

Geraldine commenced in her role early in March, and has quickly learned her way around the many aspects of management of the Shire's parks and recreational facilities. Maurice, Bryan and Joshua commenced in their new positions late in March, and Natasha (Tash) will commence after Easter.

We also take this opportunity to farewell a long term member of staff, in Larry Wildblood. Larry commenced with the Shire in 2011, and worked in many areas of operations during his almost-10 years with us. Most recently, Larry was working in the Parks and Gardens team, and contributed many of his life's learnings to establishing better and more sustainable practices in this area. Thanks Larry, and enjoy your well-earned retirement!

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Council received the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Workforce Plan 2018-2022 following the minor review completed by staff. The Workforce Plan sets out the 'people' requirements of the Shire's operations, to ensure the number and structure of staffing is appropriate to be able to achieve the strategies contained within the Strategic Community Plan.
- Council considered and adopted the new policy 1.26 'Unreasonable Complainant Conduct Policy'. This policy sets out Council's responsibilities in terms of dealing with complaints and how instances of unreasonable complainant conduct are to be managed.

WORKS REPORT

Staff are currently working on the Flat Rocks/Greenhills South Road intersection. Sealing of the intersection was completed mid-March and new signage is to be installed, completing the project. From here, the construction crew has moved to Tie Line/Moulyerup Road Blackspot - funded project. It is anticipated that the works will take three weeks to complete. Some work has commenced on the widening of the seal on Journal Street. If you are travelling in the vicinity of these road works, we ask that you slow down, drive to conditions and observe signage in place.

Four roads which are the subject of Restricted Access vehicle (RAV) amendment requests have had necessary works completed, and the Shire is currently waiting for Main Roads to reassess. These roads are Eureka Rd, Norrish Rd, Bignell Rd and Jam Creek Rd.

The maintenance crew has placed traffic counters on various roads around the Shire, with the data on traffic movements to be used to inform future Regional Road Group funding applications. Installation of guide posts, sign repair or replacement and patching of potholes is an everyday task around the Shire.

Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads through March: Beejenup Rd, Sorrento Rd, Pindellup Rd, North West Rd, White Rd, Hamilla Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Flat Rocks Rd, Chillicup Rd, Brassey Rd, Clinic Rd, Cemetery Rd, Rae Rd, McGuire Rd, Nelson Rd, Spencer Rd, Hassell Rd, Tilbury Rd, White Rd, Aylmore Rd.

The Parks and Gardens crew has completed the installation of garden beds at the Independent Living Seniors units in Broomehill, Holland Court. Some good rainfall in areas of catchment have resulted in the Jam Creek dams being at around one third capacity, which will provide a buffer when the treated waste water availability ends.

BUDGET

Staff have commenced preparation of the 2021/2022 annual budget and as part of that process, community and sporting groups are invited to submit requests to Council for consideration in the budget. Written submissions should be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by the end of May.







Cranbrook Motocross Gears up for Second State Round



We plan to once again live stream this state event to facebook and youtube for those enthusiasts who want to relive the event afterwards and for those who don't know much about the sport and just want to check in from the comfort of their lounge rooms.

In preparation the track maintenance team have been busy on the weekend of 20-21st March moving dirt to raise and level of the spectator viewing area next to our walkway bridge, and also enlarging our dam for water security. It was a hive of activity with local business Shane Fiegert, Butch Packard and Total Harvesting from Albany lending a hand.

We plan to construct a permanent club house/canteen building in this spectator area that looks upward to the Sukey Hill track. Being a central place at the venue it is where most people view the track from first and therefore is an area we would like to

beautify with limestone terrace seating and lawn. It also falls under stage three in development at this regional motorcycling facility, with the final stage being a track watering system.

This season we are continuing with our monthly coaching clinics run by Motorcycling Australia qualified coaches suitable for all riding abilities and ages. Cost for these clinics is \$30 to cover the riders insurance for the day, or \$130 for the seasons insurance. These are a great introduction to the sport and build riders track and racing skills.

On Sunday 28th March our riders will head to Southern Capes Motorcycle Club near Busselton to compete in the regional interclub. This year there are six clubs with Narrogin Motorcycle Club joining the series for the first time. Regional events are the prelude for the state events and Cranbrook will be hosting this event a month before the state round on 15th August.

Our next event is ANZAC Weekend Ride Park 25th April cost \$50, camping and canteen is available. Spectators are welcome.





The Tambellup Methodist church was built in 1905 and has seen many wedding, baptism and funeral throughout its history.

As time has gone by a new Church was built and is known as the Tambellup Uniting Church thanks to the congregation and Minnie Saggers. The old church then became the Church Hall and was used for Meetings, Sunday School and after church cups of tea.

After 115 years it has deteriorated to the point where the ceiling is falling down due to termite infection, and old age, it is now in a too dangerous state for use of any kind. We are waiting on the Perth Uniting Church to give us the go ahead to demolish the building as we have a local quote to do the work needed and they will clear the site. A plaque will be erected to mark the historical site.

In the meantime the Uniting Church congregation has dwindled down to a few members who still want to see the beautiful Church remain in the community but are finding it harder to keep up with ongoing expenses for insurance, electricity, maintenance etc. We feel that in the community there are families of members who belong to the church who may feel inclined to help out to keep the Church going with contributions towards our ongoing expenses.

The Church belongs to the people of Tambellup and we would be loathe to see it be left to deteriorate as it is still in very good condition.

If any person feels that they can help us keep the Church open we would be very please to hear from them.

Transitioning to normal tenancy laws

As the curtains close on Western Australia's COVID-19 emergency period, we begin transitioning back to normal tenancy laws in which there is no longer a moratorium on rent increases and some evictions.

While everyone adjusts to the changes, Consumer Protection has been fielding enquiries from landlords and tenants wondering about their rights and responsibilities when it comes to ending a tenancy, rent rises and rental arrears.

When increasing rent, landlords need to provide tenants at least 60 days' notice via a 'rent increase notice – form 10'. While there is no cap on rent increases, a tenant can apply to the Magistrate's Court for a determination if they believe the amount is excessive.

Tenants should know they cannot be evicted from a property straight after the end of the emergency period, as there is a process involved in ending a tenancy. Landlords are required to give 30 days' notice to end a fixed-term tenancy and 60 days' notice to conclude a periodic lease.

If a tenant has received a notice of termination, but has

not left the premises on the due date, the landlord must then apply to the court for an order for vacant possession of the property.

Should a tenant have nowhere to go, the Emergency Relief and Food Assistance Service (ERFRAS) is a good first option – this service provided by Anglicare connects people with emergency relief assistance, financial counselling and other community help. If it's a crisis situation, Consumer Protection has an online guide to help tenants find a service that may be able to help.

Consumer Protection will continue playing its part to preserve tenancies across WA through the Residential Rental Relief Grants Scheme and providing a conciliation service to help tenants and landlords reach agreements on issues that have arisen during the pandemic.

Applications for conciliation, rent arrears assistance and future rent support grants will remain open until 28 June 2021, but in the meantime we urge landlords and tenants to act and negotiate in good faith to agree on reasonable and workable tenancy agreements, helping to create stability and certainty moving forward.

What's been happening with the Tambellup Community Cropping Group?!?!

Lots and lots!! We have some exciting developments to report on!

Firstly, we would like to thank Chub & Sally Walker for the share-cropping program we were able to run with them on their farm over the past 3 years, it was a successful venture and we thank them very much for their contribution.

We are really excited to start the program this year as we have successfully secured 2 x 3 year land leases East of town. One is approximately 165 croppable hectares and the second 45 croppable hectares, take over is set for 4 April 2021.

We have already had soil tests & profiling completed by Nutrien Tambellup/Gnowangerup which was very generously done as a donation for us and we can now move forward with soil management. We are aiming to hold our seeding day on 20 April 21 (weather permitting) this year we're set to seed Trident Canola which is a hybrid variety. We have been very lucky to receive more generous donations of 2 x 120kg Trident seed from Nuseed and Elders Cranbrook respectively, we will also purchase another 120kg of Trident from Elders.

On seeding day Afgri Gnowangerup, McIntosh & Son and Harvest Centre from Katanning all intend to come out with demonstration machines to put the crop in.

We have secured public liability insurance from Elders Katanning and they have kindly donated to us the crop insurance policy.

So, what are the community benefiting projects we are financially contributing to?!?!

The TCCG has committed to contribute a total of \$150,000 over two years (2 x 75K payments) to the Shire of Broomehill Tambellup for the construction of short-term accommodation chalets as part of the Tambellup Caravan Park development project. We feel that this is a really worthwhile project as there is a noticeable shortage of accommodation for seasonal workers, construction/road crews and of course for travellers or for people coming to the area for sporting events and functions.

We have also committed to contributing \$20,000 towards the purchase and assembly of an electronic LED sign to put on the Great Southern Highway (possibly at the Southern entrance of town) which will be used for event advertisements and also Emergency Services updates. This project is in conjunction with the Shire of Broomehill Tambellup.

We held our AGM on the evening of Friday 19 March 21. We elected the office bearers and committee, as well as discussing new, potential and ongoing projects for the Tambellup Community.

We are really excited for the 2021 season and can't wait to see future projects and developments for Tambellup come to fruition!


