FROM THE MARCH COUNCIL MEETING IN BRIEF

- Council endorsed a draft brief to engage a consultant for the purpose of developing the Strategic Community Plan. As part of the wider Integrated Planning process, Council is required to undertake community consultation in order to develop a Strategic Plan, which will provide direction for the future development of our Shire. An independent consultant will be engaged to carry out this process. Council encourages all residents to be involved in the consultation phase of the process. More information will be available in the near future.
- Council agreed to donate \$140 to the Clontarf Foundation - Katanning Football Academy in appreciation of the Foundation's initiative and support of local indigenous youth.
- Council has submitted an application to Landcorp's Regional Development Assistance Program, for assistance with the development of residential lots in the Broomehill townsite. Staff will continue to work through options with Landcorp to develop lots in the Tambellup townsite.
- Council has received advice that an application submitted to the Department of Sport and Recreation on behalf of the Broomehill Recreational Complex Committee was successful. Funding will be received to replace the current grass bowling green with a synthetic green.

ANZAC DAY SERVICES - TAMBELLUP

At the March Ordinary Council meeting, Council discussed the future of Anzac Day services in Tambellup. For many years Council have organised the services, and staff have voluntarily attended on the day to set up, deliver the service in conjunction with Councillors and pack up. In 2011, when the Anzac Day holiday fell during the Easter weekend, a number of staff and Councillors were not available to coordinate the arrangements on the day. The Tambellup CWA and community members organised and conducted the service, which was very well supported, and the Tambellup CWA has offered to provide morning tea for this year's event.

A note went into the BT Times in March 2012 seeking expressions of interest from community groups to coordinate the event in Tambellup this year, with Council assistance by way of provision of facilities at no cost, advertising and printing. At the time of writing, no response had been received.

Council has determined that if no one from the community comes forward, it will conduct the 2012 Anzac Service in Tambellup in conjunction with the Tambellup CWA; however residents are advised the Shire will then withdraw from organising any future Anzac Day services.

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION

Council has recently received advice from Hon. Minister Brendon Grylls that our application for funding through the Regional Development Council Action Agenda Fund has been approved, with \$585,000 being allocated to the Seniors Accommodation project. This is a fantastic result, and, combined with funds committed by Council, the GSDC (through Royalties for Regions) and community organisations will enable the project to be completed in a single staged development.

Once all funding agreements are in place, Council will appoint a project manager who will develop specifications and advertise the tender for construction of the facility. Updates will be provided to the community as the project progresses.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

Please note the lighting of fires is PROHIBITED during the Easter holiday period, Friday 6th April to Monday 9th April inclusive.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the Shire is **98251042.** The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week. If you think conditions may be unsafe for any outside hot work, please check with the Hotline service or your Brigade captain.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. Please bear in mind the broadcasting of Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans is subject to programming constraints by the radio stations. While we are able get the information through to them, it may not be broadcast immediately. If in doubt, the Harvest Ban Hotline is the best option for up to date information.

The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. If you would like to register to receive advice of harvest bans by SMS, or if you are currently registered but your mobile number has changed, please contact Pam at the Shire office for your details to be updated.

SHIRE PRESIDENTS REPORT MY VIEW – HOW DOES A COMMUNITY WORK?

How does a community work? It may sound like a strange question but one worth thinking about.

It seems more and more that we want Councils to be our community, when in reality that's not possible. To my mind, Councils facilitate and assist in placing infrastructure such as parks, ovals, halls etc into the community and have a role in providing assistance so that groups can create a community event or fulfill a community role but in the end, it is the people who create a community while the local government is there to assist them where possible.

It seems more common in recent times that Communities expect that the local government should organize and run more and more community events. To achieve this requires the staff to be involved. It is unfair and not sustainable to expect staff to give up their free time to work unpaid, at events that fall on public holidays just because we, as a community, are not prepared to take up that role. I think Council has a supporting role and can assist in many other ways, but in the long term the events will only be successful if they are driven by the community.

It is not hard to see why things have changed. Once there were satellite communities around our towns that relied on the town for business and socializing but with better, more efficient and comfortable cars travel has become much easier and the population in smaller communities gravitates to the larger towns for business and recreation. Our population has dwindled over the years but has recently enjoyed a period of stability in terms of numbers.

Technology continues to advance on us at a "frightening" pace and it can be difficult for some to keep up with the global community that we now find ourselves in. So much more is available for us to choose from particularly in our leisure time and this competes with some of the more traditionally sports and community events. Local sporting clubs are struggling for membership and find that they are travelling further and further to participate. Also volunteering is suffering with dwindling numbers and the load falling to fewer and fewer people.

To me however that is the challenge - to engage and reinvigorate people to want to be involved in their community and not rely on someone else such as the Council. Events are always more meaningful when driven by community groups.

It was very pleasing to see the Broomehill Community again organize an Australia Day function and the Tambellup Bowling Club take on the Australia Day celebrations in Tambellup. Fantastic! Council was happy to provide a small amount of financial assistance to make both events a great success.

I would like to see the community also take on the Tambellup ANZAC day ceremony. The CWA organized the event last year when it was not possible for the Shire to conduct it. We have a great opportunity to build on that. Broomehill already has a successful day run by the community which is well supported and we would like to think Tambellup could be run in the similar manner.

Tambellup has had many successful sporting club and volunteer groups organizing events - some long term such as the Tambellup Show. We are also fortunate to have groups such as the Red Cross, Lions, St John Ambulance, CWA, Play groups, P&C and volunteer fire brigades and I'm sure there are many more that enhance and make our community work and function.

The worrying thing is that unless those volunteers that now hold those roles are replaced, we as a community are in great trouble. Council can't be a back up or a replacement. The value alone from the work done by volunteers is staggering and almost impossible to put a dollar value on but most importantly the attachment and passion supplied by volunteers to the roles they take on can't be matched.

So - do we really value our treasured community spirit or do we allow it to dwindle and disappear? The "ball" is in our hands and it us to make sure that the efforts of our predecessors is built on and that our towns continue to be great places to live. Being an active part of our community can be a hassle and even inconvenient at times, but what is the alternative - or is it simply inevitable?

Community involvement affects the way your local government is shaped - become involved?





Night. It was a very social evening with the old hall bustling with chatter and laughter. We raised over \$3000 which will be put toward the senior room camp.



Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Road Boards and Roads - From June 1882, TN makes regular references to attending meetings of the Kojonup Road Board. George Norrish was also a member and J.J. Garrity had been elected by January 1884. At the March 1883 meeting, TN paid £2.12.6 in dog licenses and his own, Henry Townsend's and George Whitton's cart taxes. A meeting was held on 25th July 1883 to decide about having a by-road between Kojonup and Eticup. In March 1889. TN presented a petition that for the minor road to Eticup to be declared a main road. This was refused. Next month, John Garrity was given the contract to clear the road and construct a culvert at Carlecatup crossing for £110. In June it was resolved to proceed with the survey of 4 miles of road from Eticup to Broome Hill and W.H. Angove was paid £5.9.2 to do the survey.

In May 1892, Katanning and Broome Hill road Districts were excised from the Kojonup road District. Elections were held on 23rd June and W.H. Graham, J.F.T. Hassell, R.S Climie, R.T. Krakouer, R. Burridge, J.J Garrity and T Norrish elected with W.H.G. to be Chairman. The first meeting of the Broome Hill Road Board was held on 7th July 1892 and later that month TN and WHG examined the roads that were very bad so that tenders might be called at the August meeting. From this time on, TN and WHG (later Patrick Garrity) spent a lot of time measuring roads for work to be done and inspecting the work as it progressed. Many locals tendered for road works; Rogers (TN complained that the gravel he used was nearly all sand), Delaney, George Norrish, Nat Nelson, Betteridge, Bannon, Alf Nelson, Taylor, Patrick Garrity junior, Bass, Green and

P. White. Sometimes work was not satisfactory and had to be re

July 1893, TN walked into Broome Hill to see A.Y. Hassell regarding a grant to sink a tank for water, a Registry Office and a Post Office Savings Bank. On 22nd December 1895, Thomas Norrish, Chairman of the Road Board, read a short address to the Governor passing through by train. It is assumed that the address was given on the Railway Station platform.

For names of members of the Road Board see the display boards in the fover of the Broomehill Shire Office; only a few names of Secretaries until 1916 are known. J.H. Otto was Secretary in 1896 and could have held the post for some years. R.H. Jones is known to have been appointed by early 1897 and was still in the post in 1899. He is one of the men in the photograph of road Board members and others in Journal Street in c 1909. Was he an interested by-stander or had he just handed over to Michael Ryan who is known to have been Secretary from (at least) 1909. ("The Official Guide to Western Australia 1909"). Another in this photograph is the accountant, J. Lush. The first Road Board election in 1892 was held in the Hotel and it is likely that meetings were held there too. With the building of the Broome Hill Hall in Journal Street in 1898, road Board meetings were held there, but the Secretary operated from his place of business or from home. Eventually a lean -to office was attatched to the rear of the hall - some time after the photograph was taken of the load of mallet bark in the railway yards as this shows no extension to the hall - and the hall was referred to officially as the Road Board Hall. In 1928, the Broome Hill Public Hall (erstwhile Sheridan's Hall)- which the road Board had taken over from the Public Hall Trustees in 1917 - was extended at the front with brick offices for the Board. In 1961, the name of the authority was changed to Shire Council.

"Autumn Pest Control Hits Target"

Nearly 300 volunteers participated in the Stockbrand's Community Foxshoot on the 24th - 26th February, with a total of 1307 foxes, 52 feral cats and 1373 rabbits culled across the weekend. Cadoux Sports Council took out top spot with 229 foxes, 5 feral cats and 538 rabbits.

"Rural communities pulling together with a great organization like Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes has a win win result. Not only are we encouraging a fantastic social event for Cadoux, Kalannie & Koorda, we are helping to control vermin which are negative to our livestock and vegetation, and raise much needed funds for RFDS which is essential for people living in our rural areas," Drew, Local Coordinator of the Cadoux foxshoots said.

'Stockbrands generously donate five dollars for every fox and cat shot over the two designated weekends to the Royal Flying Doctors and I urge all local communities to join the 42 groups that have already registered so we can have maximum impact across the landscape" said Project Officer Shahan Hobson.

"We have a wealth of resources to assist you to run a simple, safe and effective community shoot and it's also a fantastic way to support the Royal Flying Doctors," she said.

1080 baiting is a very effective means to control feral pests, and landholders are encouraged to bait their properties in autumn while food sources are scarce.

"Around 16,000 fox baits and four tonnes of rabbit bait are laid by farmers each autumn, which is a really effective way to address large pest populations and more cunning animals that have become spotlight shy over the years," Shahan said.

"David Gray's Aglink are proud sponsors of the Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes Program and are donating 5% of PAKS product sales to the Royal Flying Doctors for the month of March, and we urge landholders to give their full support to the program," Hoss Wehr of David Grays Aglink said. Landholders baiting their properties must gain poison and safe use and handling accreditation; a simple process run by the Biosecurity Officers at the Department of Agriculture and Food WA. Accreditation remains valid for fiver years.

Reminder to be safe on the roads this Easter

With many Broomehill-Tambellup residents are heading off on holidays for Easter, drivers are being encouraged to plan ahead, swap drivers and stop for at least 15 minutes every 2 hours of driving.

"No one wants to remember this Easter for tragic reasons so I urge you all take road safety seriously, no matter how far you travel," Shire President Cr Barry Webster said.

Remember, plan ahead—leave enough time to get to your destination, change drivers or stop and revive at one of the many coffee stops or Driver Reviver locations run by volunteers throughout WA.

A single distraction while driving is all it takes. Driving is actually a complex task - to anticipate and avoid hazards on the road, drivers need to concentrate and give their full attention.

Cr Webster said getting distracted doesn't take much. We all experience distractions from time to time from our passengers, mobile phones, radios or CD music.

"Common distractions while behind the wheel include reading a street directory, using a GPS unit, eating, activity from passengers in the vehicle, changing a CD, and the most frequent, using a mobile phone," Cr Webster said.

- Some easy tips to help you stay focused on the road are:

 Adjust all vehicle controls (e.g. radio/CD player) before driving.
 - Turn off your mobile phone when driving
 - Take a break rather than eating, drinking, smoking or grooming yourself while
 - If you don't know the route, make sure you or your passenger checks the map before setting out on your journey.
 - Ensure pets are properly restrained in the vehicle (e.g. using a secured carrier box).

'We ask everyone to be mindful of common distractions while driving, as it is up to everyone to ensure that the roads are safe in aiming to eliminate death and serious injuries on our roads," Cr Webster said.
