

#### SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2010 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING

- Council has entered into an agreement with the Water Corporation to access water from the No. 1 dam in Tambellup. This will assist Council into the future to drought-proof its parks and gardens, and will also assist the Tambellup Primary School to establish and maintain their new school oval. The Water Corporation will be installing a meter at the dam, and Council will be surveying the area for the most appropriate route for the gravity-fed pipeline to be installed.
- Council will remove the cement slab footpath on the western side of Taylor St in Tambellup, which will be replaced with compacted gravel as an interim measure. Provision for the replacement of the path will be included as part of the 2010/2011 draft budget deliberations.
- Council will call for tenders for the purchase of a second hand bitumen patching unit.

#### **WORKS**

Road construction has been a major focus for the works crew during February, with the widening and sealing of sections of Broomehill-Kojonup Rd and Tambellup West Rd near the Gordon River Bridge underway. Sealing of the first 2.4km section of Tambellup West Rd has now been completed, and it is anticipated all sealing works will be completed before the end of March. Council urges all road users to be mindful of these works and courteous to other drivers when travelling, slow down and drive to the conditions of the road.

#### **DIPROSE AND HOLLAND PARKS**

The parks have been the scene of much activity in recent weeks, with more to come in the very near future. At Diprose Park, the toilets are receiving a badly-needed refurbishment, pathways have been constructed prior to asphalting, and there is a touch of green to be seen thanks to regular watering by our parks & gardens crew. In recent weeks the electric BBQ and lights have been connected, making the picnic area ready for use. Early in March the shade installers will arrive, initially to install the poles for the shade sails over the junior play equipment and exercise equipment, then later to erect the sails. We expect to take delivery of the new play equipment for the junior area in the next couple of weeks, park furniture and a water fountain will be installed, and reticulation and landscaping will be carried out. At Holland Park, the reticulation has been installed and is already making a difference to the condition of the lawns. Again, the shade installers will be here early in March to install shade sails over the playground, and a new gazebo will be erected on the India St side of the park. New picnic tables and seats are to be installed near the picnic area and the playground.

We look forward to the completion of these projects, making our public areas attractive, welcoming and functional for

#### **BROOMEHILL RAILWAY PEDESTRIAN CROSSING**

residents and visitors to our community.

In November 2008 WestNet Rail granted approval for Council to construct a formal pedestrian crossing over the railway lines near the tourist information bay. In January this year, after work had commenced, that approval was withdrawn. The reason given was that the presence of double railway tracks in this location presented an "unacceptable risk to both railway operators and pedestrians" using the proposed crossing. As such, we are not permitted to construct the pedestrian crossing at this location.

Council staff, in consultation with representatives from WestNet Rail, are now working to establish a crossing at Lavarock St, with a new pathway adjacent to the Great Southern Hwy back towards the tourist information bay. Whilst this is not our preferred option, Council's priority is to provide a safe railway crossing for pedestrians and cyclists. WestNet Rail has advised they will not consider any alternative locations.

Gravel works completed at the intended site have been removed at the request of WestNet Rail and Council is currently awaiting approval from Main Roads, Department of Transport and Public Transport Authority to proceed with construction of the relocated crossing and pathway.

#### **BUDGET 2010/2011**

Council is about to commence the first stages of the preparation of the 2010/2011 budget.

As part of that process Community and sporting groups are invited to forward submissions to Council for consideration in the budget. Submissions are to be in writing and forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by close of business on Wednesday 31 March 2010.

#### RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **15 FEBRUARY 2010** and continues through until the **15 APRIL 2010** inclusive. During this period a permit is required for any burning to be undertaken. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief Fire Control Officer.

#### FROM THE SHIRE PRESIDENT

I would like to have reported that we have a much clearer direction on the State Government's Reform agenda after the recent forum held in Perth, however no clear direction was forthcoming. The forum was facilitated by the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) and held at the Ascot Racecourse. It was attended by over 300 concerned Councillors and CEOs. The Minister for Local Government, Hon John Castrilli addressed the forum and still maintained his previous position of saying that the reform of Local Government is a voluntary process and that he has no agenda or plan on what the end result should be. He stated that he would listen to each Council as we made our position clear to him. The forum supported WALGA's position on the reform process to date and passed a no confidence motion in the reform process.

The Ministers position and actions appear to be absurd. In my view if he was listening to councils and truly subscribed to voluntary decision making and the self determination rights of Councils, then our submission we put to him at the end of September 2009 would have been taken on board. Our submission clearly stated that our residents were opposed to a further amalgamation and the reasons for this position. It also included that the members of the Southern Link VROC, Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet were our preferred regional partners. If required, our submission stated that Broomehill-Tambellup would investigate the possibility of a merger with the VROC members but not until a feasibility study was undertaken. The study would need to demonstrate that such a merger would not be detrimental to our community. However without the support of all the VROC members (Cranbrook and Kojonup have indicated in their submissions that they do not support an amalgamation) any move towards an amalgamation will not be voluntary so therefore Council would not support it.

You would think that would be the end of it....but no.....the Minister has now "invited" us to join a Regional Transition Group (RTG) with our group being the Councils in the Southern Link VROC. A draft RTG agreement has been drawn up by the State Solicitors Office that requires all members of the RTG to sign. The brief for and RTG is to produce a business plan within the first 9 months and then work collaboratively towards an amalgamation on 01 July 2013. There are designated stages and clauses in the draft agreement that allow Councils to opt out of the process prior to an amalgamation however there are conditions attached. The State Government is offering \$100,000 plus to RTG to produce a business plan. Council's decision on whether or not it will enter into an RTG must be forwarded to the Minister for Local Government by 26 March 2010 Council representatives and the CEO recently attended a meeting in Kojonup and met with officers from the Department of Local Government to provide information on the RTG's and the draft agreements. The Council present gave a very lukewarm reception to the briefing and gave a clear message that they did not support the process in its current form and the perceived path that the Minister wants us to follow.

Councils view has not changed and we still represent the views of the electors of our district. Council will be considering and discussing any new developments prior to sending its advice to the Minister by 26 March 2010. I would think that it is highly unlikely that Council will enter into any formal agreement that does not have the support of the whole VROC and does not provide a clear direction.

The Minister has always said that he has no secret plan for how he wants Local Government to look after the completion of the reform process and that it is up to councils to decide their boundaries. But then, when they do make a determination he states that he does not accept that view and directs a new agenda. This is not only creating confusion but adds credence to the view that there is a planned agenda by the State Government that may very well include eventual forced amalgamations. An unpalatable outcome of all of this is the creation of a climate that is setting councils against each other. In my role as President of the Great Southern Zone of WALGA, I was elected to the State Council of WALGA and find after my first meeting that it is a very interesting forum. State Council consists of 12 Councillors from the metropolitan area and 12 country representatives who come together to express their zones views and to reach a consensus on larger issues affecting Councils and regions across the State. I mention this to let the community know that the State Council is a successful tool in getting issues heard at the highest level possible. So I encourage all residents to make your local Councillors or the CEO aware of any issues that you may have that fit the criteria.

Whilst all this is going on the business of the Shire is still being attended to and I believe much is happening. Our towns look great with the gardens and parks, the renovated toilets at Diprose Park as well as some much needed road works around the district. The deferral of Royalties to Region moneys will slow some projects that we had hoped to start. We can but hope the Government doesn't amend the rules too much more and we see a flow of the promised funds back to Local Governments to build much needed infrastructure and not see the funding diverted for other means.



Encourage large arm movements.


Model how to draw simple pictures - house, cat, tree, fish etc.

#### **Broomehill Historical Notes**

**Meyer, Edward** – Elected to Broome Hill Road Board on 21<sup>st</sup> March 1907. On 15<sup>th</sup> September young Meyer came to Sunnyside and got 6 School Board ......(illegible!) for his father who called on 7<sup>th</sup> October on School matters.

**Miles, James** – Called at Goblup on 15<sup>th</sup> July 1879 with an order from Anderson.

Moir, Alexander (Allie) – On 19<sup>th</sup> February 1883, TN spoke to Al Moir about taking a flock and the next day at Pootenup counted Armstrong's flock of 993 to him. In February 1886, Allie Moir was shepherding Henry Townsend's flock that TN was responsible for (for an annual fee) and on 27<sup>th</sup> TN counted them – 1132 including 20 culls of Townsend's. Allie brought the flock up to Sunnyside in October 1886 for washing and shearing and was back again on 9<sup>th</sup> November as all his things had been burnt the day before. In October 1888, al Moir had the flock up for shearing – 1071 – and started back to Pootenup on 7<sup>th</sup> November with 991. TN's son George went part way with him to help get the sheep through the poison. On 4<sup>th</sup> January 1889, TN paid Moir all his wages £23.13.6.

**Moir, Andrew** – On 1<sup>st</sup> June 1879, Andrew Moir called at Goblup at night to borrow a horse. He was on his way to Kojonup to telegraph for a Doctor as James Burchell had been shot accidentally at Camballup that evening by young Moir. Andrew returned at 2am on 3rd June and stayed until sunrise. On 23<sup>rd</sup> February 1882 Andrew and Fred Moir called at Goblup on their way back from Kojonup.

Moir, A – On 15<sup>th</sup> February 1882 a man named Davis called at Goblup for the loan of a horse. He had come from A Moir's and said that a man named Riley had died there supposedly from drink. On the 11th September 1893 at Broome Hill Mr a Moir paid TN £3 for the use of a plough that TN had lent to him some time before.

#### DIGITAL TELEVISION

The Rudd Government will implement a satellite service to provide digital television to viewers in regional black spot areas.

For the first time all free-to-air digital television services, including the original three commercial and two national channels, as well as new digital services such as ABC2, ABC3, SBS TWO, GO!, 7TWO and ONE HD, will be available to all

Australians, no matter where they live.

Under an agreement reached with all television broadcasters across Australia, broadcasters will upgrade more than 100 existing regional 'self-help' transmission facilities to operate in digital, while the Government will fully fund and build a new digital satellite broadcasting service for regional viewers who are unable to receive digital television from those facilities.

Any regional households not able to receive digital television from the upgraded 'self-help' sites will be served by the new satellite, which will also carry the full suite of digital channels. In order to access the new satellite service, these households will need to install a satellite dish, in which the Government will provide a satellite conversion subsidy to eligible households.



#### South Coast NRM and UWA future-proof with partnership

South Coast NRM and the University of Western Australia's Centre of Excellence in Natural Resource Management (CENRM) have formed a partnership to boost research, planning and delivery of NRM in the South Coast region.

Driven by a desire to forge a closer working relationship, the partners have signed a Memorandum of Understanding which will lead to improved investment in restoration and conservation of the land and water assets of the South Coast.

It is further anticipated that the partnership will generate greater educational and employment opportunities for NRM professionals in the region.

South Coast NRM chief executive Rob Edkins said the partners had significant interests in common and had already collaborated in several ways including the provision of university student placements in South Coast NRM projects and CENRM academic staff participation on South Coast NRM committees and working parties.

"We plan to work constructively together to help our collective interests grow and to consolidate ourselves as viable business entities into the future. Opportunities will also be developed to promote cross membership of the organisations to enhance benefits to members," Mr Edkins said.

CENRM director Professor Peter Davies explained the partners would provide facilities for the education and training of professionals and volunteers in NRM and improve opportunities for university students seeking practical experiences as part of, or in addition to, their studies.

"This agreement will provide a link between the research, education and management of the natural resources on the South Coast and should improve the outcomes of both organisations," he added.

South Coast NRM is an independent not-for-profit group that works with the community to improve the environment by preserving and protecting unique plants and animals; managing land and waterways sustainably and economically; and sharing knowledge and skill, including indigenous knowledge, in natural resource management.

CENRM's activities are centred on the scientific, economic and social dimensions of natural resource management including the teaching of undergraduate courses; supervision of postgraduate research; enhancing knowledge and understanding of NRM at a regional, national and international level; and supporting and informing communities.

The MOU will be reviewed annually and renewed by mutual agreement.

#### Innovative "Fishutes" perplex pelicans

Keen to help returned juvenile fish escape from predators, a group of professional estuarine fishermen from the South Coast have invented a unique "Fishute" device.

The bycatch reduction device comprises a concertina-style mesh shute that allows any undersized fish to be returned to the water out of sight of seabirds.

Normal fishing activities attract pelicans which prey upon released fish, particularly juvenile black bream, before they have the opportunity to escape.

WA SeaNet extension officer Neil MacGuffie said he helped invent the Fishute after being approached by industry to reduce the environmental impact of the fishery.

"We came up with the idea together through trial and error. It really was through industry initiative to operate more sustainably that we were able to develop this," he explained.

Mr MacGuffie revealed the device was introduced to a wider fishery industry meeting last week where it was enthusiastically received.

20 Fishutes have been constructed and are currently being used by the South Coast Estuarine Fishery.

South Coast Licensed Fishermen's Association president Paul Benson said the device allowed the fish to be safely released and to acclimatise to their surroundings, before attempting their escape from the pelicans.

"We've popped some fake eyes on the outside of the device and it's working well to stop the birds getting too close." Mr Benson added

South Coast NRM chief executive Rob Edkins said that by returning the juvenile fish to the water, the fishers were ensuring the future harvest and supply of locally caught fish.

"The Fishute is a great example of local ingenuity born out of a real desire to conserve and protect South Coast fish stocks," he said.

The development of the Fishute also highlights the advantages of this estuarine fishery introducing a Code of Practice for Responsible Fishing.

The Fishute project is supported by the professional fishermen of the South Coast Estuarine Fishery, SeaNet, OceanWatch Australia and South Coast NRM. The project was funded from South Coast NRM's coastal community engagement program through the Australian Government's Caring for our Country initiative.

The South Coast Estuarine Fishery's Fishute has been nominated for an Environment Award from the 2010 Western Australian Seafood Industry Awards. The winner will be announced on Friday 26 February.






