FROM THE BROOMEHILL FIRES:

Thank you to all those people who turned out on Saturday 28 November to assist with the many fires in Broomehill, and also to those who stayed on to monitor and mop up in the following days. Just a couple of issues which were raised over the course of the weekend:

- In an emergency fire situation, ring 000. They have the contacts and resources to enable a quick response from the brigades.
- Please do not rely on Harvest and movement bans being broadcast over the radio stations. If the deadline for broadcast is missed, a ban will not be broadcast until later in the day. The Shire's Harvest Ban Hotline is kept up to date, and text messages are sent as soon as possible when the decision is made to implement a ban. If in doubt, call your brigade fire captain, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers.



From the Council Meeting

WARD REVIEW

Following the close of the public submission period for the Review of Ward Boundaries, Council is required to make a recommendation to the Local Government Advisory Board. No comments were received during the public submission period. The matter was discussed at the November Council meeting, with the following proposal to be submitted to the Local Government Advisory Board for consideration:

- The current ward system be abolished and the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup moves to no wards
- That the number of elected members be reduced from nine to seven effective from the 2011 ordinary elections
- That the reduction in elected member positions be effected with only three vacancies occurring at the 2011 election.

TOWN DAM - BROOMEHILL TOWNSITE

Residents of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup are hereby advised that the standpipe at the town dam in the Broomehill townsite has been disconnected. This decision has not been taken lightly by the Council. The action is in an effort to ensure that there is an emergency bushfire water supply to cover the summer period.

Those residents who need to access water for household use or stock can do so through the standpipes around the Shire. Standpipes are located in

- India Street Broomehill –
- Greenhill North Road West Broomehill -
- Crawford Street Tambellup
- Tambellup West Road Tambellup (stock use only non potable supply)
- · Anderson's Bore Tambellup (stock use only non potable supply)

Residents wishing to access water from these standpipes will need to ensure that they obtain a swipe card to activate the standpipe. Swipe cards are available from the Shire Offices in Broomehill and Tambellup during normal office hours for a cost of \$22.00 each. The current cost of water from the standpipes is \$3.30 per kilolitre with a minimum charge of \$11.00.





Hello Everyone

Well the silly season is upon us again. We have had a very busy year with catering, travelling to Conferences and to meet up with other Branches, and plying the State Council with Motions for the next Conference.

Our highlight for November was the visit from Merilyn Winsland, giving her lively presentation of her time at the Nandom School in Ghana. Two dozen of us kept the Community Centre open after 4.00pm with all the questions, the interesting dialogue and photographs, and the excellent afternoon tea.

The Tambellup Branch of the CWA fundraised \$700.00 which went towards the building of the new toilet block at the school. Merilyn took us on a tour of the old toilet block. This defied description. I know even the hardiest of us would not have been able to use them. They were also creating a major health hazard for the school, so the injection of money from us was a godsend. The new block was finished and is in full use, and another block is now being built next to it.

Nandom has two high schools - the girls and the boys. Merilyn was at the boys school. The boys live in dormitories there, the teachers in houses on the school grounds. The boys bring in extra food for while they are at school. I am calling them boys. But many of them are adults, as they go to high school when they can afford to. Merilyn had many marriage proposals while she was there, however her dowry was well beyond their reach. She required four sheep and eight ducks, animals not seen in the district.

We would like to thank Merilyn for her presentation, and also thank the members of the community who came and joined us for the afternoon.

Our Christmas party will be on Sunday, 5th December at Glen Lossi in Kojonup. We are booked for 12.00pm. Please let Anne -Marie know if your going to be attending. We will be car pooling, so if you wish to participate, please be at the CWA rooms by 11.00am at the latest for an 11.15am departure.

The Rio Tinto Life Flight jet is celebrating a year in the skies as part of the Royal Flying Doctor Service fleet (RFDS).

The first year of operation for the only RFDS aero medical jet service—the only service of its kind to be available free of charge to most people—was highly successful, transporting more than 200 people from the furtherest reaches of the State.

The jet's ability to carry up to four patients has allowed the regular RFDS fleet to remain closer to bases throughout the State and has also resulted in the achievement of a significant milestone, in conducting the first double critical care transfer, where two critically ill patients were transported at the same time, each with their own critical care doctor and nurse team. This would not have been possible using the

The jet was made possible by a \$5 million partnership with Rio Tinto and is also supported by funding from Flying 1000 fundraising group, RFDS Victorian Section, Maroomba Airlines and the State Governments Royalties for Regions program. Total Fire Ban Changes to Assist Farmers

Changes to Total Fire Ban regulations mean you can now harvest or move vehicles across paddocks during a Total Fire Ban (TFB) as long as:

- a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban has not been put in place by your Local Government
- · you have a firefighting vehicle on site, with a minimum 400 litres of water.

Individual local governments will be responsible for placing Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans. This will happen when local weather conditions result in the Grassland Fire Danger Index (GFDI) reaching 35 (less in some shires).

If required a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban may be put in place at any time, especially if fire resources are stretched.

It is your responsibility, as the harvester operator to be aware of any bans in place before harvesting as you could be fined for breaching a ban.

Your local ABC radio regularly broadcasts bans during harvesting and bushfire seasons. Local governments also have additional processes of advising you of harvest and vehicle movement bans, such as recorded messaging services and SMS

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2010** and continues until **14 FEBRUARY 2011** inclusive.

The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited.

Residents are asked to be particularly vigilant in this regard, particularly with conditions throughout the Shire being so dry this year. For further information contact the Shire Office or your nearest Fire Control Officer.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and Radiowest 1071 as they are implemented. The Shire also has in place a Harvest Ban SMS service for residents. 

WATCH OUT FOR WILLOWS

South Coast NRM are concerned about the potential introduction of hybridized willow trees into local waterways and their impact on freshwater marron stocks. Homeowners, landholders and community groups are being urged not to buy willows (salix species) from nurseries or plant them in their gardens, because of the potential risk of crosspollination with other willow species.

The hybrid pest is already wreaking havoc in parts of NSW, VIC, SA, TAS and New Zealand, chocking up many freshwater aquatic systems and decimating marron populations. Willows drop large amounts of leaf matter into waterways which increases nutrient levels drastically and alters oxygen levels to the extent that aquatic life can be killed. There are 300 known species of willows worldwide and 30 species in Australia.



Works in November

With the dry conditions, much work has gone into ensuring our parks, gardens and ovals are in prime condition to cope with a hot summer period. Both ovals have been sprayed for black beetle, and all reticulation lines are regularly checked and maintained to ensure they operate for maximum benefit. The new gazebo in Holland Park has been completed, and with the installation of new tables and seats, adds to the appeal of the park. Plantings around the gazebo will be undertaken shortly.

Staff spent considerable time at the Broomehill Refuse site through November extinguishing a fire that had been lit in the pit. The fire smouldered for over a week, and eventually required the pit to be backfilled to extinguish it. **Residents are reminded rubbish at the tip is not to be burnt.**

The new fence around the Broomehill Refuse Site has been completed.

The construction crew have been working on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd and Heron Rd final trimming in readiness for sealing. By the time this issue goes to print, sealing should be completed on these sections of road.

The maintenance crew have had the Jetpatcher truck working across the shire carrying out bitumen patching, and will be concentrating on repairs to Toolbrunup Rd and Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month

One-Arm Jack – One of several Jack Smiths. On 30th July 1886, he was at the Sheep Wash yards and helped TN to tail lambs; said he had left Tambellarup. In August he was working with Ben Robins sinking a pond in the Chillicup paddock and came to Sunnyside on the 6th to get picks sharpened. On 1st September 1886 they finished the pond and on the 6th began putting up a fence over by Nelson's shop (blacksmith). On 25th November 1892, One-Arm Jack came to Goblup with Mrs House's team from Martinup (TN's sister) to pick up Costello's box.

Orchard, Rev J – On 16th April 1892 WHG called at Goblup with the new minister from Katanning, Mr Orchard. The following day, he preached "in the school" and Mr Piesse came for him in the afternoon. On 20th April, TN's daughter Hannah picked him up in Broome Hill to stay at Goblup for a few days. And on 23rd took him back to Broome Hill to catch the train to Katanning. Mr Orchard visited Eticup regularly each month until June 1893. He always called at Goblup, sometimes staying overnight and also visited the Grahams. On 18th June 1893 TN thought it was his "last time at Eticup".

Orchards and Gardens – In 1862, WHG planted turnips, cabbages and potatoes at Eticup and peas at Nannamillup. In 1863 he or one of his men planted cabbages, carrots, onions, potatoes, turnips, peas, kidney beans, melons, loquat, orange and peach pips. On 14th May 1864 he cut and hung green tobacco at Nannamillup. During that year' Flaherty planted onions, cabbages, carrots, mangle wurzle, peas, beans, potatoes, orange pips, together with mignonette, convolvulus, nasturtiums and chili seeds.

In 1879 at Goblup, TN pruned the grape vines and got more cuttings from Fairfield. On 7th May 1880, he planted four beds of turnips and cabbages. In July 1882, Joe Louther came up from Pootenup to get some cabbage plants so apparently he was maintaining a garden at the house there and on 4th August TN's order of fruit trees from Adelaide arrived – no details. In February 1883, Gillam's at Balyanup had so many peaches they were feeding them to the pigs. TN came away from there with as many peaches as would fit on the bottom of the trap, and 50lbs (22.7kg) of apples. At Sunnyside in 1883 TN planted 3 fig trees, 2 peaches and 15 other trees received from Adelaide. The family also planted flowers and cabbages at the new house. In 1884 TN planted the seeds of turnips, radishes, carrots and lettuce and put in a few potatoes. Later he planted out 106 cabbage plants and Mrs Norrish planted several rows of beans. TN also planted another lot of trees – 2 orange, 2 loquat, 2 mulberry, 2 cherry, 2 pear, 4 apple, 4 peach, 2 nectarine, 2 apricot and 2 cherry plum. Thomas Lott got 15 trees by the same order. In 1895, new varieties are mentioned – 5 almond trees, Lima beans, Jersey kale and thousand-headed kale, but also that year was the first mention that opossums were eating the fruit!


On 26th March 1907 wild winds stripped the fruit from the trees and the fruit had to be gathered up next day. On 10th July, Mr Breen, the fruit inspector came to inspect gardens. "All was right". In September that year TN grafted 44 muscat grape vines.

Otto J.H. – Postmaster from July 1892 – July 1893 and first to occupy the new Post Office. He was the Headmaster when the school opened in Ivy Lane in 1894 and may have been the teacher before this at Alpha Hall or the small building near the Police Station. He was also Road Board Secretary before R.H. Jones but date of appointment is not known. On 9th June 1895 he visited Goblup with Harry Jones – reason for call not given. J.H. Otto's salary as Postmaster was €20. The next Postmaster who was required to be telegraphist got £120.

Overton, Charles – May have been the shepherd who had been in some way involved with Aborigines in 1881, resulting in Police interest. He came to Goblup with Alf Nelson on 6th December 1883 and TN saw him with Wm Hayward near Pootenup on 17th March 1886.

Paddy – Aborigine Bobbinet is believed to have had a brother whom the men called Paddy and who worked for WHG and stayed on with him after Bobbinet's execution, but in the diary available, WHG does not mention the name. However from 1879 to 1886 a Paddy worked for TN lamb minding and shepherding at Pootenup and Wackenup. He helped to shift flocks and also did other work- chaff cutting, making yards, kangaroo shooting, helping with reaping and binding. In March 1884 TN referred to him as "Old Paddy", but there is no way of knowing whether this man was Bobbinet's brother.






