From the History Archives



The Relief Service Unit (Poplar) was a group of people engaged during the Second World War in relief work for those who were taking refuge in the air raid shelters in Poplar, East London. Many of them were pacifists who were exempt active service. Eventually the Unit had more than sixty members and employed several full-time workers. The volunteers used to work through the night, going to their jobs as usual the following day.

When the Blitz started in September 1940 many local people were sheltering in the public air raid shelters every night. The R.S.U. used an old van to take food

and tea to the shelterers. They also helped with other problems, such as dealing with incendiary bombs, taking people to hospital and moving furniture from bombed-out premise.

After initial distrust, they were encouraged by the local authority and eventually the van was replaced by a mobile canteen supplied by the people of Tambellup, Australia. The old van was stationed at the corner of Burdett Road, Commercial Road and East and West India Dock Roads, and became a canteen serving hot drinks for people coming off late or early work shifts; it was known as Coffee Corner, and existed for about a year (1942).

After the Blitz ended, the Unit split into two separate parts, one based in Isleworth and the other in

Poplar, at a bomb-damaged Presbyterian church in Plimsoll Street. The latter was named the Relief Service Unit (Poplar). During the quiet periods between bombing campaigns they organised various activities for local people, including outings to Epping Forest.

COVID-19

While the WA State Government and the public have done a remarkable job of minimising community transmission of the virus, the recent outbreaks in the Eastern States show just how quickly things can deteriorate, and how quickly the Government needs to act to get the outbreaks in check.

While our state borders are closed, and arrivals are closely monitored, it is easy to become complacent about the lack of COVID-19 cases in our area. However the Health Department is urging the WA public to remain vigilant and to keep yourself and your family members safe, by continuing to implement the following measures:

- practise physical distancing (keep at least 1.5 metres or two arms lengths from each other)
- practise good personal hygiene (wash hands often with soap and water, or hand sanitiser and cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use your elbow)
- stay home if unwell and if you are experiencing flu-like symptoms get tested for COVID-19

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETINGS

A Special Meeting of Council was held on 30 June 2020, to consider a number of urgent matters: Drought Communities Program

Council endorsed the projects nominated for the Drought Communities Program (DCP), which include:

- Eligible water efficiency projects including the installation of new 250kL tanks and standpipes in Broomehill and Tambellup for emergency community use, and fitting of camlocks to existing tanks to provide access to water in the event of fires;
- Upgrades to the Broomehill Recreational Complex, to improve pedestrian access to the oval from the Pavilion, and to tier the embankment to provide for better viewing of activities on the oval;
- Development of a 'Holland Track' Interpretive Centre in Broomehill;
- Streetscape upgrades in Broomehill;
- Development of a Nature play playground in Holland Park;
- Development of a youth centre in Tambellup, utilising the Railway Station building;
- Streetscape upgrades in Tambellup; and
- Development of a new Town Square and ANZAC memorial in Tambellup.

SHIRE NOTES

Community consultation was conducted for all aspects of the DCP projects through June, via Topics, a mailed flyer, website and Facebook, and we appreciate the time taken by those who responded with their thoughts. The feedback was presented to Council for their information, however the purpose of this meeting was for Council to endorse the broader scope of the projects to allow the funding application to be submitted and the costs to be included in the development of the budget.

It was pleasing to note that in general, the projects selected, which were derived from the Community Strategic Plan, appear to be in line with the community's thinking. Feedback relating to aspects of the individual projects will be taken on board by Council as the specifics of each project are developed, and more consultation will be undertaken with the community as the program evolves.

Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program

Council also considered eligible projects for a one off stream of funding from the Australian Government, the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program. Given the investment this year in the townsites through the Drought Communities Program, Council has determined that this new funding will be expended on roads in the Shire that do not normally attract roads funding but support significant transport links through he Shire. Projects endorsed include:

- Culvert replacement Nymbup Road, Etna Road
- Town works Broomehill-Kojonup Road (widen road, new kerbing and footpath, from Post Office to Caravan Park), and replacement of broken kerbing in various spots
- Gravel resheeting Beejenup Road, Birt Road, Paul Valley Road, Yetemerup Road, Stirling Access Road, Flatrocks Road

Independent Living Seniors Accommodation

With the completion of the Broomehill Independent Living Units on the near horizon, Council considered the future management of all the independent living housing and the role of the Independent Living Seniors Accommodation (ILSA) Committee.

The ILSA committee, with community representation, was established in 2013/2014 when the Sandalwood Villas were under construction. At that time, the provision of this type of service to the community was new to the Shire, and advice from a wide range of sources was required to ensure the processes that were established for the operation of the units were appropriate. The input from the ILSA Committee, and especially the community representatives, was valued and appreciated.

Since then, the systems and processes have developed to a point where the management of the independent living seniors' accommodation is considered business as usual, and is managed in conjunction with staff housing, by Shire staff. For that reason, Council determined to disband the ILSA committee.

Council wishes to express its thanks to the community representatives who served on the ILSA Committee over the years - Liz Reynalds, Barbara Groves and Aileen Prout – and to the various Councillors who were involved with the committee.

Broomehill Independent Living Units

During May the Shire asked the community for suggestions for a name for the new independent living units complex in Broomehill. A number of suggestions were received, and these were considered at the June 30 Special Council Meeting. Council determined that the new complex would be named 'Holland Court', reflecting the town's historical connections to John Holland and the Holland Track. New signage will be installed at the entrance to the complex in the near future.

SHIRE NOTES

From the 23 July 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting

Council adopted the 2020-2021 Annual budget. A budget overview will be presented in the August 2020 Topics.

Council received the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan annual report. The annual report is required to be submitted to the Department of Communities, and outlines Council's progress towards achieving the seven outcomes of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. Highlights during 2019-2020 included the construction of the independent living seniors units in Broomehill, all of which have incorporated accessibility features to enable our seniors to age in place, and the upgrade to the Shire's website to comply with accessibility standards.

Council endorsed the review of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. The Plan, which is a five year document, outlines the outcomes required, and the strategies that the Shire will undertake to progress achieving the outcomes, over the next five year period. The review process included a period of community consultation seeking feedback on the Plan itself, and Councils performance to date in relation to improving outcomes for people with disability. A small number of submissions were received relating to improvements required at community facilities, and these suggestions have been noted for completion in this year's budget.

Council received the Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 Quarterly Progress Report for the period April – June 2020 2020. Progress has been summarised as follows:

Council endorsed the desktop review of the Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022. A yearly desktop review of the Corporate Business Plan is conducted to review the financial implications for the year ahead in context of the annual budget, Strategic Resource Plan and other informing documents. No significant changes were made to the Plan.

Council reviewed a number of documents in relation to the Independent Living Seniors Accommodation, required due to the changes resulting from the disbanding of the Independent Living Seniors Accommodation Committee, and the near completion of the new units in Broomehill. A number of policies, manuals and procedures required amendment and endorsement by Council. The completion of this process gets the Shire a step closer to being able to welcome new residents to Holland Court.

Council considered and granted planning consent for the use and development of Lot 547 (100) Tieline Road, Broomehill for a patio subject to conditions.

SHIRE NOTES

Council conducted a review of its delegations register. Delegations to the CEO are made to facilitate prompt business transactions and streamline the customer service functions of the Shire to ensure waiting times and delays are kept to a minimum.

Council endorsed an application by the Shire to the Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Fund 2020-2021 Small Grants Round, for funding to assist with upgrade of pedestrian access between the Broomehill Recreational Complex pavilion to the oval. The works, which will include the construction of pedestrian ramps, landings, stairs and hand rails, will be completed as part of the Complex upgrade projects of the Drought Communities Program.

WORKS

We were sad to farewell long term staff member Ricky Riley during June. Ricky has left the Shire to go mining – in a far warmer climate we are sure. We look forward to catching up with Ricky when he's about town during his time off.

We are pleased to announce that Steve Ryan has been appointed to the position of Team Leader Construction, in Ricky's place. Steve has been acting in the role since Ricky commenced his period of leave in December, and has done a great job. Congratulations Steve!

While waiting for the adoption of the budget to allow the 2020-2021 works program to commence, staff have been undertaking planning works for the next year's projects, to allow funding submissions to be completed. These included survey and design processes on Tieline Rd, Flat Rocks Rd and Greenhills South Rd. Evaluation of material quantities for 2020-2021 road projects has also been finalised, with tenders for supply to be advertised following adoption of the budget. Staff are on the hunt for gravel supplies in the Shire that are in proximity to this year's construction projects. Line-marking has been completed on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road, Tambellup West Road and centreline spotting has been completed on the approach to the Warrenup Road intersection. This section will be line-marked during the next round of programmed works in September/October.

The maintenance crew has been busy attending to a wide range of tasks during July, from delivery of sand and construction of the sand pads for the tank at the new Broomehill Fire Station, attending to potholes and fallen trees on various roads, cleaning of drains on Tambellup West Rd, guidepost and sign maintenance, and tree pruning on Moulyerup Rd and Bessen Rd.

The Broomehill and Tambellup ovals were sprayed for broadleaf weeds during July. Parks and gardens staff have undertaken new plantings in both townsites, including the establishment of a new garden at the information bay on the northern entrance to Tambellup.

Roads graded during July included: Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Punchmirup North Rd, Pallinup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Norrish Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Holly East Rd, Washington Rd, Holding Rd, Mattiske Rd, Parnell Rd, Moore Rd, Wandoo Rd, Hassell Rd.

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UPDATE FROM THE TAMBELLUP POLICE



This month's topics has a special invitation and, for the first paragraphs below, I ask for the attention of our local Indigenous families and friends:

Welcome to August!

Starting with some promising news: While "The Zone" Youth Worker position is being filled, we're delighted to introduce one of our key support people, Karen Herlihy from South Coast NRM.

Karen and her team are officially now part of the Broomehill-Tambellup community and they're hosting a big dinner and activity registration day right here in town.

- When? 4pm onwards on 3 September 2020
- Who? Indigenous High School-Aged Young People
- What? Grab a feed and register your name to join the semester-two mob!

Once you're registered, you'll join ten after-school events in semester two, centred around the 6 Noongar seasons. You'll even go on a 3-day camp in Camp Quaranup.

I can't emphasize how special this opportunity is and how fortunate we are to have this initiative in our community so please take advantage of it and get yourselves down to The Zone right after school on 3.09.20.

"What about me?" I'm glad you asked. If you are not yet in high school and are hanging out to join The Zone after school, ALL school-aged students are welcome from 3.30pm on Friday, 28/8/20

The Zone will be open, and we will be taking registrations for The Zone after-school-hang-out then.

Off road motorbikes: It's one thing to ride your off-road bike discreetly and legally in an approved area, off road. It's another to rev the bike loudly on a Sunday morning near the sports pavilion or up and down the main drag in Broomehill. Do you want to lose your bike and go to court? Just cease this behaviour or we will be knocking on your door soon. Your bike can be confiscated and crushed, never to be seen again.

Well done on getting you and yours back to school. It is the best and safest place for them, and it gives parents a break. If you are struggling to get your son or daughter back to school, remember you're not alone and you can contact your school to ask for support. Young people seek boundaries and discipline in their regular environment.

On that note, please remember that YOUR safe environment, combined with real and reasonable consequences, builds resilience in young people. There is a difference between being their friend and being a boundary-setting role model. If they can learn cause and effect at home, it may prevent them from learning about these things in an uncontrolled environment where it is less safe.

80+ CCTV Cameras are now keeping a watch over many houses between Gnowangerup and Wagin. Thank you to all your support. You have also raised \$100 for the local VFES through purchasing your CCTV Systems!

The Zone building was damaged to the value of about \$3000 last month. Fortunately, a witness obtained footage of the young offenders which led police to a resolution. In this instance, they were under the age of criminal responsibility, however both families were cooperative and supportive.

Stay safe and drive safe out there.







Rabbit Baiting program for Broomehill and Tambellup town sites

The Shire of Broomehill - Tambellup is currently undertaking a vermin control program, this program will be extended until 1st September 2020

The program will include baiting for rabbits in bushlands surrounding both town sites and sports complexes.

This program is required due to increasing damage to Shire assets such as ovals and parks. Baits used may be toxic to domestic pets if they come into frequent contact, so please be vigilant while this program is in affect when walking or walking pets in these areas. Stations are a simple design of a 1.5 meter section of tin in a semi-circle or U shape, or a large plastic drum cut down, the bait used will be inoculated oats with a covering of green dye which will be situated on the ground under the station. Please avoid these stations as frequent contact or disturbances to the sight can lessen the effect of the stations. If you have any questions about this baiting program please contact the shire on 9825 3555 or for any additional information about baiting programs or control methods go to www.agric.wa.gov.au



In WA <u>European rabbits (Oryctolagus cuniculus) are declared pests</u> of agriculture under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007* and as such, landholders are required to control rabbits on their properties. Even landholders not growing crops are still legally obliged to control rabbits to protect their neighbours' land from the impact of rabbits.









