The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 17 December 2009, at the Tambellup Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES

In 2009 Council received \$100,000 from the Federal Government's Economic Stimulus Plan, in response to the global financial crisis. Council determined the funds should be spent in the following areas:

- Holland Park Broomehill – provision of playground equipment
- Diprose Park Tambellup – construction of paths and hard court areas
- Tambellup – installation of modular skate park facility.

With only the asphaltting of the paths to be completed, the new equipment is in use by the younger members of our community and appears to be well received.

Other projects planned, underway or recently completed in our parks are:

- the installation of shade sails over the new play equipment in Holland Park, and over the junior play equipment and fitness equipment in Diprose Park
- plumbing and electrical work in Diprose Park prior to the installation of a new BBQ
- installation of new tables and seating in Holland Park and Diprose Park
- upgrade of the basketball half court in Crawford St, Tambellup, including painting of the surface and new lines, installation of railings to define the court area, installation of a timer on the light pole, table and bench seating, and the purchase of a new backboard
- installation of a new basketball pole and ring at the skate park in Tambellup, with new line markings
- paving and landscaping in Diprose Park.
- 'Facelift' of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion, to be commenced in the near future.

These projects have been made possible through a variety of funding sources, including Community Facilities Grants Program, Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program, Royalties for Regions, Office of Crime Prevention, and Local Government Insurance Services. We are still awaiting an outcome to our application for funding from Lotterywest for the provision of play equipment suitable for young children at Diprose Park.

WORKS

The construction crew has works in progress to widen a 5km stretch of Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, with the first three kilometres to be ready for sealing by Christmas. Gravel works are complete on the widened section of Tambellup West Rd, and sealing will be undertaken in January.

The Parks and Gardens crew have recently planted out new gardens at the disabled toilets and in traffic islands on Norrish St in Tambellup, as well as maintaining newly established gardens in Broomehill. Both Ovals have been sprayed for weeds, black beetle & fertilised, and have responded well with the recent rains.

As always, the maintenance crew are working across the shire, maintaining signage, carrying out repairs to bitumen surfaces, and replacing guide posts.

The graders have completed the winter round of grading roads in the shire, and are now underway on the summer round. Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following roads: West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Eureka Rd, Peringillup East Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Clinic Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Pindellup Rd, Stock Route Rd, Green Rd, Collins Rd, Des Wray Rd, Mindora Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Pallinup South Rd, Johnston Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Anderson Rd, Carr Rd, Hankinson Rd, Newton Rd, Saggars St, Lovegrove St, Tallents Rd, Hodgson Rd.

Tennis club members are advised repairs to the tennis court fence will be carried out in the next two weeks. The contractor has experienced delays, but will soon be on the job.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Now we are into the busy harvest period, residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the whole Shire is **98251042**. The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio at 10.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm, and Radiowest 1071 as they are implemented.

Residents are also able to register their mobile number for the **Harvest Ban SMS notification service**. If you would like to receive notification of harvest and vehicle movement bans by SMS please contact Pam at the Shire on 98253555.

Please be aware text messages are not sent when a ban is lifted. Residents are encouraged to use the Harvest Ban Hotline for updates.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2009** and continues through until the **14 FEBRUARY 2010** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited. All residents are asked to take every precaution in this regard.

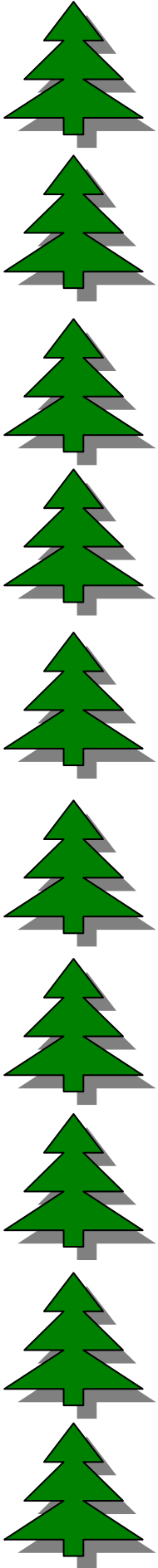
Broomehill Playgroup

If unsure whether a ban has been imposed or lifted, this is the number you should call.

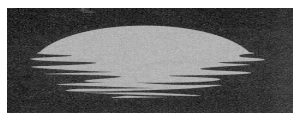

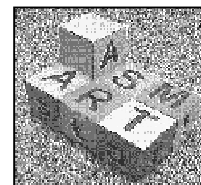

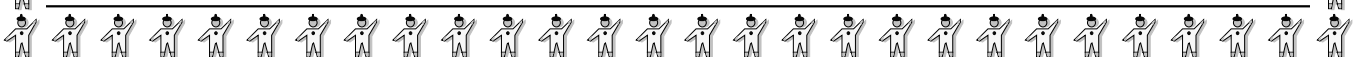
SLIME: cornflour, water, food colouring

- 6 Open up your hand and it will run through your fingers.

"TAMBELLUP PRIMARY SCHOOL - ART AUCTION"

The Tambellup P & C Committee in conjunction with the Tambellup Primary School held their inaugural Art Auction on Friday 30th October 2009.

The Art pieces auctioned were from each classroom group, constructed and arranged within their art classes under the direction of their art teacher Mrs Kate Oliver. Each class produced an individual and unique piece with a stated theme, and when completed and arranged were framed. The Art was exhibited at the Tambellup Show, allowing the community to view and consider the possibility of purchasing a piece.

The evening of the Art Auction saw a large gathering of parents and community members enjoying not only the Art pieces, but local wines from the Frankland area product stalls by local residents giving the audience an array of options for viewing and purchasing. A light finger food supper was served by the Tambellup Primary School staff.

As the evening progressed, the auction began, with the Pre-Primary/Year 1 piece called the "Golden Harvest". The bidding began just above the reserve price, but it didn't take long for interested parties to increase the price, with two families firmly bidding. The hammer fell and the piece was purchased for \$650.00, being what was called a bargain by the end of the evening.



Next in line was the Year 6/7 art piece—"Insect Collection". This was one of the largest pieces offered on the night. It provoked great interest from not only parents but community members. Many parents were thinking that this may be their one and only chance of gaining a memorable piece of work, as this was their child's last year attending the Primary School. Bidding ceased well and truly above the \$1000 mark.

"Gordon River" produced by the Kindy kids was next to be auctioned, which saw the purchaser now in possession of two lovely pieces of art work. The Gordon River piece was produced by the children's hand and foot prints, cut out in beautiful colours and placed together to form the flowing effect of the river, and showing the flora surrounds of the river bank which was placed on a beautifully coloured backing.



The Year 2/3 work of art titled "The Sheep Paddock" generated great interest. The children handmade individual sheep. They traced their hands to make the legs of the sheep, added a face and covered it in wool to create a fabulous 3D effect. The back drop of the piece was that the sheep were placed within a paddock with one ram looking over the fence at the eighteen ewes. The bidding was fast and furious reaching the \$1000 mark with a mixture of community members and parents putting up their hands, and it didn't stop there, once bidding reach \$1500, it was down to two bidders. The winning bidder was pleased to be taking home this well sort after piece.



Last but definitely not the least saw the Year 4/5 art piece "Magical Marine Life" put up for auction. Beautifully coloured marine creatures were set amongst the sea bed. Being the last piece of the evening, and knowing what the previous pieces of work had been auctioned for, saw extremely determined buyers and when the price soared above \$1500, it was down again to two families, battling it out, both extremely determined to be the one to take home this magnificent piece of art. The winning bid for this art work was to be the highest for the night.

An amazing amount of money was raised for the Tambellup P & C, not only from the Art, but also from door sales and raffle draws, along with our great sponsors of the night being: - Great Southern Fuel Supplies - Katanning, C.B.H. - Albany, C.S.B.P - Katanning, Tambellup Bulk Spreading, Ryan Trott & Chloe Cox, Landmark - Tambellup, Coopers and Tom Bowen Agencies. Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo in finalist's flutter

It loves only one partner throughout its lifetime and prefers 150-year-old trees to nest in - there's no doubt that the Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo is one quirky bird.

Now that quirkiness, and threatened status, is gaining attention with a Birds Australia WA project being named a finalist in the Department of Environment and Conservation's 2009 Environment Awards.

Birds Australia WA's Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo Recovery Project has been nominated in the Biodiversity Conservation Category for its work in identifying and monitoring breeding sites across the South Coast and Great Southern regions, and the protection of the iconic bird's habitat.

Birds Australia WA project manager for the South Coast, Raana Scott, said the project began in 2006 and has since become a major success with 35 landholders around the South Coast and South Eastern Avon Basin now involved with the bird's recovery and 23 new nesting sites being discovered.

Ms Scott said it was essential to the species' survival that all old trees were retained because the hollow nesting birds were loyal to their breeding grounds and needed trees of a minimum age of 150 years to breed.

"We know that the population has decreased by at least 50 per cent in the last half century and a number of breeding populations have already become extinct. It is thought that many of the birds we see today are ageing birds and once they die out the population will further plummet," she said.

Birds Australia WA, with help from almost \$300,000 in South Coast NRM funding, has been working on protecting the Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo habitat through fencing, weed control and revegetation efforts. The organisations have also brokered voluntary management agreements and conservation covenants.

Collectively, private landholders have protected over 1,000 hectares in the last three years, including significant stands of remnant vegetation such as salmon gum, wandoo woodland and proteaceous heath to ensure the cockatoo breeds successfully.

The winners of the 2009 Environment Awards will be announced on Friday, November 27, at the Hyatt Regency Hotel.

Background

Birds Australia Western Australia (BAWA) is a regional group of Birds Australia, a national organisation committed since its formation in 1901 to the conservation, study and enjoyment of Australia's native birds and their habitats.

The South Coast stage of the Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo Recovery Project began in 2006. The project in its entirety has been running since 2000.

Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo are a highly visible semi-migratory species that rely on various vegetation types across geographically distinct areas throughout their annual cycle. Because of these habits, they rely on vegetation occurring on various land tenure across large tracts of land. To effectively monitor and instigate recovery actions for the species across their distribution, many individuals, groups and professionals need to be engaged and informed.

Major successes to date include the protection of 323ha of critical nesting and feeding vegetation at the most significant nesting sites identified on the South Coast. This site supports at least 20 nesting pairs directly and another 20 pairs are suspected to be nesting in surrounding vegetation spread across four properties. A management plan is currently being developed to ensure the sites are maintained and hollow repairs have been carried out to prolong the life of natural hollows.

Other successes include securing a conservation covenant of approximately 90ha of priority Salmon Gum nesting habitat, containing a minimum of 10 nesting pairs and associated feeding and navigation habitat. Birds Australia WA is developing a management plan for the site to ensure its protection into the future.

During the 2008 nesting season 28 individuals contributed nearly 500 hours to nest searching across the South Coast region. Sightings are regularly received from community members and in 2009 Birds Australia WA conducted a week long Community Cocky Count which attracted over 50 participants.

The service will run on Tuesdays 5, 12, 19, 26 and Thursdays 7, 14, 21, 28 January 2010 for the very reasonable price of \$5 per trip. The coach will collect participants from Wagin, Woodanilling, Katanning, Broomehill, Tambellup, Cranbrook, Kendenup and Mt Barker at designated times.

The coach has four drop off points, the cinema, town centre, indoor pool at the Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre and Middleton Beach. The coach then collects participants at an arranged time to be taken to an alternative location if desired. For example, participants may want to go to the beach in the morning then to town in the afternoon.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of

William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Mackey (thought to be) **Francis** – 19th January 1882, engaged by TN for 12 months and given the flock that had been William Peter's at Boylup. On 23rd June 1882 TN went to the Flat Rock, built a hut for Mackey and shifted him from Boylup. However on 18th July, TN discharged Mackey, settled with him and gave the flock to O'Brien.

Maher, John – According to an earlier diary, Jack Maher had settled in the area before W.H. Graham. On 15th November 1862 he was engaged by WHG for three months – reaping and threshing rye at Eticup and shepherding at Woorgabup. On 5th April 1863 he accompanied WHG and Harry Adams to Kojonup to be ready for the races the next day. On 16th September 1863 he was Nannamillup to sign his agreement (to work for WHG?). He helped George Bruce and WHG working on the shed, and WHG dipping 700 sheep. On 11th November 1863, started for Albany with 60 wethers, apparently not returning from the Sound until January 1864. From then he appears to have been at his own place as, in March 1864, WHG went to Ewlymartup, then from Maher's to Martinup, although he helped with the ploughing at Nannamillup in July. He also went to help with the shearing on 19th October but left again the next day as WHG could not get a native to mind Maher's place.

In August 1879, Jack Maher and his son and daughter were at Goblup on their way to Kojonup. Maher, Mrs Maher and Mrs McGuire called again on 21st September. In 1881, Mrs Maher and Mrs Whitton called at Goblup on two occasions, the first time to return the repaired spring- trap from Whitton's. On 21st January 1882, Mrs Maher brought her children to Goblup to be vaccinated but the doctor did not come. On 21st April 1884, TN went to McGuire's and then Maher's to ask Mrs Maher to wait on Mrs Norrish in May. He took the carriage and picked up Mrs Maher on the 10th May. May Eunice was born on 13th May and Mrs Maher was taken home on 28th May. Also in May 1884 Jack Maher and William Peate helped to put the 4 horse power together. In July Mrs Maher came for a bag of flour and Jack came for tea and sugar. In 1892 TN leased Maher's paddock and there are references to ploughing, rolling and stripping the wheat. In May 1907, Southwell was ploughing Maher's paddock.

Mallet Bark – The recognition in the early 1900s of the tanning qualities of mallet trees (mainly eucalyptus astringes) resulted in a thriving mallet bark industry which provided an excellent sideline for farmers and others. In his 1907 diary, TN makes several references to mallet. He paid J Rogers £5 for getting bark and later in January his son Richard and Rogers carted two loads to Broomehill from the Wagerup paddock. In February his son Willie and Rogers went for more bark on two occasions, but the bark carted on the second trip proved to be too wet to pass so they went to the paddock near Annice's for more. A few days later Richie and Rogers again took bark to Broomehill.

Mangan, Edward – Appears to have had the contract for running and erecting wire netting on fences at Goblup. On 3rd January 1892 he helped with fire-fighting. TN made interim payments to Mangan: £10 on 13th February, £4 on 4th June by which date he had finished the paddock west of Boylup and £10 on 20th June. On 5th July TN's son George took wire out to Mangan to put around the paddock the other side of Boylup and on 6th September TN drove with Mangan around the NE paddock and Grover's to inspect the fencing – "He has done his work very well." On 8th September TN settled with Mangan for Lord Brassey's fencing (wire netting) - £63.10.9 for over 37 miles (59.5km).

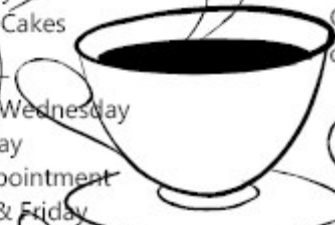

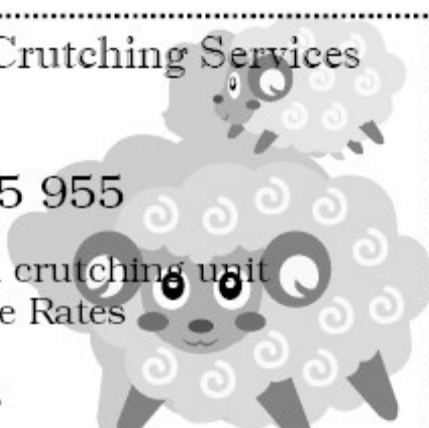
