- Punctured if they're metal

Containers with dirt, rust & dye stains **ARE** accepted, any unclean or partly filled containers **WILL NOT BE** accepted and will remain the property of the chemical users.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2010** and continues until **15 APRIL 2011** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2010** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2011** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited.

DOG OWNERS – REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations are due for renewal at **31st October** each year. If you own a dog then your dog **MUST** be registered and **MUST** be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog **MUST** be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

Notification will be sent to owners of dogs with registration expiring in 2010. Payment for re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. Please contact Siegrid at the Shire for more information.

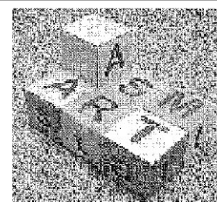

Happy gardening - Shirley Brokenshire

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Norrish, Richard Snr – WHG makes several references to Richard Norrish Snr in 1862 and 1863. When WHG was at Balgarrup on 18th June 1862, Norrish came there and settled about the Kojonup Race funds. On 19th September 1862 Norrish and his son Tom borrowed 12lbs sugar and 1-5/8lbs tea. In March 1863 Norrish and Treasure called at Eticup and told WHG that Treasure had seen his fillies at Wagin Lake and Norrish was there again on 1st April. On 13th April, Norrish's cart returned from Albany bringing WHG a number of articles; "Grog at night!" On 12th December 1863 Norrish and Treasure called at Eticup on their return from York.

Norrish, George – Thomas and Christen's eldest son, born early 1873. When old enough, he worked for his father at Sunnyside and Goblup. On 13th April 1893, the day before John Holland and his party set off to cut a direct route to the goldfields, George and his cousin Willie from Tambellarup started for the goldfields. They loaded their wagon the day before with provisions including 5 bags of flour but had to leave without their bulk supply of water as the tank TN had hoped to give them was beyond repair. On Monday 17th April, TN got a 200 gallon (910lt) tank from Patrick Garrity and took it to Broome Hill for R.S. Climie to send up the line to George. Later that year George became ill and came home for a while but later returned to the goldfields. In December 1894 he was accidentally killed by his horse running him against a tree. His parents brought him home and he was buried in the Eticup Cemetery. George's cousin Willie remained in the goldfields but contracted typhoid fever and died in 1895.

Norrish, John – Son of TN's brother John. Employed by TN at Goblup in the early 1890s. On 8th November 1890, he and his cousin George travelled to Pootenup by train to shear a flock of sheep still kept there. His work at Goblup included watering and shepherding sheep in Grover's paddock, working with Kindred and the Chinese, and helping to put fence posts near Fairfield. He finished up on 7th July to go to Kojonup but came back to let TN know that his brother John (John's father) had died that morning.

Norrish, Mary and May – Fourth and fifth daughters of Thomas and Christen. After the school was closed at Eticup, the girls attended the Broome Hill School and usually walked from Goblup. One day in October 1894 Mary (14) and May (10) killed a snake on the way to school. Mary married R.H. Jones in 1901 and May married J. Frederick Hillman.

Norrish, Nora – Second daughter of Thomas and Christen. On 19th May 1892, the Rector, Mr Orchard, asked if Nora would take school at Eticup as Miss Grover had resigned and on 10th September she had to go to Broome Hill to sign for her school pay. On 23rd September Nora gave the school children a tea party; WHG attended and presented the prizes. On 19th December 1895, Nora went with her mother and Mrs Morgan to examine the children at the Broome Hill School and give prizes. Nora married Frank Marshall Gare of Katanning in 1902.

Norrish, Richard – Second son of Thomas and Christen. Richard worked with his father when old enough and in the 1890s lived in the Sunnyside house with his eldest sister Hannah (Tissie) keeping house for him. He had his own pastoral lease at Wagerup and on his father's death in 1908 he inherited much of the Sunnyside land. In 1906 he replaced his father on the Broome Hill Road Board. He married Esther McDonald, daughter of Donald and Mary of Birnam Wood – just east of Broome Hill – and at first they lived in the building that had been Krakouer's Store, which Ettie referred to as Avon House. Sgt Richard Norrish, stretcher-bearer with the 16th Battalion, won the Military Medal in July 1918 for gallantry and devotion to duty during the operations against Vaire and Hamel.

In 2009, 40,000km was travelled over five John Curtin Weekends using 22 buses, nine vans and three planes.

Also part of these activities, the John Curtin Medal is awarded to members of the community who demonstrate his qualities of vision, leadership and community service.

The Medal is presented at a special ceremony that commemorates the anniversary of his accession to the country's highest political office on 7 October 1941.

Curtin Volunteers! is a non-for-profit student run organisation that has been a part of Curtin for 15 years.
