SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 20 August 2009, commencing at 4.00pm at the Broomehill Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

FROM THE MEETING

- Council will seek approval from the Department for Local Government & Regional Development to amend priorities for Royalties for Regions funding to bring forward the refurbishment of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion into Year 1 funds.
- Council will make a donation of \$100 to Katanning Senior High School's Spirit Week.
- Council accepted an offer for the sale of property at 48 India St, Broomehill.

Council endorsed the draft strategic plan – Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Strategic Directions – Plan for the Future 2009-2019.

BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2009/2010 budget was adopted by Council at a special meeting on 9 July. The budget includes an increase in general rates of 4% with an increase in the minimum rates from \$275 to \$300.

Highlights of the budget include:

ROADS PROJECTS:

A total of \$1,393,600 will be expended on capital road works projects this financial year. Council will be assisted in this with funding through the Regional road Group, Roads to Recovery and Black Spot Funding.

Projects include:

- Broomehill-Kojonup Rd widen and seal the next 5.5km section;
- Broomehill-Kojonup Rd reseal 4km section;
- Tambellup West Rd widen and seal 5.5km section;
- Tie Line Rd reseal 4.3km section
- Pootenup Rd reseal 1.5km section and stagger Hassell Rd intersection.
- Crosby Rd widen and resheet 2km section
- Wandoo Rd realignment and construction
- Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd reseal section
- Heron Rd clear and seal intersection

Etna Rd - clear and resheet 3km section

MAJOR PROJECTS:

Major projects include:

- Continuation of Diprose Park redevelopment
- Redevelopment of Holland Park
- Installation of skate park in Tambellup
- Construct new public toilets in Broomehill
- Install new reticulation at Holland Park
- Refurbishment of Tambellup Sports Pavilion
- Continuation of Broomehill Hall renovation project

Installation of pedestrian crossing over railway line in Broomehill

PLANT REPLACEMENT

The budget includes provision to upgrade/purchase the following equipment this financial year:

Volvo loader, Multipac Multi Tyred roller, Isuzu truck, John Deere grader, John Deere tractor, Plant trailer.

Replacement:

Caterpillar grader, John Deere 4610 tractor mower, vibrating roller, 5 utilities, crew cab truck.

New Equipment:

Skid Steer and attachments, John Deere Gator 6x6, Plant trailer, road broom.

Council is required to prepare a strategic plan to guide the operations of the Shire into the future. The draft document has been prepared, and we are now seeking public comment. WORKS

Works have commenced clearing along Tambellup West Rd in preparation for widening of the seal to 7m. If you are travelling in this area please be aware of signage indicating road works and drive accordingly.

Maintenance grading is continuing across the shire, with the following roads receiving attention through June and July: South Greenhills Rd, Chillicup Rd, Nookanellup Rd, Warrenup Rd, Crosby Rd, Graham Rd, Norrish Rd, South Punchmirup Rd, Brassey Rd, Birt Rd, Hilder Rd, Pindellup Rd, Heron Rd, Fletcher Rd, Etna Rd, White Rd and Beejenup Rd. The rains experienced this month have seen the normal seasonal deterioration of gravel road surfaces across the shire. Graders are currently working full time to address this, and we ask for your patience in this regard; please drive to the conditions.

The maintenance crew are working on road signage across the shire and rural numbering for urban properties in Broomehill as well as undertaking general road maintenance.

The parks and gardens crew is currently a member short due to illness, and have been spending time in Broomehill to complete tasks commenced. Community workers have assisted Council staff to remove gravel from the War Memorial rose garden, and this will be replaced with garden mix.

RURAL NUMBERING

Council staff have recently been working to replace missing rural and urban addressing signs at properties across the Shire. The rural addressing program was an initiative of the State Government, and was implemented by Council to continue the standardising of addressing across Western Australia. Its primary purpose is to assist the emergency services (Police, FESA, St John Ambulance) by providing a standard form of addressing throughout the state to enable a quick response to emergency situations.

This information is also used by other organisations including utility providers (Telstra, Water Corporation, Western Power/Synergy) and Australia Post. The information is provided to these agencies by Landgate.

Residents are reminded that the rural number sign should remain in place at the entrance to your property. If you have not yet been allocated a number sign to your property please advise Terry at the Shire on 98253555.

RUBBISH TIP REMINDER

Residents are once again reminded not to place hot coals in the pit at either tip site. Council staff have recently been called on to attend to a number of fires at the tip. Burning at the tip, whether intentionally or not, constitutes a breach of the license issued to operate the tip sites, and the Shire runs the risk of losing the license through such breaches. This would result in the permanent closure of the tips and added inconvenience to residents.

Please ensure ashes and coals are cold prior to taking them to the tip. With consideration and care by all users, the life of our tips can be preserved. We ask for your cooperation in these matters.

The recent report of a deer at large, apparently in the Tambellup area, highlights the need for members of the public to report any unusual animals immediately.

Department of Agriculture and Food biosecurity officer Eileen O'Neill said that to prevent another feral animal developing widespread populations in the wild, it was very important that wild deer were reported guickly so they could be removed.

'Wild deer present an extreme threat to Western Australia, with the potential to cause damage to agriculture, the environment and public amenity', she said.

'They are declared pests in Western Australia and landholders have a legal obligation to both report this species on their properties and to control them.'

Deer cause a variety of adverse impacts of an economic, environmental and social nature. This includes competition with livestock and forestry, horticulture, and fruit production. Deer damage native vegetation, compete with native animals and spread weed seeds.

The Red Deer, which is one of the two main species farmed in the State, is listed on the IUCN's "100 of the World's Worst Invasive Alien Species", alongside the Cane Toad and the Common Starling.

The two main pathways that allow deer to establish feral populations are escape from deer farms and translocation and release of animals into the wild for hunting.

Any sightings of deer in the wild or other unusual animals should be immediately reported to your local Biosecutiry officer or the department's Pest and Disease Information Service on freecall 1800 084 881.

To assess your full responsibilities you must consult the relevant **Codes of Practice** and other relevant legislation. The following provides a brief summary of the minimum requirements for Landholders and S7 Retailers.

Under Section 24 of the *Poisons Act 1964*, 1080 and Strychnine in Western Australia is administered by the Department of Health (DoH). The Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA) is an authorised Department under Section 24 to manufacture and administer the above products for agricultural protection on behalf of DoH.

Currently farmers and pastoralists in Western Australia that want access to 1080 or strychnine for the control of declared animals require authorisation from the Chief Executive Officer of the Department to transport and use the products on their properties. To gain this authority farmers and pastoralists are required to complete an application form and present it to their local DAFWA Biosecurity officers who will then undertake a Risk Assessment of the proposed use of 1080 or strychnine and ensure that the applicant or their nominated person is appropriately trained in its use.

If approved the authorised person is provided with an approval form that identifies the poison to be used, the quantity of the poison authorised, a set timeframe to use the poison and a voucher authorising supply. Landholders are then required to present the voucher to an S7 retailer to collect their authorised poisons.

Department of Health Regulations require S7 retailers to store 1080 and strychnine products in a lockable container, with-in a secure, lockable cabinet/cage/building (i.e. there must be two lockable barriers between the product and the outside). Landholders are required to transport and store 1080 and Strychnine in a secure lockable container.

The process

- Landholders must apply for use of 1080 and strychnine through your local Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA).
- Risk Assessment and Approval is undertaken by DAFWA (the landholder must have had training in the safe use and handling of 1080 and /or strychnine).
- A 1080 or strychnine Authorisation Voucher is issued to the landholder; may be sent direct to the S7 retailer with prior arrangement, or kept by the DAFWA officer, for the product to be collected by them personally from the retailer. (Some products have restrictions on who can collect them form the S7 retailer – see below).
- 4. The Authorisation Voucher states who is authorised to pick up the 1080 or strychnine product. Only the person nominated to receive the 1080 or strychnine product listed on the Authorisation Voucher can pick up the product. S7 retailers must verify the identity of the person picking up the product (e.g. driver's licence).
- Landholders can only pick up (on presentation of a valid Authorisation Voucher) 1080 products ready for direct field application or strychnine for use on wild dog trap jaws to be used on properties within the local government areas as listed in Appendix A, Schedules 1 and 2 of the Code of Practice for the Safe Use and Management of

- Strychnine (in the Agricultural areas strychnine for use on dog trap jaws is restricted to the following shires: Chapman Valley, Dalwallinu, Esperance, Lake Grace, Morawa, Mt Marshall, Mukinbudin, Narembeen, Nungarin, Ravensthorpe, Perenjori, Koorda, Kondinin, Kulin, Northampton, Mullewa, Yilgarn and Westonia. Other locations can be approved by Authorising Officers of DAFWA).
- Only suitably endorsed licensed pest management technicians or Authorised Officers from DAFWA can pick up 1080 concentrate formulations i.e. "one shot" impregnated oats, 1080 Concentrate liquid or strychnine for the preparation of emu bait. These are restricted products and <u>cannot</u> be picked up by a landholder.
- 7. S7 Retailers must keep all records of 1080 and strychnine sales and transfers on file for a minimum of two years from the supply date. These are needed to comply with the audits undertaken by the Department of Health. (Refer to 'Requirements for Record Keeping' of the relevant 'Code of Practice April 2009') which will be provided by DAFWA.
- If requested, S7 retailers must supply landholders with the manufacturer's MSDS for the product/s and/or be directed to the relevant Code of Practice on the DAFWA website.

If you have any queries concerning 1080 and strychnine products and procedures, please contact your local office of the Department of Agriculture and Food.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

McDonald, John (Jack) - Youngest son of Donald and Mary. Married Ellen McArthur of Tambellup. In partnership with his parents and brother Hector at Birnam Wood and worked at Jam Creek with Hector. Moved to Tambellup and opened a blacksmith shop there.

McDonald, Lachlan - Second son of Donald and Mary. In 1901 married Hannah (Tissie) Norrish and was first owner of

McDougall, Alick - On 18th January 1865, WHG referred to Alick McDougall passing Nannamillup. In September 1882, Alick McDougall came to Goblup looking for a flock (ie: job as a shepherd) and started shearing for TN on 3rd October.

McEvoy, Peter - Called at Goblup twice in July 1879 and came in September with Dick Wilson, looking for a flock. He came again on 16th April 1888 with horse and trap and had a black woman traveling with him. TN hired him to take Sam Smith's flock until shearing time. The flock shifted to

Wackenup on 15th May and then to McGuire's on 24th. TN learned on 1st June that the sheep were getting in the poison and 9 lambs had died. McEvoy became ill in September and Tommy Bones was sent to take over the flock at Deep Creek. When TN went to count sheep on 22nd September he found three had been poisoned the day before leaving 773 -18 gone in 5 weeks. On 24th September TN settled with McEvoy, paying him £6.4.0. One of the three graves at Fairfield is believed to be that of Peter McEvoy's wife.

McFarlane, John and Daniel Fleming - Started at Goblup on 16th April 1882 to learn about farming. They were there for 1 week without wages as money was no consideration at the time. TN took them to Martinup with him on 18th April and commented that they were very bad riders. They helped TN with grubbing and burning wood, marking out lambing yards at Salt Well, and took rations to O'Brien. On 19th May McFarlane went to Chester's camp for the lambing. On 23rd August 1882 TN started McFarlane for Albany with the teams. They arrived on 28th August and on 30th TN saw McFarlane away on the steamer that had arrived from England (bound for Adelaide?).

McGee, Thomas – May have worked for TN's brother Richard Norrish as he and TN's nephew Thomas brought back the wagon from Richard's on 11th October 1882.

McGuiness, Edward - At Goblup on 28th April 1879 with Drury, and there again seven times from March to June 1880 usually to get meat or sheep. On 1st June 1882 he came to Goblup to get John Norrish's cow to take to Albany. McGuire, Marianna - Second daughter of Philip and Mary. Anna visited Goblup several times during 1888.

McGuire, Philip- Pensioner guard, married Mary Ann Reardon at Albany. On 10th January 1862 WHG saw Phil McGuire and Tom Garrity at Balgarup. McGuire settled permanently at Moorelup in 1869, sandalwood cutting and carting. He visited Goblup in 1879 and Mrs McGuire was there in September with John Maher and Mrs Maher. On 25th January 1880, "old" McGuire (fully 10 years older than TN!) brought an order of TN's shepherd Robinson for £3. On 21st January 1882, Mrs McGuire took some of the younger children to Goblup to be vaccinated but the Doctor did not come. In March, Dick Wilson and his flock were shifted to McGuire's and on 3rd April that year TN saw

for Albany with three loads of sandalwood. On 11th January 1883 TN saw old McGuire at Pootenup with his sons cutting chaff; they had rented TN's Pootenup Farm.

McGuire's two teams and Hayward's start from McGuire's






