

STAFF UPDATE

We are pleased to welcome incoming CEO Chris Jackson and his wife Nina to our community. Chris commenced in the role on 28 September 2021, and brings with him the benefits of a solid career in local government. He is looking forward to getting out and meeting members of the community in due course.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS - 16 OCTOBER 2021

The nomination period for the 2021 Council elections opened on 2 September and closed on 9 September 2021. Nominations for the four vacancies were received from incumbent Cr Mark Paganoni and Cr Carl Letter, and new candidates Craig Dewar and Julian Wills. At the close of nominations, and with no further nominations being received, all four were elected unopposed for a four year term expiring in 2025. Our thanks and congratulations are extended to Mark, Carl, Craig and Julian for their commitment to our community. The new and returning Councillors will be sworn in at a Special Meeting of Council to be held on Monday 18 October 2021 (time to be confirmed). Residents are welcome to attend this meeting to witness the swearing in ceremony.

Retiring Councillors Kelly Holzknecht and Monica Nazzari did not seek re-election this year. Kelly and Monica were both active Councillors, representing Council on committees including Great Southern Recreation Advisory Group, Great Southern Treasures and the Tambellup Community Resource Centre, as well as various community activities and initiatives during their terms. We sincerely thank Kelly and Monica for their service to their community and the wider region and wish them well.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council approved a rates concession for the Tambellup Business Centre for 2021/2022.

Council considered and approved a request from WA Country Heath Service to waive hall hire fees, for the conduct of COVID-19 vaccination clinics in Tambellup during October and November.

Council considered a request for financial support from the Broomehill Primary School P & C Association and determined to make a donation of \$300 towards the purchase of resources for the school.

Council considered submissions received for two tenders – Broomehill Townscape Project and Tambellup Town Square Project. Council determined to reject all tenders as the submissions exceeded Council's budgets for these projects.

Further to the rejection of the tender submissions, Council considered and endorsed a recommendation to amend the 2021/2022 budget, to reallocate project funding. More information is provided below.

Council endorsed the proposal by project consultants Wayfound to locate the Holland Track Interpretive Centre adjacent to the Broomehill Museum in Journal St.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM UPDATE

We are starting to get some traction on a number of our nominated Drought Communities Program projects, including the accessibility upgrade at the Broomehill Recreational Complex, the design and development of the Holland Track Interpretive Centre, the construction of a nature playground in Holland Park, and the installation of standpipe controllers in Broomehill and Tambellup. These works are due for completion by the end of December 2021.

Contractors have been engaged to undertake the accessibility upgrade at the Broomehill Recreational Complex, and we anticipate works will be underway early in October to install paths, ramps, handrails and steps down the embankment from the Pavilion.

Consultants Wayfound have been engaged to develop content and complete installation of the Holland Track Interpretive Centre and townsite walk trail signage. Kim D'Alton from Wayfound and researcher Sue Graham-Taylor visited Broomehill on 13 September and met with members of the Broomehill Heritage Group to discuss the project – we thank those who were able to attend. Local contractors will be involved with this project, through preparation of the site and installation of the gazebo that will house the Holland track information display boards, and also installation of townsite trail signage.

South Coast Nature Play has been engaged to develop a nature playground in Holland Park, adjacent to the RSL/playgroup building on Journal St. The design submitted by the contractor includes a range of bespoke elements that will appeal to all ages, and we look forward to this taking shape over the next couple of months. South Coast Nature Play has previously constructed a climbing frame and elevated fort at the Tambellup Community Pavilion.

The DCP funds also include provision for two new standpipe controllers to be installed on tanks in the Shire. One tank and controller has been completed, at the Broomehill Town Dam. A second tank is to be installed at the Tambellup Works Depot, with the controller being located on the outside of the fence to be accessible for members of the public. We are waiting to confirm the installation date for the tank, and the controller will be installed following tank completion.

A requirement of the DCP funding also included the development of an Adverse Events Plan, which will provide a framework to guide the Shire and community through any likely adverse events. It is intended that the implementation of the Plan will build upon community leadership capabilities and increase community resilience and capacity to adapt and cope both physically and mentally to adverse events. Following consultation with identified members of the community, the draft document has been prepared and will be reviewed by staff before tabling for Council's endorsement.

Broomehill Townscape Enhancement, Tambellup Townscape Enhancement and Tambellup Youth Centre

H&H Architects were engaged by the Shire to develop concept plans for townscape works in Broomehill and Tambellup. These concepts were advertised for public comment in June 2020, and following consideration of feedback received, the plans were further developed to detailed design stage to enable the works to be advertised for tender. Unfortunately, as noted in the Council Meeting notes above, all tenders received exceeded Council's allocated budgets for these projects.

In order to be able to utilise the available DCP funding within the program timeframe, Council approved a budget amendment, to reallocate funding from two projects that had not commenced (Tambellup Townscape and Town Square Project and Tambellup Youth Centre) to the Broomehill Townscape project. The plans for the Broomehill Townscape project will be modified in line with the new budget allocation and readvertised for tender, anticipating that the works will be awarded and commenced by early November.

Council intends to complete the Tambellup Townscape/Town Square and Youth Centre projects, and will be considering other avenues of funding to achieve this. The opportunity will be taken to consult further with the community, and existing plans will be modified to ensure they are relevant to community needs and achievable within the endorsed budget.

WORKS REPORT

The construction crew has been working on grading and repairing roads that had deteriorated due to the wet weather. Gravel sheeting has commenced on the following roads, funded by the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program Round 1: Flat Rocks Road, Paul Valley Road, Birt Road, Stirling Access Road, Yetemerup Road. The footpath on Journal St is also progressing.

Roadside spraying has been carried out on all sealed roads and some unsealed roads across the Shire and bridal creeper infestations on Tambellup West Road have also been sprayed.

Now spring is here, the ovals have been prepared for dethatching, aeration and fertilising, and should be in excellent condition for the upcoming cricket season.

Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following roads during September: Chillicup Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Hassell Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Anderson Rd, Carr Rd, Hamilla Rd, North Stirling Rd, Tallents Rd, Stirling Access South Rd.

On 19 September the first of the guided wildflower walks was held, with around 15 people from near and far taking the opportunity to check out the flora in Boot Rock Reserve and at the Broomehill Golf Course. The conditions have been favourable this year, and the variety and quantity of wildflowers in our reserves is stunning.

Another walk will be held on Wednesday 29 September, 10.00am-1.00pm starting at Boot Rock Reserve (meet off Jetsam St – parking available).

ITS NEARLY BUSHFIRE SEASON AGAIN......

All residents are reminded the **RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD** commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2021**. From this date you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires, and all conditions of the permit must be complied with. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager, Cindy Pearce. Contact details for permits are as follows:

Residents are reminded of their obligation to minimise the risk of fire on their property – in particular, in townsite and urban land the height of any grass on the lot must be no higher than 150mm. Inspections will be commencing during October, and owners of non-compliant properties will be requested to undertake works to reduce the hazard.
