

STAFF UPDATE

We are pleased to welcome Annie Richardson to the organisation. Annie commenced in the role of Executive Assistant, previously held by Louise Cristinelli, early in July, and has settled into the position well. Annie's job is to manage the day to day and legislative requirements of Council and the CEO, and the prospect of a new CEO and upcoming local government elections on the near horizon will provide plenty of opportunity to learn about the inner workings of local government. Welcome Annie!

We will be farewelling CEO Keith Williams during August. As previously reported, Keith has accepted a position at the Shire of Broome – and we are sure he and Libby and the girls will enjoy the much warmer environment. There's nothing like a Great Southern winter! Council has commenced the recruitment process, with the assistance of a recruitment consultant, and we are confident of attracting a good pool of applicants. In the interim, before the new CEO can commence, there may be a period where an Acting CEO is appointed. More information will be provided to the community in due course

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council received the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2020-2025 Progress Report and implementation update. Council's responsibility includes ensuring services, events, buildings, facilities, information, customer service, complaint-mechanisms, public consultation and employment are accessible to people with disability. The Annual report is provided to the Department of Communities to inform the Minister's report to Parliament on the effectiveness of Disability Access and Inclusion Plans across the State.

Council received the Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 Quarterly Progress Report for the period April-June 2021. Most actions contained within the report are subject to ongoing action, with a number completed. A summary of progress is shown below:

Council also considered the annual review of the Corporate Business Plan. The plan is a four year document linked to the Strategic Community Plan, and is reviewed annually at this time to ensure actions remain relevant and funded through the budget. No major changes were required to be made to the document this year.

Council received a report on the recent review of the Shire's Local Laws. Following publication of the adopted local laws in the Government Gazette, they are considered by a parliamentary committee, prior to allowance by the State Parliament. Staff will be working on a number of actions and clarifications required to be undertaken prior to final approval or otherwise.

Council approved an amendment to Policy 1.24 Hire of Equipment which provides for up to 20 chairs being made available at no charge for funerals at the Broomehill, Tambellup or Pindellup cemeteries.

WORKS REPORT

The rain received during July has had a significant impact on the ability for the works crew to get out on the roads. Construction and maintenance activities, and maintenance grading, have slowed due to the soft road conditions, and staff have been working across the Shire to clear culverts to help get the water moving through the landscape.

Off-road work has continued however, in preparation for drier times. Gravel has been pushed up on White Road, for use on nominated Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program projects on Beejenup Rd, Stirling Access Rd and Yetemerup Rd. The opportunity was taken during a couple of drier spells to continue gravel resheeting works on Birt Rd and Flat Rocks Rd, these projects are ongoing.

While the rain has delayed road works, it has been full steam ahead for the parks and gardens crew, who are well into the winter maintenance activities – weeding, mowing, spraying and pruning. The dams are all full, which will ensure water requirements for the ovals can be met over the summer period. A couple of new gardens have been commenced, and as we move into spring, keep an eye out for the everlastings that will pop up in both towns.

The Shire will shortly be commencing a bridal creeper control program across the shire. August and September is the ideal time to undertake this work, which will include spraying, and also the release of rust. It is planned to release rust around the Gordon River reserve and also along Tambellup West Rd, and it will be interesting to monitor the effects over time.

MOSQUITOS

An additional consequence of the rain is the number of stagnant pools of water around both townsites, which means MOZZIES! The Shire will investigate baiting inundated areas in the townsites to try and get ahead of the mosquito issue. Landowners can assist by ensuring any receptacles in your yard holding water are removed, emptied or covered - consider pot plant drip trays, roof gutters, ponds, disused containers, dog water bowls and disused car tyres.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS – 16 OCTOBER 2021

An Ordinary Postal Election will be held on Saturday, 16 October 2021 in the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to fill four vacancies each for a four year term. Nominations open on Thursday, 2 September 2021 and close at 4.00pm Thursday, 9 September 2021. More information is included in this edition of the Topics and will follow next month.

COMMUNITY SCORECARD SURVEY

A flyer was distributed by mail last week advising that the Shire, in conjunction with the Shires of Katanning and Kojonup, was conducting its biennial community scorecard survey. Your response to this survey, which is managed by independent research organisation Catalyse, provides the shires with information that assists in managing existing services and facilities, and planning for the future.

Our P&C are having a Quiz night on the 13th of August at the hall, so we would love to see you all there. Just ring the school 98251144 to book a table of 8.



New Track Drainage Ensures a Dry Motocross Interclub

Spectators and riders will not need gumboots when they head to Sukey Hill home of Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club on Sunday 15th August to watch round four of the South West Intercub Series sponsored by Bunbury KTM.

This year, in April, the club installed twenty culverts throughout the motocross track to divert water into a newly constructed, eight thousand yard dam. Club president Justin Shepherd commented "the idea is to catch water to store to be used when the track surface is dusty and unsafe over the summer months. We have access to a water tanker and fast fill to manually water the track for summer club runs and coaching clinics. Roughly sixty thousand litres is needed per event as you need to build up the track surface moisture profile."

Justin then went on to say that the installation of this drainage system has been a win-win for the club this year. "In hindsight this track upgrade has been timely given the wet season we are experiencing, not only is the dam filling, we have a fairly dry track to race on. Ideally, it's fun with a bit of mud, but too much can cause quite a bit of wear and tear on the motorbikes. We have also been able to continue to hold club days where as other motocross clubs have had to cancel in these wet conditions. I feel we are ready for the interclub in August whatever the weather."

Over one hundred riders representing the six south west clubs, Bunbury, Collie, Southern Capes, Manjimup and Narrogin will compete across ten junior and senior classes. This is the fourth time the undulating natural terrain Sukey Hill track has hosted the event since it was constructed in 2017.

This event is a prelude for hosting a state senior motocross round, a month later on the 19th September with a similar number of riders expected.

Riders will have another chance to practice for the state round on Saturday 28th August at a club run.



Friday 27 August 2021

Enrolling to Vote

Local Government Elections are to be held on **Saturday 16 October 2021**. You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote at the election if you reside in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property within the district.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral roll as at **5.00pm**, **Friday 27 August 2021**. If you are not on the State Electoral roll or have changed your address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Non Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non resident owner or occupier of rateable property within the Shire and are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote, but must submit a Form 2 - *Enrolment Eligibility Claim Form* to the local government, as enrolment is not automatic.

A **non resident owner** who was on the last Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup local government roll continues to retain that status as long as the rateable property to which the enrolment relates is owned. An **occupier** does not have continuous enrolment and should contact staff at the Shire to confirm their enrolment status.

If you are not on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll and own or occupy rateable property within the Shire, you may still be eligible to vote. Please contact the Shire for details.

Enrolment Forms – Non Residents and Occupiers

Enrolment Eligibility Claim Forms can be obtained from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by **5.00pm**, **Friday 27 August 2021.**















ONLINE BOOK CLUB
