

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 15 December 2011 commencing at **2.00pm** in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.



The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is pleased to partner with local police to bring the 'Eyes on the Street' program to Broomehill and Tambellup. The program enables council workers who may notice suspicious or criminal activity during the course of their normal working day to report this to police for follow up. All council staff are able to lodge reports, and this includes our plant operators working on roads throughout the shire. These reports are forwarded to our local Police Station for follow up.

The Shire and Tambellup Police also have a supply of 'Rural Watch' gate signs available to residents. Thanks to Postie Pete at the Tambellup Post Office these have been distributed to residents on the Tambellup mail runs. They are also available from both Shire offices, Tambellup Police, and on the counter at the Tambellup Post Office.

As reported in a previous edition of the BT Times, residents are encouraged to contact **131 444** if they notice any suspicious or criminal activity. Details from calls are forwarded through to local police for further investigation.

DIPROSE PARK

It is disappointing to note the ongoing vandalism occurring at Diprose Park. In recent weeks more plant have been damaged (beyond normal playground activity) and the swing seats stolen but, more seriously, the toilet bowls and basins have been filled with sand and mud smeared all over outside walls. This appears to be a direct result of children being allowed to play at the park unsupervised by adults. We are fortunate to live in a relatively 'safe' community where our children have the freedom to be out and about in the community utilising all the facilities available. Unfortunately, that freedom is being taken advantage of by parents not supervising their children.

The cost to repair damage caused in this manner is eventually worn by the entire community through increases in fees and charges across the board for all Council services. Are you, as a resident, happy to accept that????

<u>Parents</u> - you are urged to accompany your children to the Park - they will enjoy the time spent with you too!

<u>Children</u> - the facilities are there for everyone to use. Please respect them or they will be withdrawn and everyone will suffer. <u>Residents of Tambellup</u> - if you notice anti social behaviour in the Park, or anywhere in the community, please ring <u>131 444</u> and let the Police follow up.

If you think conditions may be unsafe for harvesting or any other outside hot work, please check with the Hotline service or your brigade captain.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. Please bear in mind the broadcasting of Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans is subject to programming constraints by the radio stations. While we are able get the information through to them, it may not be broadcast immediately.

The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. If you would like to register to receive advice of harvest bans by SMS, or if you are currently registered but your mobile number has changed, please contact Pam at the Shire office for details to be updated.

SENDING CARE PACKAGES TO AUSTRALIAN TROOPS IN AFGHANISTAN

At the 2011 CWA State Conference, the following information was brought to the attention of all members. If a branch wishes to send a "care package" to an Australian Soldier, male or female, it can be sent free of charge providing it complies with Australia Post guidelines. The parcel must:

Be 2kg or under

- Be the size of a BM Australia Post box (available for \$2) or smaller Not contain aerosols, batteries or other
- goods prohibited in the post • Be accompanied by a customs
- declaration
- Be posted by someone who has a photograph identity (drivers' licence)

Australia Post will send the parcels from anywhere in Australia to the following address in Sydney (and then onto Afghanistan).

> An Australian Soldier Op Slipper AFPO 13

Australian Defence Force SYDNEY NSW 2890

Parcels can be specifically sent to male or female personnel by addressing to An Australian Soldier – Female OR An Australian Soldier – Male.

Please do not put the sender's name or branch and Association Name either on or in the parcel. An unsigned message of best wishes would be acceptable. If sending a parcel for Christmas, it must be in the mail in October

NOTE: A spokesperson for the Australian Defence Force has informed CWA State Office that beanies cannot be worn under helmets but are allowed to be worn when the soldier is off duty. However, at present there is a huge supply of beanies. It is suggested that gloves, fingerless mittens or

neck scarves would help the soldiers battle the cold when off duty.





The team played 6 games in total winning 2, losing 3 and drawing 1. This tournament was the first international trip for many of the Australian hockey players.

While in India the Jillaroos were invited to the High Commission of Australia, to meet the High and Deputy High Commissioners of Australia. While there, they conducted a coaching clinic for less fortunate girls from the area of New Delhi, who wish to learn and develop their hockey skills. The Jillaroos enjoyed the experience of coaching these girls very much and learning about their way of life in India. Also while at the High Commission the team had a BBQ dinner with the High Commissioner and his staff along with the New Zealand team. This was a very enjoyable evening as the girls got to meet other players from the tournament off the hockey field.

India was a whole new experience for the team, in regards to security being paramount. With guards being with the team 24/7 and some being armed the girls were restricted to the hotel, unless going to the hockey or on some pre arranged city tours.

VOLUME 11 Caring for our Country Due to some reshuffling of funds, we now have a further 27ha of perennials available through Caring for Our Country for next season. If you would like to take advantage of this funding, get in quick. The availability of perennial subsidies is drying up as far as the government is concerned, so if you would like to give perennials a go, give us a call and we can help you get started. The Caring for our Country Soil Acidity Sampling Funding is still available, but your timeline for expressions of interest is running short. These expressions need to be in by the end of November. We could potentially extend the deadline a little due to the late start to harvest. If you would like to take advantage of this opportunity to get your subsoils tested for their pH levels, please contact me ASAP to ensure you get in on time. If you would like more information on what this funding entails, feel free to contact me any time. Wildlife Corridors We are still seeking those who are interested in gaining some fencing for existing remnant vegetation. We have a two year program running which will aim to fence 25km's per year. Along with this will be 20ha of revegetation that will target the deep sandy areas where Banksia type species grow. Due to the lengthy time propagating these species takes, there is an element of haste to allocating this revegetation funding. If you have a sandy site that would contribute to vegetation corridors, please contact us. The area where funding will be available is confined to the 'Forest to Stirlings Link' which can be seen below.



As part of this Wildlife Corridors funding, you should have received a fauna survey by now. If you wouldn't mind completing this survey where applicable and returning it to us at Gillamii, we would appreciate the information. There are no records of existing fauna populations in our area and it's up to us to develop this information to justify future funding projects. This survey will aid in us acquiring further funding programs to support you.

Productive Perennials for Marginal Zones Field Day

We conducted a field day on 3rd Nov which provided some insight into perennials that are suited to poorly productive lands such as deep gutless sands and waterlogging and salinity prone areas. The first stop of the day was to the Messina trial site on Peter Valley Rd. This is actually an annual, but has great potential for barley flat type country as this species is highly tolerant to both waterlogging and salinity. The plant is a legume, and tests are in their early days to determine it's potential in the grazing system, but we are going to remain involved in trials with UWA and DAFWA as this is a very exciting new prospect for turning low producing barley flats, into a productive grazing area. The second stop was highlighting the early results of our fertiliser trial site funded by FarmReady and Caring for our Country, which is illustrating the effects different rates of Nitrogen have on the growth rate of kikuyu. This trial will also determine the effects of N rates on soil acidity. There is a partner trial to this in Ongerup targeting tall wheat grass. Early results suggest that the differences between applying 50kg/ha and 100kg/ha are negligible, suggesting that any application over 50kg/ha does not have a pronounced effect on growth rate, bio-mass tests are still being conducted, and the second pasture cuts are scheduled to take place at the end of the month.

Messina showing promise in Cranbrook

Great southern farmers got a preview of the newest promising annual legume Messina, at a Gillamii Centre field walk last week. Department of Agriculture and Food Senior Research Scientist Phil Nichol and University of Western Australia researcher Natasha Teakle discussed the latest research results Messina (Melilotus siculus). Showing promise in saline and waterlogged conditions, 21 varieties of Messina native to the Mediterranean were identified by Australia pasture researchers for further testing. Researchers from Department of Agriculture and Food, the South Australian Research and Development Institute, the Future Farm Industries Cooperative Research Centre and the University of Western Australia are working together to identify the variety best suited to Australian agriculture. Locally coordinated by the Gillamii Centre, the field trials have been set up on a typical barley grass flat at Twynam Cunningham's property in Cranbrook, with a second site at Darkan. Though the 2010 establishment failed due to the poor season, this year's sowing was successful and has showed impressive volumes of growth. Comparison plots of Frontier balansa clover and Scimitar burr medic were also established with Messina being the stand out performer on the site. Gillamii Centre Chair and Cranbrook farmer, Ian Walsh was impressed with its performance. 'Messina has the potential to really fill a gap in our current farming systems by being an ideal component in pasture systems on the marginal saline areas, especially under tall wheat grass' he said. Both the Cranbrook and Darkan Trials have found three particular varieties of Messina to be the standout performers. These will be tested further and a management package developed with a view to commercial release around 2015. Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Railways (other than GSR)- On 10th April 1907 TN and Mrs Norrish went up to Katanning and rode on the train to Kojonup to attend the banquet in honour of the opening of the Katanning-Kojonup railway line. Mr & Mrs F Piesse, Mr Charles Piesse and a great many other people from Katanning were there. "The banquet which was got up by the people about Kojonup was very good".

Ralston, Miss – At Albany on 8th July 1884, TN went to the Convent to see Miss Ralston who was to be governess to the Norrish Children. He returned for her before daylight on 11 July and they got to the 1 Mile by daylight. They reached the 4 Mile by sunrise and had dinner at the 24 Mile, reaching Pirimbup before sundown and staying at William's for the night. On the 12th they had dinner at Pootenup, got to Tambellarup in the afternoon and stayed there. They left the next morning at 10 o'clock and reached Goblup after 1 o'clock. Miss Ralston had replaced Miss Hannah Williams, but by 1886 the children were attending Eticup School.

Rams – Apparently TN maintained a large flock of lambs – possibly paddocked near the homestead at Goblup. Some of the animals belonged to neighbours who collected them as requires; others were borrowed from TN. During 1880, rams were collected by or for James Annice, Richard, George and Josiah Norrish, William Hayward and John Flaherty. On 8th February that year, one of TN's imported rams was found amongst Patrick Carmody's killing sheep! On 28th November 1880, John Garrity asked TN to let him have some rams as those from A Moir were to poor and small. In 1881 Fine Fellow got Edward Treasure's rams, Billie Bimbert came for those of Elverd, Hales and Phillips of Kojonup and William Grover bought 13 rams from TN. Fewer entries from 1882 onwards suggest that farmer were maintaining their own rams.

Ranford, H.S. – Surveyor and Land Agent. A detailed list of land grants to pioneers in the Eticup area shows that H.S Ranford surveyed blocks for W H Graham, Patrick Garrity, Lady Campbell, Thomas Norrish, Patrick Carmody, Thomas Rogers and Phillip McGuire, starting in the early 1870s.

In February 1880, he called at Goblup one evening and again the next day going back to his camp at Cungerup(?). A few days later, TN saw Ranford's teams at Killibinnup. The following week TN met him on the road from the Gordon. In November 1881 Ranford was a member of the survey party camping at Goblup tank and accompanied John Forrest over to Martinup. On December 19th 1883 TN and Ranford went on board Governor Broome's steamer at Albany. Ranford had never been on a large steamer before. On 3rd February 1884 (again at Albany) TN saw H.S Ranford at church and arranged to go to the Court House the next day to look at charts and check on a 6 000 ac (2430 ha) area that TN was interested in and found it was not leased to J.S Spencer as thought. On 21st February 1886 TN received a letter from Ranford saving he was going to the Kimberley. On 5th December 1888 TN met him in the Fairfield paddock where he was staying with other surveyors. On 30th March 1897 Ranford read the service at the Eticup Church. He did so again on 1st May, 10th July and 2nd October 1898. On 2nd December 1898 TN, Keetley, and Ranford met at Broome Hill and settled on more land for the Showgrounds.

In 1906 Henry Ranford was appointed by the Lands Department to be guide and mentor to a small Italian delegation led by Leopoldo Zunnini whose purpose it was to look for land suitable for the Italian Government to take up for settlement by their countrymen. had been the Italian Consul in Perth from1902 – 1905. In their travels around the country, the party travelled by car as well as buggy and train, and in a subsequent book about the expedition, Leopoldo Zunnini commented that Mr Ranford was very nervous about travelling in a motor car.
