

SHIRE SHORTS

It's been a busy start to new CEO Chris Jackson's tenure at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, with a Council and staff to get to know, Councillors to farewell, new Councillors to welcome and induct, community groups and regional partners to get to know, and a range of ongoing projects to be across. In between dealing with day to day administrative matters, Chris has been out and about during his first few weeks, and has been able to attend a number of local meetings with groups which have funded projects underway. He has also accompanied Manager of Works Peter Vlahov on an inspection of roads, and is becoming familiar with Council's built assets as the opportunity to inspect arises.

The impact of the wet winter we have had is still evident, with the grading team having difficulties completing the winter grade program. We hope a period of dry warm weather will assist in drying the roads out so these works can continue before the harvest traffic commences. On the flip side, the rain has provided the prefect lead in to spring preparation of our ovals, with dethatching, coring and fertilising all being completed recently. With a couple of follow up showers, the ovals are looking magnificent as we head into summer sport. And – our dams are topped up, to take us through a hot summer.

Residents are reminded of the requirement to reduce fire hazards on their property. This year in particular, the conditions have resulted in high fuel loads in all areas of the Shire, including the townsites. A fire is a traumatic experience, and something we don't want our community unnecessarily exposed to – so do your bit, clean up your yard and help keep your community safe. Inspections will be carried out early in November. And a reminder – from 1 November 2021 we have entered the prohibited burning period, which continues until 14 February 2022 – please, no fires during this period.

Rates payments have been coming in at a steady rate – we thank residents who get these paid early in the year, as the cash flow assists with delivery of services to the community.

Staff continue to work on a range of funded projects across the Shire, in a number of cases in conjunction with local community organisations. The challenges of budgets, procurement processes, sourcing contractors and actually getting works underway have been frustrating, but we are pleased to advise all projects have commenced and are progressing well. FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Following the recent Local Government elections, new and returning Councillors were sworn in by Trevor Prout JP at a Special Meeting of Council held on Monday 18 October 2021. Cr Mark Paganoni, Cr Carl Letter, Cr Julian Wills and Cr Craig Dewar were elected unopposed for four year terms expiring in 2025. Nominations for President and Deputy President were called at the meeting, with the result that Cr Michael White was elected Shire President, and Cr Doug Barritt was elected Deputy Shire President.

The October Council meeting had a heavy governance flavour, with a number of policies being reviewed and amended as required. These will be available on the Shire's website in due course. Council also considered the quarterly progress report for the Shire's Corporate Business Plan.

Council noted a report presented by consultant town planners that an application has been lodged seeking amendments to an existing planning approval issued by a Development Assessment Panel on 22 May 2017. The planning approval relates to the development of a windfarm partially located in the Shire of Broomehill -Tambellup, which has been considered on a number of occasions by the Development Assessment Panel.

ROUGH COMMUNITIES PROGRAM UPDATE

A brief update on the Drought Communities Projects:

Water Efficiencies – Broomehill (install new tank and standpipe controller – Town Dam) – Complete

Water Efficiencies – Tambellup (install new tank and standpipe controller – Gordon St) – Tank is on order

Broomehill Recreation Complex Accessibility Upgrade - contractor engaged, works have commenced.

Broomehill Townscape Enhancement – works are out to tender via the WALGA eQuotes portal, closing end of October. Council to consider the matter at the November Council meeting.

Holland Park Nature Playground – contractor engaged, on site works to commence in November.

Holland Track Interpretive Centre – consultants engaged, initial meeting with Broomehill Heritage Group held early September. Research for sign content is underway and contractors have been appointed for manufacture and installation of gazebo (to be located adjacent to Broomehill Museum) and all signage requirements.

We appreciate the roll out of these projects has been protracted, however staff are working closely with the various contractors to ensure project delivery will result in excellent outcomes for the community.

LOCAL ROADS & COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM - ROUND 1 UPDATE

Gravel resheeting projects nominated for Round 1, on Birt Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Yetemerup Rd and Flat Rocks Rd are complete. Beejenup Rd resheeting is underway at present, and resheeting on Stirling Access Rd has been delayed due to the wet conditions in the area. The widening of the seal on Journal St and kerbing is complete, and works will commence shortly on construction of the new footpath to the Caravan Park.

TOOLBRUNUP ROAD

Works will soon be commencing on one of this year's major road construction projects – reconstruction and extension of the seal on Toolbrunup Rd through to Tallents Rd.

It is acknowledged with harvest on the near horizon that the timing to be able to fully complete these works is not ideal, so the gravel works will be completed pre-harvest, and sealing will be completed early in the New Year. We urge people travelling in the vicinity to observe signage on site and travel to the conditions.



Ice-cream sandwiches

A simple ice-cream treat for summer

- 600ml Cream
- 1 tin sweetened condensed milk
- A packet (or 2 depends on the size of your tray/s and how thick you want the ice-cream) of malt biscuits — (I use Arnott's malt o' milks)
- Whatever choccie/lolly you wish to flavour - (I use 2 or 3 peppermint crisp or crunchies, sometimes I add a packet of jelly babies, I have also used m&m, experiment with flavours have some fun!!)

Method

1. Whip the cream.
2. Fold in the condensed milk.
3. Chop up/crush the chocolate and fold it in (you can use anything you wish to flavour or nothing at all!).
4. Layer the malt biscuits on the bottom of a tray (the next batch I make, I think I might try to spread some Nutella on the biscuits).
5. Carefully spoon the ice cream mixture over the top and use a knife to make sure it is even.
6. Top with more biscuits lining them up so they will cut evenly, cover with baking paper then a film of plastic wrap and freeze for at least four hours or overnight.


