

SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 15th April 2010 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

WORKS

The main focus for the works crew this month has been the various road sealing projects which are underway. The shoulders on 2.4km of Tambellup West Rd have been sealed. A further 1.6km has been widened and gravelled, and will be sealed at a later date. The reconstruction work near the Tambellup West Rd bridge has had a temporary seal applied, with further work to be carried out before the laying of the final seal. Sealing on the Broomehill-Kojonup Rd will be carried out early in April, weather and spray truck availability permitting. The maintenance crew has been carrying out works on culverts and headwalls in conjunction with the construction works underway.

Following the completion of the capital works projects, the graders will be back carrying out maintenance grading across the shire. An order has been placed for the purchase of a new Caterpillar 12M grader.

PRIVATE WORKS

Residents are reminded that all requests for private works should be made through the Shire Offices initially. This is to ensure all the necessary details of the job can be obtained, prior to passing on to the works crew for actioning. If your request is urgent you should still make your request through the office, and every effort will be made to ensure it is completed in a timely manner. Please do not contact works staff directly as they cannot authorise the works.

WHATS HAPPENING IN THE PARKS???

The benefits of the Royalties for Regions Program funding continue as work progresses in Diprose and Holland Park. In Holland Park the site for the new gazebo has been cleared on the western side of the park near the court. We are awaiting delivery of the gazebo, which will be surrounded by built up garden beds. New tables and seats will be installed, at the BBQ area, in the gazebos and adjacent to the playground.

In Diprose Park reticulation has been installed to lawn and garden areas, the toilet block has received a facelift inside and out, the pathways are finally completed, a drinking fountain has been installed near the exercise equipment and the area sanded ready for grass. Garden edgings are being installed at present, some paving is to be completed and bench seats will be installed. The new play equipment for the junior area has arrived and will be installed in the near future.



And the big news is – the shade sails have been installed over play equipment at both parks. These sails will make a huge difference for park users during warmer months. We anticipate all works at the parks will be completed by the end of April.

All residents are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period continues through until the **15 APRIL 2010** inclusive. During this period a permit is required for any burning to be undertaken. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief Fire Control Officer.



Red Card for the Red Fox

2010 FOX SHOOT RESULTS



OUT-FOXING AT ITS BEST

The second of the Stockbrands Community Foxshoots saw 45 groups coordinate the efforts of over 800 farmers and volunteers, who worked through the night culling foxes, feral cats, rabbits and wild pigs while raising funds for the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

Over 3000 foxes were culled in the shoots, which would eat the equivalent of 16 semi-trailer loads of livestock, native animals and insects each year. Farmers also culled 140 wild cats, who can give raise up to 8 kittens each year, along with over 2500 rabbits.

This total will see Stockbrands donate \$15,000 to the Royal Flying Doctor Service as part of their sponsorship arrangement of donating \$5 per fox culled in registered shoots. John Forehan owns Stockbrands Co and is proud that his Western Australian company is supporting this Western Australian cause, and is a firm believer in supporting local economy. Murdoch University researchers are currently investigating diet, parasite loads and morphology of 500 foxes and 30 cats in different locations throughout the southwest. Analysis of stomach contents will identify to prey consumed to a species level where possible and intestinal parasite identification will inform on pathogens with potential to impact upon production and native animals. Additionally, morphometric studies on fox skulls will provide information on growth characteristics of foxes in relation to their environment and location.

Growing a healthy future

Organically grown vegetables taste great, are good for you and, for these WA College of Agriculture students, help grow their career prospects.

At the Denmark College Year 11 students involved in the Plant Production course are hands-on when it comes to planting and harvesting organic vegetable crops, which are then used in the College kitchen and also sold throughout Denmark, Albany and Perth.

Crops grown organically include broccoli, cauliflower, cabbages, garlic, zucchini and sweet corn.

The horticultural course guides students through the complete cycle from researching suitable crops, ground preparation, planting, harvesting, to packing and sales.

While the farm work is a large component of the course, students have classroom studies in plant production and marketing to back up their practical skills.

At times throughout the year, students are able to preserve vegetables in the College kitchen; value-adding to the raw produce. Open Day is a great opportunity to sell this popular range.

The Year 11 course gives students the option to go on and specialise in horticulture in Year

12, leading to the Certificate II Production Horticulture qualification, ready to enter the workplace. With the growing consumer demand for organic produce, Denmark College students are developing the necessary skills to contribute to Western Australia's green, organic future.

Partners of the Porongurup Weed Control Project gathered at the Porongurup Shop to enjoy some reflection on three years of hard work.

Minister for Agriculture and Food Terry Redman joined local landholders and representatives from Oyster harbour Catchment Group, Friends of the Porongurup Range, South Coast NRM, Dept of Environment and Conservation, Dept of Agriculture and Food, and the Shire of Plantagenet joined to celebrate their success in controlling weeds inside and around the national Heritage listed Porongurup Range national Park.

The project began in 2007 after a wildfire burnt more than 5000 hectares of land in the national park and on private property. Not long after, environmental weeds such as Blackberry, Dolichos Pea, Red Valerian, Taylorina and introduced wattles started to proliferate, posing a threat to biodiversity in the region. As a result, significant progress has been made to control declared and environmental weeds in and around the Pororngurup Range National Park, with DEC crews working inside the park and Oyster harbour Catchment Group, landholders and supporting agencies, working to create a five kilometre buffer free of weeds

Broomehill Historical Notes

Mooney, Joseph – Brother of Ann Mooney who married James Annice Snr. On 8th February 1882, Joe Mooney was at Goblup to get Annice's cattle. He was at Sunnyside on 25th September 1886 with John and Tom McGuire who had bought a colt to be castrated and he was in the Goblup shearing team in October 1892.

Morgan C.T – Postmaster 1894-1898. On the 19th December 1895, Mr Morgan was appointed Auditor for the Broome Hill Road Board, vice E.W Steere. On the same day Mrs Morgan accompanied Mrs Norrish and Nora Norrish to the school to examine the children and give prizes. The following week Mr & Mrs Morgan and their son were amongst several visitors to Goblup on Christmas Day and on 29th December TN wrote to R.A Sholl, Postmaster General, regarding the report against Morgan made by PC Whiteside (no details of alleged incident given). On 15th January 1898 TN got Mr Morgan to write to Inspector Gibbons about the want of water to dip sheep. ("After much to-ing and fro-ing, Inspector J Gibbons eventually gave exemption to the district until sufficient rain set in.")

Moriarty – On 14th September 1864 "Moriehearty" was at Nannamillup to borrow tools and stayed overnight. He was back again on 24th agreed to work for WHG and the next day fitted door and window to the blacksmith shop. He worked on the wool press, helped to get rafters ready and with putting them up in the blacksmith shop and he shingles the blacksmith shop roof. He fitted a new screw to the shop bench and also made window frames. He was, however, not at work on 10th December nor on 28th when WHG wrote "this is the third day this week and 2½ days before". No reason was given for Morie's absences. In January 1865 Morie was making window sills. In February he helped WHG split she-oak for shingles and began putting the roof on the new house.

Moriarty was obviously a competent carpenter. Was he perhaps Alexander Moriarty who had been a cabinet-maker and went to Adelaide in December 1863? Could he have returned to WA in 1864?

Morissey – Unidentified. In 1882, road repairing near Townsend's (between Pingelup and Mt Barker). TN inspected the work on behalf of the Kojonup Road Board on 26th July – apparently satisfactory – but on 7th August TN condemned 2 chain (40m) of the repairs on Townsend's flat.

Mullins – Unidentified shepherd. Came to Goblup on 14th April 1880 looking for a flock.

Mutual Improvement Society – In October 1894, 16 year old Sara Norrish in a letter to her brother George in Coolgardie wrote that the Mutual Improvement Society held a debate every week; the previous week's meeting had been held in the Alpha Hall and that week Mr William Langton had read a paper.

Nella (?Nellea) – Unidentified. Shepherding for Carmody in September 1883 and a member of the Goblup shearing team later that month. On 15th March 1884, TN gave Ed Donovan £3 to send by Mr Lott to Nellea at the Gordon. Five days later Nellea came to Sunnyside in the evening and TN paid him £3 for the bitch, Clotty.

Nelson, Alfred – Sandalwood cutting c1876 and by 1879 farming at Eticup. He lived with his father Joseph who had a blacksmith shop near the road running south-east towards Ettakup Pool. In 1889 he married Elizabeth Ann Carmody, daughter of Patrick Jnr. He went to Coolgardie along Holland Track in late 1893 and returned with horses exhausted. He and his family moved to Peerinellup about this time. Mrs Nelson (Lizzie who had worked for Mrs Norrish at one time) was buried in the old section of the Broomehill Cemetery.






