COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Our thanks and appreciation goes to our two retiring councillors, Murray Bowman and Beth Schlueter. Murray and Beth have contributed in many ways to the ongoing development of our community during their terms on Council, and their input will be missed.

TAMBELLUP HALL

A recent inspection of the Tambellup Hall has revealed a termite infestation to the foyer and main hall floors. As there is no crawl space under this part of the building, the carpets in the foyer and reception room have been lifted, and the floor in these rooms and the main floor have been drilled in a grid pattern to allow for treatment of the problem. The floor holes have since been plugged and will be stained and polished, and the carpet will be replaced.

As part of the inspection under the floor of the Lesser Hall, it was noted the ground was very damp, which has affected the flooring in the kitchen. To address this, the kitchen floor will be removed and replaced with an appropriate moisture resistant product, the linoleum will be replaced and methods to improve the under floor ventilation in the Lesser Hall and kitchen will be investigated.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2011** and continues until **15 APRIL 2012** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2011** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2012** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited.

MOSQUITOES

Mosquito numbers within our Shire are always an issue. Council baits pools of water and will undertake regular fogging of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health have advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. (The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.)

DOG OWNERS - REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations are due for renewal at <u>31st October</u> each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

Notification will be sent to owners of dogs with registration expiring in 2011. Payment for re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. Please contact Siegrid at the Shire for more information.

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENTLY LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION

A number of announcements have been made recently about some significant projects within our region receiving substantial amounts of Federal government funding, and unfortunately our submission to the Regional Development Australia Fund (RDAF) for our seniors' accommodation was not one of them. This application was for a substantial amount of the funding we require to get this project off the ground, and was a disappointing result. RDAF are opening another round of funding in November, and armed with up to date information regarding the position of our neighbouring councils and their seniors housing requirements, we will be tweaking and resubmitting our application.

We still have one application outstanding, to another Royalties for Regions program, and wait to hear the outcome.

Lions need 'your eyes'

The Lions Save-Sight Foundation Screening Team will be visiting **Tambellup** on **Show Day October 15th**. The Foundation will provide a free public eye screening in collaboration with the Lions Club of Tambellup.

Screening for blindness and other major eye disease is a major part of Lions work for sight and through the Lions Save-Sight Foundation screening has come a long way since the early days, when the Foundation worked out of a small caravan operated by a very dedicated, small group of Lions.

Today the Foundation has a well trained and experienced screening team who visit various areas throughout WA to look for evidence of Glaucoma, Amblyopia and Diabetic Retinopathy, assisted by professional medical staff from the Lions Eye Institute, using valuable cameras and diagnostic equipment provided by the Lions Save-Sight Foundation.

Everyone should have their eyes screened, even if they don't wear glasses and haven't noted any symptoms, as many serious eye conditions are not obvious during early stages. However, the Foundation do not test your eyes to see if you need glasses, your local optician will perform that need.

The role of the Lions Save-Sight Foundation is to locate, identify and refer on those people who may need help or further investigation. The earlier that problems are identified the better the chance to treat and minimize the effects of the disease. Anybody can make an appointment to be seen at the Lions Eye Institute or by the ophthalmologist of their choice. The Lions Screening Team normally refers people to their general practitioner first, to ensure that they are fully covered by their medical benefit entitlements.

In the past months the Lions Save-Sight Foundation has conducted screenings in many country and remote locations from as far away as Broome down to Manjimup with several more country screenings to come.

Every October the Lions hold a highly successful screening at the annual "Seniors Have a Go Day" at Burswood. Last year saw the launch of the new Lions Eye Information and Education Kiosk. The funds for this interactive information kiosk and a similar free standing model, located in the Lions Eye Institute Clinic were raised by the Lions of Western Australia at a combined cost of \$33,000. The fund raising projects that Lions carry out in their local communities help the Foundation to achieve its goals of providing equipment and information for better eye health education.

So come along to the Lions Save-Sight Foundation Screening put on by the Lions Club of Tambellup and help prevent an unseen eye problem.


Curtin Volunteers' weekend in Broomehill



Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Postal Services – On 2nd August 1888, John Chipper, accompanied by PC Bonner, from Perth, arrived at Sunnyside with horses and on 6th August. the mail was sent by train for the first time. John Chipper and PC Bonner drove to the line at 11am, but found the train would not arrive until after 6pm. TN then reported on the mail van coming and returning every week or so. On 16th August, John Chipper came with the van, stayed overnight at Sunnyside, and picked up the mail next day. This seems to have been the practice. On 30th August, George Radley brought six mail horses and on 3rd September TN rode with him in the mail van to the line to meet the mail. On 5th September Cpl Woods came from Kojonup looking for a lost mail bag. TN walked to the line (more than 4km) but could not find it. TN refers to passengers on the mail coach from the line on their way to Kojonup or Perth. He also reports passengers going to the train for Albany. No doubt they stayed at the Eticup Inn overnight. On 20th September 1888, George Radley passed Sunnyside but missed the way and went to the ballast pits instead of the Martinup Road and had not got back to Sunnyside at 8pm. On 27th September, TN reported that the Royal Mail van had come for the last time. In future, the mail would be taken off the train at one end of the line and carried along the railway route to the other end. During this August/September period, Patrick Carmody was still Eticup Postmaster and it is assumed that the bags of mail for or from Eticup were handled by him. On 21st November 1888, Patrick Garrity took the mail to the line. His son John was Postmaster by this time.

The next diaries of Thomas Norrish are missing but official records show that the postal service was shifted to Broome Hill by late 1889 when the Garrity's opened their Hotel and store there, and Eticup people had to go to Broome Hill with and for their letters. In August 1891, Elizabeth Garrity took over as Postmistress and was paid £20 a year. She probably operated from the store. Her successor, J. H. Otto, was appointed in July 1892 and was the first Postmaster to take up residence in the new Post Office. He, too, was paid £20, but the next incumbent, J.W.C. Bird (from July 1893) was paid £120 as the Post Office had been made a Post & Telegraph Office on 5th August and a Postmaster/ Telegraphist was needed. In November 1894, C.T. Morgan was paid £110, his salary going up to £160 by July 1897. In April 1898, W.E. Keetley was also to receive £160 but when Charlotte Mitchell was made Postmistress in 1901 she was paid £70 per year. The services provided by the Broome Hill Post Office evolved with the improvements introduced by the Postmaster General's Department. A public telephone was installed on the footpath outside the Post Office in the early 1920's but in the early 1990's was relocated in Journal St near the Museum. In the 1980s the Post Office was made a private business.

A new tourist drawcard is blooming across the Great Southern this spring.

The festival is an initiative of the Hidden Treasures of the Great Southern, supported by \$80,000 of Tourism WA funding secured through the Great Southern Development Commission (GSDC).

Eight shires in the Great Southern make up the Hidden Treasures group: Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Katanning, Kent, Kojonup and Woodanilling.

Hidden Treasures chair Di Holly said the festival embraced several existing spring wildflower shows and added a range of new events. "Bloom Festival offers wildflower walks, open garden displays, two long table lunches and even an 'extreme flower arranging' competition at Woodanilling," Mrs Holly said.





Caring for Our Country

Soil Acidity Survey - The new round of soil sampling funding is due to commence in the warmer months. I will be having a meeting with the representative from SoilTech to develop a better system of soil sampling than we had last year. This sampling will be taken at surface level (at your expense) and at three depths (through the funding) to 30cm depth. This sampling will provide you with a detailed pH analysis of your soil, and recommendations to balance where necessary. For an extra cost, you will be able to determine a full nutrient analysis and fertiliser recommendations from a company of your choice. If you would like to register your interest in being involved in the project, contact me at Gillamii.

Demonstration Site — The first pasture cuts were made for analysis on the kike and tall wheat grass fertiliser trial sites, along with a further fertiliser application. There were visible differences in the pasture such as higher clover rates but minimal pasture growth where phosphorus was applied, significantly increased pasture growth where nitrogen was applied etc. However we will have to wait for pasture analysis to get a good indication of whether these indicators follow into actual FOO.

Perennials — The perennials subsidies have been very popular. We have fulfilled all our allocations up to next year. At this stage we don't have any further programs that will target implementation subsidies due to the government ceasing funding opportunities in this area. We are hopeful that we may find other avenues to pursue to maintain this service, but it is not guaranteed. The new direction the government is taking is research into carbon sequestration that perennials can provide.

Southern Incentives

A new round of Southern Incentives funding is available. These will be providing fencing and/or revegetation targeting habitats suitable for black cockatoo varieties such as the Carnaby's, Baudin's and Red Tailed Black Cockatoo's. This funding is up to \$20,000.00 per applicant, with the fencing subsidy at \$2400/km. If you would like to be involved with this funding round, you

Golden Wattle Eradication Project

With the success of our application to tackle golden wattle populations in reserves in the area, we will be contracting the project out. These works will hopefully commence as soon as we have the finances and contracts approved. There will be works conducted in Tenterden in 2 reserves,

in the 'water reserve' in Cranbrook and at Lake Poorrarecup. We will be promoting community awareness of this weed and how straightforward it is to keep it under control within your own area. If you own a saw and some roundup, you can tackle any saplings you come across. We would love community volunteers to come out and learn what this weed is so we will keep you posted when works are underway if you would like to help. It's vital to start getting the word out to prevent this from becoming the massive problem that <code>Sydney Golden Wattle</code> has become in Albany. If you would like to know more about this weed and how you can help to prevent its spread across the landscape, contact us at Gillamii for more information.





Lake Poorrarecup

The signage for Lake Poorrarecup is being produced at the printers, we are hopeful we will have them up at the lake within the next two months. To celebrate the production of these signs and the upgrades that the shire has undertaken at the lake, we are hoping to host a 'Poorrarecup Picnic Open Day' in the spirit of the annual picnics that were held at the Lake in previous years. Wildlife Corridors

We are waiting to receive the final contract and funding for this project, which has been approved. We will have fencing programs targeting those that fall within the Balicup and Unicup wetland suites. There will also be fauna surveying commencing which will be looking to ascertain if any populations of bandicoots and black gloved wallabies are found within our area. We will be contacting landholders in relevant areas in the coming months. If you have an area of healthy bush with prolific understory that may sustain populations of 'snack sized' mammals, we would be interested in hearing from you. Also if you have areas of healthy bush that you would like to protect that may fall within the area detailed below.

Thursday 8 September 2011 VISIONARY PROSPECTS FOR SOUTH COAST

A newly revised South Coast Regional Strategy for NRM has been launched containing a vision for the next five years of natural resource management investment.

Southern Prospects 2011-2016 is intended to strengthen the region's ability to work effectively to protect the environment. It analyses the values and conditions of the region's resources and ensures that the five theme areas (land, water, biodiversity, cultural, heritage) and the overarching consideration of regional capacity are considered holistically.

Friday 9 September 2011 WA LEADS IN GORSE ERADICATION

Western Australia is leading the nation in its efforts to eradicate one of Australia's most serious weeds, Gorse. WA has become the first state to be a direct signatory to a 25 year gorse eradication commitment, when a Memorandum of Understanding was signed. Gorse covers over 23 million hectares of land in southern Australia, making large areas of land unusable by reducing the carrying capacity of pasture.

The weed harbours feral animals, degrades and competes with native vegetation, and is a serious fire hazard. It also carries significant control costs and is known to reduce land values.

Monday 12 September 2011 WEB WEAPON TO FIGHT DEADLY DISEASE

Project Dieback has launched its new online weapon against the pathogenic predator of our plants and ecosystems—Phytophthora cinnamomi.

A one-stop-shop for environmental managers, DIDMS (Dieback Information Delivery and Management System) is a web-based intelligence system designed to guide government, industry and community in their decision making and provide an effective tool to pool dieback information.

Dieback knows no boundaries—damaging ecosystems of national parks, reserves, forests, farms and mining areas. The cross regional Project Dieback initiative set the first benchmark in mapping dieback across all land tenures and NRM regions. Www.didms.gaiaresources.com.au

Wednesday 21 September 2011 TUCKER TIME FOR COCKATOO
