The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 15 September 2011 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

What's going on in our towns.....

A number of funded projects are getting underway in the next couple of months. The extension of the skate park in Broomehill will be happening early in September. This will include the installation of some skate equipment and the extension of the concrete area. The park will be unavailable for use during this period, but the end result will be a much improved facility with more to offer park users.

The picnic area at the Gordon River weir will also be undergoing a facelift. The existing gazebos will be removed and the site cleaned up, and a new steel framed gazebo with picnic tables and seats will be installed. It's great to see the number of visitors to the community who stop here, and the new facilities will make it a more pleasant place to visit.

Along the same lines, funding has been approved to install a gazebo, tables and seats and landscaping on Norrish St, Tambellup, in the area of the disabled toilets. The toilets are well used by people passing through the community, and the provision of facilities here may encourage them to stop for a little longer and utilise local businesses. We also plan to display the old shire grader under cover in the same area, to complement the Heritage Trail 'Town Loop' which passes nearby.

Council has endorsed the 'Broomehill Village Heritage Precinct Draft Concept Plan', which will provide a blueprint for the upgrade of the town centre and to highlight the history of the district. The plan also provides for the construction of new public toilets adjacent to Holland Park, which will be funded by the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund. Now a site has been chosen, works will commence on the design and construction of the facilities.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2011** and continues until **15 APRIL 2012** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION UPDATE

We have just received notification of the success of one of our funding applications. The Shire has been granted \$145,000 from the Royalties for Regions Regional Grants Scheme, through the Great Southern Development Commission. Although this is less than the amount we applied for, it is fantastic news, and we now wait to hear the outcome of the final two submissions.

As a matter of interest, this round of the Regional Grants Scheme saw \$957,000 awarded to projects in the Great Southern, having a total value in excess of \$5,000,000!

In recent months facilities in the Broomehill and Tambellup communities have been subjected to many mindless acts of vandalism.

This has included the smashing of glass at the Tambellup Oval, graffiti on both the Broomehill and Tambellup skate parks, trashing of the toilets at Diprose Park, the wrecking of rubbish bins at the Tambellup Skate Park, and the continuing saga of plants being stolen from the Broomehill Rest Stop.

There is a significant cost attached to this behaviour, and unfortunately the cost is not borne by the perpetrators, but the wider community through Shire rates, fees and charges. This is not acceptable.

Local police are aware of these incidents, and their enquiries are continuing. But - we as a community need to nip this behaviour in the bud. The problem police face is that often the incidents are not reported until much later, if at all.

What we ask of the community is to be vigilant. If you see any incidents of vandalism or anti social behaviour occurring please ring **131 444**: this will enable police to act promptly on any reports received.

The facilities in our towns have been provided through the efforts of previous and present generations, for the use and enjoyment by all community members. It is up to those living here now to ensure the small minded minority who insist on anti social behaviours do not have it all their own way. Again, if you see any incidents of vandalism or anti social behaviour occurring please ring **131 444**.

To those children responsible for the recent damage to the Tambellup skate park: the only reason the Shire invested in this project was because a group of your school mates asked the Shire to consider it. It has been put there for the youth of Tambellup, and all that is asked is that it is treated with respect. Police have been notified of your names and will be investigating.

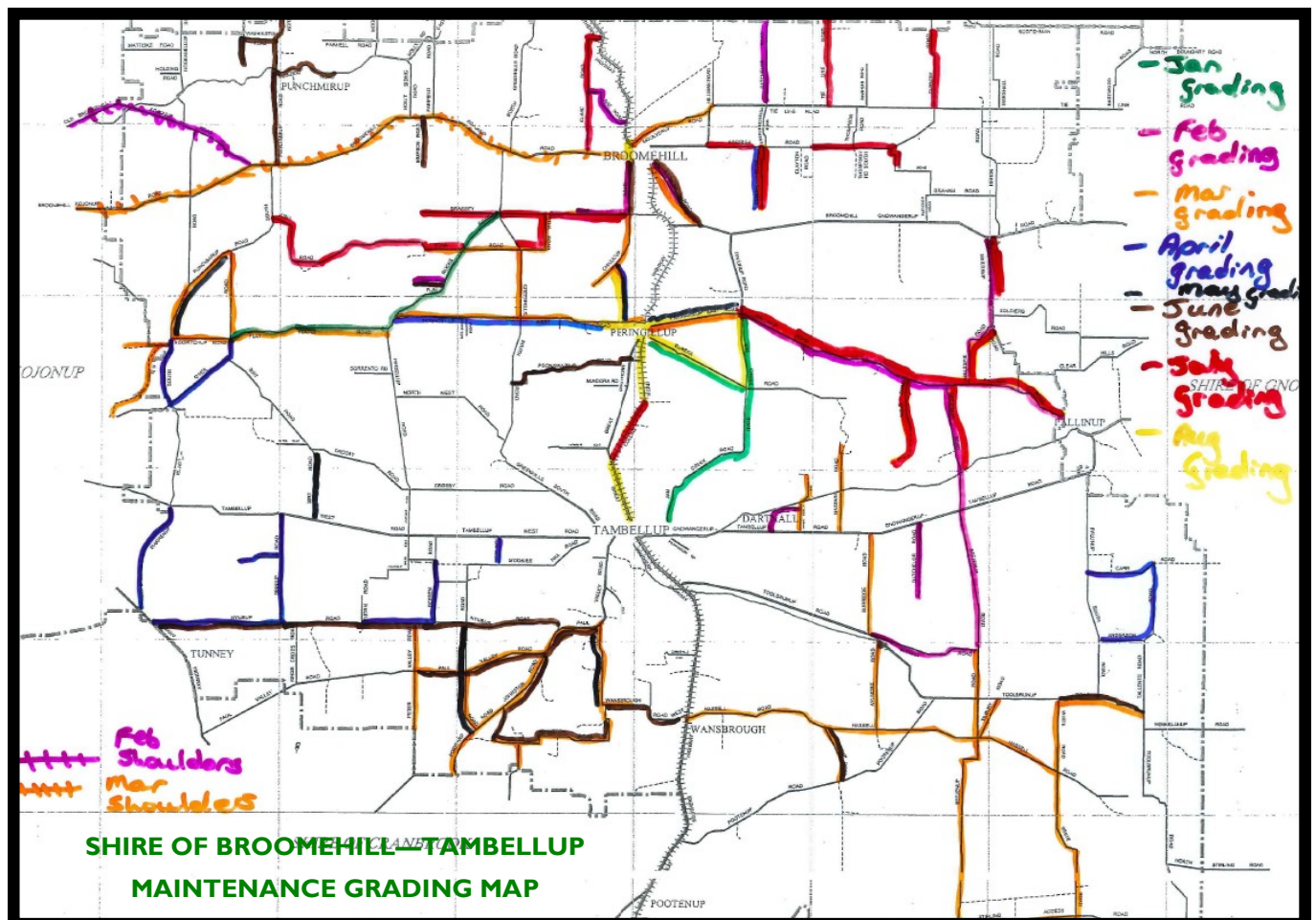

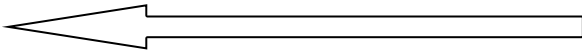
TAMBELLUP HOCKEY CLUB MINKEY

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Postal Services – WHG was a prolific letter writer. On one occasion at Eticup he sat up all night doing just that. He took his mail over to Balgarup to catch the mail coach there and pick up any letters, sometimes staying for a day or two waiting for the coach to arrive. He once sent Bobbinet all the way to Albany to post (possibly deliver) a letter. Later, and certainly by 1876, a mail delivery service operated between Kojonup and Eticup and beyond – possibly Martinup.

TN reports the mail carrier coming with mail regularly every fortnight and sometimes refers to his passing back the next day so the route did not extend very far to the east. TN was then official Postmaster at Eticup from July 1876 until handing over to Patrick Carmody in 1878 when Patrick moved into TN's house near Ettakup Pool. When Carmody moved onto his own block in May 1884, the Post Office went with him. J.J. Garrity became the Postmaster in 1888, probably operating from the store rather than the Inn. Pay for Eticup Postmasters was £10 per year. All through 1879 and 1880, ex-Sgt Loton (Enrolled Pensioner Guard) brought the mail. In January 1881, Nat Newstead of Kojonup won the contract and in March 1883 he told TN that he was required to go as far as Chester's. This would have been ex-PC Chester's – well beyond Martinup. On 21st December 1883, Nat took TN's mail to him at Sunnyside (the first since TN had left Goblu) and said that John Dearle had the contract from 1884. On 7th January 1884, Sam Baggs was at Sunnyside with the mail from Albany, having come by Salt River and two days later he was back from Albany via Camballup. John Dearle may have been the contractor but there is little evidence of his making the trip himself. Sam Baggs is mentioned most and James Annice, Rude Krakouer, Elworthy Treasure and John Delaney made the run at various times. On 5th August 1884, Ruth Nelson brought letters to Sunnyside to go with the mail, so it is likely that neighbours walked to the nearest place where they knew mail would be picked up or left. On 28th August 1884, Sam Baggs told TN that he was to go only as far as Chester's and would be met there, but this may have been for the one trip. TN's 1885 diary is not available. In 1886 Sam Baggs had the contract but in December told TN that he was giving up the mail run to John Dearle. Sam had received £190 for the Kojonup to Albany return route: John Dearle would get £139. Chubb Krakouer and "young" Krakouer (?David) are mentioned doing the run for Sam and also someone whom TN called "young Gutteridge". This may have been one of the Bettridges as TN often had trouble with that name.

There is no information from 1887 and in 1888 TN had much more interesting things to write about than the receipt or dispatch of his mail. There was a lot of to-ing and fro-ing related to the approach of the head of the railway line, and the presence of the railway gangs in the vicinity. In July 1888, TN was invited to tender for the keep of four mail horses as the mail was to be carried by train from Albany to Eticup siding where it and any passengers would be transferred by coach to the head of the line at Doust's near Jugoninning, travelling via Kojonup and Beaufort River. George Norrish also kept horses at Oak Farm during this period.

Genevieve has completed the "Increasing Knowledge & Skills in Sustainable Farming in the Cranbrook, Frankland/Gordon area" project with South Coast. The project has met or exceeded all the milestones and outcomes that were expected and the final report is available for inspection. The Poorrarecup project is also nearing completion.

Gen has done a good job on both projects.

Funding for 0.4FTE has been confirmed by South Coast in relation to the Bush Corridors project we share with Green Skills. It is part of the Gondwana Link project linking the Stirlings to the S.W. forest. Gen will now be partly funded through this project and the remainder from CfoC.

A meeting was held recently to formally wind up the Frankland

/Gordon Management Group. This process is now in motion. All assets and funds of the Group will be transferred to Gillamii which reflects what has been happening in reality.

The sheep production group travelled to Graeme Bradshaw's & Rhonda's to view and discuss crop grazing. Very informative for the small group who attended and a tactic for sheep grazing that we will see more of in the future. Thanks Kelly for the organisation.

Local grazing project update

As a farming systems project is operating in our area, I thought I would share with you regularly, how the project is progressing through the season. Currently in its 7th year, the Grazing Systems Analysis (GSA) project is based at the Mt Barker Research Station and is measuring the effects on production, profitability and sustainability of a wool-meat sheep enterprise after establishing perennial pasture species. This is achieved through two closed system 'farmlets' - one farmlet contains annual pastures only and the second farmlet contains annual and perennial pasture species. All inputs and outputs of each farmlet are recorded (the closed system design). The following is an update of the project for July. For a more detailed update, to view other monthly updates for the GSA, look at results to date, read the blogs or even post your own questions, or request to receive regular project updates, go to www.grazingsystemsanalysiswa.com or contact Kelly.

GSA in July 2011

The May and June rainfall was close to the long-term average, and the 2011 season is currently tracking an 'average' year. The new DAFWA forecasting tool suggests July, August and September will have above average rainfall. Like many around the district, the GSA doesn't quite have as much feed as it would like for this time of year. The feed on offer (FOO) was about 500kg DM/ha on both farmlets in late June. Lambing has finished (June lambing on both farmlets). Lamb marking will occur in late July. Soil moisture probes on the GSA site have recorded a slight decrease in soil moisture across paddocks, meaning evaporation and plant water use has exceeded rainfall (even with the 62mm received since May). The soil profile to 2 metres has not yet wet-up to the same level as this time last year. The soil water content of the kikuyu paddock is still significantly drier than the annual pasture paddocks.

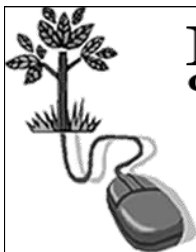

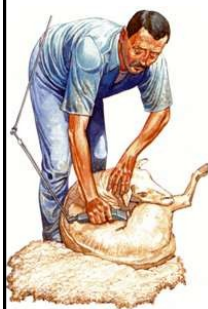

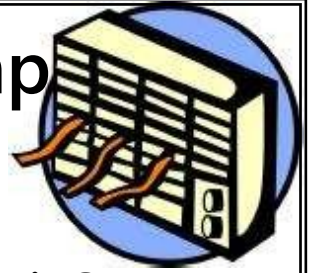
