### SHIRE WELCOMES ACTING CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Following the departure of former CEO Chris Jackson from the Shire in December due to health concerns, the Council is pleased to welcome incoming Acting CEO Rob Stewart. Mr Stewart is well known in local government circles in the region, having enjoyed a long stint as CEO at the Shire of Plantagenet. He has more recently filled temporary CEO roles at a number of regional local governments.

Mr Stewart commenced with the Shire on Monday 10 January 2022 and will be in the role until a substantive CEO is appointed.

### FROM THE DECEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

Late in 2021, local governments were invited to provide feedback on the Local Government Reforms currently being considered as part of the Local Government Act Review. At the December meeting, the Council resolved to provide feedback to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries and the WA Local Government Association.

The Council determined to adopt a Town Planning Scheme amendment (for the purpose of advertising), to change the zoning of the former bowling club site in Tambellup and adjacent vacant lots from 'Special Use' to 'Town Centre'. The amendment will be advertised for public comment in due course.

#### **WORKS**

While most of the works crew took leave over December and January, a small team remained on duty to respond to incidental matters that arose.

Before Christmas, works continued on Toolbrunup Rd, where reconstruction and sealing of a section to Tallents Rd is progressing. Clearing and clean up along this stretch has been completed, and culvert extensions and pegging of the job commenced. We thank everyone for their patience while our staff were working on site during harvest, and advise that works will recommence late in January. If you are traveling in the vicinity please be aware of workers on site and observe warning signage.

Our green spaces appeared to cope well with the spate of hot weather over December and January, thanks to the efforts of parks and gardens staff. Unfortunately the Broomehill Oval got a little dry, due to the failure of the pump over Christmas. The pump has since been replaced, and with regular watering, we hope it will recover within a short period. A new reticulation system is being designed for the Broomehill Recreational Complex, which will include the new landscaping incorporated into the accessibility upgrade works, as well as existing lawn and gardens.

At the December Council meeting, the Council resolved to accept a tender from Albany City Motors for the purchase of an Isuzu six wheel truck with two-way tipping body, to replace the current Isuzu beaver tail truck. This purchase is consistent with the Council's Ten Year Plant Replacement Program, which ensures a modern, well maintained fleet is maintained.

Work has commenced on a new carpark at the Broomehill Primary School with the site formed up and gravelled ready for sealing. We anticipate the bitumen trucks will be onsite early in February to seal the area. Kerbing and line marking will also be completed. The new car park will enhance the safety of the area, providing defined parking, one way traffic flow, separate school bus entrance, disabled parking, 'kiss and drop' zone and a safe pathway to the school for students.

### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT INITIATIVES**

The Shire has been fortunate in recent months to be able to access two programs that will enhance its ability to support the community during an emergency.

Funding was received from the *National Disaster Resilience Program* for the purchase of a 33kva generator permanently mounted on a trailer, and electrical work at the Broomehill Recreational Complex, Broomehill Works Depot, Tambellup Community Pavilion and Tambellup Works Depot. The generator will allow these sites to be powered during an emergency if there is a power outage – especially relevant to the Complex and Pavilion, which are the Shire's nominated welfare centres in the case of an emergency evacuation. The



Council appreciates the support of the State Emergency Management Committee, which administered this program in WA.

The other program which the Shire has been able to access is the Australian Government's *Strengthening Telecommunications Against Natural Disasters* (STAND) program, which has seen NBN satellite-connection devices installed at the Broomehill Recreational Complex and Tambellup Community Pavilion. During an emergency, these devices will provide internet and phone access even if the Telstra or Optus services have failed. The program has been supported by DFES and the WA Government.

While we sincerely hope our community is not placed in a situation where we need to test these initiatives, it is reassuring to know they are available to support our residents during difficult times.

### DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM UPDATE

### **Holland Park Nature Playground**

.....And it's finished!! Have your kids checked it out yet? We believe it was a popular spot over the holiday break, with locals and visitors alike. Our thanks to contractor James McLean and crew from South Coast Nature Play for the excellent job, with the installation finished just in time for school holidays. The new equipment, which includes an all-abilities swing and a timber bridge across the creek, is purposely 'rustic' in design, which will ensure it lasts for many years with minimal maintenance required. We are aware the site is a bit of a dust bowl at present, and we will be backfilling the gaps with additional wood chip mulch in coming weeks to resolve the issue.

We think the tractor provides a nice introduction to the now-celebrated Horsepower Highway which starts at the Broomehill-Gnowangerup Rd – the question is, does our tractor need a name? Suggestions welcome, contact the Shire by email – mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au!









### **Broomehill Recreational Complex Accessibility Upgrade**

The Complex worksite was a hive of activity prior to Christmas, with work underway to construct the ramps from the Oval, and installation of the limestone block terracing. Contractors are back on site after the break, and works are proceeding well.







### **Broomehill Town Centre Upgrade**

The contract for the works to be undertaken at the intersection of Journal St and Great Southern Highway has been awarded to Environmental Industries, with work due to commence at the end of January 2022. Initially the project was purely a street scaping exercise, involving paving, plantings and street furniture, however it became apparent that the existing design of the intersection does not comply with Main Roads standards for heavy vehicle access. The designs have now been modified, and the ensuing works will provide safe access for all road users, as well as improving the streetscape. We look forward to this project commencing.

### **Holland Track Interpretive Centre**

We are advised the consultants have completed the research phase of the project, and are now working on content for the panels to be installed under the new gazebo, which will be positioned adjacent to the Broomehill Museum. The project also includes signage for a townsite heritage walk trail, and the content for these panels is being developed. Staff will be working closely with the consultants, the Council and the Broomehill Heritage Group, to ensure the resulting interpretation is appropriate.

### **Water Efficiency Projects**

We are anticipating the installation of the second tank, to be located adjacent to the Tambellup Works Depot on Donald St, in the next few weeks. A standpipe controller will be installed on the tank, providing another public water outlet, and completing this project.

#### IT'S STILL BUSHFIRE SEASON ......

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period is in place until **14 FEBRUARY 2022** inclusive. No burning is permitted during this period.

The **RESTRICTED** burning period applies from **15 FEBRUARY 2022** until **15 APRIL 2022**. Permits to light fires are required to be obtained during this period, through your Brigade Fire Control Officer. February often presents the most challenging conditions for our volunteer brigades, with extremes of weather the norm. Please remain vigilant when working outdoors, or with anything that may cause a fire.



### REMINDER TO VOLUNTEER BUSH FIRE BRIGADE MEMBERS

#### **COVID-19 VACCINATION MANDATE**

As previously communicated, a State Government COVID-19 mandate issued on Friday 12 November 2021, requires all Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade members to be fully vaccinated by 31 January 2022 to be able to attend a fire.

The Public Health Directions place obligations on both the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup and individuals to comply. Breaches of a Public Health Directions Notice is an offence and could result in a fine of up to \$20,000 for individuals or \$100,000 for bodies corporate.

### What does this mean for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup?

The Public Health Directions place an obligation on the Shire to Broomehill-Tambellup to:

Ensure Bush Fire Brigade Volunteers who are unvaccinated by the required date do not attend fire and emergency services sites in breach as identified in the Public Health Directions.

The Shire must keep a register which details the COVID-19 vaccination status of its volunteers.

### What does this mean for you?

The Public Health Directions place an obligation on individual Bush Fire Brigade Volunteers to: Not attend sites in breach of the Public Health Direction; and To provide evidence of their vaccination status to the Shire.

### If you are not yet vaccinated:

We strongly encourage you to get vaccinated as a matter of priority. Access to vaccine is now wide-spread, with clinics running locally in Katanning and surrounding communities. To find a clinic and make a booking, go to: <a href="https://covid-vaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/booking/">https://covid-vaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/booking/</a>. Alternatively, speak to your GP.

### If you have been vaccinated:

If you have already received at least two COVID-19 vaccinations, then please provide evidence of your vaccination status via email to <a href="mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au">mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au</a>.

Any private medical information you provide to the Shire will be kept confidentially in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles and stored in a secure records file.

The mandate places the Shire in a difficult position, in acknowledging and appreciating the value of volunteers in our community, and having to place mandatory requirements upon you. We thank you for your understanding. Please appreciate we are implementing State Government Directions. If you have any queries or concerns, please contact the Acting Chief Executive Officer on 9825 3555.

# The grassroots approach

In October the Prime Minister announced a long-awaited commitment to reach net zero emissions by 2050. This follows on from other key announcements earlier this year such as Meat and Livestock Australia's Carbon Neutral by 2030 (CN30) publication in March and the State Government's \$15m investment in a new Carbon Farming and Land Restoration fund in July.

Net Zero is a term that often gets used with limited information on what it really means, or how it can be achieved both on-farm and nationally. For Australia, Net Zero 2050 means that by year 2050, the amount of carbon dioxide Australia is removing from the atmosphere will have to be the same as, or more than, the amount it is emitting. It is unsure at this stage what Net Zero 2050 will mean for the agricultural industry and individual producers but with 14% of Australia's greenhouse gas emissions coming from the sector, it is safe to say that any industry or government legislative change will have

widespread impact. Global net zero targets have also opened the door to an increased investment into the Australian Carbon Farming Industry.

In 2020, this increased investment coincided with a prolonged decreased investment in the Landcare sector and lead Gillamii, North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources (NSPNR) and Threshold Environmental to develop a partnership to empower farmers to rehabilitate marginal land, diversify income and conserve biodiversity. This initiative is now known as the Community, Carbon and Conservation Project. The project focuses on sequestration through biodiverse native plantings, with an emphasis on grassroots collaboration. Working with a group of progressive farmers, the project is currently underway restoring 550ha of marginal land through biodiverse carbon plantings with ecological restoration leader, Threshold Environmental. The project also encompasses 55km of protective fencing for the large-scale restoration sites, delivered by Gillamii and NSPNR, funded by the Western Australian Government's State NRM Program. Marginal land is land that traditionally has little or no agricultural value, however with

projects such as this one, marginal land can now offer farmers a new financial opportunity through diversified income, while also addressing on-farm environmental and production issues such as salinity, wind erosion and soil health.

In this project, diversified income is derived from the production (though the growth of vegetation) and sale of Australian Carbon Credit Units (ACCUs), which are formalised after each reporting period throughout the lifetime of the project. One carbon credit is the equivalent of one tonne of carbon dioxide gas, written as tCO2e. ACCUs are essentially a unit of currency, which can be purchased in Australia to offset national emission requirements. The amount of ACCUs produced by a project depends on a multitude of factors such as the location, size and duration of the project (25 - 100 years). This has recently been a point of focus in news headlines as the price of ACCUs has more than doubled this year, with the spot price reaching a record high of \$36.50 in October 2021.

As Net Zero targets formalise, ACCU value is rising, as large corporates seek to offset their emissions to comply with new targets. ACCUs can currently only be traded domestically in Australia, in Europe, during September 2021 the carbon price broke \$100 (€64) a metric tonne, with New Zealand reaching over \$60 (\$NZ65) a tonne. The more ambitious the country's Net Zero target, the higher the carbon price. With discussions of international trade arrangements being developed in the coming years, it is not unrealistic to expect ongoing fluctuations in the price of carbon.

The development, registration and management of Carbon Farming projects can seem complex to someone not familiar with the industry and for this reason individuals often partner with carbon service providers. These providers offer a variety of financial partnerships such as leases on land or a share in the ACCUs produced. To maximise local benefit, the Community, Carbon and Conservation project is being established and managed by Threshold Environmental with landholders maintaining the majority share of the credits produced.

The development of the Community, Carbon and Conservation project from the grassroots has allowed both Gillamii and NSPNR, as local grower groups, a unique opportunity to be involved in a large-scale Carbon Farming project. As the first year of the project reaches completion it has emphasized the complexity involved and the need for community involvement in both the development and establishment phase of the project. Each farmer has a different motivation, succession plan and piece in the landscape which cannot be overlooked and needs careful consideration. The project has also highlighted the need for increased industry education and awareness in regional communities. Competition among carbon service providers is strong, which means landholders have a range of options available to consider. Understanding the drivers of demand, limitations on supply and the associated risk is as important when making carbon farming decisions as it is within grain and livestock markets. It is important to understand the difference between generating carbon credits to offset industry emissions or generating credits for future on-farm offsets. If you're using your land to offset for a polluting entity, it can't also be used to offset your own on-farm emissions. Carbon Sink plantings are just one method for reducing overall on-farm carbon emissions and other options such as soil carbon, reducing livestock

emissions and reforestation are currently being established throughout the sector.

For Gillamii, NSPNR and Threshold Environmental, future years of the project will focus on strengthening current relationships with project farmers, taking time to assess the biodiversity outcomes of the large-scale plantings, as well as one-on-one training to assist each individual farmer to understand how to manage the ACCUs produced from the project over time. Resources will also be focused on baselining farms to understand net emissions and provide impartial assistance to individuals considering carbon farming projects, with hopes of empowering farmers to understand the complex industry, its risk and its potential.

# What to do if COVID is in my community

Listen to your community leaders. A COVID response team will come to help (health workers, police and others). They will help to keep your community safe.

### Stay home

Don't visit other houses. Tell friends and family to stay home too. If you feel unsafe at home, go somewhere safe, but tell your community leaders or police.



### Stay in the community

Don't leave to go to town or visit other communities.

# Be prepared for COVID

If COVID gets into your community, help will come, but we all need to be prepared.

### What you can do now - BEFORE COVID is here

- Get vaccinated. Most people who are vaccinated do not get very sick from COVID. Make sure you get 2 doses. This is the best way to protect yourself and your whole community.
- If someone gets COVID, the COVID response team will talk to them about how they can best care for them. This might mean leaving community to go to hospital. Things to think about:
  - If this is you, would you like to stay in community, or are you ok to go?
  - If someone leaves to go to hospital who can the health team contact to give updates to?
  - If you have children and have to leave to go to hospital, who will take care of them?
- Food and other supplies will be sent to the community but this may take up to 24 hours.
  - Do you have food at home to last one day?
  - If you have regular medicine, do you have enough to last for a few days?
  - Ask your community leader who you can call for help, if you can't go out and need food or other supplies.
  - If you have pets do you have some extra food for them?
  - Can you protect yourself? Do you have some face masks and soap to wash your hands?
- Stay COVID safe.
  - Wash hands often with soap and water or use hand sanitiser.
  - Cough or sneeze into your inner elbow or into a tissue.
  - Keep your distance stay 2 big steps away from people you don't live with.
  - Increase cleaning of frequently touched surfaces (phones, door knobs, benches etc).
  - Stay at home when you're sick. Call your clinic you might need to get a COVID test.

### What to do if COVID gets into my community

- Stay calm. Follow TRUE advice from your community leaders and COVID response team.
- A COVID response team (health workers, police and others) will come to help your community as soon
  as possible. They might be wearing masks, glasses and funny clothes over their normal clothes called
  PPE (personal protective equipment).
- PPE is to keep you and the COVID response team safe. It stops COVID spreading.
- You should stay at home, with your household and away from others. Don't have visitors over. If you feel unsafe at home, go to a safer place. Tell your community leaders or police.
- Stay in the community. Don't go bush or visit other communities. Even if you're not sick, you could have COVID. If you leave, you could spread it to other communities.
- You and your family might have to have a COVID test. It is quick and it doesn't hurt.
- If you have COVID or someone in your house has COVID, the COVID response team might talk to you about leaving the community, to go to hospital so you can be cared for, or to go to other accommodation to help stop COVID spreading to other people in your community.
- Food, medicine and other supplies will be provided to help your community. Tell your community leader or the COVID response team if you need something.
- Stay COVID safe (see above). Follow the health advice to protect yourself and stay strong.
- If you feel sick, stay home and call the clinic or tell the COVID response team. If you are very sick and it's urgent call 000.




