The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 17 May 2012 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE APRIL COUNCIL MEETING - IN BRIEF

- Council will apply to the Department of Veterans Affairs for funding to assist with compiling a database of local service men and women who served in the armed forces during the WW1, WW2, Korea and Vietnam conflicts. This information will then be made available to the community through the Shires libraries, museums and schools. Funding will also be sought to assist with the restoration or replacement of the communities Honour Boards.
- The Southern Link Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (VROC) - of which the Broomehill-Tambellup Council is a member - has identified that water recycling is a priority for its communities and as such is applying for funding through the Country Local Government Fund -Regional Allocation to explore the options for water harvesting and reuse. Council has endorsed the brief for the consultants, Opus International, to carry out preliminary investigations into the capture and storage of stormwater for use in Councils parks and gardens, and the reuse of sewer water in Tambellup.

ANZAC DAY

It was fantastic to see such a great turnout at both of the Anzac Services held in the Shire last week. It appears the events continue to be held in high regard and are valued by our community members.

Following the announcement last month that Council would be withdrawing from organising any future Anzac Services in Tambellup, the community is now encouraged to give some thought to next year's service. Given the day is important to our communities, it would be wonderful to see a local group or members of the community having input into the format of the service.

COMMUNITY STRATEGIC PLAN

Council will shortly be commencing its Community Strategic Planning process, which is required by the Department for Local Government. This process will assist with the development of a long term plan for the ongoing development of the Shire, and community input is an integral part of the process. An independent consultant has been engaged to carry out the process, and it is hoped every community member will take the opportunity to be involved. More information will be available in the near future.

MOSAIC PROJECT

As part of the Town Centre Enhancement Program funding, a mosaic entry statement is to be created at the southern entry to Tambellup on Garrity St. This will be done in the next couple of months. LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP Proposed Local Law

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup proposes to make the following Local Law:

Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Materials Local Law

Purpose: To provide for the clearing of refuse, rubbish or disused material from land within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup.

Effect: To control the keeping and storage of refuse, rubbish and disused materials on land throughout the Shire, and require the removal of such to reduce hazards and any adverse affects on health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants of the district.

A copy of the proposed local law may be inspected at or obtained from the Shire Offices at 46-48 Norrish Street, Tambellup and 30360 Great Southern Highway Broomehill between 8.30am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.

Written submission on the proposed local law may be made to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup 6320 by 4.30pm on Friday 15 June 2012.


Broomehill Anzac Day

Reading to your little one


Children are never too young to be read to!



PUBLIC NOTICE TO THE RESIDENTS OF TAMBELLUP & DUMBLEYUNG

It is with deep regret that over the past two months St Luke's Family Practice has not been able to provide a doctor to attend the monthly surgery at Tambellup Nursing Post. The Dumbleyung surgery has been reduced to only once a month and unfortunately, this coverage will also stop throughout April.

St Luke's is currently experiencing a lack of doctors which has occurred due to the relocation of tow of our doctors to Albany and long earned leave for several others.

We are currently attempting to employ doctors to fill the vacancies. It should be mentioned that this is proving to be a nearly impossible task. We are literally recruiting across the globe. Our next possible doctor will be coming from Cairo if all goes well.

Last year the Rural Regional Areas had over 50 vacancies for doctors and this year the number has nearly doubled to 94. We are attempting to bring this extreme predicament to the attention of the Government. Unless we can entice some doctors from the metro and into the country, the situation will not improve in the near future.

We will continue to try and attract doctors to St Luke's so everything can return to normal with doctors attending Tambellup and Dumbleyung as soon as possible. Please accept my apologies for the delay in notifying everyone regarding the current situation. I will endeavour to keep your updated in the future. Thank you for your support.

TITLE: "8,000 pests culled to raise \$21,000 for RFDS"

4031 foxes, 234 feral cats and 3773 rabbits were culled across the south west land division by over 700 volunteers as part of the 2012 Stockbrand's Community Foxshoots. Held over two weekends in February and March as part of the Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes Program (RCRF), \$21,000 was raised for the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

"Local Coordinators play a critical role in the promotion and coordination of the event, including organising a central meeting place for volunteers to bring culled pests after working all night," Project Officer Shahan Hobson said. "Many local coordinators also seek local sponsorship from businesses to assist in the running of the shoots"

"Equally as important as our local coordinators are our sponsors, Stockbrands who pledged five dollars for every fox or feral cat shot over the designated weekends," Ms Hobson explained. "Their support has enabled us to raise just over \$21,000 for the Royal Flying Doctors Service."

'The most significant results came from Frankland River group with 288 foxes, 13 feral cats and 196 rabbits over one weekend and Cadoux with 367 foxes, 10 cats and 1204 rabbits over the two sponsored shoot weekends"

RCRF has worked closely with Murdoch University's Narelle Dybing for the past two years, providing fox and feral cat samples for research purposes.

"The Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes program has been invaluable in my research," said Narelle Dybing, BSc (Hons), PhD candidate, Murdoch University.

"This year they have collected feral cat samples from a vast array of locations throughout the south west.

"These cats will be inspected for dietary preferences and any parasites that they may carry and potentially transmit to humans, livestock and other wildlife," she explained.

David Grays Aglink is the sole distributor for the PAKS range of baiting products, which have come on stream as a major supplier since the closure of the Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA) baiting production unit in 2010.

"Baiting is an effective year round tool, and key pest traffic ways such as soft sand and creek lines are ideal places to target baiting activities," Shahan explained.

"All research points to needing a coordinated approach with active landholders, and we'll keep working at plugging holes across the landscape to extend the success of these local group's efforts across the agricultural landscape.'

State NRM Program Community Grants 2012

The Government of Western Australia is committed to helping communities undertake projects that protect and restore their local environment.

This year they have pledged \$3 million towards State NRM Program Community Grants to support on-ground activities of local community groups.

Grants of between \$10 000 and \$50 000 are available for any on-ground activity that will assist in the conservation, restoration, rehabilitation or enhancement of a local natural asset. This can include land, water, marine and biodiversity assets.

Who can apply Catchment and community groups, industry groups, not for profit organisations, local government authorities and education institutions are eligible for these grants.

Applicants can lodge more than one project proposal and current and past applicants can apply.

State Government agencies, regional NRM organisations and individuals are not eligible to apply directly for these grants but may partner with eligible groups.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Robins, Benjamin – In May 1879, Robins and Connors were sinking a tank on Goblup land for Lady Campbell and they finished the job on 4th July. The next day they shifted their things to the Sheep Wash to build a yard there. The settled with them on 18th July for fencing and tank sinking and on 19th they started for Pootenup to sink a tank for Josiah Norrish. On 18th December 1879 they came from Josiah's with TN's timbers from the sawpits and they and Sam Smith went to Josiah's for Christmas. In May 1880, robins must have been working at Martinup as he came to Goblup on the 3rd with Burridge and Kelly for Treasure's chaff. Robins was back in mid-September with J. Collins and another man looking for shearing and was hired to start on 2nd October. On 18 November, he and Deveral began reaping TN's barley. By mid-April 1881, Robins was sinking another tank at Pootenup. On 15th July he had 7 feet to go and finished on 11th August. TN paid him £32.5.0. In September Robins sank a small tank at the lambing station near Eticup and joined the Goblup shearing team in October. On 2nd January 1882, Robins accompanied TN to Pootenup to select a place to sink a tank. They could not find a good place and two days later settled on the Deep Creek and he and Paddy smith went out to start work. However that proved unsuitable. On 20th January TN went out with the men and showed them a fresh place to sink a tank, which they finished on 29th April.

tank, which they finished on 29th April. On 4th May 1882, Ben robins started for Albany, saying he was going to Adelaide and on 24th April 1883 he arrived back from Albany with John Garrity – presumably having come off the steamer from Adelaide on 20th April. Th the re-employed him to do work associated with the building of the new house (Sunnyside), including carting bricks from the kiln. He finished this work on 12 June but started again in July to dig a pond at the new house – 400 yards at 2/6 per yard. TN paid him £17.15.0 in March 1884. There is evidence that he was given more digging to do as TN pointed four picks for him in April and settled with him on 13th may 1884. In January 1886, Robins settled with TN for the stores he had got from him

In January 1886, Robins settled with TN for the stores he had got from him and in March he came to Sunnyside to borrow the auger but Nat Nelson had it. TN does not say for whom he was working. In April TN took robins to Alf Nelson's to show him where to sink a pond near Mr Nelson's blacksmith shop. In July he was sinking a pond in Chillicup paddock. On 6th August he came up with One-Arm Jack to get picks sharpened. They finished the pond on 1st September, TN paid Robins £6.13.6, and on 6th September the two then began putting up a fence over by Nelson's shop, presumably where TN had sold ½ acre (.202 ha) to Nelson a few days before. On 6th October 1886, Ben robins was at the Wash Pool with others washing TN's sheep.

robins was at the Wash Pool with others washing TN's sheep. **Robinson, George –** On 23rd September 1879, George Robinson came to Goblup and said he had left Treasure. TN took him on and he was put to helping Joseph Louther cut poles for the Sheep Wash. He went with Johnny to take Beauty and the old black mare to Edward Treasure's and went back with Thomas Knapp two weeks later to get the mares. On 5th November he was given a flock to shepherd at the Three Wells. He came in the following week to go to Martinup with horse and trap to bring his wife and family to Deep Creek, and on 17th November started for Deep Creek with 1206 sheep. In December 1879, he shifted to Paper Bark Pool where TN found that he had lost 400 sheep; Johnny found them again. During 1880, 1881,1882 and 1883 Robinson shepherded his sheep at various locations - Wackenup, McGuires, Little Hell and Pingellup. In October 1880, Sam Smith, Louther and Johnny cut rushes and cart stuff for the Robinsons hut at Deep Creek, and the fact that Louther did not return to Goblup until July from building the hut suggests that Mrs Robinson stayed at Deep Creek with the family (number unknown). Mrs Robinson is mentioned several times. On 2nd September 1880, she and her boy came in from Deep Creek. She came to Goblup on 19th February 1881 and stayed until the next day. Louther brought her in on 16th March to help with the washing and she was there again on 26th April...Mrs Norrish's birthday! Was this a coincidence? On 7th July 1881, the black African Jimmy brought word that Mrs Robinson's child was very ill and not likely to live. Four days later TN took Mrs Norrish and the children to visit Mrs Robinson and the sick child but it's fate is not recorded. On 12th November 1882, son Johnny Robinson was given culls to mind at Josiah Norrish's. On 8th December 1882 he was sent with 13 rams to J. Sims and to stay there until Churchill took over. He returned to Goblup on 30th December. It appears that TN continued to give him work, as in June 1883 "young Robinson" was minding lambs for Chester.

George Robinson's flock had always been a fairly large one: 1159 lambs, 61 culls and 1 bell wether at Wackenup in October 1880; 1215 lambs, 139 culls in November 1881; 1442 at Pingellup in April 1882. His wage in 1882 was £40 per year with rations. With the transfer of the Goblup lease from TN to Thomas Lott in November 1883, Robinson agreed to work for Lott; but he left his service on 29th July 1884.

Imagine this.....

You have taken your young child or grandchild up to the town oval to kick a ball, fly a kite, play Saturday sport or just have a run around. Your youngster is having a great time on the massive expanse of grass - it's so inviting for them to run around with no boundaries.... And then they come back to you. With a peculiar odour - more like, offensive, really. Yes, you guessed it; they have trodden in a 'steaming mound' of dog poo. Yuk.

This is happening on a far too regular basis at the Tambellup Oval, and is not fair to the intended users - ie the community as a whole. Numerous requests for people to clean up after their dogs appear to be falling on deaf ears, so now, here's the official line:

Firstly - the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Dogs Local Law 2008 states categorically that **dogs are not permitted at either the Broomehill Recreational Complex or the Tambellup Sportsground**, and specifically not on any area being used for sporting activities. If you take your dog to these areas you are committing an offence, which may incur a penalty of up to \$2000.

Dog exercise areas have been designated by Council in both Broomehill and Tambellup. These areas are:

- (a) Reserve 634 Javelin Street, Broomehill;
- (b) Reserve 1698 Spencer Road, Broomehill;
- (c) Lot 24 Broomehill/Kojonup Road, Broomehill;
- (d) Part of Reserve 19757 East Terrace, Tambellup the bush area behind the Sportsground
- (e) Reserve 22607 Garrity Street Tambellup.

If you require more information on the location of these areas please contact the Shire office.

Secondly - the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Dogs Local Law 2008 also states that if your dog excretes in a public place, or on any vacant land in the townsite, and you do not remove the excreta, you are liable to incur a penalty of \$200. A supply of small plastic bags does not cost that much.

Thirdly - the Dog Act 1976 states that all dogs must be on a leash in a public area, unless it is a designated dog exercise area. The owner, or person in control of the dog, can receive an on-the-spot fine of \$100 for allowing a dog to roam free.

All three issues above are contributing to an increasing problem. The Ovals are provided and maintained for the sporting and recreational activities of the people of Broomehill and Tambellup; however this does not include exercising dogs. With summer sports finished and winter sports about to commence on the ovals, those people who are exercising their dogs on the town ovals are asked to refrain from doing so, effective immediately.
