SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 18 December, commencing at 2.00pm at the Tambellup Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

COUNCIL WORKS

With the conditions just right (prior to rain, storms and hail), the resealing of sections of Tie Line Rd and Broomehill Kojonup Rd were recently completed. Works are continuing on Pootenup Rd carting gravel, water binding and installing pipes while bitumen patching and pipework has been carried out on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd in preparation for widening and sealing early in 2009.

Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following roads during November: Flat Rocks Rd, Chillicup Rd, Pallinup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Etna Rd, Clinic Rd, Cemetery Rd, Rae Rd, McGuire Rd, Pallinup South Rd, North West Rd and Carr Rd.

FROM THE MEETING

Council has approved the planning application submitted on behalf of Moonies Hill Energy to establish an 80 metre wind monitoring tower on land at Nookanellup Rd.

The Draft Strategic Waste Management Plan for the Stirling Group of Local Governments (Broomehill-Tambellup, Kent, Gnowangerup and Jerramungup) which was considered at the October meeting was adopted by Council following the close of the public comment period. Following approval by the Department of Environment & Conservation, the Plan will be incorporated into Council's 'Plan for the Future'.

STANDPIPE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

As mentioned in last months BT Times, Council has investigated the installation of an automated access system for the standpipes on India St & Greenhills Rd in Broomehill, and Crawford St & Tambellup West Rd in Tambellup. The standpipes will be activated by use of a swipe card, which will record the amount of water taken. It is anticipated these will be installed early in December. More information will be forwarded to residents shortly regarding purchasing of access cards, use of the system and invoicing of water charges. Cards will be issued when outstanding accounts for water charges have been settled.

NEW WEBSITE

We are pleased to advise that work has commenced on the new shire website. Scotty Tidey from Katanning Web Services has been engaged to build the site, and we hope to have it up and running prior to Christmas. A feature of the site will be a Photo Gallery, where we are hoping to post photos of community events, scenes, people (with their consent) and anything relevant to our district.

Norman (Norm) Winspear

Born to work the Soil

Norman Harrison Winspear was born in the Katanning Hospital on the 24th May 1926.

Norman's schooling involved attending the tiny six student Fifield School which operated from 1928 to 1943. The day he turned 14 Norman left school to help plant that years wheat crop with a seeder pulled by a team of horses. In 2008 he planted his final wheat crop driving a Cat Challenger tractor pulling a DBS bar and airseeder.

Norman was also immensely proud of his sheep flock and wool clip. During the 1950's and 60's he enjoyed much success when entering sheep in the district ewe hogget competition.

After meeting his future wife at a dance in the Broomehill Town Hall, Norman and Iris were married in Katanning in June 1951. Together they raised 4 children with the younger son Kevin continuing to farm "Danby". Norman always took great pleasure from the time spent with his family and friends. He was especially proud of his 5 grandchildren.

Always keen to ensure his family's farming and economic base Norman expanded his land holding on a number of occasions.

Although busy and working hard on his farm Norman always had time for his family, friends and the community. A foundation member of the Broomehill Bowling Club, he always enjoyed the social interaction with the other bowlers and the competitive nature of the game.

For his entire life Norman was someone who was greatly admired and respected for his work ethic, strength of character and for his honesty and integrity.

Norman was farewelled with a graveside service at the Broomehill Cemetery.

Katanning Runaway Bus 2008 School Holiday Fun

The Great Southern Development Commission will again be funding the Katanning Runaway Bus in January 2009. The service to Middleton Beach from Katanning via the Great Southern Highway provides teenagers with the opportunity to go to the beach, or spend time in Albany, particularly if their families are not able to go away on a holiday.

The service will run on Tuesdays 6, 13, 20, 27 and Thursdays 8, 15, 22, 29 January 2009 for the very reasonable price of \$5 per trip. The coach will collect participants from Wagin, Woodanilling, Katanning, Broomehill, Tambellup, Cranbrook, Kendenup and Mt Barker at designated times.

The coach has four drop off points, the cinema, town centre, indoor pool at the Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre (15 yrs under \$3.30, 16 over \$4.20, an extra \$3 for the use of the pool slide) and Middleton Beach. The coach then collects participants at an arranged time to be taken to an alternative location if desired. For example, participants may want to go to the beach in the morning then to town in the afternoon.

The coach is capable of seating 46 teenagers and boogie-boards or skate boards. The odd bicycle may even be accommodated.

The Shire is once again participating in the WALGA RoadWise Program's *White Ribbons for Road Safety* campaign.

The White Ribbons for Road Safety campaign, which runs from Monday, 1 December 2008 to Monday, 5 January 2009, encourages our community to come back safely every time they drive, walk or ride this Christmas.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Krakouer, Rudolph - Member of Goblup shearing team in 1882,1883 and 1884, visited Eticup frequently, sometimes calling at Goblup and also seen by TN at Thomas Rogers' place. On 23rd April 1884 he carried the mail to Albany for John Dearle and in May 1886 he called at Sunnyside with Mr Grant the Insurance Agent. On 23rd July 1886, he came to Sunnyside to ask TN if he would sell him 1 acre (.405 ha) of land to build a store on. He returned five days later and paid £7.0.0. for 1 acre and on 23rd September, TN and Mrs Norrish walked over from Sunnyside to Krakouer's Store. On 4th December 1886, Rudolph and John Garrity went to Williams River to get a Peddler's License.

Following the establishment of Broome Hill in 1889, the Krakouer brothers transferred their business into the new township and sold the acre of land - and it's three roomed building - back to TN, but it was realized nothing had been done to obtain new Title Deeds.

In September 1890, R Krakouer's tender for fencing Goblup was accepted - £17.5.0 a mile - jam posts bored with three holes for wire. When TN examined the work done to 23rd December 1890 he found several hundred posts had to be taken out. Final examination was carried out by TN and J.F.T.Hassell in May 1892 and TN commented "Fence is well put up." 11 miles 74 chains 48 links (30.8km). However, Hassell would not pay William Wray for carting the condemned posts (separate contract) and said Krakouer should pay Wray. On $10^{\rm th}$ May 1892, TN gave Rude Krakouer a Certificate for the fencing and paid him £100. Calculations suggest that there might have been an interim payment, otherwise there were unrecorded debits. On 23rd June 1892, R.T Krakouer was elected to the new Broome Hill Road Board.

In April 1893 Rudolph (and his younger brother David who was in partnership with him) joined John Holland's trek to cut a direct route to the Goldfields from Broome Hill. On the eve of their departure, the Broome Hill Cricket Club, of which Rudolph was a member, gave the team a farewell party and they set off on the 14th.

TN refers doing business with Krakouer's Store in Broome Hill but does not mention it's fate when Rudolph and David failed to return to the business. In the late 1980s a researcher said she had found reference to the effect that Phillip (Chub) had been left in charge and there had been a fire. The store was located about where the old Shire Depot (now Museum Machinery Display Shed) is.

Krakouer, Samson (Sam) - At Sunnyside on 28th July to get a bag of wheat for Flanagan of Kojonup. He had been to the gravel pits for a load of stores. Sam Krakouer was the Father of Alfred Krakouer who married Sophie Smith. Alfred and Sophie had a large family and their descendants include the Krakouers of footballing fame.

Ladbury, Edward – Came to Nanamillup on 24th June 1863 and agreed to stay and cook until after shearing. On 9th August 1863 Police Constable O'Keefe came with a summons for Ned Ladbury; he started for Perth on 27th September and got back to Nanamillup on 14th October. No explanation given for the summons - witness or accused? He was either still at Nanamillup or back there on 1st march 1864 when he went to the sawpits for some charcoal. He called at Goblup in 1879 and on $9^{\rm th}$ February TN wrote that old Ned Ladbury and Carmody had returned the winnowing machine.

Junior Cricket

We had our first game of the season against Katanning at Kojonup, in weather more suited to footy than cricket! But that did not stop the enthusiasm of all players. The level of sportsmanship was wonderful to see.

Our next game is in Katanning on Saturday 6 December, starting at 9am. More fixtures will be played in February and March next year.




