Not many people get to have their father for so long, but unfortunately it was definitely time to go and he wanted to go. We had a small but still full-on funeral with all ten of us, which dad would have

been happy about. He didn't want a big fuss. His sister May was there, and she told a story about saving dad from drowning when he was 3 years old. May would have been 13. Dad had gone under water twice and surfaced twice but went under for a third time. May said if she hadn't gotten hold of him then she probably wouldn't have been able to save him.

Thanks to Betty, sisters Robin and Sandy for all their help during the last few months. Thanks, Betty, for all the running around, unpacking and shopping you've done for dad and mum over a long period of time.

Mum is still doing well in Clarence Estate under lock down. One couldn't ask for better surrounds and genuinely caring staff to be looking after vulnerable people. It was good dad could leave this world in his own room surrounded by familiar faces and not be shunted off to the hospital in a much more sterile and unfamiliar environment. We are forever grateful to Clarence Estate and Dr Zee Wong.

People may have been leaving messages on my farm landline, but the phone is dead from my end and I can't retrieve messages so I'm sorry if I haven't returned your calls.

I know a lot of you want to celebrate dad's life with a memorial of some sort. We will see what the COVID scene is like later on this year and let you all know what is possible.

### COVID-19

The four weeks since last Topics have seen some significant changes made to the way we all live and the things we take for granted. Regional travel restrictions and the direction from the State Government to stay home impacted on the ability of people to get away for Easter, with many social media posts highlighting the small pleasures of camping in your back yard! We were pleased to note the majority of people in the state heeded the directive, and stayed home.

The Local Emergency Management Committee has been meeting weekly since the middle of March, and it has become apparent that the processes initiated by each of the agencies represented are appropriate for now. All committee updates are provided to the District Emergency Management Committee weekly so they have a handle on the broader picture across the region.

Shire staff continue to monitor the situation, and changes to operations have been made where required. All administration staff are still working from the offices, and observing hygiene and social distancing practices. The offices remain closed to the public at this time, however residents are able to phone and make an appointment for any business matters that can't be dealt with online or by phone or email.

Facilities including the Broomehill Recreational Complex, Tambellup Community Pavilion, all playgrounds, skate parks, the Broomehill Caravan Park and public BBQ facilities remain closed.

The Broomehill and Tambellup libraries are closed, however staff are still working and are more than happy to assist library patrons on a 'click and collect' basis. This can be done in two ways:

- Go to the Libraries tab on the Shire website <a href="www.shirebt.wa.gov.au">www.shirebt.wa.gov.au</a> and search the online catalogue. Members can use the online reservation system to reserve items available at both libraries, and staff will be in contact to arrange for collection; or
- Phone your library staff Jacinta at the Broomehill Library (9825 3555) and Melissa at the Tambellup CRC (9825 1177) and let them know what you are after. They will be more than happy to pick your selections and arrange a time for collection.
- Staff are also happy to source inter-library materials for you on request.

As mentioned in the last Topics, the Shire has a Facebook page, and we hope to provide information that is relevant and timely. The new Shire website has improved functionality, and we are working to ensure information is updated regularly.

### RECYCLING UPDATE

Please remember that Tissues and Paper Towel CANNOT be recycled. This applies even once the COVID19 risk subsides.

Tissues and paper towel should never be put into your recycling bin. The cardboard box and rolls that they are packaged in can be recycled however, and of course clean paper and newspaper should be recycled.

While it is heartening to see the reduced number of positive COVID-19 cases in our region and across the state, it is timely to ensure you continue to follow health and hygiene protocols as recommended by the Australian Government Department of Health:

- Wash hands often with soap and water, or hand sanitiser
- Cover coughs and sneezes into a tissue or into your elbow
- Stay home if you are unwell
- Observe social distancing requirements at least 1.5m

In accordance with the amendments made to the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, the April Ordinary Council meeting was conducted electronically for the first time, and Councillors are to be commended on their adaptation to the new format. All Council and Committee meetings will be conducted electronically until further notice.

Council received the Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 Quarterly Progress Report for the period January-March 2020. Progress has been summarised as follows:

Council granted planning consent to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for the use and development of Lot 632 Great Southern Highway, Broomehill Village, for a Fire Brigade Building, subject to conditions.

### WORKS

Programmed works to widen a section of seal on Toolbrunup Rd were completed after Easter, with contractors completing the stabilising and sealing. While the contractors were available, patches on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, Pootenup Rd and Tambellup West Rd were also resealed

Maintenance grading was completed on the following roads during April: Flat Rocks Rd, Beejenup Rd, Palomar Rd, Birt Rd, Warrenup Rd, Hassell Rd, White Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Witham Rd.

The project to improve the harvesting and reuse of storm water in Broomehill continued through April, with the new pipeline installed from the sump at the CBH expansion site to the Broomehill Recreational Complex dam. The installation of this bigger line has improved the efficiency of the pump at the CBH dam, with water transferring to the Complex dam at a much faster rate. The catchment area at the Complex dam has been compacted, and will be sealed as funds permit. The latest stage of the project completed is the installation of a new pipeline from the Town dam to the Broomehill Caravan Park, to allow for watering at the Caravan Park to be done via the dam rather than the mains water system. This project has been funded by Council and the Department of Water & Environmental Regulation, and will assist in securing water supplies for our open spaces into the future.

### WATER AVAILABILITY

At the April Ordinary Council meeting, Council acknowledged concerns in the community regarding the ability of landowners to access water from standpipes in the Shire. Specifically, concerns raised included:

- Lack of flow/pressure at Crawford Street standpipe
- Lack of water at Tambellup West tank due to high use
- Cost of water at Donald Street given slow flow rates

### **Treated Waste Water:**

Tambellup is serviced with a reticulated sewer network that allows for the use of tertiary treated waste water. This currently allows for Tambellup Oval watering during specific periods. The allocated treated waste water was used for this summer.

### **Andersons Bores:**

In the south east corner of the Shire there are two bores known as Andersons Bores. Both are currently operating with few issues. These bores are unmetered, and power use is not charged to users. There is no information on current extraction rates or levels of use, though anecdotal evidence is that there has been significant use of this resource.

### Dams/tanks:

There are a number of dams and tanks in Broomehill and Tambellup that are connected and used for a variety of purposes, predominantly for maintenance of parks, gardens and ovals. These are not currently accessible to the public.

### Concerns raised

The three facilities at the centre of landowners concerns (Crawford St, Tambellup West Rd and Donald St) are controlled by the Water Corporation.

Currently large volumes of water are being taken from the Crawford St standpipe for transport to other centres including Kukerin, Jerramungup, Fitzgerald and Ongerup. This facility is connected to a 50mm main (it is noted that the Water Corporation has restricted the flow from 50mm main down to 40mm). The larger mains connection results in an increased flow rate, and is charged at a higher rate per kilolitre accordingly, however it is acknowledged the increased draw from this source by the Water Corporation may result in lower pressure/flow rate. Shire staff will contact the Water Corporation to clarify this.

The Tambellup West Rd standpipe is connected to a 240kL tank and a 25mm main. The smaller connection to the scheme results in a slower flow rate, and is charged a lesser rate per kilolitre accordingly. With seasonal conditions as they are, the draw on this source has increased, with larger volumes being taken, and the slower flow rate means the tank is slower to fill after being emptied – it is estimated that with no use, the tank will take up to 48 hours to fill. This has resulted in water not being available at times.

The issues being experienced at the Tambellup West Rd standpipe has seen increased use of the Donald St tank. This tank is connected to the scheme via a 25mm line from a 40mm main, and as a result, is quicker to fill after being emptied. However – the larger main feeding this tank means the water is charged at a higher rate per kilolitre.

Council is aware of discussion in the community about the original purpose of the Donald St tank being for stock water during periods of drought – regardless of the original intent of the facility, as it is connected to the scheme it is now controlled by the Water Corporation and water accessed through this source is charged in accordance with Water Corporation charges to the Shire.

### Water Charges

The costs of water were considered at the February Ordinary Council meeting, following the Water Corporation's review of infrastructure and charges during 2019. Council endorsed the following fees for sale of water:

• Tambellup West Road standpipe \$3.40 per kilolitre (no change – 25mm meter)

Crawford Street standpipe
 Greenhills North Road standpipe
 Broomehill-Kojonup Road standpipe
 \$9.20 per kilolitre (50mm meter)
 \$9.20 per kilolitre (50mm meter)
 \$9.20 per kilolitre (50mm meter)

At the time of consideration of the amended fees, Council was unaware that the Donald St tank was being accessed for water. At the March meeting, Council determined that water from this source would be charged at \$9.20 per kilolitre, as per the Water Corporations charges.

While it is regrettable that these costs have increased, the Shire's Fees and Charges are determined on a cost recovery basis and in this case, include the Water Corporation rate and a small sum to partially offset the cost of operating and maintaining the infrastructure. Unfortunately Council is not able to subsidise these costs.

### **Declaration of Water Deficiency?**

Council officers have requested information about Water Deficiency Declarations, and advice received indicates that there is no current criteria that would allow the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to be declared as Water Deficient. Advice received states as follows:

'Pricing concessions for scheme standpipes are applied where determined necessary through Government's Water Deficiency Declaration process. Pricing concessions can be utilised through the WDD process to strategically manage distribution for water deficient areas. The objective is to manage the availability of water, not to provide subsidies.

Similarly, the scheme water is being carted for animal welfare purposes after assessment of scheme and non-scheme water availability through the stringent WDD process, and after approval from both the Ministers for Water and Agriculture.'

Effectively, while there is Scheme water available it is difficult, if not impossible, to be determined as water deficient as the relevant agencies (DWER and Water Corporation) believe that water is available and accessible. While this does not take into account the current issues with water being unavailable due to excess load on the Scheme, there remains no way to have the Shire declared water deficient.

### What is the Shire putting in place to assist?

At the April Ordinary meeting, Council determined the following actions would be taken:

- Installation of a 250 kilolitre water tank in Tambellup (location to be determined), with a 40mm main supply;
- Installation of a 250 kilolitre water tank in Broomehill (location to be determined), with a 50mm main supply;
- Installation of a 110 kilolitre tank at Broomehill Town Dam with 20mm main supply, to provide water at the lesser charge;
- Reline existing 90 kilolitre tank at Donald Street and connect to 25mm main supply, to provide water at the lesser charge. This will be completed once new 250 kilolitre tank is installed.

These projects are to be funded by a reallocation of funds from other capital projects in this year's budget and will be commenced in the near future. The funds available do not allow for standpipe controllers to be installed this financial year – this will be completed in 2020-2021. Projects that have been postponed will be reconsidered during 2020-2021 budget deliberations.

### Other actions include:

- Shire staff to seek advice from the Water Corporation on the Impact of drawing 300,000 litres a day of water on pressure and flow rates on Tambellup water supply;
- Council will request that the Water Corporation install a standpipe at the corner of Broomehill-Gnowangerup and Pallinup Roads on the 200mm water main to provide water to water deficient areas to reduce the impact on water supply in Broomehill and Tambellup;
- Council will commence monitoring use of the Andersons Bores to determine the volumes of water being drawn from these bores.

While it is acknowledged these actions may not be implemented in time for this current dry season, all actions assist in securing water supply for landowners in our Shire. Also - with the Katanning fire in our not-so-distant memory, an increased number of water supply points with better capacity and flow rates will benefit our emergency services in the event we are faced with an incident on that scale.

### DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM (DCP)

As advised in the April Topics, Council is continuing to develop plans for projects that will be implemented through this programme, which will provide \$1 million of funding towards eligible projects. The DCP projects being considered include:

- Eligible water efficiency projects
- Upgrades to the Broomehill Recreational Complex
- Development of a 'Holland Track' Interpretive Centre in Broomehill
- Streetscape upgrades in Broomehill
- Nature play playground in Holland Park
- Development of a youth centre in Tambellup
- Streetscape upgrades in Tambellup
- Development of a new Town Square and ANZAC memorial in Tambellup

Council will release concept plans soon to allow for public comment. These projects are proposed to conform to eligibility requirements of the DCP, and have been extrapolated from our Strategic Community Plan.

### BROOMEHILL CENTRAL FIRE BRIGADE BUILDING



Works have commenced on site, with the sand pad being laid and compacted over the Easter weekend. Utilities will be connected in coming weeks and the construction of the shed will also start. Keep an eye on this space!

ROAD SAFETY DURING SEEDING OPERATIONS

It's that time of the year again when a lot of heavy machinery will be moving around the Shire. Farmers, your licensing concession on tractors, self-propelled sprayers, spray equipment etc., contains conditions which may include the requirement to only travel on roads between sunrise and sunset, may require a flashing light, and may need to have an "over width" sign attached. In the event of an accident involving other road users, if conditions of your license are not complied with, motor vehicle injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred. ### TAMBELLUP POLICE UPDATE

Over the past month Tambellup Police have been busy juggling our regular duties and response capabilities, while assisting with road blocks and roving patrols in the western parts of the Great Southern District. Our experiences have proven that most people are abiding by

the government's expectations by not moving across regional districts without an exception to do so. There is a new App. named, G2G Pass. This application allows you to apply for an exemption to travel across regional borders for legitimate reasons. I would ask anyone who is currently crossing borders or planning to cross borders, to download the application and apply for an exemption token, which can simply be scanned by police at relevant road blocks. This will reduce interaction times with police, and allow people to go where they need to go quicker.

Some people in Tambellup have not been abiding by the social distancing expectations appropriately, and I remind people that these measures have not yet been relaxed. It is still a requirement to social distance, maintaining a 1.5m gap between each other and not being in groups of more than two. To the vast majority of people, well done and keep up the great work.

Since the last update Tambellup Police have preferred the following charges –

- A 17-year-old male 2 x Possess Stolen Property, No Authority to Drive, Drive Unlicensed Vehicle.
- A 40-year-old male Disorderly Behaviour, Disorderly Behaviour in a Police Station.
- A 12-year-old male 2 x Aggravated Burglary, 3 x Criminal Damage, Stealing.
- An 11-year-old male Aggravated Burglary, 4 x Criminal Damage.
- A 19-year-old male 2 x Stealing.
- A 34-year-old male Possess a Prohibited Drug (Cannabis), No Authority to Drive.
- A 40-year-old male No Authority to Drive Vehicle Seized.
- A 36-year-old male Trespass.

Tambellup Police have applied compliance notices (Yellow Stickers) to a number of vehicles recently. There are vehicle standards regulations for a reason. Yes, some of the standards may seem a little over the top, and we are fairly reasonable as to how we apply them, nevertheless if your vehicle clearly shouldn't be on the road, a compliance notice will be issued.

On 20 April a Broomehill couple was charged with numerous serious offences that include Aggravated Armed Robbery. The couple have been remanded in custody pending future court appearances.

Can I please remind people that the Tambellup Primary School is off limits to anyone other than teachers, students (during school hours), and other related workers. Anyone else on the school grounds is trespassing and will be charged.

I may have touched on it previously, however I just wished to again stress of the importance of child restraints. Please ensure they're been used correctly to protect your children. For more information about child restraint requirements please contact us.

None of us are liking the restrictions relating to Covid-19, but keep up the great work. It appears to be having a positive impact more broadly, and with any luck the end will be in sight sooner rather than later.


Although it was great to have these four recognised, the 2019/2020 season was a great team effort with many young talents showing great signs for the future.

### Water Corporation crews are asking you to do your bit – think before you flush

Water Corporation is asking the community to make our wastewater crew's work-day easier, by ensuring they only flush the 3P's – pee, poo and (toilet) paper.

Items such as wet wipes, paper kitchen towel and sanitary products should be disposed of in a bin, as this material does not break down in wastewater pipes and can cause blockages.

Water Corporation Great Southern Regional Manager, Adrian Stewart, said crews had stepped up their planned maintenance to clear potential blockages before they happen, but the community needed to do its bit.

"Across Western Australia, our crews are on-the-ground ensuring our essential water and wastewater services continue to be provided to our 1.3 million customers," Mr Stewart said.

"If a blockage occurs in Water Corporation's wastewater network, then our crews have the unenviable job of clearing these blockages, and since the start of this year they have cleared 1,965 blockages (as at 7 April 2020) in the wastewater system.

"Over the past five years, we've spent nearly \$20.4 million clearing blockages from wastewater systems across the State.

"I'm asking the community to do their bit to ensure our crews are only being called out to essential work, and not to clear blockages caused by incorrect things such as wet wipes, paper towels and newspaper being flushed down the toilet.

"Even items that are marketed as flushable cannot be flushed down the toilet. The only things that should be flushed are the 3Ps – pee, poo and (toilet) paper – everything else goes in the bin.

"Thank you to the Western Australian community in advance from our crews who are on the ground each day performing essential work to ensure you continue to receive safe and reliable water and wastewater services."

Blockages can also occur in the internal plumbing of a home, and householders are then responsible for any plumbing repair costs.

To report a fault with the wastewater system, phone Water Corporation's 24 hour Faults, Emergencies and Security line on 13 13 75.

### Did you know?

Water Corporation manages 17,193km of wastewater mains, 1,178 wastewater pump stations and 112 wastewater treatment plants across Western Australia

The significance of Anzac Day and the sacrifices made were remembered.






### Lenard Andrew King

Born at 'Glen Willen' on 27<sup>th</sup> October 1928 to Herbert Andrew King and Mabel 'Annie' King (nee Hull). He was the youngest of four. His siblings being Nellie 'May', Tom (dec) and Don (dec).

Growing up he attended the local Moonies Hill school until the age of 14. Working the farm was priority over school, often missing school to do the cropping. He was always asking his kids how to spell words for him. Corporal punishment was the way of discipline in those days. For that reason he didn't believe in unfair punishment when it came to his own children.

He lived through the depression years as a child, and then later the Second World War, when he lost his eldest brother Tom in PNG. He was too young to go to war, plus he had lifelong asthma which would have discounted him. Horses were a big part of his life as a young person but he didn't want them after Don and his mum had serious accidents with and they used to knock all the fences down. He married Ragnhild 'Rae' Laing, a teacher posted in Tambellup originally from Albany, on the 17th December 1955.



He and his brother, Don, worked the two blocks in Moonies Hill, Tambellup and bought a property at Borden together. Later splitting the partnership with Don moving to Borden and Len retaining the Tambellup blocks.

Rae and Len went on to have four children: Lindsay, Robin, Sandra 'Sandy' and Roderick 'Rod'. He was a very community minded person. Sport-wise he had a solid football, cricket and tennis upbringing. There were remnants of a tennis court on the Glen Wilen farm. Golf and bowls came later. Other community efforts were around cleaning up rubbish. He led many others to do the same. We, at one point called him Mr. Rubbish. He was rewarded with a community award for his efforts. Being humble he believed he did not deserve it. He was committed to anything he was involved in. He once enhanced the surrounds of the bowling green by growing gladiolus. He became a life member of the Tambellup Bowling Club. Sadly he lost his eldest son, Lindsay, age 24, on the farm. This took its toll, as he was backing off and trying to hand the farm over to him. Rod had just finished high school.

Eventually, Rod took over the farm and Len and Rae moved into Tambellup near the golf club, then 18 years later moved to RAAFA village in Albany, where they enjoyed six years with the company of others in the village. Cards and robust conversations were a big part of their lives. Bridge was his choice.

Over his time, Len was very generous and had a worldly view to do for greater good. He had several causes that he donated to. Namely, RFDS, St. John's Ambulance and Bush Heritage. His generosity extended to purchasing solar panels including the installation costs for the entire RAAFA Village. Such was his outlook on saving the planet and keeping costs down for all.



Last year, in 2019, things got too much for them both. Illness plagued them and both took up residence in Clarence Estate in July.

Len still enjoyed a game of cards with Rae every afternoon, right up to when he fell acutely ill. He enjoyed chatting to his sister May, who is also a resident there. He was a popular resident there, staff very much enjoying his sense of humour. His mind was very much together up till the acute illness. He was happy to leave this world, as he was suffering. Passing away at approximately 10pm Monday 30th March 2020. Unfortunately this year of 2020, was also the year of the Covid-19 virus catastrophe, and a community invite to celebrate his life was sadly impossible.



5. Tapping the 'call via device audio' will connect your phone/tablets microphone.





### It's back to school – remember 40km/h zones

Even in these different times some School students will be returning to school on Wednesday 29th April and we would like to remind everyone to take extra care and to heed the 40km/h zones around schools as children begin heading back.

The kids heading back to school will be excited, chattering, looking at their phones – it's essential that drivers slow down and be vigilant as schools resume again.

With statistics showing that every year police detail a high number of people fined for travelling at more than 40km/h in school zones all of us as road users need to be cautious in school zones, even when doing the correct speed, to ensure that children's lives are protected.

In Western Australia 40km/hr speed zones are in place around schools from 7:30 - 9am in the morning and from 2:30-4pm in the afternoon on school days with research showing that a child hit by a car at 40km/hr has a 75% chance of surviving compared to a child hit at 60km/hr only having a 20% survival rate.
