The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 16 July 2009, commencing at 4.00pm at the Tambellup Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

WHATS HAPPENING IN YOUR COMMUNITY?

Broomehill

Following the opportunity for the Broomehill community to view proposed designs for the Holland Park playground, Council has approved the purchase of the preferred option from Forpark Australia, with some minor alterations and additions to the design to make it suitable for young children. We hope to have this installed in the not-too-distant future.

The information bay opposite the Hotel has been on the receiving end of a mass planting project, and looks great. The gardens at the Administration office have also been refurbished. The drainage work at the office has been completed, and pavers will be laid along the wall where the excavation took place. Community workers have been cleaning up at the cemetery and Holland Park after the recent periods of inclement weather.

Sealing works on Javelin St were completed just prior to the rains setting in this month.

Tambellup

Work will soon commence on the refurbishment of the Crawford St basketball court. Community workers will be painting the concrete (weather permitting) and installing rails to prevent vehicles accessing the court. The lighting will also be addressed to ensure the focus is on the court and not the neighbouring houses.

The Gardeners have been replacing faulty pop up sprinklers on the oval. There is still a problem with one solenoid and Katanning Irrigation is working with Council staff to rectify the problem.

The picnic and BBQ shelters for Diprose Park have finally arrived, and will be installed through July. The shelters have solar lighting incorporated into the roof structures, making it an ideal location for balmy summer evening BBQs. Watch this space!

WORKS

With the onset of winter rains, two graders have commenced road maintenance grading fulltime across the shire. A number of roadworks projects were completed in June, including the widening and sealing on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, resealing a short section of Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, gravel resheeting on Nookanellup Rd, and the corner realignment on Birt Rd. Clearing works on Brassey Rd are almost complete, prior to resheeting. Bitumen patching was carried out on Pallinup Rd whilst the spray truck was available, and the maintenance crew has been working on bitumen repairs, signage and guideposts on rural roads.

SHIRE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

It would appear that Local Government in Western Australia is heading for a major change similar to what has recently happened in Queensland and other States such as South Australia and Victoria. The proposed reform is being promoted as voluntary but as with the South Australian experience it is somewhat of a "carrot and stick" approach. The State Governments desired outcome of the reform is less Local Governments.

The CEO and myself, recently met with the Minister for Local Government, the Hon John Castrilli, but were unable to get any assurances that Broomehill-Tambellup would be given any "special treatment" to allow us to see out the current amalgamation.

We also got an understanding that amalgamations WILL happen and the desire for multiple Councils to amalgamate is the preferred result.

Council representatives have had a number of meetings with representatives from our neighbouring Councils to gauge their feelings and what directions they are considering.

A community questionnaire and public meetings will be organised for the near future to ascertain what the views are of community of Broomehill-Tambellup are. These views will also help the Council in its submission to the Minister which is required by 31 August 2009.

I believe that the current State Government will have the parliamentary support to bring about the desired changes to local government boundaries. The Commonwealth Government is also promoting the reform of local government and has recently announced funding of \$25m to assist in this process.

So where does this leave us? This current reform process is not like our previous amalgamation where we knew who our partner would be. Following are the choices that we are faced with and need to consider:

- Stay as we are which is highly unlikely of being successful
- Pick the partners that we would like to be with
- Wait until after the 31st of August 2009 and let the Government select a grouping for us

Council is currently experiencing the feeling of being "between a rock and a hard place". The Councillors are working hard to ensure that the final decision will be the best one for the people in our community.

If you want to get involved and have your say or just find out more information contact your local Council representative or the CEO and attend the public meetings when they are held in your town.

- 2. A crèche co-ordinator. To organise helpers to look after children in the crèche whilst parents attend the workshops.



Great Southern Area Consultative Committee - Winding Up

Committee Chairman and well respected local businessman and community advocate Mr. Len Smith is presiding over the official wind up of the Great Southern Area Consultative Committee (GSACC) as the organization undertakes the dissolution process over the next couple of months. Replacing the GSACC, Regional Development Australia will come into being on 1st July 2009, and will be delivered across Western Australia by the state government through a service delivery contract between the Commonwealth Government and the Department of Local Government and Regional Development and the Regional Development Commissions.

"The Great Southern ACC has been one of the most effective bi-partisan community committees I have had the pleasure of working with in my 40-plus years of community work in the Albany and Great Southern Region" said Mr. Smith. "The Great Southern ACC has benefited from a very dedicated group of committee members representing wide ranging aspects of community activities and development within the region, I'm proud to say that we got things done despite many varied stakeholders" said Mr Smith.

During its 13-years of service, the Great Southern ACC was successful in coordinating and supporting millions of dollars of Commonwealth and State Government funding for numerous organizations throughout the region including \$4.5 million through the now defunct Regional Partnership Program. While not directly responsible for providing funding itself, the GSACC empowered organizations with the skills and business acumen to be more strategic and effective in their field of interest, and particularly on working with groups seeking funds through various grant programs. "This technical advice and general community advocacy will probably be the most lasting legacy of the ACC network both in the Great Southern and throughout Australia", said Mr Smith.

Formed in 1994, the GSACC provided an advisory link between all levels of business, government and community with Canberra. "This marks the end of an era for the ACC network established in 1994 by the Australian Government" said the Executive Officer Simon Lyas. "Although my tenure with the GSACC has been relatively short, the last few months have given me an appreciation of the community work the Great Southern ACC has done and the achievements of the committee over many years. The Great Southern Region has been well served by their local ACC" said Mr. Lyas.

2009 Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Funding

The State Government has announced a revamp of the community infrastructure funding program to ensure more money is spent on a wider range of sport and recreation projects. Sport and Recreation Minister Terry Waldron said the maximum available grant under the Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) would jump from \$1.8 to \$4million with an extra small grants round created for projects under \$150,000. Mr Waldron said DSR had also initiated a Development Bonus scheme where an application could receive up to 50 per cent of the total cost of the project if the project satisfies certain criteria.

The new small grants scheme will open on July 1 and close on Friday July 31 at 5pm. Application forms are available from the DSR website www.dsr.wa.gov.au and will be posted out to all clubs in the next week. 


