HIDDEN TREASURES OF THE GREAT SOUTHERN -BLOOM FESTIVAL - BROOMEHILL COMMUNITY PLANTING DAY

....and what a day it was! On Saturday October 13 around 50 members of the community (including an enthusiastic group of kids) turned out to work with Aaron East to plant the garden between the Broomehill Hall and the Broomehill Hotel. Around 5 hours, 1100 plants, 200 square metres of turf, and a mountain of garden soil later, the job was complete, leaving Aaron to supervise a small group to install the reticulation. The results were spectacular, and a credit to all who participated. Thank you one and all. Photos are included in this issue of BT Times.

To capture the project Aaron installed a time lapse camera in the vicinity of the site. This camera captured an image of the project every 20 seconds, and when compiled, will replay at 20 images per second. Those people who registered on the day with their email address will receive a copy of the file directly from Aaron, and we hope to be able to post it on the Shire's website for the community to view. The garden project was funded by Royalties for Regions - Country Local Government Fund.

Following the efforts of the planting, many went home to rest and relax (or revive...!), to return that evening for the second part of the event - the community BBQ and movie night. Unfortunately the windy conditions saw the movie shift into the Hall; however this did not dampen the enthusiasm of those attending. Bean bags, camp chairs and sleeping bags were the order of the evening, with everyone enjoying the movie.

This event was a great example of members of the Broomehill community coming together for a single purpose, and we look forward to more opportunities for events such as these to be held.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2012** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2013** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is **prohibited**. For further information contact the Shire Office or your nearest Fire Control Officer.

COUNCIL WORKS

Construction works are continuing on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, with formation works underway for the widening and resealing of a 4.0km stretch. The maintenance graders are currently working in the mid-eastern section of the Shire, heading towards the southern end. If the graders have not yet been along your road, we ask for your patience. Drivers are asked to slow down and take care when passing through road works.

BROOMEHILL ARCHIVE REPOSITORY

The Broomehill Archive Repository project is progressing, with the tender for construction works advertised in October. Works at the Broomehill Shire Office will commence once the tender process is completed. This will involve the refurbishing of the office space to allow for records storage. The reception and library areas will be relocated within the building to provide better access for the public, while also making the best use of the available space.

Prior to the start of construction works, all services at the Broomehill Office, and Siegrid, will relocate to the Broomehill Hall for a six month period. This will mean the Hall will be unavailable for hire until the works are completed. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

We will continue to provide updates to the community as the project progresses.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

As we move into the harvest period, residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the whole Shire is **98251042**. The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. If you would like to register to receive notification of harvest bans by SMS, (or if you are currently registered but your mobile number has changed), please contact Pam at the Shire office for details to be updated.

CAT ACT 2011

Did you know....... That the Cat Act 2011 is being implemented, with Phase 1 effective from 1 November 2012. Phase 1 deals mainly with the regulations of the Act provides for Local Governments to establish the procedures required to administer the Act. Phase 2, which will impact on all cat owners, becomes effective from 1 November 2013. From this date, all cats will be required to be registered with the shire in the same manner as dogs are currently, and microchipped.

Mt Barker Veterinary Clinic has kindly offered to conduct a cat microchipping clinic in Tambellup, at a date to be determined. They have advised the cost for this will be \$64 per cat.

At this stage we are looking to determine whether there is sufficient interest in conducting the clinic. If you would like to take advantage of this opportunity please contact Danice at the Shire (ph 98253555) by Friday 16 November.

Mt Barker Veterinary Clinic also offers a cat sterilisation/microchipping package. This includes health check, sterilisation and microchipping, with the cost of microchipping discounted to \$30. This package will not be available at the Tambellup clinic. Please phone Mt Barker Vet Clinic on 98511177 for more information.

DOG OWNERS – REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations were due for renewal at <u>31st</u> <u>October</u> each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

Notifications have been sent to owners of dogs with registration expiring in 2012. Payment for re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. Please contact Siegrid at the Shire for more information.

Expression of Interest - Removal of Storm Damage Debris


The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is seeking formal expressions of interest from contractors to assist with the cleanup of its road verges from the storm damage in June 2012 which has been declared a natural disaster under the *Western Australia Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements* (WANDRRA).

The Shire is seeking removal and restoration of local road reserve verges from fallen trees and limbs. This process will involve cutting material to appropriate length, extraction from the road verge, carting to nominated holding sites, and disposal by burning wind rows at the appropriate time. PARVOVIRUS SEASON-PROTECT YOUR DOG!!

<u>Kojonup Veterinary Hospital</u> is coming to Tambellup for a <u>vaccination clinic</u> so you can protect you beloved pooch from this highly contagious virus.

What is it? Parvovirus attacks the lining of gastrointestinal tract of the dog causing them to become very lethargic. Vomiting and bloody diarrhoea are indications of this virus, along with it being very painful for them.

How is it transmitted? Parvovirus is highly contagious and is easily picked up by oral or nasal transmission. This can occur in a large number of ways: from direct contact with bloody diarrhoea from an infected dog to being walked into your home on your shoes. So even if your dog doesn't leave your home you can bring it home!! Parvovirus is extremely resistant and can last in the environment for up to 3 years with normal household cleaners unable to kill the virus

<u>How is it treated?</u> This deadly virus can kill your loved family pet in a matter of days. There is no 'cure', just supportive care, which includes keeping them hydrated, keeping electrolytes balanced, stopping vomiting, keeping pain under control and being quarantined away from other dogs. This can be very costly at \$1500 to \$3000; however this is preventable with vaccination.

CAT MICROCHIPPING CLINIC



DIGITAL TELEVISION SWITCHOVER

On 25 June 2013, analog free-to-air TV signals will be switched off in Country WA and replaced with digital signals. If you are not digital ready by this time or choose not to do anything, you will no longer have the access to receive free-to-air television.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR DIGITAL TELEVISION

- Convert your existing analog TV using a digital set top box or digital TV recorder (converts digital signals back to analog)
- Upgrade to a TV with a built in digital tuner

Most antennas should work after the digital switchover, if you receive good analog signal, you will most likely receive good digital signal, however some old antennas may need to be replaced or new cable connections may need to be installed.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup proposes to make the following Local Law:

Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Materials Local Law

Purpose: To provide for the clearing of refuse, rubbish or disused material from land within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup.

To control the keeping and storage of refuse, rubbish and disused materials on Effect: land throughout the Shire, and require the removal of such to reduce hazards and any adverse affects on health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants of the district.



Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Shearers and Shearing - TN's shearing teams at Goblup were –

<u>1879</u> – George Norrish, Alf Nelson, James and Thomas Knapp, James Kelly, George Whitton, Thomas smart, John King.

1880 – John and Henry Young, James and Thomas Knapp, Edwin Palmer, Jack king, George Whitton, James Collins, Ben Robins, Elijah ford, John Griffen, Donovan (Humphrey or Edward), James Deverall, Alex Armstrong.

1881 – Thomas and James Knapp, John, Harry and Andrew Young, John Croker, George Whitton, Fred Baker, Thomas Quinn, John Griffen, Ben Robins. *They shore 8 480 sheep in 18 days*.

1882 - John and Andrew Young, John Arber, Rudolph Krakouer, Enoch Taylor, Thomas Ford, George Whitton, John Griffen, Paddy Armstrong, A. McDougall and Johnny. Fred Williams, Jack and James Ford started 3 days after the others. *They shore 9 347 sheep in 24 days*.

1883 – Fred Williams, Jack Wagstaff, Nat Nelson, James Ford, Nella, Donovan, Griffen, Whitton, William Kelly, John Herbert and Johnny. A young man Named Brown took Nat Nelson's place but went down with the measles 3 days later. Fred Williams accompanied TN to Garrity's with the trap to get the cask of rum for the shearing. *They shore 9 884 sheep.* Shearers had their farewell supper on the 30th October. Singing and dancing until 12 o'clock but well behaved

1886 – Ben Robins, John Griffen, Johnny, Dan Rooney, Chas Ward, Jack Loand, George Norrish jnr, 3 natives. Johnny left to go horse hunting with Finefellow and Patrick Carmody took his place.

1888 – Joe Scott, Ed Carr, Ed Offer, Jack and James Ford, J Betteridge, Martin Carrotts, Antony Sylva, George Norrish in

1890 – Shearers included Sam Baggs, and J White. On 8th November George Norrish Jnr and his cousin John Norrish went to Pootenup by train to shear Henderson's (Anderson's?) flock.

1891 – J Betteridge, Thomas Betteridge, Thomas Buirchell, P Heady, Charlie Baggs, R & F Knapp.

1892 – James Annice, Joe Mooney, Perry, George Buirchell, Frank Knapp, Sam Baggs, Cockram, Ben Gaylor, TN's sons Richard and George.

<u>1893</u> – Two Fitzpatrick brothers, George Norrish, William Langton, R Knapp and several Chinese.

<u>1895</u> – Shearers included Charlie Baggs, James Fitzpatrick, George Norrish and J Tunney.

Sheep Sales - At Chipper's sale on 1st July 1880, Cornwall bought most of the sheep at 10/- per head, ewes and lambs 10/9; J Hassell 300 ewes in lamb at 9/6; W Grover 201 rubbishy lambs at 3/6d. In December 1888 Mrs Rogers bought from TN culls at 8/- and 3 for killing at 7/-. In December 1892 Climie paid TN 12/6 for wethers. In January 1893, Desterlagua, the butcher at Albany, agreed to take animals fit for butchering at 12/6 and the following week TN sent a truck load of 84 to Albany to Mr Wise. (Was he Desterlaqua's manager or slaughterman?). TN made regular consignments to Wise/Wiese in February, March and April, usually 80 to 84 animals in each truckload. On 14th April 1893 TN sold some of his own sheep at Majidup to Goblup Estate - 400 ewes at 10/- and 100 tags at 8/-. In May Delaney bought four Goblup sheep at 12/- each. In April 1895 R.E Beeck bought Goblup sheep at 13/- per head but TN thought that 12/6 would have been a fairer price.

Australian shearer cleans up on Saturday, back on the job today

It will be business as usual today for triple New Zealand Merino Shearing champion Damien Boyle, who will be back in the shed, but this time no trophies are at stake.

The Western Australian farmer won his third successive open title on Saturday night, at the 51st fine wool shearing championship, staged over two days, in Alexandra.

Boyle and his family have been long-time supporters of the event, competing for the past 15 years.

"It's really a big thrill to win this. It's the only merino shearing championship in the country and that's what I do. I'm not a crossbred shearer at all."

Boyle (35) lined up against five New Zealanders in the final and finished almost seven points clear of his next rival, Chris Vickers, of Palmerston.

"Everything just came right, eh.

"It felt comfortable and I just tried to be clean and quick."

Within six hours of arriving home, stepping off a plane at midnight, he planned to be back in the shearing shed. The family farms 4046ha at Broomehill and he promised his brother Brendan, who was also competing in Alexandra at the weekend, he would help him to shear some sheep today.

Vickers, the top New Zealand finalist, earned a place in the New Zealand shearing team for a transtasman test this month in Warrnambool, Victoria. He joins shearers Angus Moore, of Ward, and John Kirkpatrick, of Napier, and wool handlers Sheree Alabaster, of Taihape, and Rocky Hape-Taite, of Dannevirke.

Tony Coster, of Rakaia, was third in the open final on Saturday, Mana Te Whata, of Mossburn, fourth, Charlie O'Neill, of Alexandra, fifth, and Nathan Stratford, of Invercargill, sixth.

The open woolhandling final pitted experienced wool handlers Joel Henare, of Gisborne, and Tina Rimene, of Hawarden, against two relative newcomers, Cushla Abraham and Sharnie Graham, both of Masterton.

Henare was elated to win the title, saying it was "a dream come true".

He first competed in the fine wool championships in the junior wool-handling section as a 12-year-old, he said.

Rimene had been his mentor.

Henare also won the Gina Nathan Memorial Trophy for best quality points.

The winner of the teams section was the Lyon Wannabees, with the Broomehill Hustlers second.

The New Zealand Merino team (Colin O'Neill, Tony Coster and Nathan Stratford) beat the Perth team (Damien and Brendan Boyle, and Todd Wegner) in the transtasman contest.

The senior shearing title went to Brett Roberts, of Mataura.

Kodi Hawkins, of Martinborough, won the senior wool handling title and Raylene Johnson, of Milton, won the junior wool handling section.

WOULD UP TO \$200 PER CHILD HELP PAY FOR THEIR SPORTING CLUB FEES?

KidSport will assist <u>eligible</u> families to receive up to \$200 annually for each of their children aged between 5 – 18 years, to subsidise fees to join a sport and recreation club.

Eligible families include those with health care cards or pension concession cards, or those referred by other community groups such as schools, juvenile justice teams, government agencies and health practitioners. These groups are known as referral agents.

The process for accessing KidSport is simple!

Kids and parents/guardians can complete the application by picking one up from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup office or their website. The parent/guardian fills in the application and takes it to be validated at the <u>local government they reside in</u>. A photocopy of the health care card or pension concession card must be attached.

Alternatively, referral agents may assist in filling out the application, complete their section on the back and give it to the parent/guardian to sign. The parent/guardian will take the voucher to the sport or recreation club for processing when registering their children. The club will then invoice the Shire. It's that easy! - To find out who the Referral Agents are in your community please contact the Shire.
