The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 15 March 2012 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE DECEMBER AND FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETINGS - IN BRIEF

- Council made a donation of \$500 to the Lord Mayors Distress Relief Fund - Margaret River Bush Fire Appeal.
- Council gave retrospective conditional planning approval to CBH for the installation of a temporary grain sampling facility at corner Toobrunup Rd and Beejenup Rd, valid until February 29 2012.
- Council adopted the revised Standard Operating Procedures for Bush Fire Brigades. Copies have been distributed to all Brigade Captains and secretaries, and are available to brigade members on request.
- Council endorsed the amendment of the Forward Capital Works Plan, which will see \$324,000 from the Country Local Government Fund 2011/2012 allocation directed to the Tambellup aged accommodation project. A further \$50,000 has been allocated for the installation of a solar energy system at the Broomehill Shire Administration office as part of the works to establish a Regional Archive Repository.
- Following the close of the advertising period for amendments to the Broomehill Town Planning Scheme No. 1 and the Tambellup Town Planning Scheme No. 2, Council adopted Amendment No. 5 for each, which dealt with the interpretation of 'Industry' in the Scheme texts. The documents will now be forwarded to the WA Planning Commission for final approval.
- Council endorsed the design for the construction of new public toilets in Holland Park. This project is funded through the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund 2010/2011 allocation.

CAT ACT 2011

The *Cat Act 2011* was passed by Parliament on 2 November 2011 and was assented to on 9 November 2011.

This legislation effectively defines "responsible ownership" of cats and means that all cats are:

- sterilised unless being used for breeding;
- micro chipped so they can be returned if lost,
- stolen or stray from properties;

and

 registered so local governments can readily deal with cats without owners.

The new *Cat Act 2011* also gives local government the power to deal with unowned cats as well as with irresponsible cat owners. Local government will also be able to make local cat laws where there is a community demand.

To ensure that the new requirements do not cause hardship, cat owners have two years in which to comply with the regulations as the new laws will not come fully into effect until 1 November 2013. There will be a one year phase period from 1November 2012 to allow local governments to prepare for the registration of cats and associated administrative

The key features of the *Cat Act 2011* are:

- A) providing for all cats that have reached six months of age to be micro chipped, sterilised and registered with the local government where they are usually kept;
- B) providing for all cats to also be micro chipped and sterilised prior to transfer or sale;
- C) providing for local governments to administer and enforce the provisions of the Act;
- D) providing for local governments to be able to seize cats; and
- E) providing for local governments to create local laws for the control of cats.

We are currently awaiting information on assistance with implementation from the Department of Local Government. More information will be provided when it comes to hand.

EASTER HOURS

KIDSPORT

The Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) recently announced the rollout of the KidSport program across WA. KidSport is an initiative under the four-year, \$20 million project, 'Sport 4 All' aimed at increasing participation in community sport and recreation throughout Western Australia.

KidSport will make it possible for Western Australian children to participate in community sport and recreation, no matter their financial circumstances. KidSport will allow eligible youth aged 5–18 years to apply for financial assistance to contribute towards club fees. The fees will go directly to the registered KidSport clubs participating in the project through their local government.

To be eligible, the applicant must be aged 5–18 years, must have a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card, and the applicant's primary place of residence must be in the local government area they are applying to (exceptions may apply).

BUDGET 2012/2013

Council is about to commence the first stages of the preparation of the 2012/2013 budget.

As part of that process Community and Sporting groups are invited to forward submissions to Council for consideration in the budget. Submissions are to be in writing and forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by close of business on Friday 30 March 2012.

DID YOU KNOW...??

That the Tambellup Heritage Trail along the Gordon River is a <u>walk/bicycle path</u>? Council is in the process of carrying out maintenance work to the gravel trail, and it is disappointing to note that vehicles, go carts and motorbikes have already made their mark. Aside from the damage caused to the path, pedestrians and cyclists should be able to use the path without having to take evasive action from vehicles <u>illegally</u> using the path.

Those people involved in driving vehicles, go carts and riding motorbikes along the Heritage Trail are advised this must cease immediately.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are advised the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **15 FEBRUARY 2012** and continues through until **15 APRIL 2012** inclusive. You are required to obtain a permit prior to lighting <u>any</u> fires during this period. Permits can be obtained through your Brigade Captain/Fire Control Officer, or the Chief Fire Control Officer:

Please note the lighting of fires is PROHIBITED during the Easter holiday period, Friday 6th April to Monday 9th April inclusive.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the Shire is **98251042.** The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week. If you think conditions may be unsafe for any outside hot work, please check with the Hotline service or your Brigade captain.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. Please bear in mind the broadcasting of Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans is subject to programming constraints by the radio stations. While we are able get the information through to them, it may not be broadcast immediately. If in doubt, the Harvest Ban Hotline is the best option for up to date information.




Please remember if you would like to get the discount for your annual post box renewal you need to pay by 31st March 2012.



Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Rifle Club – On 15th August 1888, TN went to John Garrity's for a meeting about a Rifle Club. He went to another meeting the next day with John Chipper to decide on a rifle match on 31st August. At the match, John Holland proved to be the best shot with George Norrish the second highest scorer and John McGuire the third; there were 14 men firing. The shooting was a great deal better than at Kojonup. In the 1907 diary there are regular references to Richard and Will Norrish (TN's sons) going to Broome Hill for Rifle Shooting. On 12th August TN went to the rifle Range with his sons to fire the first shot at the official opening of the Range on behalf of the Broome Hill Rifle Club. In the evening there was a firing match between the people from Katanning and Broome Hill; Broome Hill won by 6 points. On 25th September, Broome Hill rifle club went to Katanning for a match. On 2nd and 16th October 1907 a two-day shooting match was held for a prize of £5 given by Mr Moir of Salt River.

Rigby – Unidentified. At Nannamillup on 31st January 1864 with Dover the tank sinker.

Riley – In September 1880, TN went for Mrs Riley on the birth of his son William. He and John Wray took her home on 12th October. She was collected again on 8th January 1882 from Pardalup on the birth of Arthur Ernest. On 29th December 1881, Michael Riley (ex enrolled Pensioner Guard) came from Kojonup for two young rams. Michael died on 23rd August 1884 and TN entered in his diary on 28th "old Mr Riley died last Sunday" Mrs Riley was very likely Michael's wife. In February 1882, a man named Riley died at Andrew Moir's – supposedly killed by drink.

Riley, Paddy – Shepherd, called at Goblup on 26th December 1890 on the way to Woodiarup to take a flock for J.F.T. Hassell.

Ringbarking – It is not known when this practice was first introduced but TN's first reference was in January 1893 when some of the Chinese workers were put to this job and again in July that year. On 30th December 1895, E.W Steere and R Wilhelm came to Goblup to look at the land to be "rung".

DIGITAL TELEVISION

An important update about your Television viewing in the Tambellup area

The introduction of digital television broadcasting in Australia will see the cessation of television being broadcast in analog some time in the second half of 2013. All television towers in regional and remote Western Australia will be switched off with the exact date yet to be determined by the Australian Government.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup retransmits television to residents in the Tambellup townsite and areas immediately surrounding the town.

Council has been advised by the Executive Director of the Digital Switchover Taskforce (part of the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy) that it has two options:

Convert the current self help retransmission site located on Jam Creek Road to digital

Or

• Switch off the analog system and opt into the Satellite Subsidy Scheme and the Australian Government funded digital Viewer Access Satellite Television (VAST) service.

Council has determined to take up the second option to switch off the analog system and opt into the Satellite Subsidy Scheme and the VAST service. Council had to advise the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy of its decision by 15 February 2012 to be eligible for the Satellite Subsidy Scheme. Further explanation of this decision follows with information provided by the Digital Switchover Taskforce.

OPTION 1

Convert the current self help retransmission site located on Jam Creek Road to digital

Broadcasters advised the Minister in 2010 that they had decided they would not be converting any existing analog self-help retransmission towers in remote Australia to digital, including those in regional and remote Western Australia. It is important to note that commercial tower upgrades are being carried out by the commercial broadcasters and, consequently, the choice of towers to be upgraded is a matter for broadcasters to determine. Tower upgrades are not being funded by the Government.

Any upgrade and all future upgrades to the tower in Tambellup would have to be at Council's and the community's cost. Initial quotes to undertake the upgrade to digital were upward of \$150,000. In addition to the prohibitive costs and the challenges involved in implementing the standards required to retransmit, Council would also, if having chosen this option, needed to apply to the Australian Communications and Media Authority for a digital broadcasting licence to retransmit their services. This option included a wide range of technical and regulatory considerations and no guarantee that Council would be granted a licence. Under this option, should any household find out later that they are not able to receive adequate digital reception, that household would not be eligible for assistance.

OPTION 2

Switch off the analog system and opt into the Satellite Subsidy Scheme and the Australian Government-funded digital Viewer Access Satellite Television (VAST) service

Under the Satellite Subsidy Scheme eligible households will receive an installation, subsidised by the Government, of equipment that enables them to receive the VAST service. The installation will include a satellite dish, a VAST set top box and associated cabling. VAST installation will be carried out by an experienced installer engaged by the service contractor.

Households registered for installation must make a pre-determined financial contribution on the day of installation. The remainder of the installation cost will be paid for by the Government. The household financial contribution is expected to be between \$200 and \$350. The contribution amount will be determined once the contract has been finalised by the Government.

Household Assistance Scheme

Some people currently serviced by the self-help transmission from the facility at Jam Creek Road will be eligible for assistance under the Government's Household Assistance Scheme (Scheme). <u>Note</u> that a person may not receive assistance under both the Household Assistance Scheme and the Satellite Subsidy Scheme.

The Household Assistance Scheme will, at no cost to eligible households, supply, install and demonstrate a HD set-top box specifically chosen to meet the needs of the elderly and people with a disability. If a person cannot access a digital terrestrial television signal, they will receive a VAST installation under the Scheme.

A person may be eligible for assistance under the Household Assistance Scheme if they live in a switchover area due to switch to digital, own a functioning television, do not already have access to digital television on any of the televisions they own, and they receive the maximum rate of one of the following payments:

- Age Pension
- Disability Support Pension
- Carer Payment
- Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) service pension
- DVA income support supplement payment

Eligible customers for the Scheme will receive a letter from Centrelink, in the second half of 2012, inviting them to participate in the Scheme.

The VAST Service

The VAST service features the same 16 digital free-to-air channels that are broadcast terrestrially in regional and remote Western Australia licence areas. These channels are:

Once the VAST service is installed there are no ongoing costs for households. The VAST service also allows for the introduction of new broadcasting technology as new digital television standards are implemented, without households having to do anything.

Fauna Surveys

We are slowly getting some more info on wildlife in the area. If you have sighted something of interest on your property, or driving somewhere, we would be interested in hearing from you. Just a phone conversation will be all I need from you. While the funding program is focussing on brush wallaby's, if you have anything from phascogale and bandicoots, to possums of any variety, I would like to hear from you. We aim to use this info to target our conservation programs more effectively. If we can learn where larger fauna populations are, we can try to protect this area as a priority, and try to create bush linkages for them to increase their gene pool.

Golden Wattle Fact Sheet

You should sometime soon receive a fact sheet in the mail regarding golden wattle. In conversations I have had with some community members, some people are unclear which wattle is the invasive golden wattle. This fact sheet is an identification tool, along with methods of eradication if you find any on your property. I can't stress enough the importance of eradicating this species before it becomes a problem. You can drive along the railway line from Tenterden to get an idea of how bad the infestation gets if left unchecked. Please keep an eye out for the fact sheet and spare a bit of time to remove it if you find any on your land.

OPTIONS FOR DEALING WITH NON-WETTING SOILS IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Farmers looking for options to tackle non-wetting soils in their cropping programs heard from leading researchers in the field at Cranbrook this week. The latest research from trials at Geraldton and Ravensthorpe with the Department of Agriculture and Food WA and CSIRO were discussed and the relevance of the most recent findings for farmers in the great southern. Soil


pits on gravel hill and duplex sand over clay sites were dug at Ben Sprigg's property to see where and how far dyed water would infiltrate. The infiltration of water through the previous year's seeding row was very obvious, especially on the sand.



Dr Margaret Roper, CSIRO soil microbiology scientist, reviewed her research on the roles of microbial activity and root pathways from previous year's crops to aid infiltration, highlighting the success of some trials with seeding back into the previous year's row. Stephen Davies, the lead water repellent soil researcher from DAFWA Geraldton, discussed some of the tactics successfully employed on farms and in trials in the northern agricultural region. The use of winged knife points to increase soil throw and the banding and blanket application of wetting agents have all had some success. 'Adding wings to seeding points or boots can reduce the flow of water repellent soil into a slot with the seed and fertiliser which can make the furrow highly repellent and difficult to wet', Stephen said. 'Other changes to improve furrow sowing may include sowing speed, row spacing, rake angle or press wheel shape and pressure'.

Claying, spading and mouldboard ploughing were also reviewed as long term strategies on problem sites. According to the research, all of these strategies are successful though expensive, but there are a number of critical factors such as proximity of clay, quality of clay and adequate incorporation.
