From the Council Meeting

- Council determined that \$30,000 funding to be received from Round 3 of the Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program will be utilised on the upgrade of the Broomehill skate park and the upgrade of visitor facilities at the Norrish St rest stop.
- Council has commenced the process to dedicate portions of Lavarock St and Norrish Rd (Tie Line Rd) which cross the Railway reserve in Broomehill. These sections have been constructed for many years providing access across the Great Southern Railway line, however were never officially dedicated as roads. Council will shortly advertise the proposal for comment.


SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP **DISABILITY ACCESS AND INCLUSION PLAN**

Budget Overview

The 2010/2011 budget was adopted by Council at the Council meeting on 15 July. The budget includes an increase in rural (UV) rates of 5% and townsite (GRV) rates of 10%, with minimum rates remaining at \$300.00 per assessment. Highlights of the budget include:

ROADS PROJECTS:

The 2010/2011 budget includes \$1,180,700 of expenditure on capital road works. Council will be assisted in meeting the costs of the projects with funds from Regional Road Group, Roads to Recovery and Black Spot Funding.

Projects include:

- Broomehill Kojonup Road widen, prime and seal to 7.00m a 2.8km section
- Tieline Road reseal a total of 7.8km in two sections
- Pallinup South Road widen & resheet 13.5km section
- Wandoo Road realignment and construction carry over from 2009-2010
- Gnowangerup Road reseal section carry over from 2009-2010
- Nookanellup Road realign intersection with Broomehill Kojonup Road
- Pootenup Road stagger intersection with Hassell Road carry over from 2009-2010
- Greenhills South Road widen and resheet 6km section
- Flat Rocks Road reseal 2.4km section
- Paul Valley Road reseal section
- Paul Valley/Peter Valley intersection reseal sections

ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS

The 2009-2010 Country Local Government Fund allocations were deferred by the State Government and will be made in the 2010-2011 financial year. The Royalties for Regions program is now managed by the Department of Regional Development and Lands and with this change there have been some amendments to the guidelines.

Council has been advised that it will receive \$426,470 which is almost 65% of the initial allocation. Prior to being able to access these funds Council must submit a Forward Capital Works Program to the Department of Regional Development and Lands for their approval. Once the plan is approved Council can make application for the funds. The following projects will be undertaken with the assistance of Royalties for Regions funding:

•	Tambellup Sports Pavilion Refurbishment	\$200,000
•	Public Toilets – Broomehill	\$100,000
•	Window Replacement – Broomehill Administration Building	\$ 50,000
•	Extension of townsite pathways – Broomehill	\$ 76,470

Country Local Government Fund – 35% Regional component

The 2010-2011 financial year will see 35% of the 2009-2010 CLGF allocation administered via a regional pool. Again Council has been advised that an amount of \$229,638 will be available for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to contribute towards the regional grouping of local governments that has been identified.

Broomehill-Tambellup has identified its regional grouping as the Southern Link VROC which includes the Shires of Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet. A number of projects with regional significance have been identified, however projects that will be physically located within this Shire and which will impact on the 2010-2011 budget are:

- Records Management Regional Archive Repository \$250,000
- Waste Management \$160,000 2 transfer stations proposed one in each town
- Regional Recreation facilities \$60,000 to replace the asbestos roof at the Tambellup Sporting Pavilion

OTHER PROJECTS

Other major projects to be completed in 2010/2011 include:

•	Continuation of the Broomehill Hall renovation project	\$ 94,500
•	Fencing of the Broomehill Refuse site	\$ 30,000
•	Upgrade to the Works Depot at Tambellup	\$ 50,000

Council has also made provision in the budget for the following

- completion of the staff house in Henry Street Tambellup
- complete the subdivision of the "University" block in Broomehill
- fencing at the Community Resource Centre
- repairs to the Hall roof in Tambellup
- development of a new Town Planning Scheme (amalgamation)

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Norrish, John – Fifth and youngest son of Richard and Honora. Born in Albany in 1848. Married Margaret Noonan in 1875 and lived for a time at Warkalup (Wokalup). Margaret was a very able horsewoman and the story is told that on one occasion she was carrying her six week old son John, while on horseback when the horse started bucking. She called to her husband to catch the baby and once he was safe in his father's hands, she brought the horse under control. In July 1880, John Norrish took the London Hotel in Albany on lease for 5 years at £250 per year. On 25th June 1892, Sam Baggs brought word to TN that his brother John was very ill at Kojonup and not likely to live; John died on 7th July. On 9th July 1892, TN wrote "My brother was buried at Warkalup this evening at about 4 o'clock. A good number of people were there from Kojonup – Henry Chipper, Piesse, Tom Haddleton, Grovers and Noonans. He would have been 45 next Tuesday."

Norrish, Josiah – Third son of Richard and Honora, born in England in 1841. Held the fort at Ettakup Pool until his marriage to Ellen cull in 1863. On 7th January 1862 he borrowed a ladder and some mutton from WHG, and in November that year he helped with the shearing at Nanamillup for 3 days. After his marriage Josiah went to Nigalup until 1873 when he settled near Tambellelup Spring.

In September/October 1873 he visited Nanamillup three times staying one or two nights on each occasion. On 21st January 1882 Josiah and Ellen brought two children to Goblup to be vaccinated but the doctor did not come. They returned the next day and TN vaccinated 2 year old Ellen from the previous year's glass. On 12th February 1882 Josiah's son Frederick was drowned in a pool at Killibinnup. Apparently he had gone with a visitor to Tambellarup to show him where he might bathe. He had slipped into the pool and the man had not been able to save him. They boy's body was not recovered until next morning and TN and his brother-in-law Henry Quartermaine stayed up all night to make the coffin and finished it about 8 'clock. The inquest was held at 11 o'clock with Louis Van Zuilecom, Constable Cole, Henry Quartermaine, Philip McGuire and Thomas Norrish attending and the boy was buried at about 4 o'clock. In mid December 1883 Josiah was getting over a bout of the measles but by Boxing Day was so ill that TN took him down to Albany to see Dr Walpole. On $3^{\rm rd}$ January 1884 the two brothers saw a lawyer in Albany and Josiah signed over all his

brothers saw a lawyer in Albany and Josiah signed over all his rights (whatever they might be) to TN's land at old Eticup to TN. TN returned to Goblup but learned on 21st January that Josiah's wife and daughter had been sent for as there was poor hope for his recovery. However, Joe did return to Tambellarup until 16th February when he was so much worse that TN made a bed in his trap and started for Albany again. Josiah died at 5 o'clock in the evening of 4th March 1884. TN and William Wray laid him out for burial. In the very early days at Warkalup (Wokalup) it had been Josiah who made boots for the family from their own grown and tanned leather.

Norrish, Richard – Eldest son of Richard and Honora. Born in Inneskilling, Northern Ireland in 1835 when the 96th Regiment was stationed there. After rejecting the land at Eticup (Ettakup Pool) that his father had bought off Solomon Drolf in December 1860, Richard took up land at Marleyup. He married Elen Malone in 1863 and WHG mentions going to the wedding festivities. In January 1886, Richard (Dick) became ill at Kojonup and on the 19th TN started with him in Edward Treasure's trap, James Treasure going as far as the Gordon in case Dick had to be lifted out; TN's shepherd Fred Kain took over at the Gordon. On 28th January the doctor telegraphed that Richard was no worse but the next day Elsworthy Treasure brought a telegram from Kojonup that Richard had died at 5am

and would be buried in the evening.






