STAFF UPDATE

We farewelled CEO Keith Williams and his partner Libby and their girls during August, with Keith taking up a position at the Shire of Broome. Keith and Libby will be missed in the community, and we wish them all the best for this new chapter in a warmer climate. Council has appointed Manager of Finance and Administration Kay O'Neill to the position of Acting CEO until either a temporary or permanent appointment is made.

BUDGET 2021-2022

The 2021-2022 budget was adopted by Council at a Special Meeting of Council held on 13 August 2021.

This year's budget totals \$13.4 million, representing \$6.8 million in operating expenditures and \$6.6 million in capital expenditures. The Shire's Community Strategic Plan 2018-2028 and Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 provide the strategic direction for Council and the Community. The budget process takes into consideration the strategies included in these plans, as well as the Strategic Resource Plan (asset management/long term financial planning) and Workforce Plan.

While Western Australia has generally avoided significant setbacks from the global COVID19 pandemic, our Shire is fortunate in this budget to be able to include a significant number of capital projects as a result of financial stimulus related to the pandemic. Nevertheless, to achieve a balanced budget, a 4% increase in rates is included. As always, as every home and business does, the Shire has escalating costs such as insurance, power, water, materials and fuel. The annual rate increase is still lower than the cumulative cost of these increases.

Two funding streams that allow the Shire to achieve significant projects are again included in the budget. These projects will achieve significant outcomes for the community that would not ordinarily be able to be achieved.

Drought Communities Program

This funding, targeted at economic stimulus rather than drought resilience, offers the opportunity to undertake development identified in our Strategies and long term planning that would not be achieved otherwise. Using our Community Strategy as the driver, and after further community consultation, a number of projects have been identified in Broomehill and Tambellup. Listed below, these projects offer a unique opportunity to improve the amenity and impression of both towns:

- Holland Track Interpretive Centre
- Broomehill Complex Access Upgrades
- Holland Park Nature Play Area
- Broomehill Streetscape upgrades
- Tambellup Town Square Redevelopment
- Tambellup Youth Centre Upgrade
- Tambellup Streetscape upgrades
- Water efficiency improvements

Given final approval in December 2020, significant planning and design work has been undertaken already and these projects are about to commence on the ground.

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program

Round 1 and Round 2

Council was notified in June 2019 that it is eligible for Local Road and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program funding; a new funding stream in response to COVID19. Using the same eligibility and funding arrangements as Federal Assistance Grants, the Shire was awarded \$441,000 for a number of projects. We were then notified that a further \$331,000 of funding was available under Round two of this program. Round one projects will be completed by the end of September 2021, while round two will be completed by the end of December 2021.

Road projects, particularly re-sheeting of gravel roads, were identified as a priority.

Significant work has already been undertaken with re-sheeting of several roads completed, and work commencing on the remainder shortly. Major works have been commenced on Journal Street between the Post Office and Caravan Park in Broomehill, and work will soon commence on the Broomehill Primary School Car Park. Kerbing in Tambellup and Broomehill has also been completed.

Round 1 and 2 LRCI Projects include:

- Beejenup Road gravel sheeting
- Birt Road gravel sheeting
- Paul Valley Road gravel sheeting
- Yetermerup Road gravel sheeting
- Stirling Access Road gravel sheeting
- Flat Rocks Road gravel sheeting
- Nymbup Road culvert widening
- Etna Road culvert widening
- Broomehill Primary School car park upgrade
- Broomehill Fire Shed car park
- Greenhills South Road widening and reconstruction Ongerup Creek

Round 3

Council has been advised that it will be eligible for further funding under Round Three of this economic stimulus program, with \$881,000 of funding available between January 2022 and December 2022. A mix of roads and community infrastructure has been identified for this funding:

Road projects:

- Beejenup Road Sealing of 90 degree corners
- Flat Rocks Road enrichment seal
- Paul Valley Road enrichment seal
- Tieline Road additional widening
- Garrity Street Tambellup tree removal and footpath
- Beejenup Road additional gravel sheeting

Community Infrastructure Projects:

- Upgrades to Broomehill Caravan Park
- Develop Tambellup Caravan Park
- Broomehill Town Hall sound proofing
- Tambellup Town Hall building improvements
- Upgrades to Broomehill and Tambellup cemeteries
- Broomehill Museum improvements
- Tambellup Youth Centre improvements

Road Construction and Maintenance

A road construction program of \$991,000 is planned for the coming year. Council is fortunate to receive funding from the Regional Road Group, State Black Spot and Roads to Recovery programs, which assists in meeting the costs in completing the planned projects.

Regional Road Group and Black Spot funds are allocated on the basis that 2/3 in funding is provided by Main Roads WA and Councils are required to contribute 1/3. Roads to Recovery is delivered by the Federal government funding does not require a matching contribution. The road program includes the following projects:

Regional Road Group

- Broomehill-Kojonup Road pavement repairs
- Tambellup West Road pavement repairs
- Tieline Road pavement repairs

State Black Spot

- Tieline Road at Norrish Road intersection widening

Roads to Recovery

- Toolbrunup Road reconstruct and seal from end of seal to Tallents Road

Other road projects will also be delivered as part of the LRCI funded works listed above. Upgrade of footpaths in the Broomehill and Tambellup town sites will continue during the year, and will be undertaken in stages over the coming 4-5 years. Further vegetation trimming and clearing along roads will also continue.

Other Key Projects**Water Resources and Efficiency**

While significant increases in capacity have been made, council has allocated further funding to improve the availability of water for domestic, stock and fire-fighting use in both Broomehill and Tambellup. Importantly, water stored in tanks is available without electricity during a fire, and these projects will contribute substantially to community safety.

Great Southern Housing Initiative

The Shire has, unfortunately, had to terminate contracts with a builder to allow completion of two dwellings in Broomehill that form the last part of this project. These last two dwellings should now be able to be completed by mid-October, finalising this significant project.

Plant Replacement

The Shire strives to maintain a modern fleet of vehicles and equipment, and maintains a 10 Year Plant Replacement Program to achieve this objective. Optimum use and changeover times have been identified for plant and equipment, ensuring the Shire receives best value for money and to minimise the impact on annual budgets.

Funds are held in the Plant Reserve which is used to achieve all changeovers and purchases included in the Plant Replacement Program. Any savings realised throughout the year on plant and equipment changeovers is retained in the Reserve for future requirements. Along with changeover of the light fleet, it is proposed to replace one of Council's trucks with a prime mover, achieving a saving that will allow purchase of a skid steer trailer that will allow more mobile road maintenance tasks to be completed.

The plant replacement budget is always a significant cost, however, to achieve the consistent high standard of roads in our shire it is imperative to maintain this fleet.

Tambellup Caravan Park

Council purchased the former bowling club in Tambellup in 17/18, and had agreed to sell the land to a private developer to convert this site into a new caravan park. Sale of the land has not occurred however, and as outlined above, the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program will allow an allocation of funds for this project.

The Tambellup Community Cropping Group has generously allocated funding to this project, partnering with the shire to deliver this important community asset. This support is greatly appreciated.

Development of three cabins, upgrades to the building and installation of caravan bay infrastructure will occur in 2022 when funding is available.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered and endorsed the review of its Delegations Register, and also Policy 1.4 Temporary Employment or Appointment of a CEO.

Council provided it's in principle support for the recommendations of the draft Great Southern Treasures Proposal developed by Australia's South West.

Council considered and approved a rates concession for the Tambellup Golf Club for the 2021-2022 financial year.

Council appointed Manager of Finance and Administration, Kay O'Neill, as the Acting CEO until a temporary or permanent appointment to the position s made.

WORKS REPORT

As you are no doubt aware, the rain we have experienced over the past few weeks has done little to improve our gravel road network, and for this reason we had to implement road closures across the Shire at different times. We acknowledge this may be inconvenient, however residents should be aware the reason for closing roads to heavy vehicles after significant rain is to preserve the road surface, and ultimately minimise the risk of further damage (and resulting cost to ratepayers). Unfortunately the driver of a truck travelling on Nookanellup Rd during a period of closure appeared not to get message, with the result that the road had to be closed to all traffic so emergency repairs could be completed when it was dry enough to work on.

The rain has also slowed the progress of the construction and maintenance program, however funded works to resheet Birt Rd were completed, and resheeting on Paul Valley Rd and Flat Rocks Rd is underway. If you are travelling in the vicinity of these works, please observe signage on site and drive to the conditions.

The maintenance crew has been busy dealing with fallen trees and clearing culverts on flooded sections of road across areas of the Shire. The graders have been working on the following roads: Greenhills South Road, Eureka Road, Collins Road, Nookanellup Road, Brassey Road, Beejenup Road and Chillicup Road.

Now the budget has been adopted, the replacement of various fleet vehicles has commenced. The specifications for replacement of major items of plant will be developed for advertising in coming weeks.

The rain has been of great benefit to the Shire's water stores, with the CBH and Bignell Dam, and Broomehill Town dam being full – this water is being transferred to the Broomehill Complex Dam. The Jam Creek dam is at 80% capacity, and all pumping systems are working well.

- between 2:00pm and 4:00 PM Thursday, 9 September 2021 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, 46-48 Norrish Street, TAMBELLUP.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission(www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 800 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order);
- (optional) a recent passport-sized photograph of the candidate's head, or head and shoulders; and
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled *Induction for prospective candidates*, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

Event Prelude to State Round

Ninety Six riders representing six motocross clubs from across the South West kicked off Round 4 of the South West Interclub Series at the much revered Sukey Hill track on Sunday 15th August. This is a prelude event to hosting the state round on Sunday 19th September.

“Riders compete across twelve competition classes over three rounds, following one round of practice, which makes it a very packed day for club officials and riders” club president Justin Shepherd commented, “But this makes for a great day for spectators watching the sport.”

The 1.926km 70% sandy loam 30% clay circuit held up well throughout the day considering the amount of rainfall received over the past two months. There were two small sections in the track, one being on the start straight making gate pick a challenge where the ground water had started to form a spring and was seeping out just prior to the event. However with each class running separately and the grids half full these areas could be easily avoided by riders.

Perfect weather conditions did not disappoint local spectators who ventured out for some rays of sunshine. “There was barely enough wind to move the flag suspended from an excavator at the iconic Sukey Hill table top jump, in fact you couldn’t have asked for a better day” Justin commented.

Local riders competing from our monthly coaching clinics rode well drawing on the cornering and rider positioning skills learnt – Scott Ericsson, Harry Leov, Coby Ravenhill, Sawyer Watts, Noah Francis, Brock Curtis, Laura Featherstone-Dawes and Lincoln Preston.

Results Cranbrook MCC members rode well with the following placing;

In the seniors it was a clean sweep for the host club Cranbrook in the Clubman Open class with club coach Jacob Jones (3rd) Tambellup local Owen Kay (2nd) and Albany local Todd Knuiman (1st). Kendenup resident and long time competitor in the sport Paul Smithson placed 2nd in Vets just in front of Josh Reeves (3rd). For the premier senior events, Ladies class Jasmine Clark (2nd), MX2 Lites Broomehill local Braydon Baynes (2nd) and MX1 Albany local also ex state rider Dion Knuiman (1st).

In juniors Callum Reeves (3rd) in 85cc Big Wheels.

Next South West Interclub Series round is at Bunbury MCC with Collie MCC hosting the final for the season.

Cranbrook MCC will host a senior state motocross round in a months time on Sunday 19th September, free spectator entry.

Scam Messages

Been getting a few of these scam messages? Me too. So I asked our cyber security experts about them.

z0re4 You have a missed lall.
Caller left ylu z message: <http://www.geodesian.info/v.php?exyl6io>

- It's Android malware "Flubot". It sends you a message along the lines of "You have 1 new Voicemail(s)" (or something similar) along with a link. Anyone can get the message (iPhone users included), but the malware only affects Android users if they click the link.
- Clicking that link will try and install Android malware on your device, if your device allows installations outside of trusted locations (like the Google Play store). Once installed, the malware has access to everything stored on your phone (including passwords). The software then copies your contacts to send the scam message to all of them (but the sender won't be listed as you).

This scam is hard to block as it's coming from legit handsets all over the world. But we are working on it.

Did you know: Payphones are now free in Aus!!

Also Fun fact: you can send messages from payphones (for free within Aus). Here's how.

- Step one: lift the handset and press the "ok" button. That'll give you the option to write a new SMS message or use a prewritten "typical" message.
- Enter the number you're messaging. Easy stuff. Hit OK and start typing your message. It's a great T9 flashback as well. Fun.
- Press "OK" to send your message. Then press it again to confirm. Then you wait. Once your message is sent, your recipient will get both your message and the number they can use to call that payphone.

Too easy. Enjoy.




