

Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings, however social distancing requirements limit the number of people able to be present. FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

The November Council meeting provided new and returning Councillors with their second meeting since Local Government Elections in October, and a learning experience for all in terms of understanding meeting procedures as determined by the *Local Government Act 1995*.

A range of matters were considered, including:

- Adoption of CEO Performance Review Policy and CEO Probation Report Three Month Period
- Further consideration of the pending development application by CBH to establish a Rural Industry and Rail Siding on Lots 2, 533 and 535 Nardlah Rd, Broomehill. This application will be determined by a Development Assessment Panel.
- Ordinary Council meeting dates for 2022 were set, as follows:
- 17 February; 17 March; 21 April; 19 May; 16 June; 21 July; 18 August; 15 September; 20 October;
- 17 November; 16 December (Friday). Dates will be uploaded to the Shire's website.
- A request from the Broomehill Heritage Group to waive hall hire fees was approved.
- Awarding of the tender for the Broomehill Townscape Works to Environmental Industries.
- Awarding of the tender for bitumen supply services for 2021/2022 to Bitutek.

WORKS

Toolbrunup Rd: Works on Toolbrunup Rd to construct and seal a 2.5km section from South Pallinup Rd to Tallents Rd have commenced with drainage works and verge clearing underway at present. Gravel works will start early in December, with sealing to be completed in the New Year. People travelling in the area are asked to observe works signage, slow down and drive to the conditions.

At this busy time of the year, wise words from Main Roads WA - 'Traffic controllers and road workers are mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters and mates – who deserve to do their job and go home safely at the end of the day'.

Mosquitoes: The Shire is in the early stages of developing a Mosquito Control plan in conjunction with the Shires of Katanning and Gnowangerup which will see fogging of the townsites progressively phased out in favour of baiting of mosquito breeding sites. This is a longer term project, and we will keep the community advised of progress.

Journal St Footpath: The footpath on Journal St from the Post Office to the Caravan Park is progressing, with Council staff completing sections of the concrete path in between other tasks.

Playgrounds: We are aware there are a number of maintenance requirements with play equipment at playgrounds in the Shire. A playground industry representative has attended and inspected all equipment, and will compile a report for actioning by the Shire. Some items will be a quick fix and easily resolved, however others (potentially including equipment replacement) will require Council's consideration in the next budget.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM UPDATE

Broomehill Recreational Complex Accessibility Upgrade: Site works are complete, concrete paths, stairs and ramps have been poured. Progressing well.



Broomehill Townscape Enhancement: The tender for the works has been awarded to Environmental Industries, and it is expected onsite works will commence early in the New Year. Aside from improvements to the streetscape (paving, kerbing, plantings, and street furniture) changes are required to be made to the intersection to provide the best outcomes for safety and traffic flow to and from the highway. Staff will work with Main Roads in this regard.

Holland Park Nature Playground: The contractor will be commencing on site early in December, with completion prior to Christmas. Watch that space!

Holland Track Interpretive Centre: The project consultant is progressing the research component of this project, which will inform the content of the signage to be developed and installed. In consultation with the Broomehill Heritage Group, it has been determined that the facility will be located adjacent to the Broomehill Museum, and will complement the excellent work being achieved by this group. Contractors have ordered the gazebo, and the design process for the signage is underway.

Water Efficiencies: As previously reported, the new tank and standpipe have been installed adjacent to the Broomehill Town Dam. A new tank is on order, to be installed behind the Shire Works Depot in Tambellup on Gordon St. A standpipe controller will be installed at this site.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

Office Hours:

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Friday 24 December 2021** and reopen at 9.00am on **Tuesday 4 January 2022**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period. Patrons of the Broomehill Library are encouraged to consider your holiday reading needs and call in early!

Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 24 December 2021. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas/New Year period.

Rubbish Collection:

There will be no change to the kerbside rubbish and recycling collection schedule. Please note the Waste Transfer Stations in Broomehill and Tambellup will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Emergency Contacts:

Any urgent matters during the Christmas and New Year period can be referred to the Manager of Works, Peter Vlahov on 0418 955 642, or CEO Chris Jackson on 0475 253555.

Harvest Ban:

Harvesting and the carting of grain is banned on Christmas Day. This does not restrict the movement of vehicles across paddocks, however if it is determined that weather conditions on Christmas Day will be hazardous, a Harvest and Movement of Vehicles Ban may be imposed. This will be communicated through usual channels — via text message, and the Shire's Harvest Ban Hotline (phone 9825 1042).

There are no automatic bans proposed for Boxing Day or New Year's Day, however conditions will be monitored. Please contact the Harvest Ban Hotline for updated information.

- * Rhys Brown, Scott Anderson and Ben Hankinson our discreet campground presence.








The most fun activity on camp was the little robot cars we programmed. Hazel

Well, the boys were all busy last weekend, so the girls turned out to the Community Market Day to remind everyone we are here, and to share some important information in relation to the upcoming fire season – how to keep you and yours safe during a bushfire, how you can prepare BEFORE a bushfire emergency, and updates to the bushfire warning system. This year has been another productive year for the Unit, providing response and support to our neighbouring brigades and units to a number of nasty vehicle crashes, as well as support to our local bushfire

brigades where required. Members meet twice a month for training, vehicle and equipment checks and just 'touching base' to ensure everyone is doing OK. In terms of response, we are limited to an extent by the fact our volunteer members are not all located in town and available during the working day, which can either delay our response, or result in our inability to attend. We do our best, however, to respond to any incident that we are called to.

As with every volunteer driven organisation in our community, we would dearly love more active members – so a call out to the community – if you have ever considered you would like to be more involved in your community, emergency services is a worthwhile, fulfilling past time. And – we are a great bunch – just saying J. There are many roles available within the Unit, some are frontline –on the end of a hose or the cutters, but also 'behind the frontline' – administration, promotion, catering, station duties and more. Fallen Soldiers Memorial AT TAMBELLUP

UNVEILING CEREMONY

On Sunday, November 20, a very large assemblage of people gathered at the site of the Tambellup Fallen Soldiers' Memorial to participate in the Dedication and Unveiling Ceremony. Apart from the intimate sentiment felt by the residents of the entire district in the occasion, which was to mark the tangible record of appreciation and sympathy for the services rendered by the men of the district in the great war and their sacrifice on behalf of the Empire, additional interest was lent to the ceremony by the presence of the direct representative of Great Britain and His Majesty The King in the person of His Excellency the Governor (Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate KCMG) who had consented to perform the unveiling ceremony.

Religious Service

Punctually at the time appointed, the Governor, accompanied by his Aide, (Captain Fortescue), was motored to the site by Mr Herbert Balston, together with Lieut-Col. F Lovegrove AMC and Lieut-Col CWH Birt, DSO, the party being met by Mr W J Rourke, Chairman of the Tambellup Road Board, and taken to the platform erected alongside the Memorial. The ceremony commenced with the National Anthem, after which the Rev. G E Hipwell as leader, announced the order of service and opened proceedings with prayer, being assisted in the religious observances by the Revs J Craven and Brooks and Ensign Fisher. The Dedication prayer was offered by the Rev. J Craven and the Commemoration of the Fallen by Ensign Fisher of the Salvation Army.

Welcome to the Governor

At the conclusion of the Dedication Service, the Chairman of the Road Board (Mr W J Rourke), formally requested His Excellency the Governor to unveil the Memorial. In doing so, Mr Rourke voiced the loyal pride of the district in having the representative of His Majesty the King present on such an occasion. Tambellup as a district was probably not so large, nor as important as many other districts but he would give it second place to none in patriotism and love of country. It was not given to everyone to be able to fight for their King and Country but those who had been free to go, had gone, and those who were unable, through force of circumstances to actually carry the rifle, had done their best, though behind the lines, by working for the men who had gone. Throughout the war, every personal interest had been put to one side, in order to collect money and gather comforts for those who were absent. He was proud to be able to ask the direct representative of the King, for whom they had all striven during the war, to unveil the Memorial to those men who had paid the supreme sacrifice at the Call of Duty.

Governor's Address

His Excellency the Governor, Sir Francis Newdegate, who was greeted with warm applause, said he keenly felt the honour that had been bestowed upon him in being asked to unveil the Memorial to Tambellup's Fallen Soldiers. Since he had been in Australia, he had come to more fully realise the sterling qualities that went to form the Australian character. He thought the Memorial that stood before them was truly representative of the spirit that imbued, not only those that had fallen, but of every Australian pioneer, and all Australians in the wide spaces of the Commonwealth were pioneers to a greater or lesser degree. The rough granite that formed the column was an embodiment of the grit and spirit to endure that which was possessed by every Australian. It was looking upwards as did every Australian, to the better things that would be won to, when the present hard fight against nature was turned to victory. As the representative of the King, he had to tell them how greatly His Majesty sympathised with those who had suffered bereavement through the war, and with those others, who came back, certainly, but who bore the marks of conflict upon their bodies and their minds, and would bear them possibly to the grave. His Majesty's message to all Australians was one of thankfulness for the noble way they had answered the call of the Empire, when the British race was fighting for freedom and liberty, with its back against the wall, and to whom was due much of the spirit that brought them through to victory. Not only, to the men was that message sent, but to the women also, who made sacrifices greater even than their men, who willingly sent their husbands, sons, lovers, to fight at that mysterious call of race and who worked hard and selflessly, to provide comforts for their men in the trenches. The Memorial that had been erected was more than to commemorate the fallen, it was a message and lesson to the children of today and to the future generations. He fervently hoped that the children would not be called upon to suffer as had this generation, but he was certain that IF the call came, they would respond even as their fathers responded. This Memorial, and all such memorials throughout the Commonwealth would serve, should such need ever come again, to inspire and uplift that generation to the deeds of the men of Gallipoli and France. It was thought, when the great war ended in victory to the Allies, that an end had come to all wars, but was sad to think so little peace existed today in the world. The unrest, the unpeacefulness, that was everywhere might be the aftermath of war that would disappear when the nations reverted to peace-time conditions. He hoped so, and looked to the great American Conference being held at the present time, to solve many of the difficulties and to dissipate many of the jealousies and distrusts between nation and nation. Again, on behalf of His Majesty, he had to express thanks and sympathy to the people of Tambellup for the sacrifices they had made, and unveil the Memorial in his name.

As the flag fell from the Memorial, Mr A H Morrell sounded the Last Post, whilst all present stood silent and as the notes died away, relatives and friends of the Fallen placed wreaths at the base.

Wreaths were placed on the memorial by the following:- Tambellup RSL, Katanning RSL, Dr & Mrs Lovegrove, H Balston, Miss C Trathan, Mrs Ellis Henderson, Mrs J A McDonald, Mr & Mrs J Brown, Mrs E A Bradshaw, Mrs McNamara, Tambellup State School, Mr & Mrs Robinson, E & G McDonald, Mrs D Bessen, EWH Bunce, Mrs E Gmeiner, Mrs A Gmeiner, Mrs C Temby, Mrs Ball, Mrs J R Norrish, Miss E Temby, Mrs S Hall, Mrs Crosby, Mrs Parnell Snr, Mrs A E Bradshaw, Mrs Birt, Mrs Stacey, Miss Addie Johnson, Mrs T Brown, Mrs A Bessen and Tambellup children.

Mr A Thomson's Address

At the conclusion of the service, Mr A Thomson MLA on behalf of the people of Tambellup District, thanked His Excellency the Governor for being present. He said the Governor was a busy man, and could ill spare two days from his official duties to come to Tambellup and the people of the District fully realised his courtesy in

accepting the invitation to unveil their Memorial. Tambellup had a war record of which they were deservedly proud. It was only a small place, and comparatively speaking, had a small population from which enlistments could be drawn, yet a very large proportion of its eligible men had offered themselves for service. Of these, 109 had gone away and 26 paid the supreme sacrifice. They had reason to be proud of the prowess of their soldiers, two had returned with the rank of Lieut, Colonel, and a DSO with two bars had been awarded to Lieut.Colonel CWH Birt, who was present, an MC and C. de Guere to Lieutenant JC Birt and a Military Medal to Roy Russell, both of whom had fallen fighting for their country. They were proud to see the resentative of the King amongst them, and he desired to thank Sir Francis Newdegate on behalf of the district for being present.

At the conclusion of the ceremony, the official guests and the public were entertained at afternoon tea in the Agricultural Hall, after which the Governor and party were taken to see the beauties of the Gordon River.

During his stay in Tambellup, Sir Francis Newdegate was the guest of Mr Herbert Balston.
