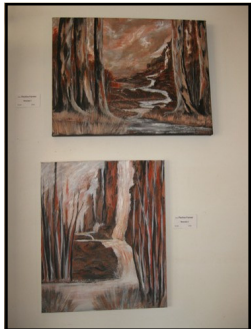

SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP

Please be advised there will be no Council meeting held in November. The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday 17 December 2009, commencing at 2.00pm at the Tambellup Chambers. Members of the public are welcome.

FROM THE MEETING

- Council adopted the Annual Report for 2008/2009. Copies of the report are available at both Broomehill and Tambellup offices.
- Council agreed to contribute \$4000 from the Broomehill Recreation Complex Reserve to assist the Broomehill Cricket Club to erect a fence around the Broomehill Oval.

WORKS

With a reinforced Parks and Gardens crew on the job, many tasks around both townsites have been carried out. Staff spent time in Tambellup prior to the Tambellup Show mowing, sweeping and whipper snipping the town centre. Garden beds have been replanted in both Broomehill and Tambellup, and mowing is ongoing in Broomehill.

The pedestrian walkway over the railway line in Broomehill has been gravelled, and we are waiting on final approvals from Westnet Rail before the remainder of the job is completed.

Staff have spent time at the Broomehill tip to bring some order to the site. Over one weekend recently approximately 40 cubic metres of rubbish was dumped at the tip, which overflowed the pit.

Work is continuing at Diprose Park, with locally manufactured building blocks being used to construct an entrance off Taylor/Crowden Sts. Tables and seating have been installed in the picnic shelter and near the fitness equipment. Asphalt will be laid on the paths in the near future, and a new BBQ will be installed.

Construction projects on Tambellup West and Broomehill-Kojonup Rds are progressing, with the clearing being completed. Gravel carting continues on Tambellup West Rd, and culverts are being widened where required.

The maintenance crew have been busy working on bitumen repairs and replacing signage across the shire. Now the weather is more conducive, bitumen patching will take priority on all roads.



ART EXHIBITION

Congratulations are extended to local artists Pauline Farmer, Lynne Wilding and Athol Farmer on their successful exhibition staged recently at the Henry Jones building in Broomehill as part of the Southern Arts & Craft Trail.

TAMBELLUP SHOW

Congratulations to the Tambellup Agricultural Society committee on the staging of another successful Tambellup Show. The show is a great opportunity to showcase the town, and it was noted many visitors were in attendance on the day. It was great to see not even the mid-afternoon shower of rain could dampen the enthusiasm of show goers!

MOSQUITOES

Mosquito numbers within our Shire are always an issue. Council baits pools of water and will undertake regular fogging of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health have advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. (The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.)

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the PROHIBITED burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2009** and continues through until the **14 FEBRUARY 2010** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited. All residents are asked to take every precaution in this regard. For further information contact the Shire Office or your nearest Fire Control Officer.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

As we move into the busy harvest period, residents are reminded the Harvest Ban Hotline number for the whole Shire is **98251042**. The service provides up-to-date information seven days a week.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are broadcast over ABC radio and Radiowest 1071 as they are implemented. Residents are also able to register their mobile number for the Harvest Ban SMS notification service. If you would like to receive notification of harvest and vehicle movement bans by SMS please contact Pam at the Shire.

DOG OWNERS – HAVE YOU REGISTERED YOUR DOG???

All dog registrations are due for renewal at **31st October** each year. If you own a dog then your dog **MUST** be registered and **MUST** be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog **MUST** be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

Remember, all drums must be **triple rinsed inside and out**, and allowed to drain or air dry to ensure they contain no rinse water.

Please note: ALL LIDS MUST BE REMOVED.

Any unclean or partly filled containers will not be accepted and will remain the property of the chemical users.

The Council and the P & C look forward to your support in rinsing out, rounding up and running in all your empty, properly cleaned, non-returnable farm chemical containers.

Final Meeting of the Ag Society for 2009 – Tuesday the 10th of November, 8 pm at the Telecentre – everyone very welcome to attend, even if just for this one meeting to talk about the 2009 Show and brainstorm ideas for 2010.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

McLarty (unidentified) – Employed by West Australia Land Company during the construction of the Great Southern Railway. On 29th March 1888, TN saw him at Albany and got the promise of a truck to take some stores out by train to the rail-head.

McLeod (unidentified) – Employed by West Australian Land Company and store man at the main railway camp, called at Sunnyside on 18th May 1888.

Machinery-Farm – When Richard Norrish Snr came back to Kojonup in 1850 and took up land at Warkalup, he had a light Yankee plough which proved to be useless until rain had softened the ground. In the 1860s WHG makes frequent references to repairing his own plough or those of his neighbours. On 18th march 1863 he wrote "passed by J Norrish's but he had not quite finished with the fanners." The next day he got the machine from Joe about dinner time and put the barley through once. Took the machine back on 20th. On 31st January 1865, WHG went to Eticup to find 'Toby' & 'Maggie' to fetch the winnowing machine but could not find them. He returned home and loaded the cart with the threshing machine to send to Balgarrup. By 1895 he had a Woolsey Shearing Machine – believed to have been the first in the Colony. TN had a horse-power (assumed 1horse) and in April 1881 took delivery of a reaping machine from Albany. In November that year

He bought a winnowing machine at Treasure's Sale for £10.5.0 and also a horse rake. He had a tree-puller and in 1884 bought a 4horse-power (horseworks) for £20. William Peate and Jack Maher helped to put it together. By 1892 the reaping machine (same one?) was giving him a lot of trouble and Climie and Permain a lot of business! He also bought a stump jumping plough for £19.0.0. In 1893, TN ordered a hand sowing machine from Sanderson's representative so his son Richie could sow wheat at Eticup. Next month TN used the sowing machine himself. In January 1894, TN's stripper would not work – wheels would not cog. William Holly came to look at it – without success. TN's brother George looked at it with equal success so the machine was sent into Broome Hill to the smith. When it was brought back it still would not strip so back to Broome Hill again!. In May 1898 TN's new drill arrived – The Farmer's Friend - £41.18.6. The next day they started the drill but there was some time before they could find the different gears for working it. In July 1898. E.W. Steere came to Sunnyside for his engine as he was going to Katanning tree-pulling. In January 1907 at Sunnyside, TN using an engine driven chaff-cutter, cut 200 bags of chaff. TN's son Willie drove the engine and Sam Newbey was there to see how it worked. Pat Garrity Jnr was also there to see how the engine worked as he wanted it the following week. In October 1907 TN's son Richie started ploughing in the garden at Sunnyside with the 2 furrow plough. During 1907 TN also referred to a tank (dam) sinking plough.

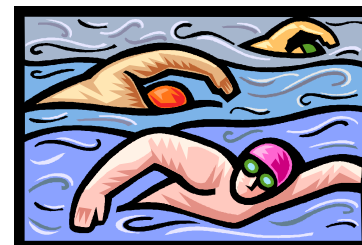

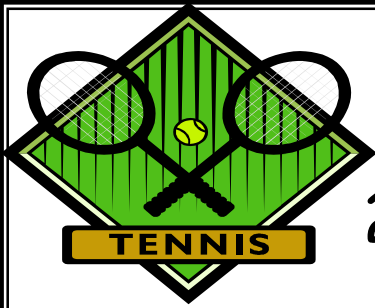

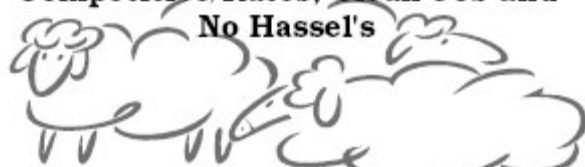
