WHATS GOING ON IN YOUR TOWN?

Broomehill:

Residents will have noticed the installation of the new play equipment in Holland Park has been completed. It is hoped all younger members of the community will enjoy the equipment. Shade will be installed over the play equipment prior to summer.

The paving in front of the Administration building has been completed, and newly planted gardens around the town centre are starting to flourish.

Work has commenced on the pathway across the railway line, from Leven Street to the Great Southern Highway. The path will be surfaced with black asphalt, and a maze will be installed at the railway lines in accordance with the Public Transport Authority's requirements.

Tambellup:

Diprose Park has once again been a hive of activity, with many of the planned projects underway. Concrete pads for the shelters have been laid, a path around the exercise equipment has been concreted with assistance from community workers, the new play equipment has been installed, pathways have been prepared ready for asphalting and work has commenced on the entrance to the park. Tables and seating for the picnic area have arrived, and together with the BBQ, will be installed in the near future. Shade will be installed over the smaller children's play equipment prior to summer. The skate park is nearing completion, with the weather holding up the final surfacing of the individual pieces. The park should be ready for installation during October.

FROM THE MEETING

• Approval was granted to the Tambellup Tennis Club to renew its club restricted license for the period of 01 October 2009 to 30th April 2010.

Following the close of the advertising period, with no feedback or comments received, Council adopted the Strategic Directions – Plan for the Future 2009-2019. This document is available for perusal at both Administration offices, and can be viewed at the Shire's website, www.shirebt.wa.gov.au.

• The kitchen at the Broomehill Hall will be upgraded as part of the repairs and renovation of the building. This project will be completed using funds from the Broomehill Village Hall Replacement Reserve. Council endorsed the Structural Reform document which has been submitted to the Reform Steering Committee. Copies of the submission are available for perusal at the Broomehill and Tambellup Administration offices. It is also available to view on the shire's website, www.shirebt.wa.gov.au.

WORKS

Severe winds have slowed road construction and maintenance as the outside crews have been continually called on to remove trees from roads over the last month. Work has been progressing on the Broomehill-Kojonup Road widening but has been hindered by wet weather and wild winds. A bull dozer has been contracted to help remove trees on this project. Thank you to property owners in the vicinity who have been accommodating in allowing trees to be stacked inside their fence lines.

Gravel carting will commence in the middle of September on the Tambellup West Road if weather conditions improve. Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads: Chillicup Rd, Brassey Rd, Nardlah Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Norrish Rd, Batchelor North Rd, Latham St, Tieline North Rd, Collins Rd, Cemetery Rd, South Batchelor Rd,

Morgan Rd, McGuire Rd, Hassell Rd, Wansbrough West Rd, Barracup Rd.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2009** and continues until **15 APRIL 2010** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers. The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2009** and continues through until the **14 FEBRUARY 2010** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited. For further information contact the Shire Office or your nearest Fire Control Officer.

DOG OWNERS – REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations are due for renewal at <u>31st October</u> each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area. Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

PRESIDENTS REPORT

Council has completed its Structural Reform Submission on behalf of Broomehill-Tambellup and has clearly stated our position. I believe there will be a drawn out period over summer before there is any outcome from the submission and any State government determination on our future direction. We have made every attempt to do everything possible to present our case.

The completion of the submission should give us a break from the amalgamation issue, and let us concentrate on the important things a council does within the community. Royalties for Regions projects, as well as Council's own programs, are delivering many positives to the whole shire. Following the amalgamation of Broomehill and Tambellup it was natural that people would be more focused on activities in the 'old shires' and looking for comparisons between the old and the new, but as they say, "Rome wasn't built in a day". Council is firmly focused on delivering relevant services to all ratepayers and residents.

Royalties for Regions plus Councils own programs, are not only resulting in projects such as upgrades to Holland and Diprose Parks, refurbishment of the Broomehill public toilets, paving and maintenance to the Broomehill office, refurbishment of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion, but is also providing additional employment for local residents.

The continual rainy days have pleased the farmers in the district, but have also hampered the progress of the road maintenance program. Works will be completed when the conditions are suitable and I assure you Glen and his team are doing all they can to get to all roads. If you have any specific problems please contact the Shire office.

So whilst not asking for undue patience, I would just ask you to give some time to allow Council to fulfil this year's projects to give a complete picture and allow some leeway for the added burden of the governments agenda, which I might add, isn't over by a long way.

Thank you sincerely to all those who assisted and attended.







Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

McGuire, Arthur – Fourth son of Philip and Mary. In July 1864, 16 year old Arthur played cricket for the Eticup Cricket Club and in august practiced for the match against Kojonup.

McKenna – On 22nd September 1890, TN counted the late r Wilson's sheep from the natives and gave them to McKenna. He was to be paid £3.15.0 a month. This was possibly a short arrangement as on 27th

November 1890 McKenna was at Goblup with TN's brother John and two days later took over a different flock of sheep at Sunnyside. On 13th December, Mr Norrish and one of her daughters took rations to McKenna at Sunnyside. On the 20th McKenna shifted the flock up to Goblup for TN to draft 20 culls for his brother George at Oak Farm.

McKenzie, Albert – Fourth son of John McKenzie and Janet (nee Moir). In partnership with his brother Leslie at Fairfield which their father had bought for them – he living there in 1900 – 1910; Leslie 1910-1919. TN mentions Albert and his family several times in 1907. McKenzie, John – Three times mayor of Albany. His third wife was Sarah Wray, Mr Thomas Norrish's sister. On 3rd September 1883, at Albany, John Garrity took his sandalwood to McKenzie's as the price offered by others was too low. John and Mrs McKenzie came to Sunnyside for a visit on 14th June 1898. John stayed until 22nd June, helping around the property while there – grubbing and burning prunings –and on two occasions went to Goblup with TN for dinner (midday).

McKenzie, Leslie – Fifth son of John and Janet McKenzie. Was staying at Sunnyside in November 1892. Was in partnership with his brother Albert at Fairfield which their father had purchased for them – he living there 1910-1919. His daughter Lesley attended the Broome Hill School and is included in a school photograph c 1912.

McKenzie, Lowrie - Eldest son of John & Janet McKenzie. As a young man, Lowrie visited the Garrity's regularly - Mrs Garrity was his aunt. He called at Goblup in 1879 and was there again on 13th May 1880 returning TN's roller from Garrity's. The pattern of his visits to Goblup suggest he came up from Albany in 1880, 1881 and 1882 to help with the shearing at Green Hill. In 1882 he arrived from Albany saying the measles were still very bad there. He was already showing symptoms and was down with the disease the following day. He called at Goblup on 15th August and TN wrote "He has got over the measles but should not have come here so soon." On 24th August, Miss Williams, the Governess, had the measles and the complaint soon spread through the settlement.



This grant will enable the regional body to continue its support of the local shires of – Broomehill-Tambellup, Kent, Woodanilling, Kojonup, Gnowangerup and Katanning, who in turn help and support parents of children 0-4 years of age in their shire.
