#### STAFF MOVEMENTS

Louise commenced with the Shire of Tambellup on a part time basis in May 2008 in a customer service role. Following the amalgamation and a number of staff changes, Louise accepted the position of Executive Assistant in 2010, and has been the CEO's right arm ever since! Many residents will have had the pleasure of dealing with Louise for many matters over the years, and her calm, professional manner will be missed. Louise and Tony are 'retiring' to Albany, but we are fairly sure the notion of 'retirement' is still a way off! Councillors and staff wish you both all the best for this next chapter in your lives.

We also farewelled our dynamic cleaning team in Broomehill early in April. Julie Taylor, who has been with the Shire since 2013, has decided the time is right to swap the mop and broom for retirement, and daughter Mandy Tuffley, who has been with us for just a couple of years, has left us to concentrate on family. We thank Julie and Mandy for their conscientious and thorough care of Council facilities during their time with us, and wish you both well for the future.

Recruitment processes have been commenced to fill the Executive Assistant and Cleaner/Caretaker roles, and we look forward to introducing the successful applicants in the June Topics.

#### FROM THE SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL

A Special Meeting of Council was held on 29 March 2021, for the purpose of receiving the Auditors report for 2019-2020, adoption of the Annual Report 2019-2020 which included the audited financial statements, and to consider the annual budget review.

Council has previously adopted several budget amendments relating to inclusion of the 'Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program' funding for Phase 2, inclusion of bridgeworks and funding for Martinup Road bridge 4250A and reallocation of funds between Black Spot Projects as authorised by Main Roads WA. Aside from these matters, no significant amendments to the budget were required.

Council was required to provide comment to the Department of Planning, Lands & Heritage (DPLH) in response to a number of land parcels identified in the Tambellup townsite for potential transfer to the Noongar Land Estate as part of the South West Native Title Settlement. Council considered the list of land parcels provided by DPLH with respect to a number of queries, including existing or planned infrastructure on the

land, current or future interests or proposals for the land or adjoining land, future planning scheme amendments, and current land management issues including contamination, fire hazards, inundation, debris or rubbish dumping, and unauthorised use of the land. A response has been provided to DPLH.

#### FROM THE ANNUAL ELECTORS MEETING

The Annual Electors Meeting was held on 15 April 2021, following the Council meeting, with Councillors, senior staff and five community members in attendance.

Copies of the Annual Report 2019-2020 were made available to all attendees, and was formally accepted by the meeting.

Other matters discussed included:

- Tourism signage at the Gordon River reserve;
- Request to seal the gravel access road at the Tambellup Pavilion, and installation of entry signage;
- Request to trim trees in the townsites, and consider controls for bridal creeper;
- Consideration of development of tourism assets in Broomehill and Tambellup;
- Thanks for work completed on roads, and request for additional maintenance works to be completed.

#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council endorsed the recommendations of the Bush Fire Advisory Committee meeting held 31 March 2021, including the appointment of Brigade Fire Control Officers and Fire Weather Officers, and a change to the trigger level for the imposition of a Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban to Fire Danger Index of 29.

With the completion of the new cabins at the Broomehill Caravan Park, Council was required to set fees for usage of these facilities. Council endorsed the following fees:

Bookings for the new cabins can presently be made by contacting the Broomehill Administration office, however staff are in the process of establishing an online booking system for all accommodation bookings for the Broomehill Caravan Park, through the Shire's website. More information will be provided in coming weeks once this service is established.

Council endorsed the appointment of Community Emergency Services Manager Cindy Pearce and Shire Ranger Damon Powell as Fire Control Officers for the 2021-2022 fire season.

#### WORKS REPORT

The construction team has completed the widening of the curve located on Tieline Road at the intersection with Moulyerup Road, Broomehill. Bitumen has been ordered. Signage has been installed at the Flat Rocks Road Black Spot project. This has now completed the project. Some minor reseal and patching work on Tambellup West Road will complete this year's construction program. The townscaping program has recommenced, with the pavers on Crowden St being replaced, and new kerbing laid.

The maintenance crew has been working around the Shire, repairing and replacing signage and guideposts where required, and patching potholes. Traffic counters have been set out on a number of roads to collect data that will inform future road funding applications.

The parks and gardens team has been busy carrying out general garden maintenance in both towns, as well as at the Sandalwood Villas. The rain has been appreciated, but has resulted in a surge of grass and weed growth that keeps staff occupied! Both ovals were fertilised just before the rain, and this has had a good effect on the grass, just in time for the commencement of winter sports. Unfortunately the storms that went through resulted in the pumps at both Jam Creek dams being struck by lightning – these have since been repaired.

New fencing has been erected at the Tambellup Works Depot, to improve security of the site, but also to provide staff parking off Bridge St, and safe pedestrian access to the crib room and office. Visitors to the Depot should not enter the site, but should phone ahead, and park in the Bridge St parking area.

Staff leave over Easter and staff illness has resulted in a reduced maintenance grading program through April, however the following roads were graded: Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Brassey Rd, Moulyerup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Poonawarriup Rd, Warrenup Rd, McGuire Rd, Nelson Rd, Burridge Rd. The crew will be back to full strength in May.

#### DROGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM

Progress is being made in the planning and procurement for projects to be funded by the Shire's Drought Communities grant. The projects included in the program include:

- Accessibility upgrades at the Broomehill Recreational Complex. Works will include terracing and installation of retaining walls to the embankment, and construction of new paths, ramps and steps from the Pavilion to the Oval. The plans for these works have been finalised, and will shortly be available on the Shire's website and at the Administration officers for your perusal. The scope of works has been developed and will be advertised to contractors soon.
- Townscape works in Broomehill. Works will be undertaken at the intersection of Journal St and Great Southern Highway to improve the visual amenity of the area. Plans have been developed, and pending the completion of detailed site surveys, will be updated and made available through the above channels for your information. At that time, the scope of works will be finalised and advertised for contractors.
- Development of a Holland Track Interpretive Centre in Broomehill. These works include the construction of a 'shelter' (the nature of this is to be determined) to house an interpretive display of information relating to the Holland Track and linking to other heritage sites of importance in Broomehill. The project scope has been developed and will be provided to heritage consultants as a request for quote. The location and design of the shelter and signage is a requirement of the scope of works. More information will be provided when the procurement process has been completed.
- Construction of a nature playground adjacent to the Broomehill Playgroup (RSL building) in Holland Park. Once detailed site surveys are complete, quotes for design and installation will be sought from nature playground providers.
- Townscape and development of a town square in Tambellup. Feedback received in previous consultation periods has been taken into account, with the latest designs featuring angle parking along the western side of Norrish St, and long vehicle/bus parking and the bus shelter retained opposite the post office. These plans are almost complete and will be made available for public information when

they are available. Staff are working on a preliminary scope of works, to be finalised and advertised for quotes from contractors. Staff have also consulted with users of the Tambellup Youth Centre (The Zone) regarding the proposal to upgrade the Railway Centre for use as a youth centre. The nature and extent of this element of the project is yet to be finalised.

• Water initiatives: New standpipe controllers have been ordered for tanks to be installed in Broomehill and Tambellup.

As noted above, the detailed plans for all construction works are nearing completion and will be available on the Shire's website <a href="www.shirebt.wa.gov.au">www.shirebt.wa.gov.au</a>, and at the Administration offices for your information. This funding has provided the Shire with a one-off opportunity to make significant improvements to our townsites, and we look forward to the commencement (and completion!) or works.

#### ANZAC DAY

As these notes are bring compiled, the news of the latest three day lockdown in Perth has just been released, and ANZAC services were still to be held. We are fortunate that were are able to continue with our local services, and sincerely thank our local organisations for their coordination of services – Broomehill Heritage Group, Tambellup Lions Club and Tambellup CWA. #### **BROOMEHILL PRESCRIBED BURN**

Members of the Broomehill Central Bushfire Brigade and the Tambellup Volunteer Fire & Emergency Service completed a prescribed burn in bushland off Tieline Road behind the Shire Depot during April. The burn was coordinated by CESM Cindy Pearce, and was utilised as a training opportunity. Other blocks in the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites have been identified, and burns will be conducted when conditions are suitable.







#### ROAD SAFETY DURING SEEDING OPERATIONS

It's that time of the year again when a lot of heavy machinery will be moving around the Shire. Farmers, your licensing concession on tractors, self-propelled sprayers, spray equipment etc., contains conditions which may include the requirement to only travel on roads between sunrise and sunset, may require a flashing light, and may need to have an "over width" sign attached. In the event of an accident involving other road users, if conditions of your license are not complied with, motor vehicle injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred. Hello,

Firstly, I'd like to apologise to those that may have noticed the omission of Tambellup Police in the April edition of the Topics. I was away for a couple of weeks working in Kalgoorlie and Rob was busy on the home front. There is plenty to catch up on this month however.

Let me start with the negative. Unfortunately, we've been busy charging people who've been up to no good –

- A 20 year old Tambellup man charged with Trespass / Criminal Damage / Being Armed in a way that may cause fear / Obstructing Public Officers / Carried an article with intent to cause fear that someone will be injured or disabled.
- A 37 year old Tambellup man charged with No authority to drive
- A 31 year old Broomehill man charged with Driver fail to comply with a direction to stop / Failed to give information identifying the driver or person in charge of a vehicle
- ♦ A 41 year old Boyup Brook man charged with − No authority to drive / Used an unlicensed vehicle on a road
- A 41 year old Tambellup man charged with Disorderly behaviour in a public place.
- A 47 year old Tambellup man charged with three counts of Fraud.
- A 21 year old Tambellup woman charged with Stealing.

As I'm sure most of you are aware, the Tambellup 124 Store was targeted on two occasions in recent times by unknown offenders. The store is the life blood of the community and we rely on the store to assist us with our daily needs, not to mention the folks that run the store are very decent people and didn't in any way deserve what occurred. If you know who it was, please find the **courage** and come forward to report those responsible!! I'm sure you've all noticed we take a no-nonsense approach to community policing. We expect the community we serve to meet us halfway and come forward with information – We truly succeed when the community partners with us.

#### The 2021 Census

The Census counts every person and home in Australia. It helps to tell our story of who we are as a people.



The Census asks questions about our communities, who we are, where we live, and about people living and staying with us.



People living in cities and regional areas will either get a letter with instructions on how to complete online, or a paper form. You can start as soon as you get instructions, if you know who'll be home on Census night, Tuesday 10 August.



There will be Census staff in remote communities. They can come to your home and help you fill in your Census.



It generally takes about 30 minutes to complete the Census. It might take longer for bigger households.



#### Make your community count


The Census can help plan for community needs and our future. That's why it's important to include everyone who is staying in your home on Census night, such as Elders, babies and visitors.



Having the right numbers means the right services can be provided for our community. For example, knowing the number of babies in a region can help plan funding for preschools or mums and bubs health programs.



It's used to make decisions about schools and early learning, health clinics, housing, aged care, jobs, roads, language centres and community programs.



#### Your personal information is safe

Your personal information is protected by law and isn't shared with anyone. This includes other government agencies such as police, Centrelink or housing officers.



You can't be identified by the information you share about yourself and your family in your Census.
