Sophie's Fund ME/CFS

On June 9 we had a very successful meeting with about 30 attending and nearly that many again putting in apologies. On behalf of the Aylmore Family thank you all for your love and concern. They are very overwhelmed and humble at your willingness to enable them get help for Sophie and other ME/CFS sufferers.

From the meeting we have formed a Steering Committee with Liz Reynolds, Yvonne Herbert, Vicki Webster, Annie Aylmore, Janene Heron, Ros Collins, Barb Groves and Betty Hams. These people are charged with the running and co-coordinating of events. We will meet every 2nd Wednesday of the month – the next meeting being 14th July.

We have also formed a Fund Raising Committee with Fiona Herbert, Debbie Christinelli, Tania Willmott and Marie White who will gather ideas, formulate plans and also help with the running of all fund raising events. We invite the community and sporting groups to put forward plans and suggestions to any of the people above and they are very willing to assist you as much as needed.

Our aim is to raise \$10,000.00 in 2010 within and outside of our community.

This is the beginning of raising the necessary funds to get a laboratory in Perth and that is the best way to help the Annie and Brian in their care of Sophie. So we will do the best we can!!!

The Steering Committee is busy getting all the legal and business obligations arranged. Banks and governments require so much paper work these days but we will wade through them and get it all completed and then we can actually put money into an account. The name of the account will be **SOPHIE'S Fund ME/CFS Incorporated** and held at the Tambellup Branch of the Bendigo Bank. Donations can be made directly into this account. ME/CFS stands for Myalgic Encephalomyelitis / Chronic Fatigue Syndrome.

We have begun to organize a website and all events, information and routine updates will be posted on this page. Will be able to let you know as soon as it is up and running.

The first fund raiser on our agenda is a **Sheep Drive**. Please ring Michael and Marie White on 98258216 for details. They are organizing this fund raiser as soon as we get the bank account.

What lucky people we are and what a fantastic community we come from. We miss you all and can't wait to come home. Once again we would like to thank you from the bottom of our hearts for the kindness and caring you have continually shown us during Sophie's long illness.

Sophie's Story

Our darling daughter Sophie has been ill for over 7 years now. She has a diagnosis of CFS/ME- Chronic Fatigue Syndrome/Myalgic Encephalomyelitis. If you try to find out more about this condition you will get a variety definitions and if you "Google" CFS/ME you would probably become even more confused. The only way we know of explaining this condition is by telling a little of our Sophie's story.

It is hard to know where to start in writing about Sophie's illness as so little is known about the condition (CFS/ME) and we are constantly struggling to understand it ourselves. What we do know is that over the last 7 yrs Sophie's health has slowly deteriorated to the point where she is now totally bedridden and struggles everyday to do just the basic tasks of everyday living. Brian and I are caring for Soph with the help of family and friends and health professionals who come to the house. In other words we have set up a hospital at home situation.

Earlier this year with Sophie's health declining to the point where we were turning her in bed and feeding her, she was admitted to hospital via ambulance. Unfortunately after spending 10 days in the Mount Hospital and after seeing many specialists they all came to the conclusion that hospital was not the place for someone with CFS/ME as all the activity and disturbances in hospitals just serves to cause more fatigue so she was sent home again via ambulance.

As so little is known about CFS/ME we have had a very long and complicated journey to find information and professional help for Sophie. We have visited many health professionals who specialise in the treatment of CFS. Earlier this year we were lucky enough to have a visit from a world leader in the field of research and treatment of CFS/ME, Prof Kenny De Melier from Belgium. He has been studying the condition for many years and has a clinic in Belgium where a team of researchers are slowly discovering more and more about the condition which is resulting in many people with severe CFS/ME like Sophie getting help. Professor De Melier is very overwhelmed with patients from all over the world who have CFS/ME and is only able to visit a fraction of people who seek his help.

Through the clinic and research being done he is having quite a significant amount of success in helping people. Our doctor arranged for blood tests to be sent over to the clinic in Belgium and through these test it was discovered that Soph has had Q fever which is one of the underlying causes of her condition. This along with other contributing factors has caused her ill health. If it hadn't been for these blood tests being done we would still be in the dark over what the underlying cause of Sophie's declining health was. Since the tests have been done our doctor has started the treatment protocol as recommended by the Professor and Sophie has for the first time made a bit of an improvement and even though it will be a long slow journey we are very hopeful that she is on her road to recovery.

We are extremely lucky as we have two GP's working together who are very interested and dedicated to finding out as much as they can about CFS/ME to help Sophie other patients. To send the tests over to Belgium was a very expensive exercise as you can imagine and this along with treatment from the US and around the clock care for Soph is very taxing emotionally and financially. One of the ways that this all could become a lot simpler and more cost effective for Soph and others with this condition is if we could do testing in Perth. Prof DeMelier is trying to start branches of the laboratories world wide and our Doctors believe that a lab could be set up in Perth with the necessary funds. This would be fantastic for Sophie and anyone with CFS/ME in Australia as at the moment most people just can't afford to even have the testing done.

Sophie's struggle is far from over but as more is found out about this condition it will be more likely that she and others like her will have a good chance of recovery.



Works

Inconsistent rains through June slowed the maintenance grading program slightly and enabled the graders to carry out shoulder maintenance on bitumen roads. This has been completed in the Broomehill area, and is continuing on through the Tambellup area. Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following gravel roads through June: Chillicup Rd, Birt Rd, Bowman Rd, Beejenup Rd, Warrenup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Crosby Rd, Burridge Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Witham Rd, Sprigg-Simpson Rd, Nazzari Rd, Dartnall Rd, Saggers Rd.

Council staff are liaising with Main Roads to obtain the final approvals required prior to commencing work on the Heron Rd Black Spot project.



Construction works continued on the widening and resheeting of Crosby Rd. The opportunity was also taken to replace culvert pipes to improve drainage in the area.

New child car restraint laws from October – Kids don't grow up as fast as you think

New laws for child car restraints will be introduced on 1 October this year. They will ensure children are appropriately restrained when travelling in vehicles.

Currently, Western Australian law requires children less than 12 months of age to be restrained in a suitable approved child restraint. However, older children can be restrained in either an approved child restraint or a properly fastened seat belt, where one is available.

An adult seat belt alone does not provide small children an adequate level of safety when travelling in a vehicle. The new laws will reduce the risk of injury caused by the use of unsuitable restraints by specifying the type of restraint to be used at different ages and where children must be seated in a vehicle.

Pam Hull, member of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup RoadWise Committee said the new laws are an integral part to protecting our most precious cargo, our children.

"While these new laws will also bring some issues with the cost of purchasing new restraints, we need to look at the bigger picture. The laws will ensure our children travel safely in vehicles and that is the aim," Pam said. New law changes will help ensure our children stay safer on our roads and reduce unnecessary suffering for WA families.

Specifically, the new laws will require children:

- From birth to the age of six months to be restrained in a rearward facing child restraint (such as an infant capsule).
- From six months up to the age of four years to be restrained in either a rearward or forward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness.
- From four years up to the age of seven years to be restrained in either a forward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness or booster seat restrained by a correctly adjusted and fastened seat belt or child safety harness.
- Children seven years of age and over can use an adult seat belt, as the law currently allows.
- Children under four years must be in the rear seats of a vehicle if the vehicle has at least two rows of seats.
- Children under seven years are not permitted in the front seats of a vehicle, unless all rear seats are occupied by children less than seven years of age.

Children who are outside weight/size guidelines for existing restraints will be able to use the restraint type for the next age group.

If you would like your restraint checked free of charge, RoadWise in conjunction with McDonalds Albany are conducting a child car restraint fitting station on July 2 from 9am.

**ALWAYS SUPERVISE CHILDREN AROUND WATER

* When writing your shopping list, give them paper and pencil and let them write it for you. Make sure you take it with you and 'pretend' to read from it.

Shows your little one the importance and value of reading and writing.

* When peeling the veggies for tea, let them help. Give them the carrots and potatoes and the potato peeler and let them have a go at peeling them. (You may need to re peel-don't let them see you doing it!)

Listen to the language that occurs during these activities. Join in the conversation, encouraging the learning of new vocabulary and speaking in correct grammatical sentences.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Norrie – Unidentified – possibly Anglican Minister. On 16th April 1893 apparently attended church service at Eticup after which TN's daughters drove him and Rev Orchard in to Broome Hill.

Norrish Family - The Norrish family arrived in Western Australia in January 1847 when the 96th Regiment, on transfer from Van Diemen's Land to the Swan River Colony called in at King George Sound where Cpl Norrish and his wife Honora (nee Regan) and children Richard, Thomas, Josiah, George and Anna together with a detachment of 7 soldiers disembarked. Cpl Norrish and the men left Albany the next day to relieve the detachment at Kojonup but Honora and the children had to wait in Albany until a team could take them up. They left Albany about two weeks later with John Young and his son David driving two teams partly loaded with rations for the Kojonup station – tea, salt, pork, beef, flour and sugar. At the outskirts of the township, Young insisted that the two eldest boys (in their 12th and 10th years) should walk despite the fact he had been paid to carry them. It was a dreadful journey for the boys in the January heat, water being very scarce. Sometimes they would get to the waiting place first at midday, in time to have a drink and a bit to eat before starting off again. They reached Kojonup on the evening of the sixth day.

Honora Norrish was a great curiosity to the natives "who were very plentiful then" as she was the first white woman to live in Kojonup. (In his memoirs TN records several incidents involving Aborigines.)

At the end of 1848, the detachment was transferred to Perth where Cpl Norrish was in charge of the magazine near the Causeway. When the Regiment was under orders for India (late 1849?), Cpl Norrish, following advice from Colonel Irwin – who had been Acting Lt Governor – applied for his

discharge. He was cutting timber for Canning Bridge for a time and then decided to return to Kojonup and look for land. At Kojonup, Norrish learned in 1850 that Mr Hassell had given up a sheep station at Wokalup, so he went and took possession of the shepherd's hut there. To purchase the 10 acres that he selected, he later borrowed £10 on the understanding that he repaid £20 within 2 years.

In December 1860, with the intention of acquiring land for each of his sons in turn, Richard Norrish purchased from Solomon Drolf his 42 acres (17ha) at Ettakup Pool together with his interest in Pastoral Lease B113. This land was intended for his eldest son, Richard, but he stayed there for one year only, leaving the third son Josiah to take over. Richard died in 1871 and Honora in 1900. Both were buried in the family cemetery at Warkalup. In 1979 the site of the cemetery was marked with a large concrete plinth after the headstone had been removed to the Kojonup Cemetery.

Norrish, Anna Maria – Elder daughter of Richard and Honora, married Edward Treasure of Martinup in 1863.

Norrish, George – Fourth son of Richard and Honora, born in Tasmania in 1844, married Margaret Sheehan at Warkalup in 1877. They lived at Warkalup for a while, George working that property until he got his own place which he named Oak Farm. There were many exchanges between TN and his brother George about farming as well as family matters. George was a member of the Broome Hill Road Board. He died at Katanning in 1927(?).

LOCAL ABORIGINALS IN MILESTONE MEETING

South Coast NRM's new Aboriginal Reference Group met for the first time last week to determine how the Indigenous community could contribute to the organisation's regional strategy and help guide future cultural projects.

The Aboriginal Reference Group nominated John Farmer as its interim chair (representing the Tambellup Aboriginal community) and nominated Treasy Woods as vice chair (representing the Choorilj Farm Management Corporation). South Coast NRM chief executive Rob Edkins said the organisation took a new approach to forming the 15-member reference group by attracting a skills-based membership that was representative of the Aboriginal community and relevant Aboriginal community groups. The Aboriginal Reference Group will meet quarterly and is due to meet again in July for the review of the strategy.

GRASS-ROOTS CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION BEGINS ON SOUTH COAST

Loss of biodiversity and declining water quality will be the two biggest future impacts of climate change within the South Coast region of Western Australia according to a wide-ranging report commissioned by South Coast NRM. The report, titled *Climate Change: Whole of Landscape Analysis of the Impacts and Options for the South Coast Region,* was launched to an audience of 60 community representatives in Esperance on June 17.

Among its findings, the report revealed the impacts of climate change on the South Coast region were likely to be significant, particularly on water resources and biodiversity. It found climate change was likely to exacerbate stress on ecosystems which are already under pressure from habitat loss, fragmentation, invasive species and changed fire regimes.

The report recommended to form a South Coast Climate Change Management Group of a similar model to the successful South Coast Management Group, to help guide government policies at all levels. It also recommended the organisation build climate change resilience and adaptation strategies into Southern Prospects, the South Coast Strategy for NRM.

RESTORING CONNECTIONS PROJECT IN NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

A project which works with Noongar communities to identify, protect and restore cultural places at risk of degradation across the South Coast region of WA has won a prestigious National Landcare Award, the Leighton Holdings Indigenous Award.

South Coast NRM's innovative Restoring Connections project is a community-driven initiative delivered in partnership with the Aboriginal people of the South Coast. The project has developed and implemented a range of natural resource management and heritage projects over the past six years which have helped to build and strengthen community skills.

Last week, the project received almost \$20 000 from the state government through its Coastcare grants program to carry out cultural heritage mapping of Cape Vancouver, known as Quaranup.






