


# BROOMEHILL BIGGEST MORNING TEA

#### SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> June 2010 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### Works

The area around the University block and railway line in Broomehill have been the site for much activity through May, with works continuing on the pedestrian crossing over the railway line and pathway, and drainage and footpaths at the University Block. Asphalting will be undertaken on the pathway and pedestrian crossing late in May and the maze and fencing as required by WestNet Rail will be installed. In Holland Park, a new picnic setting has been installed in the existing gazebo, and construction will start on the new gazebo and gardens in the next couple of weeks.

Now major works at Diprose Park have been completed staff are ensuring the new grass and gardens are settling. We hope to soon have in place a couple of locally manufactured concrete pots, with more to come for streetscape use in both communities.

The construction crew completed the resealing of a 4.4km section of Tie Line Road recently, and the resealing of two sections of Tambellup West Road.

The maintenance graders are currently working in the mid western section of the shire, moving towards the south western corner. Once the wet weather sets in, it is planned that all three graders will carry out maintenance grading. The maintenance crew are working their way around the shire, carrying out bitumen patching and sign and guidepost replacement.

#### From the Council Meeting

- Council will continue its financial support of the Hidden Treasures group in 2010/2011 and 2011/2012.
- Council endorsed the Southern Link Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (VROC) Strategic Plan and Priority Projects list. The Strategic Plan represents the agreed direction into the future for the four member councils being Broomehill-Tambellup, Kojonup, Cranbrook and Plantagenet, and the Priority Projects list represents regional projects which may be eligible for funding under the Royalties for Regions 35% Country Local Governments Fund. A copy of the plan and list is available at both offices for perusal.
- Council will sign the agreement between the Shire and the Tambellup Primary School for access to water at the No. 1 Dam on Jam Creek Rd to reticulate the school oval.
- Council adopted a Ten Year Plant Replacement Program. This will provide Council with an overview of current and future plant requirements, and will be used to develop the 2010/2011 and subsequent budgets.

#### **RUBBISH TIP REMINDER**

Now the cooler weather is upon us, residents are reminded not to deposit hot coals at the tip. This action increases the risk of fires at the tip. Burning at the tip, whether intentionally or not, constitutes a breach of the license issued to operate the tip sites, and the Shire runs the risk of losing the license through such breaches. This would result in the permanent closure of the tips and added inconvenience to residents.

With consideration and care by all users, the life of our tip sites can be preserved. We ask for your cooperation in this matter.

All pensioners are reminded that in order to claim the Pensioner Rebate in 2010 the amount due on your rate notice needs to be paid (in full) before 30 June, 2010. If you think you may be eligible for a rebate and require further information, please contact Kay O'Neill at the Shire. If you haven't registered as a pensioner please do so as soon as possible. We will require a copy of your pension card.

On Monday, 24 May 2010 members and their partners of the Tambellup St John Ambulance Sub Centre gathered for a Dinner in honour of Trevor Prout and his recent award – The Order of St John Medal for outstanding services rendered.

The local Sub Centre members also recognized Trevor's outstanding contribution to our Sub Centre and the Tambellup Community with immediate past President, Mr Mick Trezona presenting Trevor with a Life Membership Certificate and Badge. Trevor now joins the Late Jean Schlueter and Steve Herbert on our Sub Centre list of Life Members. Congratulations Trevor.

Trevor has been involved with St John in Tambellup since 1976. He has held the position of President & Secretary/Treasurer over the years. He is our Transport Officer, which is a position he has held for the past 20+ years. In this position, Trevor keeps the Ambulance maintained, and has the responsibility of having a crew on call 24/7. More often than not, Trevor has been on call himself for the majority of the time, and on many, many occasions forgoing his own personal social life to provide this service to the people of Tambellup.

Following Jean Schlueter's retirement, Trevor took on the role as our First Aid Trainer, and later took on the role as our inaugural Ambulance Trainer. Both of these positions he still holds today which involves going to courses to update his own skills, and running training courses in Tambellup in his own time, and the majority of the time, at his own cost.

A magnificent contribution by Trevor, and we thank him, and acknowledge this wonderful contribution he has made to the Tambellup district. Without dedicated people like Trevor, there would not be the standard of Ambulance service that is provided in Tambellup. Our thanks also go to Aileen for the support she has given Trevor, and our Sub Centre.

Enrich your world by reading, learning, looking and listening.



Onto Gnowangerup they toured around the streets, and stopped for an enjoyable BBQ lunch at the Hotel.



#### **Broomehill Historical Notes**

**Nesbit** – Unidentified. A Mr Nesbit came to Goblup from Broome Hill with William Thomas to go tamar farming with George and Richard Norrish. He came again twice in February.

**Newstead, Nathaniel**- ex 96<sup>th</sup> Regiment (Richard Norrish Snr's Regiment) and may have been a member of the detachment that took over at Kojonup Barracks in 1847. In 1881 had the contract to deliver mail between Kojonup and Albany.

**Newton** – Unidentified. On 11<sup>th</sup> December 1892, George and Sara Norrish went to Newton's for the evening.

**Nichols**- Unidentified. On 21<sup>st</sup> December 1881, Joseph Spencer's shepherd Nichols attacked TN's shepherd William Peters. On 26<sup>th</sup> December 1881 TN went to see Louis Van Zuilecom to take out a summons against Nichols for kicking Peters.

**Nichols, William** – Possibly the same man. On 11<sup>th</sup> April 1884, Bill Nichols was at Sunnyside with George Buirchel and TN cashed a £2 cheque for him. On 23<sup>rd</sup> July that year, Lott's flock that had been shepherded by G Robinson was given over to Bill Nichols.

**Nicholson, A.M** – When TN was confined to his bed after his horse had rolled on him and broken a collar bone and several ribs in 1896, A.M. Nicholson took over the

supervision of Goblup. On TN's resignation from the position in 1898 Nicholson leased Goblup Estate and also became Lord Brassey's agent until the property was sold to the Anderson brothers on 1904.

**Nicholson, John** – Police constable at Broome Hill c1890s. He made several visits to Eticup during 1895. He met TN at Sunnyside on 31<sup>st</sup> March enquiring into the charge against the Chinaman who had said he'd paid for the trinket (unfortunately no further details) The Constable was again at Goblup on 18<sup>th</sup> June about a Chinese who had been thieving at Kendenup. On 4<sup>th</sup> July TN gave him a summons for Oh Pack, which he brought back the next day – after registering it perhaps?

On 28<sup>th</sup> July 1895 PC Nicholson was killed by his horse running him against a tree. His burial was the first held in the Broome Hill Cemetery. By the late 20<sup>th</sup> Century there was no sign of any headstone on the grave but in 1998 when the top of the grave was being prepared for a plaque unveiling by representatives of the WA Police Historical Society, the remains of a wooden cross was found buried in the soil. The placing of a marker on John Nicholson's grave was the first in a project by the Police Historical Society to ensure all graves of men who died in service were marked.

Anecdotal history has it that John was riding from Sunnyside to Goblup when the accident happened and the fateful tree was marked with a nail. However all trace of the nail and the tree have long since gone.

Nicknames – Many of the shepherds and general servants – a lot of whom were pardoned convicts and expirees – used nicknames and TN usually recorded both nickname and proper name in his diaries. He was required to maintain full records of ex-convicts and would have done so for all of his employees for pay and deduction purposes. Names included Snap & Rattle, King Dick, Two Rags, Singing Billie, Stuttering Billie, Pot Hook, Sailor Jack, One-Arm Jack, Four Finger Jack and Leeds Bill.

Some of these names where TN does not give a proper name, may have applied to Aborigines but, apart from Dirty Fellow, Fine Fellow and Strong Fellow, not a lot of imagination seemed to have been used in giving Anglicized names. The men who worked for the settlers were often Jackie, Johnnie or jimmy with a few Paddy's and Charlie's.

#### State funding boost for South Coast conservation

The South Coast region has reaped over \$1.1 million in funding from the State Government's latest NRM funding round, allowing conservation groups such as South Coast NRM to continue protecting biodiversity.

South Coast NRM received over \$666 000 in total to deliver five projects in the region, including protecting the Walpole Wilderness and Mt Lindsay from dieback, managing invasive weed species in and around the Porongurups, and controlling dieback and weed species in other priority locations including Wandoo woodlands and Carnaby's Black Cockatoo habitats.

Another six projects were funded in the region including eradicating introduced wattles from the South Coast, Carnaby's Black Cockatoo recovery, Greekabee Hill Ecolink, preventing the spread of dieback in the Western Fitzgerald Biosphere and addressing climate change and degradation of the Oyster harbour Catchment.

South Coast NRM chief executive Rob Edkins said the state funding commitments were a great result for the not-for-profit organisation and its community partners.

#### Help protect Wandoo and Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo

Restoring and protecting precious Wandoo woodlands and the habitat of the Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo are the focus of South Coast NRM's new Southern Incentives Small Grants Scheme round.

Landholders in Wandoo woodland locales such as Mt Barker, Cranbrook, Broomehill, Tambellup, North Stirlings Pallinup and Kojonup are encouraged to start thinking about what they can do on their properties to help conservation efforts.

Applications for Southern Incentives grants will open in July this year and projects to be considered include fencing off remnant Wandoo woodlands to exclude stock, strategic revegetation and invasive weed removal activities.

Landholders keen to take part in the program will be able to download application forms and guidelines from the South Coast NRM website in July.
