








Works in August

Seasonal tasks are underway in both townsites, with pruning and spraying being carried out. Katanning Cherry Pickers have been in Broomehill recently trimming trees under power lines, and will move to Tambellup once they are finished. Both ovals have been sprayed for broadleaf weeds, and it is hoped some more rain with some warmer spring weather will bring the grass along.

Community workers have been active in both communities, cleaning up at the tip sites and whipper snipping in Tambellup. The fence around the playground in Holland Park will be painted as part of their next visit.

Works on the Heron Rd Black Spot project are progressing, with all gravel works completed. Sealing of the intersection will be carried out with the new Jet Patcher truck, which is due to arrive mid September. In the meantime, the widening of the next section of Broomehill-Kojonup Rd is underway, with gravel being carted. People travelling on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd are asked to be aware of road works in the area and drive accordingly.

Katanning Rural Youth (KRY) is proud to present their 8th annual Pre-Harvest Ball to be held on the 9th of October 2010

This is a function for the youth of the Great Southern and surrounding regions and attracts people from all over Western Australia to come together and enjoy interaction and networking on a social level before harvest begins in 2010. A live band and other activities will be held throughout the night to entertain the projected 200 patrons and staff.

Our club currently attracts approximately 35 young adult members (aged 18-35) from the Great Southern Region and also attracts many community members that participate in events and training held throughout the Great Southern region. KRY also work closely and have the same aims as our head body, Rural Youth Western Australia (RYWA) who currently have approximately 150 state wide club and lone members on there database. We facilitate opportunities for Australia's future rural leaders to meet and develop important networks, which will be vitally important as they strive forward to play an active role within industry groups and corporations.

Katanning Rural Youth is seeking support from, and partnerships with, various organisations to ensure this is a success. The young and dedicated members of Katanning Rural Youth are keen to showcase their town and are excited by the possibilities of what future events may present for young people, and for them to be motivated and become involved in their local communities.

Who are Katanning Rural Youth?

Katanning Rural Youth is a club run under the Rural Youth Western Australia (RYWA). We are a not-for-profit group **run by young people for young people**. It is a **volunteer based** organisation which builds lasting social networks and provides valuable skill development for young country people or those with a strong interest in rural life. The target group is young people aged between 18 and 35 right across Australia.

Katanning Rural Youth aims to:

"Facilitate opportunities to network and interact socially for personal, professional and business development and to learn in an environment of fun."

We bring young people together from geographically or socially isolating environments to interact with their peers as well as participate in skill development sessions for future life. RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2010** and continues until **15 APRIL 2011** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2010** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2011** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2010. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Norrish, Thomas – Second son of Richard and Honora. Born in Inneskilling, Northern Ireland in July 1837 and came to Western Australia in January 1847. with his elder brother Richard had to walk from Albany to Kojonup, the boys were in their 12th and 10th years.

12th and 10th years.

After TN's brother Richard decided against staying at Eticup (Ettakup Pool) on the freehold land and lease that had been Solomon Drolf's and after the other brother Josiah got married in 1863 and moved away, the land was possibly left idle until W.D. Moore to whom the land was mortgaged, suggested TN should work the property and pay off his father's debt of over £400 by sending his wool clip to Moore in Fremantle. Moore also paid off other Norrish debts – including one to McKail in Albany – TN went to Fremantle to finalize the deal and W.D. Moore provided him with a dray and harness for 3 horses, a plough, and provisions and an account for £673. An invoice dated 1st July 1869 is for £520.10.0 and includes £420 for a flock of sheep as well as the rent on various pastoral and tillage leases which Moore had obviously paid to keep the leases alive. In November 1872 TN took his fourth and last load of wool to Fremantle and found himself £3.14.0 in pocket, "the first money I ever had to spend that I could really say was my own". He also had 2 bales left over as the dray would only take 18 bales. These were sent to Albany for sale but got caught in a bushfire and lost.

By 1872 TN had built himself a small house close to the road going south-east towards Pallinup and Martinup Roads. TN always referred to this place as Eticup or old Eticup but his wife Christen (nee Wray) whom he married in February 1872 used the Ettakup spelling. Family anecdote has it that he married only when he had the £3.14.0 in hand but in fact he married before the debt was fully paid off.

During the first few years at Eticup, TN had contracts to supply hay to the Police Stations at Gordon River and Twonkwillingup. With theses contracts and the cartage of sandalwood to Albany, TN kept the station in rations and also paid his men's wages. In May 1871 TN was elected to the first Kojonup Road Board and in July 1876 he was appointed Eticup Postmaster, a position he filled until he moved up to Goblup at the beginning of 1879. (Patrick Carmody moved into Ettakup and also became Postmaster). In December 1878, TN leased Goblup with 5,000 sheep from Lady Campbell for 5 years at £500 per year.

In 1882, TN was instrumental in getting settlers to a meeting to discuss the possibility of their building a school-cum-church. The proposal did not gel until 1884 and St Peter's Anglican Church was completed and consecrated in 1885 with arrangements made for the Education Department to use the building as school during the week. In 1883, during his last year at Goblup TN had 'Sunnyside' built on Location 206. By this time he had 1100 acres (445.5 ha) of his own.

Following Lady Campbell's death in 1889 and Lord Brassey's acquisition of Goblup, TN was invited by J.F.T Hassell (Lord Brassey's agent) to manage the Goblup Estate – Lady Campbell's Goblup and Eticup properties and huge tracts of land purchased from the West Australian Land Company (builders of the Great Southern Railway). TN and his family then moved back to Goblup and Sunnyside was leased to TN's brother-in-law William P Wray for two years. Although others were interested in leasing the place, TN preferred not to let it.

In 1892, TN was elected to the new Broome Hill Road Board. He was the second Chairman and served on the Board until two years before his death in 1908. He, together with WHG or another member of the Board spent a lot of time inspecting roadworks being carried out by contractors, and attended various Road Board meetings and conferences. His obituary included the words – "For a lifetime almost, he headed every public movement in the district at different times."

In April 1900 he was approached to stand for Legislative Council but he declined. Locally, in addition to being a member of the Road Board, he was an inaugural member of the Great Southern Districts Agricultural, Pastoral and Horticultural Society, as well as being on the Church Committee for St Peter's Eticup, the Broome Hill School Board, the Health Board, the Institute Committee and the Mutual Improvement Society. He was also a Justice of the Peace and occasionally heard charges against offenders, usually at Katanning.

Thomas Norrish's diaries end with an entry on 29th October 1907: "My wife and I start for Albany this by evening's train and expect to leave Albany on Thursday next for Adelaide." It had been hoped this trip would help to improve his health, to little avail. He died in April 1908 and was buried at the Eticup Cemetery. Christen Ann Norrish died on Christmas Day 1942 in her 98th year and was buried in the churchyard at St Mary's in the Valley, Kelmscott.
