

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Parliamentary Elections - On 6th December 1890, TN went to Broome Hill to vote for a Member for the district. In April 1900 TN was approached to stand for the Legislative Council but declined.

Parrish, Rev Dr – Twice in June 1907, Dr Parrish held the service at Eticup and on 2nd September he and Mr Knight called at Sunnyside on their way to see Joseph Nelson who was very ill. On 23rd October Dr Parrish assisted by Mr Knight officiated at the wedding of Sara Norrish to Hector McDonald.

Parry, Bishop – On 29th November 1881 Bishop Parry and Rev Withers conducted the service at Goblup in the evening. On 20th January 1884, the Bishop conducted a service at Sunnyside and on 28th November 1890 the Rt Rev Parry, Bishop of Perth, held a service at "the school" and confirmed Hannah and Nora Norrish, two Van Zuilecom boys and Mr Tylor's daughter.

Parties, Dances, Concerts -

26 Nov 1879; Norrish's had a party at Goblup which was kept up to 3 o'clock in the morning. Visitor's were: George & Mrs Norrish, Mr Wray & Martha, Mr & Mrs Kilpatrick, Mrs Garrity, John, Mary and a little girl, James Annice, Frances and Anna, Mrs John Annice and child, Alf & Ruth Nelson.

14 April 1884; Ball at Nelson's after the Eticup v Kojonup cricket match. Mrs Garrity provided the supper and some stayed till daylight.

1 Jan 1886; Dance at Nelson's after New Year's Day Sports 1 Nov 1886; The Ruth Nelson/John Garrity wedding party tea at Kojonup. 20 sat down to supper and dancing kept up till near morning

5 Nov 1890; The men had a dance in the kitchen at Goblup (after shearing)

2 Jun 1892; Concert in Broome Hill

23 Sep 1892; Teacher Nora Norrish gave the school children a tea party. Mr Graham attended and presented prizes. 19 Oct 1892; Grand concert and ball at Haack's Alpha Hall after the second (?) Broome Hill Show.

3 Dec 1892; Norrish family, and all of the men including the Chinese went to a performance in Broome Hill.

3 Apr 1893; Ball in Haack's Alpha Hall after Sports Day. Norrish family stayed overnight at one of Climie's houses. 30 Sept 1893; Performance in Broome Hill

Oct 1894; Concert in Broome Hill. Over 150 people attended.

17 Oct 1894; Mr Twine held a ball. Show night?

26 Dec 1895; A school picnic was held ... evening at the Alpha Hall for the children.

1 Jul 1898; Ball held for the opening of the Broome Hill Hall (Mechanics Institute)

15 Jul 1898; Dance in Broome Hill

29 Jul 1898; Four Norrish's and three Van Zuilecom's to Broome Hill dance

27 Aug 1898; Norrish family to dance in Broome Hill 22 Oct 1898; Ball in Broome Hill

18 Nov 1898; All the Norrish's went to party in Broome Hill given by Mr & Mrs Keetley. Returned home at daylight next morning.

26 Dec 1898; Ball in Broome Hill

1 Jul 1907; Send-off for Mr Moseley, Bank Manager

7 Sep 1907; Social in Broome Hill for N Taylor, Land Agent, about to leave Broome Hill

20 Sep 1907; Norrish's except TN and Will went to Fancy Dress Ball in Broome Hill

1922; Children's Fancy Dress Ball





Autumn Garden Tips:

- (1) Give all your plants a good feed and they will be sure to reward you with healthy flowers, produce and foliage.
- (2) Because daytime temperatures are still remaining quite high ferns will still need to be watered but not saturated. Remember to give the fronds time to dry off before nightfall because wet fronds can promote fungal growth.
- (3) Sow succulent seeds and propagate cuttings. This is also a good time to repot cacti.
