Former resident (and school captain!) Ted Farmer (son of Shire Works Supervisor John Farmer) sent through some photos from his recent trip to London for the Olympics.

Previously employed with the WA Police, Ted now works for Rio Tinto as a supervisor of the Dampier Indigenous Participation Program. This program assists with the attraction and retention of indigenous employees, and Ted plays a key role in supporting employees into roles with the company, and seeking the support of other front line leaders to take on indigenous trainees.

Along with around 300 others, he was nominated by workmates for the 'Rio Tinto Heroes' employee recognition program, which is judged based on the company values of accountability, teamwork, integrity and respect. Ted's efforts in his role were recognised by a global leadership selection panel in London where his nomination was acknowledged and rewarded with a trip for two to London, during the 2012 Olympic Games.



Ted, with wife Amanda, spent 5 days in London, visiting the sights and attending a number of Olympic events, including the Italy v Brazil semi final of the men's volleyball, the final night of athletic track and field events and the closing ceremony.



As the photos show, Ted also took the opportunity to fly the Tambellup flag - literally! - at as many venues as he could! He mentioned every time the flag came out, people stopped and wanted to know the 'what and where's' of Tambellup. We might be a small spot on the map, but there are now a whole lot of people who know we are here!

Ted is a fantastic role model for all the kids in our towns, and particularly indigenous youth, by showing that with hard work, commitment and respect for all, you can go anywhere you want in life. Well done Ted!

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 20 September 2012 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

Residents and users of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion will be aware Council has for some time been planning an upgrade of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion, utilising both council and grant funding. Given the nature of the works which have been considered, Council is keen to ensure the end result provides the best possible outcome for the community.

To enable this, Council has applied for funding through the Department of Sport and Recreation to allow a feasibility study to be undertaken. The study will consider options for the Pavilion, including the possible relocation of the bowling green to the Oval, alterations to, or replacement of the building, and future management options for the facility. Community consultation will be part of the process which will provide Council with direction on the matter. It will also support any future application for funding associated with the project, whichever way Council decides to proceed.

We anticipate if the application for funding is successful that the feasibility process will commence late in 2012. The results from the feasibility study will also support any future applications for funding by Council for this project. More information will be provided as it is available.

FIRE BRIGADE PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council has granted approval to the Tambellup Tennis Club for the renewal of its club restricted liquor license from 1 October 2012 to 30 April 2013.

Council has identified the following projects to be funded by the 2012/2013 Country Local Government Fund allocation:

Tambellup Sports Pavilion upgrade	\$194,889
Broomehill Office Solar Energy	\$50,000
Broomehill Hall - building improvements	\$30,000
Tambellup Hall - roof and ablutions renovations	\$100,000

Council considered Expressions of Interest which had been received for the construction of the Tambellup Independent Living Seniors Accommodation project. Three companies have now been invited to tender for the design and construction of the facility.

Council endorsed the draft of the Community Strategic Plan which was developed following the two community workshops held in August. The document is available at the Shire offices and on the Shire website (www.shirebt.wa.gov.au) for public comment until Thursday 6 September.

HIDDEN TREASURES OF THE GREAT SOUTHERN - BLOOM FESTIVAL/WA ASSOCIATION OF CARAVAN CLUBS RALLY

Programs for the 2012 Bloom Festival are now available at locations in Broomehill and Tambellup, and highlight a range of events which will be held throughout the Hidden Treasures region between 16th September and 24th October.

This year, the Bloom Festival coincides with the WA Association of Caravan Clubs Rally which is being hosted by Hidden Treasures, in Tambellup. The organisers are expecting around 200 caravans to pull in at the Tambellup Sporting Ground over the September long weekend, with delegates able to take in the sights and experiences available in our region.

In Tambellup, the Tambellup Agricultural Show has been brought forward to the Saturday of the long weekend (29 September) to coincide with the rally. This annual event is an ideal opportunity for the community to showcase everything that is good about our part of the world, and the event organisers have done a great job so far in pulling the day together. Yes, it is AFL Grand Final day, and yes, they have organised a big screen! If you are available to assist in any capacity in setting up on the preceding Friday, on the day itself, or packing up, please contact Jenni Bradshaw on 0417 090045.

In Broomehill, two tours have been organised for rally delegates- the first to show off the fantastic wildflower displays in areas of bushland close to town, and the second, a heritage walking tour of the townsite. Those attending the rally are required to pre book for these tours, and numbers so far show they are a popular choice of activity.

The other significant event during the Bloom Festival (which is not linked to the Caravan Rally) is the **'Broomehill is about to Bloom' day**. Aaron East, landscaper from TV series 'The Block' (see the Bloom Festival program for more information), and his team, will be commencing work early in September to create a public garden on the block of land between the Imperial Hotel and the Broomehill Town Hall, which will provide access from Great Southern Highway through to the new public toilets in Holland Park. On **Saturday 13 October** the community is invited to come along and get their hands dirty, and work with Aaron and his team to plant out the final stages of the garden. This is a great opportunity for gardening enthusiasts and anyone with half an interest to work alongside an experienced landscaping team, and maybe pick up a few hints along the way. All ages are welcome; please contact Pam at the Shire if you are interested in participating.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2012** and continues until **15 APRIL 2013** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2012** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2013** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2012. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers.

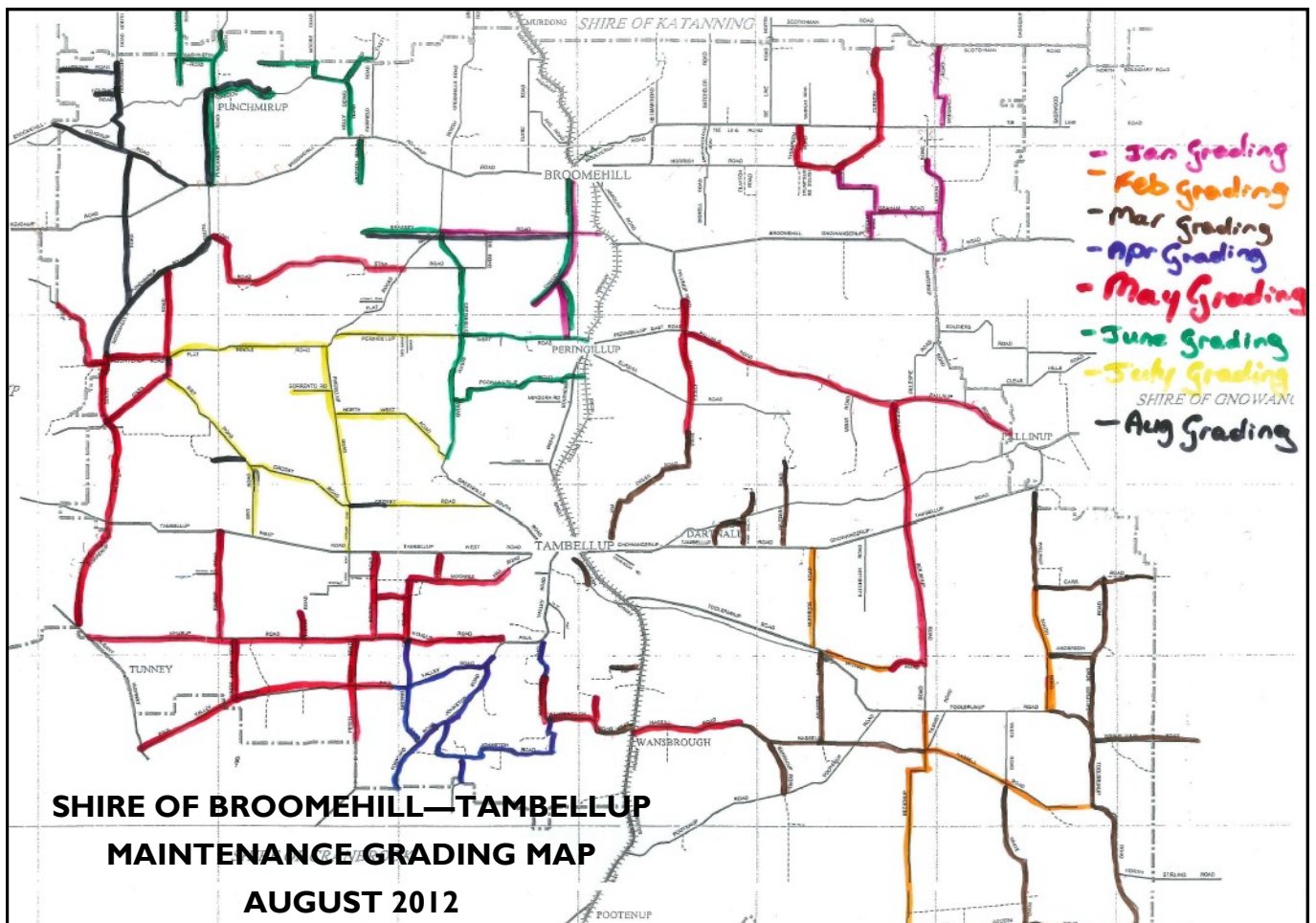

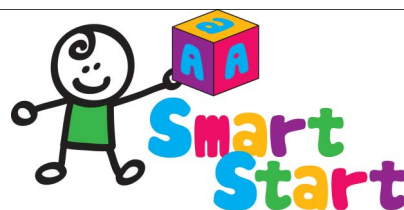

Waldron Rejects "Dying Towns" Claim in Report

The Member for Wagin Terry Waldron has strongly rejected claims that several towns in his electorate are the most vulnerable in WA and in danger of completely dying out by 2050.

A recent report for the Federal Government by the University of Adelaide's Professor Andrew Beer listed Gnowangerup, Tambellup, Cranbrook, Jerramungup, Dumbleyung, Kulin and Brookton as vulnerable, with Cranbrook the most likely town to die and become a ghost town within 40 years.

Citing reasons including climate change, an over-reliance on agriculture and low educational status, Prof Beer also said Tambellup was WA's fifth most at risk town and Jerramungup 14th.

But Mr Waldron has rejected these claims and said small country towns had an important role to play in maintaining WA's economic growth and stability and had a lot to look forward to in the future.

"WA country towns are historically made up of community minded people, all working for the good of that town and the region, not only in the present, but also planning for the future," Mr Waldron said.

"This is what Royalties for Regions is also all about – helping to build local communities and maintaining them for the future.

"I am also incensed at comments regarding education. I visit our local schools frequently and our schools are achieving excellent academic, sporting and social outcomes. In fact, Tambellup Primary School was recently recognised for their outstanding achievements," he said.

CEO of Cranbrook Shire, Peter Northover agreed with Mr Waldron, saying the shire gave little credence to Prof Beer's report and the related newspaper articles.

"Cranbrook is a safe and vibrant community, with a lot to offer in terms of lifestyle, close proximity to Albany and Denmark and the Stirling Ranges, with a number of great wineries on our doorstep," he said.

"We have plans for development of the southern link transport hub, we have built a new sporting complex, accommodation units for our shire staff and for private use and have an active local sustainable farming/landcare group - in fact there are a whole raft of achievements we are very proud of as a shire.

"Reports like this one make us very frustrated and don't do any good at all."

Nationals candidate for the Agricultural Region, Jill Sounness also supported Mr Waldron's comments.

"Having lived all my life in the country I have no doubt our small towns will continue to play an important role into the future," she said.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Sailor Jack (Jack the Sailor) – On 29th November 1883 while TN's men were cutting and tying hay and barley, Jack the Sailor stayed at Gobrup and stoked the hay and looked after the horses. On the 6th December he and Johnny went to Wilson's camp to make a brake for his flock as the wild dogs were disturbing his sheep. On the 11th December Sailor Jack went with Fred Williams and George Fox to Wackenup with wagon and horses to cut rushes. On 12th march 1884 he and James Rogers cut chaff but on the 13th TN settled with him and let him go as he would not draw water for the sheep on Sunday.

Saggers, Owen – Member of Broomehill road Board in 1902 and referred to as a Land guide in 1903.

Sales, Auction – TN went to Schipper's sale on 1st July 1880- and bought some wheels, but doesn't give the cost. At the Martinup sale on 10/11th November 1881, TN bought : a piano £46; wagon and 3 sets of harness £46; winnowing machine £10.5.0; horse rake for £3 less than Edward Treasure paid for it; and 2 bullocks for £12. TN and Thomas Lott attended John Holland's sale. TN bought: 1 tip cart £6.10.0; 1 set of harness £1.12.6; and 1 mould board 5/- . "It was the dullest sale that I ever was at. They were greatly in need of some spirits to liven the people up for everyone seemed so dull. I think if they had some spirits everything would have been more lively and some things sold better."

Sampey, (possibly Thomas) – Employed by TN. In 1890 he was carrying rations to Flynn, Langton and Wilson; carting fencing for Tom McGuire; fencing with Currie and going to Broome Hill with W.P. Wray to get timber. In January 1892 Sampey took water to Langton, shifted Langton to Wackenup and took staples and strainers out to Carbadup. On 1st February he and TN's son George gathered up the sheep from Pallinup paddock to shift to Carbadup and he then went with three Chinese and Kindred to bush up the fence. The next day one of the Chinese complained that Sampey had struck him, and on the 3rd the men were told to stop bushing as TN had heard that there was wire available at Albany. On the 5th February 1892 Sampey left TN's employ.

Sandalwood – In the 1870's some known sandalwood cutters were William Stone, James and William Scott, Frank Edwards, William Martin, George Burns, Thomas Hutton and Nat and Alfred Nelson. In the latter half of 1879 Douglas, Drury, Johnny and Smart were cleaning, marking and carting TN's sandalwood; loads were usually 2 tons (2.04t). TN's brother George, John Wort and James Annice were also going north-east for sandalwood. Early in 1881 Jack Smith, Deveral and Johnny bought in more wood from the north-east and in March two teams made two trips to Albany. On 4th April Jack Smith and Deveral took two loads to the Gordon to leave there until spring. The following week TN went to the Old Police Station to see the 6 tons offered by Ed Donovan but the wood was poor. In July that year TN arranged with a man named Jenkins to get in 20 tons of sandalwood and roots, and in the next 5 months Fox, Deveral and Johnny brought in 23½ tons of wood. TN settles with Jenkins on 5th February 1882, paying him £28.1.0. In February 1882 TN bought 31 tons 11 cwt 56 lbs off Charles Moore who was working north east of Muradungup. On 23rd January 1883, sandalwood was fetching £8.10.0 a ton at Albany. In April Alf Nelson found that a heap of his sandalwood at the north east – about 70-80 tons – had been

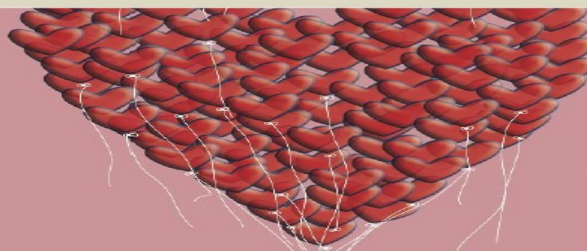

burnt; TN thought it had been done willfully. Tom McGuire and Hayward were also carting sandalwood at this time. Early in 1888, TN's man Ward went to Henry Quartermaine's for a load of sandalwood and 2 tons of TN's wood was sold by the Bank to Albert Hassell at £6 per ton. In October 1888 Robert Tunney came to Sunnyside trying to buy up sandalwood for Mr Bateman. The granting to the W.A Land company of large tracts of land along the railway line restricted some sandalwood gathering activities and in July; 1889 32 people including R. Krakouer and William and Charlie Norrish of Tambellup were caught cutting sandalwood within 40 miles (64km) of the GSR and each fined 20/- (£1).

CLUB - NEWSLETTER INFORMATION

Sport 4 All is a new \$20 million state government initiative, which aims to build stronger, healthier, happier and safer communities! The initiative has four parts, **KidSport**, Community Volunteer Project, ClubTalk and Nature Play WA.

KidSport will assist eligible families to receive up to \$200 annually for each of their children aged between 5 – 18 years, to subsidise fees to join a sport and recreation club.

Eligible families include those with health care cards or pension concession card, or those referred by other community groups, such as schools, juvenile justice teams, government agencies and health practitioners. These groups are known as referral agents.

The process for accessing KidSport is simple!

Kids and parents/guardians can obtain an application form from their participating local government office or their website, or from a sport or recreation club, a referral agent or anywhere local governments make them available. The parent/guardian fills in the application and takes it to be validated at the local government they reside in. A photocopy of the health care card or pension concession card must be attached.

Alternatively referral agents may assist in filling out the application, complete their section on the back and give it to the parent/guardian to sign. The parent/guardian will take the voucher to the sport or recreation club for processing when registering their children. The club will then invoice the local government. It's that easy!

Not all local governments participate.

KidSport vouchers are available to all clubs.
