FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council determined that Ordinary Meetings would be conducted on the following dates in 2021:

All meetings will commence at 4.30pm at the Tambellup Council Chambers unless advertised otherwise. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

Council accepted a tender from Westrac for the purchase of a 2020 Caterpillar 140M grader and trade of the 2012 Caterpillar 12M grader.

Council accepted a tender from Westrac for the purchase of a Caterpillar 444 Backhoe Loader 2020 model and trade of the 2013 Caterpillar 444 Backhoe Loader.

WORKS

At time of writing, contractors were about to commence stabilising works on Toolbrunup Road is preparation for sealing. From here, contractors will move to Pallinup Rd, and sealing on both jobs will be completed by Christmas. We acknowledge the timing of these works, during peak harvest period, is not ideal, however we have been at the mercy of the contractors who have experienced delays on other jobs. People travelling in the vicinity of roadworks are asked to observe all traffic management directives, and drive with caution.

The maintenance graders worked through the south west corner of the Shire during November, with grading completed on the following roads: Paul Valley Rd, Hassell Rd, Nymbup Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Bessen Rd, Johnston Rd, Wansbrough West Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Binniup Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Barrecup Rd, Kings Cross Rd, Newton Rd, Cristinelli Rd, Bowman Rd, Thorn Rd, Forward Rd, Lehmann Rd, Beejenup Rd, Pallinup Rd. Vegetation pruning has been completed along Greenhills South Rd ad Crosby Rd, and the contractors have done a great job.

FIRE BREAKS - BROOMEHILL

The Shire has been made aware of instances where logs, branches and fencing wire have been placed across firebreaks in the vicinity of the Broomehill townsite by persons unknown. Firebreaks have a specific and important purpose, and that is to assist in restricting the spread of a fire and to allow access by firefighting appliances to areas to fight a fire. These firebreaks are strategically located to protect the townsite. Any obstruction of these firebreaks puts your whole community at risk – residents, the volunteer brigade members who give their time freely to protect your property, and potentially you as an individual. This activity also presents a significant danger to anyone using the firebreaks and may result in serious injury.

The Bush Fires Act 1954 states it is an offence for any person to restrict access to firebreaks constructed for the purpose of preventing, controlling or extinguishing a bush fire, with a penalty of \$5000. The severity of this matter has required the Shire to involve local police.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM - AMENDED CONCEPT PLANS

Advice has been received that the Shire's application for Drought Communities Program funding of \$1 million has been approved, and we are currently awaiting documentation to confirm this advice. As previously advised, the following projects were nominated:

- Holland Track Interpretive Centre
- Broomehill Recreational Complex Access Upgrades
- Holland Park Nature Play Area
- Broomehill Streetscape upgrades

- Tambellup Town Square Redevelopment
- · Tambellup Youth Centre Upgrade
- Tambellup Streetscape upgrades
- Water efficiency improvements

The consultation process around the townscape projects has continued, with the latest draft of the concept plans advertised for community comment. The comment period closed on 27 November 2020, and all submissions will be considered by Council at the December Council meeting, with the aim of commencing works in the New Year.

The intent of the program is to provide an economic stimulus to the community, and local businesses and contractors will play a key role in delivering each project. The timeframe for these works to be complete is tight – by 30 June 2021 - and we anticipate a flurry of activity in the New Year. Watch this space!

IT'S BUSHFIRE SEASON AGAIN......

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2020**. No burning is permitted from this date until **14 FEBRUARY 2021**.

As you are aware, all our brigades are manned by volunteers who give freely of their time to keep our community safe. How about playing your part?

- Prepare your home ready for the bushfire season,
- Exercise caution when working outside with equipment that may cause a fire,
- Have that 5 Minute Chat with your family to establish your Bush Fire Plan, and
- Tune in to emergency service broadcast channels to keep up to date with current conditions and events ABC Radio is the official emergency broadcaster.

Harvesting? Locked up in your air conditioned cab you may not be aware of changing weather conditions outside. Keep an eye on the forecast, chat to your neighbours and your brigade contacts (below), and if in doubt – stop!

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Summer is here, harvest is underway, and just a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- Harvest Ban Hotline phone 98251042. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans
 and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you
 could contact Lesley or Sam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you
 would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- Radio broadcasts ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle
 movement bans at scheduled times through the day (10.15am, 12.15pm, 2.15pm). While every effort is made
 to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always
 possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer contact details are noted above.
- And if all else fails make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

EMERGENCY WA

Emergency WA (www.emergency.wa.gov.au) is the State's official website for community warnings and other emergency management information for bushfires, storms, cyclones, floods and other emergency situations. The site provides real time updates on emergency warnings and incidents across the state, as well as information on preparing and recovering from and emergency situation. One to bookmark!

EMERGENCY PLUS

Another one for the toolbox of useful stuff - Emergency Plus is a free app for your mobile device that allows you to alert emergency services (Triple Zero - 000, Police, SES) if you require emergency assistance. The app provides a GPS location of your current position, and this information can be relayed directly to emergency services by selecting the service required. A range of other useful information has recently been added, including contacts for the Poisons Information Hotline, Crime Stoppers, Health Direct, Life Line and more. The app can be downloaded for both Apple and android devices.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

The Shire Offices will close at **4.00pm** on **Wednesday 23 December 2020** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Monday 4 January 2021**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period. Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Wednesday 23 December 2020. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas/New Year period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on **Thursday 24 December** and **Thursday 7 January**. The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on **Thursday 31 December** and **Thursday 14 January**. Please ensure your bins are out early as the contractor may be running early.

The Waste Transfer Stations will be closed on Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

I think it is now timely to remind everyone to please take care on the roads. There has recently been a huge increase in road movements due to harvest and tourism in our part of the world. These increased movements will inevitably increase the risk of road trauma occurring, so once again please take extra care, be patient and consider all road users when making <u>decisions</u>. With an increase in festive season parties and gatherings, please don't be tempted to drink and drive. Identify your skipper before you head out to

avoid an unwanted encounter with police, a loss of licence or worse the fact you could endanger yourself, your passenger and other road users. DON'T BE TEMPTED.

There was a recent incident in Broomehill whereby someone suspended wire across a firebreak in Crown Land near to the Broomehill Primary School. In addition to this branches and debris were placed on the firebreak. This may have been done to prevent or deter motorbike riders from riding in that particular area?? These acts really concern me and need to stop. There are numerous examples of past similar incidents that have resulted in people being seriously injured and killed. The local Ranger and Tambellup Police are keeping a close eye on this. If the offender is identified and sufficient evidence exists, the person will be charged with the serious offence of 'Acts Likely to Endanger Life', or an alternate charge appropriate in the circumstances. THINK CAREFULLY BEFORE YOU ACT!

TAMBELLUP VOLUNTEER FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICE

Well, what a year 2020 has been! While the world paused due to COVID-19, our emergency services continued on, armed with hand sanitiser, disinfectant and a roll of paper towel, and of course, the necessary equipment to assist people out of some pretty scary predicaments.

We gained a couple of new members through the year, and they have both thrown themselves into training along with the rest of the team. While all DFES training was shut down during the COVID period, we have made up for it in

the last couple of months with members completing a Basic General Rescue course with Gnowangerup SES over three week nights and a Saturday in October, and then On Road/Off Road Driving over two weekends in November with instructors from metro career—stations and the DFES Academy. Our thanks to DFES Great Southern for arranging these opportunities, and also thanks to Ben and Maxine at the Tambellup Hotel, Beth at the Tambellup Post Cafe and Belinda Hankinson for your assistance in accommodating and feeding the troops!

Aside from external training, we have also continued our semi-regular locally based training sessions. These generally involve cutting up a car, or spraying water, sometimes both. Familiarisation with the fire truck, light tanker and rescue

equipment is essential to providing efficient response, and all members get involved in these activities. Our storm and land search roles are also getting some attention, with a roof safety system and harnesses arriving a couple of weeks ago.

We've also checked the hydrants for serviceability – did you know the Water Corp has installed many, many more than the few we had? It's reassuring to know that if there was a serious fire in the Tambellup townsite, that there is now the ability to tap into the scheme in most areas of town for a constant water supply to the fire truck.

All in all, it's been a pretty good year — we have been able to respond to incidents as required, we've trained and learned some new skills, and refreshed many more. There have been plenty of laughs along the way. And — most importantly — our shed doesn't leak anymore!

If you had ever considered doing something for your community, why not consider becoming a member of your local emergency service unit? There's a job for everyone – frontline or behind the frontline, and it's not all hard work.



Bench helps to spread powerful message

A brightly coloured bench newly installed outside Tambellup Community Resource Centre is intended to convey a very powerful message.

Made possible in part by a micro-grant from Linkwest, the not-for-profit peak body which represents over 150 regional, remote, and metropolitan Neighbourhood and Community Resource Centres in WA, the purple bench provides a highly visible symbol of the issue of domestic violence, and includes a plaque detailing a support helpline for victims. Jane Chilcott, CEO of Linkwest, explains that the initiative was first launched in Canada, back in 2015, where purple benches were installed in public parks to honour the memory of women murdered by their partner and to provide help numbers for people in need.

"When we heard about the initiative from one of our regional member Centres, which had transformed an old park bench into a symbolic purple bench, we thought it would be wonderful if there could eventually be one outside all of our member Centres across the State," explains Ms Chilcott.

"Linkwest now offers 16 micro-grants to their members per year in honour of the 16 Days in WA campaign, a 'Stop Violence Against Women' campaign which runs from 25th of November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, to the 10th of December, which is Human Rights Day.

"As an organisation, Linkwest stands in solidarity with the survivors, those lost and those who are still doing what they can to keep themselves and their children safe in a home where domestic violence is an ongoing threat."

Rebekka Polack – Coordinator of the Centre says: "We feel that the Purple Bench initiative provides a permanent reminder that domestic and family violence exists in all communities and every West Australian has a responsibility to recognise and respond appropriately to this devastating issue in our community.

We would also like to thank the Tambellup CWA branch for their generous donation, and the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire for helping us to install the bench."

The bench can be found outside Tambellup Community Resource Centre, which is located at 34 Norrish Street, Tambellup.
