work for the future security of this important infrastructure."

Mr Aldridge said it was disappointing the Liberal Party's Agricultural Region members had failed to represent the interests of their electorate in the Parliament.

"The Nationals WA are the only members prepared to advocate for the future of the tier 3 rail lines," Mr Aldridge said.

The Nationals have written to the Minister for Transport asking for unspent funding from the Transitional Assistance Package to be diverted into maintenance on tier 3 lines for the next two years

"According to Brookfields estimates, the tier 3 rails require \$7-8 million over the next two years to allow CBH/Watco to run trials safely and test their business case.

"The TAP funding, topped up with funding from industry, would allow a reasonable trial to go ahead," Mr Aldridge said.

He said The Nationals WA understood the importance of a viable grain freight network to Wheatbelt communities.

"Rail not only provides transport efficiencies, more importantly it keeps grain haulage trucks of our already pressured country roads.

"The Nationals remain committed to keeping as much grain on rail as possible."

#### **Broomehill Historical Notes**

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Schooling – The Norrish children were more fortunate than many as their father not only realized the importance of education for them but was in a position to do something about it. On 27<sup>th</sup> September 1880 the Rev Withers arrived from Albany bringing Miss Wade with him to teach the children for the next fourteen months. She left / Goblup on 7<sup>th</sup> December 1881 to return to Albany. On the 11<sup>th</sup> March 1882, TN left Albany with Miss Hannah Williams who took the children's lessons from 15<sup>th</sup> March and continued until February 1894. The next Governess to the Norrish children was Miss Ralston whom TN picked up at the convent in Albany on 11th July 1884 and she is thought to have remained with the family until 1885. In the meantime, TN had approached other settlers to attend a meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> February 1882 to consider building a school house. At the meeting attended by Rev Joseph Withers, L.F Van Zuilecom, Thomas Rogers, George Whitton, Patrick Garrity and Patrick Carmody as well as Thomas Norrish, it was resolved to build a school/church and a committee comprising TN, Garrity and Carmody was elected to select a site as soon as possible. They did this on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1882. The intention was that the settlers would provide material for the building and get the job done themselves. It appears little happened after March 1882 until 12th September 1883 when TN arranged for Benjamin Gaylor, the brickmaker, to make 50, 000 bricks if he could find good clay; £1.5.0 per thousand to be counted out of kiln, no casing. On 20th January 1884 Bishop parry, Rev Withers, L.F. Van Zuilecom, Joseph Nelson, Patrick Carmody, John Garrity and TN attended a meeting (possibly at Fairfield), about the building of the school and it was decided to purchase the timber in Albany and get on with the work at once. On . 22<sup>nd</sup> January TN, Van Zuilecon and Carmody went to see the place to build the school – part way between the Goblup gates on Green Hills Road and the road to Kojonup. In April that year some progress was made. TN met Van Zuilecom at Goblup and marked the place to put the brics, he went to see Garrity about the list of money gathered for the school and Garrity was ready to cart bricks. However, earlier in the month, old Ben Gaylor had left off making bricks and gone to George Norrish's as there was no water at Sunnyside. Old Ben was back at the brick kiln on 10<sup>th</sup> June but there may have been another break in brick making as in December 1884 TN reported the carting of firewood for the kiln and Ben Gaylor lighting the fire.

Even after the building's consecration as a church in 1885, TN continued to refer to it as the school. On 30<sup>th</sup> January 1886 he went to see Van Zuilecom to settle some of the school accounts and wrote "School is now indebted to each £6.4.014."

On 11th February 1886, Miss Mary Alice Gregg (daughter of the Rev J.Gregg of Albany) arrived at Eticup to teach the children at the Eticup School; she was to board and lodge at Sunnyside. On 3<sup>rd</sup> January 1887 Rev Withers examined the school children. Hannah and Nora Norrish were equal first and all children got a prize. Later that year Miss Gregg married Rev Withers and it is not known who succeeded her. In January 1889 Miss Hannah Williams (earstwhile governess) came to stay at Sunnyside for a week. Was she persuaded to take over as teacher? On 22nd December 1890 TN cashed a cheque for her and on n27th of that month TN took over the school books from her. Eleanor Grover is thought to have taken over next and is known to have been school mistress in the early part of 1892 as, on 19th may that year, Rev Orchard asked if Nora Norrish could take the school on miss Grover's resignation. On the 12th August 1892 Mr Gardiner, School Inspector, came to Eticup. He stayed at Goblup and on the 15th examined the school children. On 23<sup>rd</sup> September 1892, Nora Norrish gave the children a tea party and Mr Graham presented the prizes.

At the same time efforts were being made in Broome Hill to provide facilities for the children there and a school opened in the Alpha Hall in January 1893 with J.H. Otto as teacher – the Government paying £9 per annum rental. Enrolment for 1893 was 4 boys and 9 girls and J.H. Otto was paid £60 per annum. A small one-roomed building near the Police Station was also used for schooling at one time. On 24<sup>th</sup> December 1893 all the Norrish family went to a meeting of

We are still trying to fit in a trip to Albany to visit gardens, Helen Bignell is keeping in contact with Sheryl Shaylor (a former member) at this stage the trip could take place in November.

The Katanning Show is not far away now and we would love to see members of the public bringing along their flowers for exhibition, there are no entry fees so why not have a go and help to make the show worthwhile for the overall hard working show committee.

school children in Broome Hill. By September 1894 a school had been built in Ivy Lane (Hassell Street) with J.H. Otto continuing as teacher. The two youngest Norrish girls Mary and May walked to school from Goblup (though probably not every day!), and in October 1894 they killed a snake on the raod.

On 21<sup>st</sup> October 1898 TN and Mr Keetley went up to Katanning and on to Moojabing to the school there, canvassing for the Show. On n5th November he and R. H. Jones went to the school in Kojonup but no reason is given for the visit.

Thomas Norrish continued to serve on the School Board until late 1907. On the 23<sup>rd</sup> February a meeting of the Board was held in Broome Hill about the children being over crowed and on the 12<sup>th</sup> march TN went to John Annice's to find out about the number of children about the place fit to attend school. A fortnight later he wasn't to Bradshaw's to see how many children he would send to school if one were erected at John Annice's. He then went to Birt's, Davis' and Alfred Nelson's presumably on the same matter. On 29<sup>th</sup> March TN wrote to the Central School Board. He made no record of their reply, but a school was opened at Coorinyup on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1909. On 10<sup>th</sup> September 1907 TN wrote to the Central Board about the number of schools in the district, including Tambellarup. Other entries in the 1907 diary indicate that Edward Meyer was a member of the School Board
