SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 18 June 2009, commencing at 4.00pm at the Broomehill Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

WORKS

Construction works on roads have been a major focus of the activities carried out this month. Sealing works on Pootenup Rd have been completed, with Javelin St and Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd sealing to be carried out shortly. Resheeting of Nookanellup Rd, and the Black Spot-funded corner realignment on Birt Rd are almost complete. Clearing has almost been completed on Brassey Rd in preparation for gravel resheeting.

The Parks and Gardens crew have spent time planting out the information bay in Broomehill as well as carrying out routine maintenance tasks around both towns. The Tambellup oval has responded well to recent works carried out. A number of dry patches have appeared, due to the failure of some pop up sprinklers. These are being replaced as required.

The Maintenance crew has been active across the shire bitumen patching and replacing guide posts where needed. Community workers have raked and cleaned up around the Broomehill and Tambellup cemeteries. Their next tasks will be painting kerbing around town streets in Tambellup and whipper snipping in Broomehill.

RUBBISH TIP REMINDER

Now the cooler weather is upon us, residents are reminded not to deposit hot coals at the tip. By this action the risk of fires in the refuse pit is increased. Burning at the tip, whether intentionally or not, constitutes a breach of the license issued to operate the tip sites, and the Shire runs the risk of losing the license through such breaches. This would result in the permanent closure of the tips and added inconvenience to residents.

With consideration and care by all users, the life of our tips can be preserved. We ask for your cooperation in this matter.



Factsheet



Dispelling the myths



FACT: The internationally recognised standard for canola to be considered non-GM is for the canola to contain less than 0.9% of GM material. Under the conditions applied to the growing of non-GM and GM canola in Australia, contamination of neighbouring farms/crops at levels greater than the internationally recognised 0.9% threshold is not expected to occur as:

MYTH: GM canola will contaminate neighbouring farms or crops




- GM canola is predominantly a self-pollinator and is not a strong cross-pollinator.
- Australian studies have shown that in canola crops planted alongside each other the rate of cross-pollination found was less than 0.1% well below the internationally recognised 0.9% threshold.
- Gene flow to other plants like fruit trees, vegetables, wheat or weeds is virtually nil. In extremely rare cases where crossing may occur sterile hybrids can form but they can't reproduce.

FACT: There is no premium market for non-GM canola

- Japan which is often touted as an anti-GM market million tonnes of GM canola from Canada every year. Oil from non-GM and GM canola is mixed in this market.
- Europe which has been importing non-GM canola, has this year announced approvals for importation of GM canola for human
- Canada Studies on market premiums have shown no significant price difference between Australian non-GM canola and Canadian GM canola.

MYTH: Once GM is out there, there is no turning back





This can be achieved through appropriate herbicide strategies during the pre-seeding phase of the crop or with selective herbicides in crop

FACT: To date we are not aware of a case anywhere in the world where a farmer has been sued for accidentally contaminating a neighbour's farm.

In the unlikely situation that there was a case of contamination it would be treated in the same way as other agricultural issues like chemical spray drift, soil movement or weeds moving between properties.

MYTH: Non GM-farmers will have to pay Monsanto royalties if their

FACT: It is almost impossible for accidental contamination through either pollen or seed flow to raise the presence of GM material beyond the threshold level of 0.9%.

Monsanto has stated publicly that it would not take action against farmers for accidental presence (ABC Country Hour, April 15 2009).



MYTH: Multinationals with predatory contracts want to take over food

FACT: It is important to point out that no farmer is being forced to grow GM canola or sign a contract against their will.



Farmers are smart business people who will weigh up the advantages and disadvantages, costs and benefits of GM technology and make their own choice as to the usefulness of the technology.



In addition, as patents on gene technology expire other companies will have the opportunity to provide alternative varieties and products in competition to the multinationals.

MYTH: GM poses a risk to human health



Diprose Park Outdoor Gym Equipment

An exciting new range of outdoor gym equipment for adults is now available for all to enjoy in Diprose Park. Funded through a grant from the Premier's Physical Activity Taskforce, the new outdoor gym features six pieces of equipment including a stepper, Butterfly Press, Ab-hip Swinger, Cross Trainer, leg press and Rowing Machine. Club Development Officer Kellie Patterson said the new equipment has mechanisms that use body weight to provide resistance for muscle development. "The new gym equipment can be used by anyone, however it is recommended that children under 13 be supervised by adults, and is perfect for those who would like to ease back in to an exercise routine, Kellie said."

Congratulations to Broomehill and Tambellup who where apart of Australias South West Familiarization Tour last week. A group of 9 Tourism representatives (Tourism WA, RAC Travel, Thriffty, Mt Barker, Fremantle and Swan Valley Visitor Centres) participated in a 'get to know hands on whats out there' tour, so they can better promote our area to prospective future tourists. The feedback has been hugely positive and many—I didn't know that was there or It really is beautiful comments have come our way. Fremantle and Swan Valley Visitor Centre have on average 400 people thru their doors a day (close on 300 000 visitors between

Fremantle and Swan Valley Visitor Centre have on average 400 people thru their doors a day (close on 300 000 visitors between them per year), which is FOOD for thought as Tourism research indicates that on average each visitor spends \$75 per day. If these centres can successfully promote our Hidden Treasures area to just one eighth (37 500 visitors), in which the visitor spends one day and night in the region it would drop over \$2 000 000 into our small towns.

Developments and Projects been implemented or planned

- **A. Shire of Cranbrook** enthusiastically joined the Hidden Treasures partnership, which encompasses the communities of Frankland River, Tenderden.
- **B. Rural Group Tours Development Project** This is an ongoing 2 year project funding \$100,000 AusIndustries, \$15,000 Great Southern Development Com, \$7,000 from Shires annual contribution and approx \$100,000 in-kind from HT working Group & Shires. The Group Tours Tool Kit is in draft form so we are getting closer to reaching the outcomes of this project due to be completed in September this year.
- **C. Murdoch University** "Hidden Treasures Destination Management Plan" A partnership project worth approx \$20,000 but cost to HT was accommodation, meals, fuel and some local guides.
- D. Review the existing HT Destination Marketing Plan, which is now 5 years old and most recommendations have been implemented or in their final stages. Develop a new 2020 Hidden Treasures Destination Development and Marketing Plan. Funding has been sort through Royalties for regions. This Plan when developed will be similar to the existing HT Plan, but more projects based. It will also hopefully become a tool to assist not only for HT working group to continue to develop and market successfully into the future, but Shires, community groups and individuals will be able to utilize it in their individual endeavours of planning and developing their tourism assets.
- **E. Design and production of promotional items**, vests, caps etc (the HT Bob Tail logo is proving to be very popular and we hope to capitalize on this and also maybe assist our financial sustainability)
- F. Up-grade of web-site was done mid 08. Soon to include the communities of Cranbrook.

- **G. Re-aliening the exiting HT Drive Trail** and signage to incorporate our new partner the Shire of Cranbrook and associated communities
- H. Design and production of detailed HT Drive Trail Map. Funding has been sort through Royalties for Regions; the Map is the last phase in the HT Drive Trail Signage Project and will be built around the 70 HT extrusion signs. These are the finger signs Shires where given to highlight their individual communities tourism assets, you should have 5 signs per communities. The object is to link all these assets to encourage visitors to stay longer in or around each of our communities. (If Shire haven't erected your signs yet it would be appreciated if you could in the near future)
- I. Planning activities and promotion in preparation the Ulysses AGM to be held in Albany in March 2010. Expected number of visitors to the GS Region 5,000+ from one to 4 weeks. HT was promoted at this year's AGM in Penrith Qld and the organizes have expressed many riders will be looking to travel, Tour and participate in organized day Rallies throughout the HT area, so great opportunity for all our communities
- J. We have been recently working very closely with the Caravan & Motor Home Club of Australia WA Branch to encourage more Caravanners to visit the HT. They have been assisting with valuable advice on this large tourism segment.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first

pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and appendites in these digries and we

wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

McDonald, Euphemia (Pheme) — Daughter of Donald and Mary, married Arthur Allardyce of Anglesea, Gnowangerup.

McDonald, Eva — Daughter of Donald and Mary. Married David Ball. After the 1914-18 War and the death of her husband in the Army, she and her son Hector moved back to Broome Hill. Hector is included in the school photo of the Big Room in 1922. About that time Eva organized a Children's Fancy Dress Ball and dressed a set of Elves and Fairies. Late in the 1920's Mrs Ball leased 'The Reste' and a small area of land, obtained a permit from the Agricultural Department and experimented with growing tobacco for a few years. She later married Brother Fruer (later to

be Bishop Fruer).

McDonald, Hector – Second youngest son of Donald and Mary. In partnership with his parents and the youngest son Jack. A regular visitor to Sunnyside, he became engaged to Sarah Norrish in 1901 but they did not marry until 1907 in a ceremony at St Peter's Church, Eticup. By this time Hector and Jack had taken out a lease on Crown Land at Jam Creek which they worked together for a time. After his marriage, Hector had a three roomed house with verandah and lean-to kitchen built at Jam Creek and these three rooms form the core of the homestead that was later built there, the verandah becoming a passage. Jam Creek land was purchased from the Crown by

moved away and took position as manager of a Fletcher property east of Broome Hill for a short time. He then took over management of Chillicup until 1919 when he and his family shifted to Katanning. In the 1930s, some members of Hector's family restored the "a in Mac to their surname, the correct spelling of the family name.

William Robinson Jackson in 1911 and shortly afterwards Hector

At Jam Creek Hector had concentrated on chaff production. A photograph held in the Broomehill Museum shows a very busy railway yard at Broome Hill in 1910 with Hector loading 9tons 6 cwt 3 qrts (9.33 t) into trucks, the largest consignment ever dispatched to that date.

Hector and Sarah McDonald were the parents of Shirley MacDonald.

McDonald, John (Jack) – Youngest son of Donald and Mary. Married Ellen McArthur of Tambellup. In partnership with his parents and brother Hector at Birnam Wood and worked at jam creek with Hector. Moved to Tambellup and opened a blacksmith shop there.

McDonald, Lachlan – Second son of Donald and Mary. In 1901 married Hannah (Tissie) Norrish and was first owner of Kilburnie. **McDougall, Alick** - On 18th January 1865, WHG referred to Alick McDougall passing Nannamillup. In September 1882, Alick McDougall came to Goblup looking for a flock (ie: job as a shepherd) and started shearing for TN on 3rd October.
