FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered and approved an amendment to the 2020-2021 budget to accommodate additional bridge funding received from Main Roads WA and subsequent work on Martinup Bridge; and to reflect the reallocation of Black Spot funding between two approved projects – improvements to the Flat Rocks Rd/Greenhills South Rd intersection and Tieline Rd/Norrish Rd intersection. The reallocation was required following review of the scope of works for the Flat Rocks Rd/Greenhills South Rd works, which indicated a more extensive realignment and improvement was required to achieve the best outcome for the longer term. Works to the Tieline Rd/Norrish Rd intersection have been deferred until 2021/2022.

Council endorsed a Memorandum of Understanding with Great Southern Treasures. The MOU provides Great Southern Treasures (and participating local governments) with an interim governance structure until a formal structure has been finalised and adopted. Council also committed to funding Great Southern Treasures for the next three years, and endorsed the Great Southern Treasures Strategic Plan.

Council endorsed projects to be nominated for Round 2 of the federally funded Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program. The following projects will be included in the 2020-2021 budget to deliver this funded program:

Council endorsed the draft concept plans for the Drought Communities Program-funded town centre works, with the CEO to investigate additional car parking bays in the Tambellup concept plans.

Council approved the use of the Tambellup Infant Health Centre as a daycare centre to be operated by Tambellup Family Daycare commencing in 2021.

WORKS

A couple of major construction jobs were completed in December, with sealing completed on Toolbrunup Rd and Pallinup Rd prior to Christmas. Work commenced on the Flat Rocks Rd/Greenhills South Rd Black Spot funded project, with clearing and culvert extensions completed before the works crew stood down for their Christmas break.

Tree slashing and vegetation control has been completed along the full length of Greenhills South Road, as well as Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) submission roads that have been assessed by Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA). These include Jam Creek Road, Bignell Road-Norrish Road intersection and Eureka Road.

Staff provided assistance at a number of fires experienced in the Shire during the harvest period. The loader was deployed on a number of occasions to assist with containment of the fires. While it was fortunate that this was possible, it should be noted that requests for Shire plant and machinery to assist with containment may not always be possible or timely if the machines are working any distance away from the fire location. It should also be noted that in accordance with Council policy, assistance provided in 'mopping up' activities where requested by landowners will be charged to the landowner at current private works rates.

Maintenance grading was completed on the following roads during December: Chillicup Rd, Pallinup Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Beejerup Rd, Stock Route Rd, Warrenup Rd, Hassell Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Tilbury Rd, Burridge Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Aylmore Rd, Yetermerup Rd, Hamilla Rd, Nazzari Rd, North Stirling Rd.

Both ovals have had maintenance completed to reticulation systems, with sprinklers repaired or replaced where required. The solar pump on the CBH dam in Broomehill is working well. Reticulation on the Tambellup oval has been switched over to the Water Corporation's treated waste water while it is available, and will then revert to the Jam Creek Dam. The hot days and winds over Christmas and New Year have crisped the grass a little, however given its healthy condition prior to summer, we are confident it will bounce back with regular watering and calmer conditions.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN 2018-2028 REVIEW

The Strategic Community Plan 2018-2028 is the principal document that guides Council's short, medium and long term planning, and was developed following extensive community consultation in 2017 and 2018. The Shire is required to undertake a desktop review of the Strategic Community Plan, and invites community feedback to this process.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM

As noted above, Council endorsed the amended concept plans for the town centre upgrades in Broomehill and Tambellup, noting the requirement to consider additional parking in the Tambellup plan. Thank you to those people who provided feedback to the second consultation period. The main matters which were the subject of public comments (for both consultation rounds) included the following:

- Location of Holland Track Interpretive Centre: Council will consider this in conjunction with advice from the heritage consultant to be engaged to develop the project. The project will include additional heritage interpretation to be installed at other locations in the townsite.

- Retention of trees in Tambellup town centre: The concept plans show many mature trees are to be retained, however the single remaining pine tree will be removed as pines restrict successful plantings and damage road/paths and kerbings for a wide area, as is evidenced already. Additional tree plantings are proposed.
- The location of the proposed water play and nature play areas on Norrish St: Currently these elements are unfunded and as such, are not part of the Drought Communities funded project. If funding is sourced to allow these to be implemented, further public consultation in regard to location and design will be undertaken.
- Parking availability in Norrish St: The concept plan indicates in excess of sixty bays are proposed between Henry St and the Tambellup Health Centre (extent of the plan). Existing parking is also currently available on Crowden St, and behind the Shire Hall/office. Council has requested the CEO to investigate opportunities for additional parking in Norrish St. Provision will also be made for long vehicle and bus parking. This will be considered in the development of the detailed designs.
- Relocation of the War Memorial in Tambellup: It is considered this program provides an opportunity to move the memorial a short distance into the town centre reserve, to enhance the safety of people paying their respects (off the road) but also to enhance the setting in keeping with the construction of the memorial itself. More information on the design of this area will be available during the detailed design process.
- Inclusion of lawn areas and water requirements associated: It is considered that some grass is required to soften the area, to enhance its purpose as a town square. The extent of lawn areas will be determined in the detail planning, however it is anticipated the total area will be less than 400sqm which equates to an increase of less than 1% on total grassed areas maintained in the Tambellup townsite. Council has determined to proceed with installation of grassed areas. It is intended that all new lawns and garden areas will be reticulated for maximum water efficiency. Staff will investigate the possibility of using recycled water, as is used on the oval and Diprose Park when it is available.

Following Council's endorsement of the concept plans, the architect will be preparing detailed designs, with consideration of the parking matter outlined above. These will be made available for public inspection when they are ready. During January staff are undertaking procurement processes and engaging contractors as required to be able to commence all works early in February. Watch this space!

IT'S BUSHFIRE SEASON AGAIN.....

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period is in place until **14 FEBRUARY 2021** inclusive. No burning is permitted during this period.

The **RESTRICTED** burning period applies from **15 FEBRUARY 2021** until **15 APRIL 2021**. Permits to light fires are required to be obtained during this period, through your Brigade Fire Control Officer.

February often presents the most challenging conditions for our volunteer brigades, with extremes of weather the norm. Please remain vigilant when working outdoors, or with anything that may cause a fire.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Summer is here, and while harvest is finished, the dry conditions are still with us. Here's a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- **Harvest Ban Hotline – phone 98251042.** This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- **Text messaging** - Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. **If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Lesley or Sam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct.** Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- **Radio broadcasts** – ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day (10.15am, 12.15pm, 2.15pm). While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- **Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer** – contact details are noted above.
- **And if all else fails** – make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

EMERGENCY WA

Emergency WA (www.emergency.wa.gov.au) is the State's official website for community warnings and other emergency management information for bushfires, storms, cyclones, floods and other emergency situations. The site provides real time updates on emergency warnings and incidents across the state, as well as information on preparing and recovering from an emergency situation. One to bookmark!

Do you own a swimming pool? An important reminder for pool owners.

Maintenance of Gate Hinges in Private Swimming Pool Safety Barriers



Swimming pool safety barrier gates are one of the most common means of unsupervised access to the pool area for young children.

Please maintain your swimming pool gate latches and hinges to ensure you have a compliant safety barrier in place at all times.

The most important elements of compliance for pool gates are:

- a) Does the gate close by itself from any open position, including from resting on the latch?
- b) Is the self-latching device working properly?
- c) Is the gate secure when closed?
- d) Does the gate open outwards, away from the pool area?
- e) Is the latch release mechanism, either:
 - At least 1.5 metres above the ground; or
 - Located on the inside of the gate, at least 15cm below the top of the gate and shielded so no opening greater than 1cm occurs between the top of the gate and radius of 45 cm from the latch.

UPDATE FROM THE TAMBELLUP POLICE

Hello,



Well 2021 is now well and truly upon us. I hope everybody had an enjoyable and relaxing Christmas and New Year Period with family and friends.

The Covid vaccine has finally been approved for rollout in Australia, so with any luck Covid and the surrounding restrictions will be behind us sooner rather than later. Fortunately, the virus and related impact has been minimal in this part of the world, but it has still impacted us all at least in-directly over the past few months. At this time there is an ongoing demand for police officers throughout the state due to Covid, and this may further impact Tambellup Police in the coming months. I ask that you please be patient if that is the case, but don't worry, this will not impact emergency requests.

Congratulations to the Broomehill Tambellup Community for behaving over the past couple of months. Our notable reduction in reported crime has continued and this clearly bodes well for all of us.

SAFETY ADVICE FOR SENIORS –

Your safety at home –

- If you see something wrong or unusual, never get physically involved. Instead call the police immediately on 131 444 or 000 if it's an emergency.
- If you live alone, keep your details private.
- Apart from family, friends, and trusted neighbours, beware of telling people that you are alone at home. For example, when dealing with delivery and tradespeople, either directly or on the phone, try to indicate that there is someone else living with you. Simply say that you have to consult your partner, friend or relative before finalising any arrangements.
- Make sure your house number is clearly visible from the street to enable emergency services to locate your house easily.
- At night close all your curtains and remove clothes from any outside lines. Keep an outside light on so anyone approaching your home can be seen.
- Make sure you have a clear view from your windows. If you have plants growing in front of windows, consider pruning them so that a potential intruder can't hide behind them.
- Avoid leaving a spare key outside your house. You never know who is watching, so leave your house key with a trusted friend, family member or neighbour.
- Always keep security screen doors locked when solid doors are open!
- Make sure that handbags and or wallets are not left in sight, on bench tops or cupboards.
- Listen to your instincts: if something doesn't feel safe or comfortable, be aware and take precautions.
- If you're a victim of crime, don't be embarrassed. It's important to tell someone who can help you as soon as possible. For counselling and support, please contact the Victim Support Service on 1800 818 988.
- Know your neighbours!

All of these above tips shouldn't just apply to Seniors however, they should apply to all of us, and please don't think that because you live on a farm you're invulnerable, as there can be pros and cons when it comes to living in an isolated location. In fact, I investigated an incident when posted in the Wheatbelt, whereby one night a young man with a disability walked a number of kilometres through bush and across paddocks, before arriving at a secondary house on a farm. He entered through an **un-locked sliding door**, took possession of a knife from the resident's kitchen while the resident lay asleep on his couch in front of the television. The young man then approached the resident and repeatedly stabbed him for no reason. Fortunately, the resident over powered the young man and was able to restrain him and phone police. The resident survived, but did suffer emotionally in the wake of the incident, as you can imagine. The victim and offender were not known to each other. Thankfully a very rare and unusual incident.....Yes, But it might be a wakeup call to those that proudly say, "I don't lock my doors"? I'm certainly not trying to scare anyone, as I say that incident was highly unusual, but be smart not paranoid.

Take care and make the most of this warm weather while it lasts.
