#### **FIRE SEASON**

On 21 October a small number of interested residents attended a presentation by Murray Hatton from FESA on fire season preparedness and keeping home and family safe in the event of a fire. The information and advice provided was practical, with many of the tips easily implemented around the home prior to the fire season.

The single most important action which all people should take is to develop their own bushfire survival plan and bushfire survival kit. FESA have released a publication called '**Prepare. Act. Survive.'** which includes information, templates and checklists to help you develop a plan which relates particularly to your family's circumstances. This booklet is available at both Shire offices, the Tambellup Community Resource Centre, or can be downloaded from the FESA website (www.fesa.wa.gov.au).

This workshop was preceded by a pre-season get together for brigade members to discuss arrangements for the coming fire season. The meeting was held at the Broomehill Shire Depot, and our thanks go to the Broomehill P & C under the leadership of Esso Delaney for providing the BBQ breakfast to all who attended.

#### LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME AND LOCAL PLANNING STRATEGY

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is currently developing a new Local Planning Scheme and Local Planning Strategy. As part of the process Council is seeking your views on the proposed Local Planning Strategy. The Strategy will guide the Shire's future land uses and development aspirations over the next 10-15 years.

Two workshops were held recently in Broomehill and Tambellup to gather ideas from the community on future land use planning for our shire. The sessions were facilitated by Mr Phil Shephard, Town Planner.

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#### **RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD** All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2011** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2012** inclusive. As we move into the harvest period, residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the whole Shire is **98251042.** The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week. Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and RadioWest 1071 as they are implemented. The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. If you would like to register to receive advice of harvest bans by SMS, or if you are currently registered but your mobile number has changed, please contact Pam at the Shire office for details to be updated.

Residents are reminded if they are aware of roads requiring maintenance they should contact the Shire Works Manager in the first instance, so works can be scheduled. ## From the Shire President

The local government elections have come and gone with Broomehill –Tambellup not requiring an election. Councillor numbers have been reduced, in line with the State Government's local government reform process, from nine to seven.

Cr Scott Thompson, Cr Kym Crosby and Cr Garry Sheridan were returned to office unopposed, and will continue to serve the rate payers of Broomehill and Tambellup as they have done in the past. Thanks must go to retiring councillors Murray Bowman, I I years and Beth Schlueter, 4 years for their time and efforts. Both will be missed but left with the satisfaction that in their time on council they made a strong contribution on your behalf.

At the October council meeting Cr Barry Webster was elected President and Cr Kym Crosby as Deputy President. Councillors also nominated to represent the Shire on various local and regional committees including Regional Road Group, Great Southern Zone WALGA, the Southern Link Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (VROC), Senior Citizens Unit Management Committee, Fire Advisory Committee, Roadwise and the Local Emergency Management Committee.

Councillors are also involved with additional council committees which deal with a range of issues from parks and gardens and economic development to plant replacement, buildings etc.

I encourage people to consider standing for council at the next election in two years time. I believe the strength of any local government is its choice of candidates, and that we are served better by new people taking up the challenge and bringing fresh enthusiasm to council. This, blended with the experience of existing councillors will result in a successful forward thinking and vibrant organization.

It is with that view we intend to try to give people an idea of how council works and the issues confronting us both good and bad, by inviting people to sit in on council meetings. All meetings are open to the public but would be run slightly different in that the invited guest would sit with council and be given the opportunity to comment on matters being considered, but obviously not be able to vote.

This program was run in Tambellup prior to the amalgamation, and proved to be a successful way for people to gain an insight into the workings of Council and the stringent requirements that underpin every Council decision without exception. We hope the program will provide participants with a greater understanding of their Local Government, and possibly the motivation to stand for Council at the next election.

We will be extending an invitation to a selected community member to attend each Council meeting. If you are particularly interested in participating, please do not hesitate to contact either myself or Louise at the Shire office on 98253555.

I can't stress enough that for us to be sustainable into the future, even given the Reform agendas from both the State and Federal Governments, the community needs strong candidates to choose from. I can say with my hand on my heart that your present councillors have the best interest of the Shire at heart and work hard to make this a better place in which to live and raise a family. As with all volunteer positions they cannot do it forever and new candidates are always needed.

It is great to see our district looking as it is. Although not a perfect year (what ever that may be) it is a far cry from the horror season of 2010 and should bring a confidence and optimism back to us all, whether on the land or working in other industry. We are all connected to Mother Nature's whims and we hope she will be kind for some time to come.

There is no council meeting in November due to the C.E.O being away on annual leave. Kim Hastie is our relieving C.E.O for the interim so any enquiries can still be dealt with at the office. As usual all councillors make themselves available should you wish to discuss anything with them.

We welcome Judy Stewart to our council taking on the role of Manager Corporate Services. Judy and husband Peter have taken up residence in Tambellup so please introduce yourself as we hope they will stay for some time.



My name is Wendy Bradshaw and I am researching how farming 'with nature' influences farming practices and values for my Master's degree. ## **Broomehill Historical Notes**

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

**Pot Hook** – Unidentified. In August 1864, WHG reported that Pot Hook had been caught and got a dozen lashes.

**Prichett, Rev** - Held the Church services at Eticup on  $20^{th}$  March and  $10^{th}$  April 1898.

**Quartermaine, Henry** – Married to Thomas Norrish's younger sister Matilda. Diary entries imply that he was associated with his wife's brother-in-law, Edward Treasure of Martinup in the 1880s. On 21<sup>st</sup> January 1882, he and Matilda and their children went to Goblup for their (and other) children to be vaccinated but the doctor did not come, having been delayed in Albany. The next day TN vaccinated Stephen Crozier Quartermaine, 7 months, from the previous year's glass.

**Queetchal** – An Aborigine, was at Nanamillup on 8<sup>th</sup> May 1863 and, on 18<sup>th</sup> September 1864, brought the boy Garon (or Ngaron) to Nanamillup. In November that year Jimmy Queetchal returned from Martinup with 10½ lbs (3.8kg) of nails that WHG had borrowed from Edward Treasure. WHG then sent him with Jim Watson's things and one weeks rations. On 20<sup>th</sup> December Bobbinet was sent to Yaungup (Yowangup) to bring Queetchal in and on 20<sup>th</sup> January 1865, WHG counted out Jim Watson's sheep to Queetchal as Jim wanted to go to Albany.

**Quinn, T** – On 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1881, Quinn and Baker who were fencing for Joseph Nelson came to Goblup for blankets, tea and sugar; they had lost all of their things in a fire. In October he was shearing at Goblup and on 18<sup>th</sup> January 1882 he settled with TN for the rations that he and Baker had had while fencing for Nelson. He was there again on 25<sup>th</sup> January with Baker and also George Whitton who had come for his wedges and borrowed three of TN's. On 22<sup>nd</sup> February, TN agreed to let him plough and sew some land at the Eticup paddock for £10 worth of grubbing in the paddock. On 19<sup>th</sup> May 1883, TN sent Quinn to John Croker at the Three Wells for lamb minding and on 18<sup>th</sup> June he came to TN's camp (lambing still in progress) to say Croker no longer needed him.

**Races**- On 20<sup>th</sup> April 1862, William Spencer and WHG rode across to Balgarup to attend the races at Kojonup the next day. On the evening of the 21<sup>st</sup>, at Balgarup, WHG wrote in his diary that he had been much disappointed with the races, expecting to see more fun and sport. On 10<sup>th</sup> June, at Balgarup again, Richard Norrish Snr settled with WHG about the race funds. The following year, WHG, John Maher and Henry Adams went to Kojonup to be ready for the races next day. This time WHG reported that the races passed off very well until the last where there was a bit of a row! No explanation given unfortunately!

At Albany on  $3^{rd}$  January 1884 there was a race between Mr Hassell's horse and that of Mr Dimes (?) the lawyer. Hassell's horse won easily.

On 1<sup>st</sup> March1893, TN and Mrs Norrish with Henry Quartermaine and his family went to the races in Katanning. They stayed until afternoon but the races were very poor and they came away early. Races were held in Broome Hill but whether on the land set aside for this purpose (in the area beside the new Nardlah Road) or at the Showgrounds is not known. Many of TN's diaries are not available and the first found reference to races at Broome Hill is not until1907.

**Radley, George** – Radley came to Goblup on 29<sup>th</sup> October 1881 to see if Croker could go to George Norrish's to shepherd. On 30<sup>th</sup> August 1888, George Radley came to Sunnyside with six mail horses and on 3<sup>rd</sup> September TN rode in the mail van with him to meet the mail from the train at the Eticup siding. He was there again on 16<sup>th</sup> September with the van to go to the line next morning, and on 20<sup>th</sup> he passed with the mail but went the wrong way – going to the ballast pits instead of Martinup Road – and was not back by 8pm. Radley made one more trip before the last one on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1888 after which the mail was transferred from rail-head to rail-head along the railway route.

## Wray Families celebrate "Roundwood"

It would be difficult to imagine just what was going through the mind of William Plumpton Wray in October of 1891-One hundred and twenty years ago when he took ownership of a small portion of land in Broomehill and named it Roundwood.

Just as difficult to imagine, would be the hundred and fifty descendants, neighbours and friends gathered here at Roundwood today to celebrate 120 years of the initiative and foresight of W.P.Wray.

This is just a brief account of the Wrays from their first settlement in Albany, W.A. in 1853. John and Celia Wray sailed from Southhampton, England, in the clipper 'Clara' on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 1853, intending to settle in New Zealand.

However, news had reached Western Australia, prior to their arrival at Fremantle in September 1853, that there was trouble with a Maori uprising in the country.

This news caused second thoughts for John and Celia and after two weeks at Fremantle, they changed their minds and decided they would move to Albany.

They sailed to their destination aboard the 'Gold Seeker'.

Their son, William Plumpton Wray, was born at Albany on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 1860.

John Wray commenced a tailoring business in Albany, where he set up a comfortable home. His son, William Plumpton, followed his father's trade, but also worked at Mr. Hassell's store.

It was in 1889, that W.P. married Miss Agnes Young. John and Celia reared other children, one daughter married Tom Norrish, a settler at Broomehill.

Their property was named 'Sunnyside'. W.P was eventually to lease this property from his brother in law, and no doubt it was whilst he was there he conceived the idea of owning a property nearby (20 miles away). He purchased it and named it 'Roundwood'.

The history of the Wray family now continues from William Plumpton and Agnes Wray, who reared two sons and two daughters, namely William Robert, David John, Mary and Margaret. They were all reared at 'Roundwood'.

William Robert married Violet Peterson-Palmer, the couple reared seven children, four sons and three daughters.

The two brothers, William Robert and David John, farmed together at 'Roundwood'. Eventually the farm was divided between them, with David remaining on the original homestead.

William Robert's sons Mervyn and William Russell farmed their portion of Roundwood until their retirement in 1996.

David John married Sadie Cockram, from that union there were two sons and two daughters Verna, Janice, Lindsay and Ronald.

David's sons Lindsay and Ronald again divided Roundwood and both farmed the property. Over the years when Lindsay took up a farming venture in West River and with the retirement of Bill and Mervyn, Roundwood was again as one parcel with Ronald.

Ron married Isabel in 1962 and had 3 Boys and a Girl, Michael, Timothy, Robert and Janet.

Ron and sons Michael and Tim farmed together until Michael wife Debby and daughters left to live in Albany in 2001.

Ron and Tim farmed together until Ron passed away in 2008.

Farming the property now is Tim and his wife Lori and three children, Christopher, Lachlan and Maddison.

Much more could be written of the hardship and success of William Plumpton Wray, Agnes Wray and the generations of Wray Families that have lived here on Roundwood.

This is a very brief outline of the farms beginning and family ownership until now and there could be many names and events added to this snapshot.

## Roundwood Turns 120

It was an overcast but fine day on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> of October when 125 Adults and near 40 Children gathered at Tim and Lori Wray's property 25km SE of Broomehill to celebrate the Properties 120<sup>th</sup> year. Family, Neighbours and friend travelled several km's some coming from Melbourne, Geraldton and Albany to name a few.

The celebrations were held in the "transformed" machinery shed, with pinup boards covered in photos and the history of the farm lining the walls. The feature being William Plumpton Wray's diary from 1891 and several other bank books, Bible and Hymn books dating back 120 years for all to see in a glass display cabinet.

A BBQ lunch and beautiful salads catered for the hungry crowds and were followed with several bus trips around the property to reminisce different locations and events. The kids were kept entertained with "Bluey" a lovely Clydesdale and trailer who came from Gidgegannup and provided fun for the "big "and little people alike.

The Afternoon saw local Shearing contractor Mark Stanton blade shear two sheep to show how it was done in the "ol" days and show the art is still alive.

Tim and Lori's niece Kelly Wray is beginning her career as a photographer and what a way to start with taking family portraits in the old shearing shed as your back drop. This was well received with a lot of people taking the opportunity to gather the family together and record the day.

Collyn Garnett provided a talking point by bringing out one of the Garnett's collectables in the form of a Beautiful old Chamberlain Tractor.

A great day was had by all with some 30 family and friends camping overnight to make a weekend of it.

One hundred and twenty years is an amazing milestone and the Wray family is very proud that they have been fortunate enough to continue on the generations of William Wray that is ---Roundwood.




