THANK YOU

From the Tambellup community – thank you to all our fire brigade volunteers, those who attended from our neighbouring communities, and DFES personnel and resources for their excellent response to the fire on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd on Thursday 24 February. The fire was located a mere 5km from the town boundary, and with the weather conditions that were experienced at the time, the outcome could have been far worse.

The decision to place the townsite and surrounding areas under a Bushfire Watch and Act warning, and the resulting evacuation notice that many resident would have received, was made pre-empting any likelihood of conditions worsening and the risk of the townsite being impacted. Thankfully, the fire was able to be contained and controlled, and the warning level was downgraded to a Bushfire Advice early in the evening. It is timely to remind residents that the decisions made that day were made were based on a range of information available to those managing the incident. While informal fire ground updates are valuable, they often don't factor in all the information that is available, for example forecast changes in weather conditions. For this reason, emergency warnings should not be dismissed.

While the incident was alarming, it has proven to be an excellent learning mechanism for all agencies involved. Aside from response, which our volunteer brigade members do really well, the notice of evacuation allowed us to test our community evacuation plans in real time. We have identified areas where improvements and adjustments are required, and will, as an organisation, be working through these with the Local Emergency Management Committee to improve our processes.

For anyone who was wondering what/how/where to evacuate, we encourage you to look at the resource prepared by DFES – 'My Bushfire Plan' at <u>https://mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au/</u>. The site contains a wealth of resources and checklists that will assist you to make your bushfire plan.

We have also identified that within our communities of Broomehill and Tambellup, there are residents who may need assistance to evacuate. To ensure we are able to organise assistance if required, we invite anyone who feels they may need assistance to register their details at the Shire – by phone to 9825 3555, or email to <u>mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au</u>. Any information provided will be confidential and only used in an emergency situation. Please contact Pam Hull at the Shire for more information.



SHIRE COMMENCES PROCESS TO RECRUIT NEW CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

At the February 2022 Council meeting, Council resolved that the Acting CEO, Rob Stewart, would manage process of recruiting a new Chief Executive Officer. A recruitment committee consisting of Councillors and an independent person has been established to oversee the process. The advertising for this position commences on Saturday 26th February 2022, with applications closing mid-March. We look forward to a successful recruitment process, and will advise the community when an appointment has been made.

STAFF UPDATES

We are pleased to welcome Kenneth Farmer to the organisation. Kenneth has taken a position on the Parks and Gardens team, commencing during January.

We also farewelled two of our works team at the end of February, in Damon Powell and Barry Ford. Thank you both for your efforts during your time with the Shire.

FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING

With this being the first meeting of the year, the Council received the financials and creditors accounts paid for December and January.

The Council adopted a reviewed Organisation Chart for the Shire, showing a total staff establishment of 28.1 full time equivalent personnel. The Council's endorsement of this document provides the CEO with strong direction regarding staffing requirements.

The Council was required to consider an application received from the WA Planning Commission for boundary realignments to a number of parcels of land on Beejenup Rd. The Council will recommend that the application be approved.

The review of the Shire's local laws took the next step, with the Council recommending that a number of draft amendment local laws be referred to the Joint Standing Committee for Delegated Legislation for review prior to advertising.

The Council received the quarterly progress report for the Corporate Business Plan. The report outlines initiatives and actions that have been in progress for the September-December 2021 quarter, which contribute towards the achievement of the Strategic Community Plan. The report is included with the minutes of the February 2022 Council meeting, which are available on the Shire's website <u>www.shirebt.wa.gov.au</u>

The Council endorsed a recommendation for the purchase of a new cab chassis 6-wheeler truck and two-way tipping body, and also a new 6x4 prime mover. These purchases and the relevant trade-ins are in accordance with the Shire's ten year Plant Replacement program.

WORKS

Works have continued on Toolbrunup Road during February, with gravel works underway. Two new culverts have been installed, and four existing culverts have been extended.

The Broomehill Primary School carpark has been sealed with asphalt and kerbed, with the line marking set out completed. Permanent line marking and bump stops will be completed in the near future.

The accessibility upgrade works at the Broomehill Complex are largely complete, with some minor works to be done when temperatures are suitable.

TRAILS STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION

Outdoors Great Southern in conjunction with the Shire, have commenced community consultation to uncover stories of Tambellup which will inform new signage for the Tambellup Heritage Trail. A productive session was held recently at the Tambellup CRC, with around 20 local residents attending to share their recollections of life in Tambellup over many years. Dr May Carter and Robbie Miniter, from Outdoors Great Southern, will be following up these conversations to prepare content for trail signage. As discussed at the session, the suggested content will be brought back to a follow up session to ensure it is an



accurate reflection of the discussions. Thank you to everyone who turned up, and thank you to the CRC for hosting.

IT'S STILL BUSHFIRE SEASON

All residents are advised the **RESTRICTED** burning period is in place until **15 APRIL 2022** inclusive. Permits to light fires are required during this period, through your Brigade Fire Control Officer.



UPDATE FROM THE TAMBELLUP POLICE



Warning for Trail Bike Riders from Tambellup Police

Tambellup Police have noted an increase in illegal off-road motorbike use in the district. To minimise public risk, Tambellup Police will be increasing patrols in off-road areas and targeting unlicensed off-road vehicles.

What are the rules?

Road-registered trail bikes can be ridden by anyone with a WA motorcycle licence on any open public road, including roads in State forests, national parks and drinking water catchment areas. Off-road vehicle (ORV) registered trail bikes and quad bikes, being ridden by anyone without a WA motorcycle

licence, can only be legally ridden in permitted ORV areas.

Trail bikes and quad bikes can be ridden on private properties with the owner's permission. Bikes do not need to be registered and riders do not need to hold a license to ride on private property. There is no specific licence for trail or quad bike riders. However, riders must be over eight years of age if they are in a permitted ORV area.

Breaking the rules

Penalties for riding the wrong bike in the wrong place or without the correct vehicle registration or motorcycle license is costly. There are fines of up to \$2000 for the unauthorised use of a vehicle on public land.

Local Government Rangers and Police can impound and destroy trail or quad bikes when they believe the vehicle is involved in an offence (such as being illegally ridden on a public road) or if the rider is unable to prove ownership.

RESTORE YOUR LAND

Carbon Positive Australia is a not-for-profit organisation that uses donations from individuals and organisations to revegetate degraded land and restore native habitats across Australia.

How do we work with landholders?

Each year, Carbon Positive Australia supports a number of landholders to develop large-scale, mixed native species planting projects on their land.

These projects are funded by donors who wish to offset their carbon footprint by investing in tree planting projects that remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.

These funds pay for all project planting and monitoring costs.

Landholders maintain full ownership of the land, however must sign a Landholder Agreement so that our donors know that the trees they have funded have permanence.

Why plant your land?

The benefits of revegetating rural land can include:

- · reducing salinity and waterlogging
- improving soil quality and reducing erosion
- providing a natural wind break to protect crops and livestock
- restoring habitat for native flora and fauna
- providing shade and shelter for livestock
- increasing the ecological and financial value of the land

Is your land suitable?

- planting area greater than 20 hectares (however, this can be total area over adjoining properties if neighbouring landholders would like to participate)
- cleared prior to 1990
- annual rainfall 200mm+

OUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- select suitable species
- acquire seeds and seedlings
- prepare and plant the site
- register the site with the Emissions Reduction Fund (if applicable) and administer the carbon covenant*
- fund the whole cost of site preparation and planting
- monitor survival and growth rates

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- maintain fences and firebreaks
- take reasonable steps to manage pests
- allow our site managers reasonable access
- sign a Landholder Agreement signifying your commitment to protect the trees (minimum 25 years)



FAQs

What happens once the trees are planted?

We let nature take its course! Over the first three years, we will need occasional access to the site to monitor growth. If survival rates are low at first monitoring, we will assess whether to restock the area.

Can livestock be grazed on the planting area?

After three years, sheep are allowed for light grazing; provided there is no damage to the trees/shrubs.

Can I visit existing Carbon Positive Australia planting sites?

Yes. Many of our landholders are happy to let other prospective carbon project owners visit their land and see what has been achieved. If you would like to visit a site, please contact us and we will arrange a visit to a site near you.


Why do I need to sign a Landholder Agreement?

A Landholder Agreement must be in place for us to register a Carbon Covenant and a Carbon Right over the planted area(s). The Carbon Covenant protects the planted area, ensuring the "permanence" of the project for a period of either 25 or 100 years. The Carbon Right assigns all carbon sequestered to Carbon Positive Australia.

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

<u>Cranbrook Motocross set to host Round 1</u> <u>of Southwest Interclub Series</u>


Capping off a successful 2021 year, the Cranbrook Motocross club has nominated to host Round One of the Southwest Interclub Series sponsored

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
