BREAK IN AT ADMINISTRATION OFFICE

The Shire Administration Office in Tambellup was broken into in the early hours on Sunday 23 May. CCTV footage has been provided to Police who are investigating. Anyone with any information that may assist is asked to contact Tambellup Police on 131444.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council received the Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 Quarterly Progress Report for the period January-March 2021. A summary of progress is as follows:



The remainder of the meeting had a significant 'Governance' flavour, with Policy and Delegation the order of the day.

June 2021

Council completed a review of Part 3 (Finance) and Part 4 (Engineering) of the Policy Manual. No major changes to policies were required.

In accordance with the introduction of the *Local Government (Model Code of Conduct) Regulations 2021* in February 2021, Council was required to consider a number of new and amended policies and delegations. Council endorsed amendments to Policy 1.5 Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates, adopted new Policy 1.27 Code of Conduct Behaviour Complaints Management and adopted new Policy 1.28 Standards for CEO Recruitment, Performance and Termination. These policies are based on the Model Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates contained within the new legislation. The amended Code of Conduct will be available on the Shire's website for information.

Council also endorsed a new delegation to appoint an authorised officer to receive complaints and withdrawals of complaints relating the breaches of the new Code of Conduct.

WORKS REPORT

The construction team, led by Steve Ryan, has completed the widening of the curve located on Tieline Road at the intersection with Moulyerup Road, Broomehill. Works to widen Journal Street from the Post Office to Javelin Street have commenced, with formation and gravel works completed. Bitumen sealing and kerbing has been programmed and footpath construction will follow. Some minor reseal and patching work on Tambellup West Road has been completed and work has commenced on Etna Road to include gravel sheeting, culvert upgrades and improvement to the intersection with Greenhills South Road.

Have you noticed the new directional signs that have been installed in Tambellup? These will significantly improve the ability for visitors to town to locate community facilities.

The maintenance crew of Skinny, Mick and Justin has been busy with a myriad of tasks over the past month, including retrieval of traffic counters, installation of guide posts, pot hole patching, installation of signage and construction of a school bus stop on Wandoo Road. Termite inspections have been completed by contractors on all Council-owned bridges. The maintenance graders have been working on the following roads during May: Punchmirup North Rd, Chillicup Rd, Brassey Rd, Etna Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Simpson Rd, Washington South Rd, Green Rd, Parnell Rd, Moore Rd, Wandoo Rd, Johnston Rd, Witham Rd.

Geraldine's parks and gardens team has taken full advantage of the excellent rains we have received, to complete the planting of street trees along Garrity St and a refurbish of the garden at the eastern entry to Tambellup. In Broomehill, garden maintenance, mowing and weed control has been the priority. Fogging for mosquitoes in both towns has also been undertaken on evenings when the conditions are right.

The rain has fallen in the right spots over the past few weeks, with the Broomehill dams at around 70% full, and the Jam Creek dams at over 50%.

The Shire recently took delivery of a new 33kva generator on a trailer, which will provide power backup for the Shire Depots, Broomehill Recreational Complex and Tambellup Community Pavilion in the event of an outage during an emergency. The generator, trailer and electrical works to enable the generator to be hooked in to these buildings was funded by the National Disaster and Recovery Program.

DAMAGE TO BEEJENUP ROAD



It is disappointing to note that the bitumen surface on Beejenup Rd has been damaged by a towed agricultural implement not being raised high enough to clear the road surface. Beejenup Road was sealed as part of the 2018/2019 capital works program, at a cost of approximately \$40,000 per kilometre just to lay the bitumen. Unfortunately the implement has penetrated through to the gravel, meaning water penetration and subsequent pot holes are inevitable. While every effort will be made to repair the damage (at cost to the ratepayer), it should be noted that ad hoc repairs do not provide the same strength and durability as the fully laid surface. If anyone has any knowledge of who is responsible or how this damage occurred,

UPDATE FROM THE TAMBELLUP POLICE



There was a recent residential burglary in Crawford Street and another at the Shire Office, both in Tambellup. Investigations into both incidents are ongoing and we request information should anyone know anything that can assist us with our inquiries.

I must be starting to sound like a broken record, however I ask that residents and business owners seriously consider upgrading their security. This doesn't just assist police with our reactive inquiries, but it hardens your premises as a target and can prevent burglars from attempting to gain entry. If you'd like advice in relation to what measures can be taken, please get in touch with us here at the station or call a local (Katanning or Albany) security company.

As the rainy weather begins to increase please ensure that your motor vehicle tyres are in good shape. The legal amount of tread required is 1.6mm, which is not a lot! That amount of tread is required across the entire tyre, which means if you have a bald patch the tyre is not legal. If we stop your vehicle and find that to be the case we can consider issuing your vehicle with a yellow sticker, so please keep that in mind. Ensuring your tyres are up to scratch is all about keeping you, your passengers and other road users safe, so do the right thing.

Despite the recent burglaries in town, which are in no way acceptable and are **serious offences** that carry lengthy terms of imprisonment, I wish to update the community on year to date (YTD) and five -year crime statistics to put matters into perspective and to allay the concerns of some residents.

So far YTD we have had an 80.8% reduction in reported Burglaries and over the five-year trend a 67.5% reduction in Burglaries. With regard to Damage offences we have seen a 36.8% (YTD) / 18.9% (five-year) reduction in Damage offences, Stealing has seen a 16% (YTD) increase and 50% (five-year) reduction. Sadly, we have seen a significant increase in reported historical sexual offences and family assault. This is tragic, however the fact that these matters are being reported to police is a very good thing. Across all reportable offences we have seen a 21% decrease (YTD) achieving a 40% sanction rate, which rates well against other sub-districts (shires).

We were supposed to have had Pardelup Prison Farm render the wall for the mural by this stage, however they have been locked down due to contraband concerns. As such there has been a delay in progressing the mural project temporarily. I've been advised this lock down will be over soon. Hopefully by the time the next Topics are issued you'll see some progress!!






