

SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 19 March, commencing at 4.00pm at the Tambellup Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

FROM THE MEETINGS

- Council made donations towards the operation of the Katanning Runaway Bus Service which operated during the January holidays, and the "Kulungah Waangkaniny – Kids Talking "Residential Workshop held in December.
- Standard Operating Procedures for Bushfire Brigades were adopted. This document has been forwarded to each brigade, and copies are available at the Shire office on request.
- Council endorsed the recently completed Broomehill Bikeplan. This document will provide a blueprint for the ongoing development of the footpath network in the Broomehill townsite. Copies are available at both Council offices for inspection.
- Council agreed to make a contribution to the Broomehill Primary School towards the cost of transporting students to in-term swimming lessons.
- Council agreed to make a financial contribution towards the "Red Card for the Red Fox' program held in Broomehill recently.

REGIONAL AND LOCAL COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM 2008-2009

The Federal Government will provide one-off funding of \$250 million in 2008-2009 to local communities to stimulate additional growth and economic activity in Australia as part of the Australian Government's contribution to address the global economic crisis.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup will receive \$100,000, which is to be spent on community infrastructure.

Council originally nominated three projects for the program, being the continuation of the Diprose Park project, commencement of a playground for Holland Park and the planning for new public toilets in Broomehill, however further information received indicated the funding was not available for public toilets.

Council has nominated the redevelopment of the playground at Holland Park, continuation of Diprose Park including investigating of the provision of a skate facility in Tambellup.

ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS – COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERN-MENT FUND

The Country Local Government Fund was launched on 16th December 2008 by the Minister for Regional Development. The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup will receive an allocation of \$676,507 for the 2008-2009 financial year. Council will allocate funds to the following projects: Staff housing; Diprose and Holland Parks. Other projects for

future rounds of the funding are renovation of the Tambellup Pavilion; footpaths; Broomehill Public Toilets.

STANDPIPE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

We had anticipated the new standpipe management system would be up and running on all standpipes by now, however delays have been experienced by the contractor, which has made the system unavailable for use. Residents will be notified when the system is fully operational, at which time access cards will be available for purchase.

NEW WEBSITE

The new shire website (www.shirebt.wa.gov.au) went live during January. Two new services available on the site are the Business directory and Community directory. Broomehill and Tambellup business owners and community groups are invited to submit details to Pam Hull at the Shire by email to mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au for inclusion.

BUSH FIRE RADIOS

If you have recently had your bushfire radio replaced can you please ensure your old radio is returned to the Shire Office in Broomehill or Tambellup as soon as possible?

DID YOU KNOW?!!!

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup requires that a Building Licence must be issued prior to any resident within the Shire undertaking any of the following:

- the erection of a dwelling
- additions to existing dwellings
- enclosing of any verandah, carport, patio, or garage to convert such space to a habitable room
- patio or pergola
- carport or garage
- retaining walls with an effective height greater than 600mm
- solid sheet fences within the front setback greater in height than 750mm
- swimming pools and outdoor spas

Before any work is commenced a Building Licence Application must be submitted with the relevant information. The specifications and materials for any proposed structures must comply with the Building Code of Australia 2007 and the Residential Design Codes 2002.

Before you commence any building work it is advisable to contact our friendly staff on 98253555 who are happy to assist you in obtaining the correct information.

If you intend to demolish a building on your property you are required to make an application for a Demolition Permit prior to commencing any demolition works. Failure to obtain a permit can attract substantial fines as well as prohibit any further development or sale of the property. Applications are readily available at the Shire Office where staff are happy to assist with the completion of the form.

A couple of things to keep in mind when planning a building project:

You should very early in the planning stage contact the Council to ascertain if a Planning Consent Application is required. This application is in addition to a Building license and if required must be obtained prior to obtaining a Building License. Applications for Planning Consent are required to go to Council — so please factor this in to your project timing. Council meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month.

Council agendas are finalised one week prior to each meeting. To avoid delays please ensure your application is received by the Shire prior to this date.

If your application is complicated it may need to be referred on to Council's Planning consultants this may add additional time to the process

BUDGET 2009/2010

Council is about to commence the first steps in the preparation of the 2009/2010 budget.

As part of that process Community and sporting groups are invited to forward submissions to Council for consideration in the budget. Submissions are to be in writing and forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by close of business on Tuesday 31 March 2009.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

A reminder to all residents that the **RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD** is now in place and continues through until **15 APRIL 2009** inclusive. During this period a permit is required for any burning to be undertaken. Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief Fire Control Officer.



We would like to sincerely thank the Cranbrook Shire for enthusiastically supporting and taking up our invitation to be involved in Hidden Treasures, we are looking forward to working together to promote and enhance all our tourism assets collectively. Hidden Treasures now encompasses 14 communities each unique, special and valuable.

To incorporate Cranbrook Shire, over then next 18 months we will be altering the main Hidden Treasures Drive Trail, adding community tourism information to the web-site, upgrading the existing Hidden Treasures Plan and producing a new Drive Trail map. If you live in the Cranbrook Shire or any other Hidden Treasures Shire and you have a tourism related asset or business small, medium or large and would like to be included in any of our promotional activities it's important you contact your Shire or Di Holly g-dholly@westnet.com.au sooner rather than later as you may miss the boat. Most of you will know there is no membership fee; if your Shire is part of Hidden Treasures then you are automatically a member, so don't be shy get involved.

Our communities where well received at the Hidden Treasures stand at the Albany Show most where unaware of the diverse range of activities and attractions our communities hide and many indicated they would be keen to do day or weekend trips to explore and discover the Hidden Treasures further

We once again we will be attending the Caravan & Camping Show to promote our communities and tourism assets. It is been held at the Claremont Show Grounds from the 19th – 23rd of March. If you have brochures that promote your business or community please get them too your Shire by the 7th March. We are also looking for volunteers, several of the working group generously volunteer and cover their own costs to promote all our Hidden Treasures Communities and businesses. So if your planning to be in Perth between the 19th and 23rd of March we encourage you to support the group come along, meet new people, learn what your neighbouring communities has and have some fun promoting your community or business, we'd love to have you. The Rural Group Tours Development Project, yes it is still going, this is a very ambitious project for the group as nothing like this has ever been tried before, in Australia. The Pilot Tours are just that pilots, they are trials, some will work and some may not, one may not work this month for different reasons, but it may work 2 months later because we're learnt from the first attempt. Two pilot tours where planned for early November (Bush Poets and Cracker's Jack Bowls Tour) both did not eventuate due to several factors. The Cracker's Jack Tour has been re-scheduled for April as there was keen Perth interest but promotional lead-time and financial crisis had a negative impact first time round, fingers crossed 2nd time lucky.

We congratulate the community people and groups who have embraced this project, taken up the opportunity to have a go organising a tour or are involved in a pilot tour. We have a few tours planned to happen over the next 6 months, One Day Archery Tour, 3 day Bowls, 3 day Golf Tour, Best of the Hidden Treasures Tour, Wife for a Farmer Tour, the Hidden Treasures Pub Tour. The processes and what we are all learning when putting these Pilot Tours together will help form the Rural Group Tours Tool Kit. The Tool Kit, which is in draft from now, when completed will be marketed in WA and eventually Nationally. Keen interest and support has been expressed in the Rural Group Tours concept and the Tool Kit from Tourism WA, Sport and Rec, Victorian Government to name a few. If successful it will be due to your Shire delegates and Communities of the Hidden Treasures. If you have a Tour you might like to have a go at or a Tour idea it's not too late. Murdoch Students completed and presented their Hidden Treasures Management Plan, which has given us some useful direction to the future management of the Hidden Treasures. We will be following up Murdoch to see if we can develop an on going research partnership. Again thankyou to all who supported this research project and gave their time to show students their part of Hidden Treasures. They where very impressed and would love to come again.

In November we where rather chuffed that Hidden Treasures became Semi Finalists in 2 Regional Achievement & Community Awards Categories Local Government "Best Practice Award" and Curtin University of Technology "Service Award". These Awards are very competitive so to achieve the results the group did where very rewarding. (All Shires have Award certificate so see if you can spot them next time you visit)

Did you see Woodanilling's Old Dave, his horse and cart, now famous!! After appearing on the front page of the Western Australian recently, also a story on Wakes Garage. Opportunities such as these where a direct result of the Western Australian contacting Hidden Treasures seeking unique and authentic stories to highlight rural WA. The financial crisis is taking it's tole on the tourism industry like other industries but there is increasing tourism potential and benefits for our communities if we continue to work together. All Tourism Agencies are encouraging people to explore and travel in their own State. More people are seeking to experience our rural way of life, nature, quite and inexpensive locations this puts many of our communities in a good position to capitalise on this new tourism climate and trends.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Langton, William - Worked for TN prior to September 1884 when Jack Maher got a bag of flour from Sunnyside on Langton's account. Next entry was 17th January 1887 – William Langton was 2nd in the Old Men's Race (over 48 vrs) at the New Year's Sports and won 10/-. In late 1890 he was shepherding for TN and on 12th December went to Pierenellup to fire-fight. Still shepherding in October 1892 - stationed at various places including Wackenup and Eticup, but by November his duties had changed to those of General Servant. He helped with shifting sheep, burning around paddocks, loading sheep on railway trucks, checking Boylup and Three Wells for sheep water supply, poison grubbing at Whearup, laying poison at Deep Well, and blue-stoning wheat for sowing. On 21st January 1893, he had a day off to go to a cricket match with Kindred and George Norrish in lieu of working on New Year's Day, and on 1st March he went to the races at Katanning with Kindred. On 28th April 1893, Langton went into Broome Hill to collect new group of Chinese workers from the train. On the way home the horse bolted and crashed the trap, breaking the shafts. "Some of the men were a little hurt". From July 13th that year, Langton was to be paid £3 per month if he stayed on. Prior to this he had received £1

per month. In October 1894, Mr William Langton read a paper at the meeting of the Broome Hill Mutual Improvement Society. In 1895 he returned to shepherding but still did other general work. On TN's resignation from the post of Manager at Goblup, Langton stayed on to work for Mr Nicholson (1898).

Larkins, William – At Goblup on 8th May 1880 and four days later agreed to lamb mind with William Peters –gave TN £5 to keep for him. On 5th July TN paid him for lamb minding and he came back the next day to borrow a saddle. The following week he returned with Ed Baldock to take the brick kiln to pieces and burn it over again.

Larsen, Henry – On 23rd February 1892, WHG asked TN to act as arbiter between the Kojonup Road Board and Larsen. On 25th March TN went to see the culvert that Larsen hade made to value it on behalf of the Kojonup Road Board. On 31st March 1892 in the case of Kojonup road Board v Larsen, the Magistrate decided in favour of Larsen and awarded £8 of £27 claimed.

Lee, Eliza – Worked for Mrs W.H. Graham at Fairfield and committed suicide by jumping in the well. An English girl, apparently she was very unhappy with conditions in the Colony. Her grave is one of the three at Fairfield.

Lee, George – On 6th March 1907, helped Lachlan McDonald shift the scoop that TN had bought at the Italian's sale for 30/- out to Sunnyside.

Lee, Jack – Jack Lee and his wife Mary had the boarding House and Barber's Shop in the old Hotel building that had been shifted from Jasper Street into Journal Street beside the (now) Museum.






