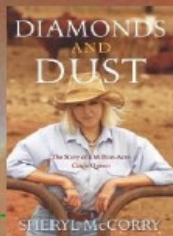

Thank you for 'Sophie's Fund' from The Aylmores



In the last year through the work and support of the generous and caring people in our community 'Sophie's Fund' was formed and has successfully raised an enormous amount of money which will be used to help our daughter Sophie and others suffering with the debilitating condition Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. There can be a variety of reasons why people suffer with this condition and at times the cause and treatment can be elusive and complex but as more research is done more sufferers are finding answers.

After a meeting with a delegation of the 'Sophie's Fund' committee and Sophie's Dr some ideas were put forward for the allocation of the funds. We would like to keep you informed on how the hard earned money will be utilized so you can see that it will be put to good use and will indeed 'hit the ground' where needed.

The funds will be used in a variety of ways. Firstly it will help with the cost of transporting some medication from overseas for Sophie. This medication has been used in a trial on several patients overseas but to date has not been available for anyone in Australia. So far with the trials that have been done they have been showing some promising results with other CFS sufferers and as Sophie fits the criteria we are hopeful that this will help her. It will be some time before this medication will be available in Australia so it has to be transported in dry ice and the transportation cost alone is quite considerable. Another area where some of the funds will be allocated is in setting up various tests which are as yet unavailable in Australia. This is called a 'Red' Lab. We are looking for these tests to be incorporated into an established laboratory in Perth so that the only cost involved will be purchasing of the equipment. At the moment a lot of testing is done overseas and many patients cannot afford to have them done so it will make these tests a lot more affordable for everyone. Australia wide. The other proposal was to help fund the Dr on a short study/research trip to the Belgium Research and Treatment Clinic run by Prof Kenny DeMelier. Dr Derham is mindful of the efforts involved from our community in raising so much money and as such is very keen to make every dollar go as far as it can. Because of this he will incorporate this week long study trip into another trip that he will be doing next year so that the Sophie's Fund need only pay for the land content component.

So as we continue to search for answers for our dear Sophie it means a great deal to us that we have such a supportive community. Special thanks to the committee and all of the helpers for this tremendous fundraising effort. To think that our wonderful community has fundraised over \$50,000 during such a poor season and a hard year for all is just so very humbling and much appreciated.

SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL—TAMBELLUP **TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENTLY LIVING** **SENIORS ACCOMMODATION**

The project continues to move ahead, with yet another substantial application being made for funding to assist, this time through the Regional Development Council Action Agenda, an off shoot of Royalties for Regions. The development of this application included an analysis of this type of accommodation already available in the region. It was interesting to note that although each of the communities of Kojonup, Cranbrook, Katanning, Gnowangerup and Mt Barker have addressed the need for senior accommodation in their own manner, each reports near 100% occupancy of existing facilities, with long waiting lists for future occupancy. So it seems we are not alone - regional people want the option to be able to stay in their local community into their senior years. The regional situation has provided valuable support to our submission and we are hopeful of positive outcomes to all three applications. We will continue to keep the community up to date with developments.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT POSTAL ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Friday 26 August 2011

Enrolling to Vote

Local Government Elections are to be held on Saturday 15 October 2011. You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote at the election if you reside in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property within the district.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral roll as at 5.00pm, Friday 26 August 2011. If you are not on the State Electoral roll or have changed your address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Non Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non resident owner or occupier of rateable property within the Shire and are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote, but must submit an *Enrolment Eligibility Claim Form* to the local government, as enrolment is not automatic.

A **non resident owner** who was on the last Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup local government roll continues to retain that status as long as the rateable property to which the enrolment relates is owned. An **occupier** does not have continuous enrolment and should contact staff at the Shire to confirm their enrolment status.

If you are not on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll and own or occupy rateable property within the Shire, you may still be eligible to vote. Please contact the Shire for details.

Enrolment Forms – Non Residents and Occupiers

Enrolment Eligibility Claim Forms can be obtained from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5.00pm Friday 26 August 2011.

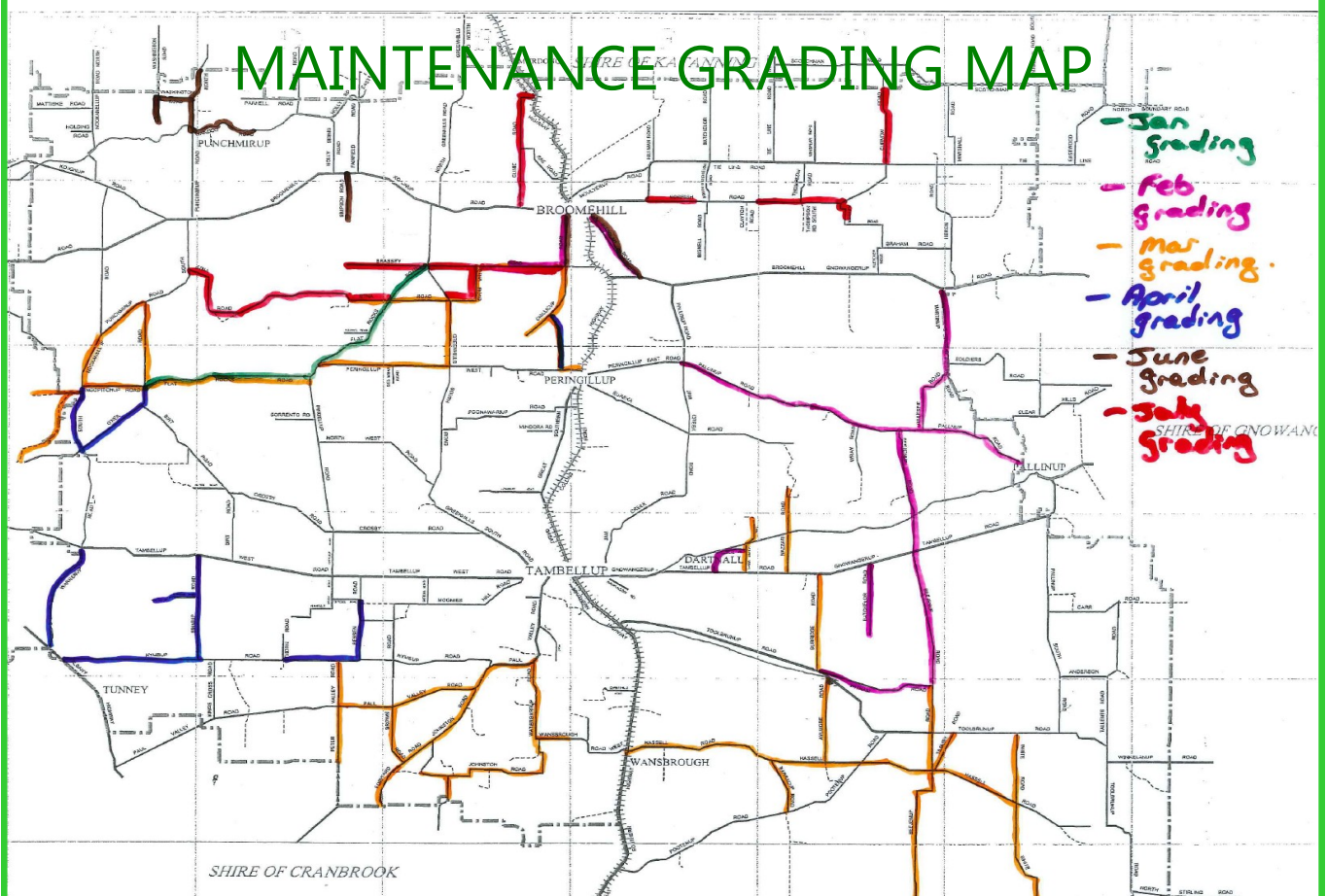

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Police – In his 1862-1865 diary, WHG makes frequent reference to Police calling at Eticup or Nanamillup, sometimes to see him but usually on their way on a particular mission: Quinlivan for Black Harry to go in about Bobby Bungar's case; O'Keefe looking for Callbung and later with a summons for Ned Ladbury; Sgt Furlong and others looking for William Graham who had shot Quartermaine; and Wheatley to get Bobbinet to help look for Graham. Other Police mentioned in this period were Philip McGuire, R. Williams and Preston.

Late in 1864, Police decided to open a station at Twonkwillingup (later called Katanning Police Pools) to be known as Eticup Police Station – despite the distance from Eticup! Terrence McKenna was the first Officer in charge and was required to build his own house. The second Officer was William Grover who resigned to take up land at Indinup. The next incumbent was Constable M Fahey but by his 1873 round of visits to settlers was from Kojonup and the Eticup Police Station was deserted. Police not only visited all settlers – farmers and sandalwooders – on a fairly regular basis but also took the census. TN's diaries from 1879 show that Police called at Gob lup or Sunnyside whenever in the area – even if only to water their horses. Reasons for calling included: John McGlade to enquire of Johnny about the murder of black man Jackie at Martinup; P.C. going to Van Zuilecom as young Wilkes had hanged himself; Robert Forsythe (who appears to have been an officer of the Court) and P.C. Mansfield going to Martinup to get Hiscoc's fine for grog selling; P.C. Cole at the Inquest on the drowning of Josiah Norrish's son Frederick; Sgt Paton investigating Frederick Norrish's drowning; Cpl Heaton and P.C. Cole looking for Jim the Pigman's remains; P.C. House looking for Charley for shooting the native Bolinger. Other Police mentioned between 1879 and 1886 were Hogan, Cleary, Kennear, Boucher, Duffield, Bovell, Gee and Squires. Michael Fahey was with Trooper Armstrong when Armstrong was killed by Bobbinet in 1875 at Teengerup Swamp.

A copy of extracts from the Kojonup Police Occurrence Book January 1887 – October 1889 is held in the Police File in the Museum Office. These notes include names of travellers to and from Eticup; check on John Green (Ticket of Leave); reference to Rudolph Krakouer being hunted and abused by navvies; check on George McLeod possibly selling grog to navvies; theft of English silver lever hunting watch from Robert Carmody; inquest of Ned Brown; death of James Ball at Mrs Rogers' house; investigation into Thomas Churchill's accident; James Carrott's delirium tremens; assault of Pilling by William Skelly; trespass of WA Land Company land by sandalwooders including R Krakouer and two Norrishes from Tambellarup. Also listed are the visits by Police to check the settlers, the Public House at Eticup, the ballast pits, and the various railway camps. Of particular interest are the arrangements for the mail to be carried by Royal Mail from rail head at Eticup to rail head at Doust's via Kojonup and Beaufort River; clearing of the Kojonup to Eticup road; organizing stabling and foraging for horses at Eticup and also board for Constable. Police mentioned during this period were Cpl Woods, Lance Corporal Wall, PC's Evans, Kelly, Chipper (driver of mail coach complete with bugle) and Bonner (guard).

Even before Rudolph Krakouer's complaint about the navvies being a terror to the people, Police had been instructed to visit Eticup as often as possible. On 6th June 1888, P.C. Evans asked TN if he would take him whenever he visited Eticup. He returned two week later and stayed overnight, went to church with the family the next day and stayed overnight again. In July TN and Patrick Garrity both tendered for the stabling and foraging of four mail horses; TN won the contract 5/- per diem per horse. Later in July, Cpl Woods was instructed to obtain quarters for a single Constable at Eticup – perhaps at Norrish's; TN agreed to do so at 18/- per week. On 2nd August P.C's Chipper and Bonner arrived with the four horses – Sprite, Napier, Radical and Sambow. On the 6th August, Bonner (the Guard) went to the line with Chipper at 11 am to meet the train and pick up the mail for the first time but it did not arrive until 6pm. Cpl Woods had ridden from Kojonup with lamps for the coach and Chipper's bugle and intercepted them at Garrity's. They got to Kojonup at 12.30am. On 5th September, Cpl woods came to Sunnyside looking for a mail bag lost between Doust's and Eticup. TN walked to the line but could not find it. There was a fair amount of drinking taking place, two instances recorded of delirium tremens, and several checks on sly-grog selling. P.C Kelly conducted the Census on 13th January 1889 and was back on 29th January for duty at the Polling Place for the Albany elections; three people voted.

Police cont..

It was not long before the residents of the new township of Broome Hill and the district started urging for a permanent Police presence. The 1889 plan of Broome Hill provided for lots in Law Lane on the eastern side of the line for Police Station and Law Courts but no advance had been made by 1892 and in April the Commissioner Of Police instructed that the enquiry be made to secure the rental of a suitable property for use as a Police Station pending the erection of one in the town. In May 1892, arrangements were made to rent on it's completion the four-roomed dwelling with detached kitchen being erected in Janitor St by R.S. Climie for James Annice. Constable Meagher moved in on 19th of that month.

It appears James Annice had not finalized his purchase of the Janitor Street land when negotiating with the Police Department as the Land Company's Title Deed shows that the blocks were transferred directly to Her Most Gracious Majesty, Queen Victoria.

On 29th August 1892, Constable Meagher went out to Gob lup to see if TN knew anything about a man named Sinclair. On 8th October 1895, P.C Whitehead took summonses out to Gob lup for the Chinese who had been fighting and, on 11th February 1907, P.C. Stevens took the Census. On 21st February, TN and C.J. Darcy had an interview with the Inspector of Police and local Inspector Holmes about a Police Court at Broome Hill. The next day TN had a further interview with F.H. Piesse and Inspector Holmes on the same subject. The Court House never eventuated but TN went to Katanning on several occasions to hear cases as Justice of the Peace.

By 1947, Constables were aghast at the condition of the quarters at the Police Station. A new house in the side lane was occupied in November 1950 and the new Station in Janitor Street became operational on 6th April 1951. The old building was purchased by the Anglican Church in 1952, modified, and consecrated as a church in 1953. The building was Heritage Listed in 1997.

Permanent Police presence in Broomehill was terminated in 2001 and a new residence was built in Janitor Street (by the Shire Council) for occupation by a member of the Katanning Staff.

2011-2012 BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2011-2012 Budget was adopted by Council at the Ordinary Council meeting in July. The 2011/2012 budget includes an increase in Rural UV rates of 6% and townsite GRV rates of 10%, with minimum rates increasing to \$330.00 per assessment. Highlights of the budget include:

ROADS PROJECTS:

The 2011/2012 budget includes \$1,109,300 of expenditure on capital road works. Council will be assisted in meeting the costs of the projects with funds from Regional Road Group, Roads to Recovery and Black Spot Funding. Projects include:

- Broomehill Kojonup Road – (*widen and seal to 7.00m slk 18.80 to 23.30*)
- Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road – (*widen and seal to 7.00m – slk 7.90 to 9.90*)
- Greenhills Road – (*widen & resheet slk 0.00 to 8.00*)
- Toolbrunup Road – (*gravel resheeting – slk 23.98 to 25.98*)
- Tieline and Norrish Roads – (*realign intersection*)
- Paul Valley/Peter Valley intersection – (*reseal – slk 17.25 to 17.67 & 2.60 to 2.99*)
- Greenhills South Road – (*widen and resheet slk 0.00 to 4.35*)
- Flat Rocks Road – (*reseal – slk 8.74 to 11.74*)
- Pootenup Road – (*reseal – slk 8.50 to 10.00*)

ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS

The 2009-2010 Country Local Government Fund allocations were deferred by the State Government and programmed for distribution in the 2010-2011 financial year. The Royalties for Regions program is now managed by the Department of Regional Development and Lands (RDL).

Council will receive \$426,470 which is almost 65% of the initial allocation. The budget identifies the following projects that will be undertaken with the assistance of Royalties for Regions funding.

Country Local Government Fund – 35% Regional component

The 2010-2011 financial year saw 35% of the 2009-2010 CLGF allocation administered via a regional pool. Again Council has been advised that an amount of \$229,638 will be available for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to contribute towards the regional grouping of local governments that has been identified.

Broomehill-Tambellup has identified its regional grouping as the Southern Link VROC which includes the Shires of Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet. The funding is to be pooled for the group as a whole. The intention of the regional groupings component is to provide financial assistance to local governments to fund larger scale infrastructure projects which demonstrate wider community benefits across a region. Business cases have been developed and approved for the following projects that will be physically located within this Shire and which will impact on the 2011-2012 budget:

- Records Management - Regional Archive Facility - \$250,000
- Waste Management - 2 transfer stations proposed, one in each town - \$230,000

OTHER PROJECTS

Integrated Planning

Funding of \$85,000 has been received to assist with the development of plans required with the introduction of Integrated Planning for Local Governments in WA. It is envisaged that this new planning process will provide the basis for improving the practice of strategic planning in local government and attain a greater level of community participation.

Well Aged Seniors Accommodation

Funding applications have been made to various government agencies to assist with the cost of this project however at this stage the outcome is unknown. The full cost has been included in the 2011-2012 budget in anticipation that works will commence through the year, to be offset by proposed funding received. Council has funds set aside in a Reserve which will be used as a contribution towards the project.

Broomehill Hall

\$22,000 has been allocated to complete the Broomehill Hall renovation project. This allocation will see the room behind the staged area renovated and heating installed. A transfer will be made from the Broomehill Village Hall Reserve.

CONT...**Upgrade to Works Depot at Tambellup**

\$50,000 has been set aside to undertake renovation of the washroom facilities and to erect a storage area for signage at the Tambellup Depot.

Council has also made provision in the budget for the following

- Replace side fencing at the Tambellup Infant Health building
 - Extension of the equipment at the Broomehill Skate Park
 - Installation of the pump station at the Jam Creek Road dam for the water supply to the Tambellup Oval
 - Contribution towards the application made by the Broomehill Recreation Complex Committee for a synthetic bowling green
 - Replacement of the reticulation at the Broomehill Caravan Park
- development of a new Town Planning Scheme (amalgamation)

PLANT REPLACEMENT

Council has made provision to upgrade/purchase the following equipment this year:

Replacement: Bomag Roller, Isuzu truck, 5 utilities,

New Equipment: Side tipping quad dog and dolly, tree grabs as an attachment to the Loader

Carbon Package Announcement

On 10 July 2011 the Prime Minister for Australia, the Hon Julia Gillard MP, announced the Australian Government's policy for a clean energy future for Australia. This policy will be implemented from 1 July 2012.

Many Regional Development Australia (RDA) committees have been deeply engaged in the issue of climate change, as a regional priority, for some time. Some RDAs have hosted climate change forums and meetings to help local leaders and communities understand the potential social and economic effects of carbon pricing and to identify potential opportunities in the region. This is important and strategic work for RDAs.

A price on carbon will result in a broad range of effects over a period of time, with different communities experiencing varying degrees of change. The Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government will continue work with RDA committees to support and assist regions through this transition to a low carbon economy.

The Department is currently working to develop the evidence base around the potential effects that a price on carbon will have across Australia. FARMING SEMINAR A SUCCESS

With over 200 people in attendance, and the majority being farmers, the Designing Resilient Farming Systems seminar and field day held last week was deemed a huge success.

Keynote speaker Allan Savory of the Savory Institute, spoke on holistic thinking as an imperative process in developing agricultural systems that generate profit and regenerate the landscape.

Savory, along with fellow speakers General Michael Jeffery, Professor Lynette Abbott and Tony Lovell, emphasised sound decision-making as the key addressing food security while achieving sustainable profits.

While the focus of the day was on building soil fertility by promoting biological processes, livestock were highlighted as an important tool in stimulating plant growth.

Savory's work in agricultural-based education around decision-making comes from an African background as both a wildlife researcher and military advisor.

The Savory Institute was awarded the 2010 Buckminster Fuller prize for the proposal with the most significant potential to solve humanity's most pressing problems, and holistic thinking was identified in the 2009 Manchester report as the second best idea for tackling climate change.

The events were hosted by the Bugs and Biology Grower group and through sponsorship by Regional Business Development Corporation, Rio Tinto, South West Catchments Council, Mingenew-Irwin Group, Wheatbelt NRM, Holistic Results and Southern DIRT.
