FROM THE APRIL COUNCIL MEETING

Prior to the Council meeting, the Council was pleased to welcome Rick Wilson MP for a discussion around the upcoming Federal Government election to be held on 21 May 2022, current Government priorities, and local projects. The meeting provided an opportunity for the elected members and staff to raise matters relevant to our community.

Matters considered by the Council at the Ordinary Council meeting included:

- The 2021/2022 Annual Budget Review;
- A new agreement with the Tambellup Community Resource Centre for the provision of Library services in Tambellup;

- A variation to the Bush Fire Risk Management Plan grant agreement, which will allow for the appointment of a Bush Fire Risk Management Coordinator and development of Bush Fire Risk Management Plans for the Shires of Broomehill-Tambellup, Kojonup and Katanning;
- The appointment of Fire Control Officers and Fire Weather Officers
- The formation of a Contiguous Local Authority Group with the Shires of Gnowangerup and Katanning, for the purpose of mosquito control;
- Various policy reviews;
- A Draft Sea Container Policy, which will be advertised for public comment;
- The Corporate Business Plan Quarterly report for the January – March 2022 quarter.

WORKS

The period before Easter was a busy time for the construction crew who finished preparation of a 2.8km section of Toolbrunup Rd, from South Pallinup Rd to Tallents Rd. The section has been cement stabilised, and will be sealed when conditions are warmer later in the year. Works have continued on Tieline Rd, to repair a pavement failure, and to widen and seal the curve at the intersection of Tieline Rd and Norrish Rd. Stabilising of these sections will be completed by contractors early in May. The construction crew will be working on Broomehill Kojonup Rd and Tambellup West Rd over the next couple of weeks, where a number of pavement failures will be repaired.

Contractors have been in Tambellup over the last week, undertaking reseals to a number of townsite streets where numerous minor repairs have been made in the past. Pre-winter culvert maintenance and repairs are underway at various points across the Shire.

Our parks and gardens team, led in the interim by Morrie Hirjee, completed a minor refurbishment of the gardens surrounding the War Memorial in Tambellup. Sleeper garden edges and new soil were the basis for new plantings of rosemary around the Memorial. The Memorial itself also received some attention, with a pressure clean and repainting of lettering, ensuring it was fresh on ANZAC Day for the 100 year commemoration of its dedication in November 1921.

COVID-19 continued to impact the works crew during April, and in particular the maintenance grading program. With a number of staff needing to isolate as close contacts, machine operators needed to be flexible in their ability to work in different areas to ensure the construction program was able to continue. As a result, maintenance grading for April was limited to the following roads prior to the Easter break: Witham Rd, Hassell Rd, Burrridge Rd, Sprigg-Simpson Rd, and Nazzari Rd. We are looking forward to having a full complement of staff to enable all works to get back on track.

SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO. 2 - PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 6

The Shire has commenced the process to amend the Town Planning Scheme, to change the zoning of the former Tambellup Bowling Club and the adjacent lots at the corner of Taylor St and Crowden St. The purpose of the rezoning is to broaden the potential use of the land into the future.

In consultation with community members and community organisations it has been identified that the lack of short stay accommodation facilities in Tambellup is detrimental to the attraction of visitors and short term

workers to our community. The former Bowling Club has been identified as a potential site for the development of a caravan park with camping grounds and short stay chalets, however the current zoning of the land does not allow for it to be used for this purpose.

The consultation period for this proposed amendment has commenced, with written submissions to be forwarded to the Shire by 20 May. More information is available on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au.

ANZAC DAY

Our thanks are extended to the community organisations who coordinated the ANZAC services in Broomehill and Tambellup again this year – the Broomehill Heritage Group, Tambellup Lions Club and Tambellup CWA. Both services had a distinctly local flavour, providing a moving tribute to those members of our community who served their country, and those who did not return.

ROAD SAFETY DURING SEEDING OPERATIONS

It's that time of the year again when a lot of heavy machinery will be moving around the Shire. Farmers, your licensing concession on tractors, self-propelled sprayers, spray equipment etc., contains conditions which may include the requirement to only travel on roads between sunrise and sunset, may require a flashing light, and may need to have an 'over width' sign attached. In the event of an accident involving other road users, if conditions of your licence are not complied with, motor vehicle injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred. FROM THE SERGEANTS DESK - TAMBELLUP POLICE STATION



Please remember from Tuesday 26th April our Schools are back in Broomehill and Tambellup bringing with it the 40kmph zones between 7:30 am to 9:00am and 2:30 pm and 4:00pm.

Over the Easter period, we saw a large increase in vehicular traffic into the region which thankfully didn't result in any crashes. Tambellup Police conducted over 500 random breath tests with no positive results which is pleasing to see.

As the weather is now changing it is a timely reminder for anyone carting firewood that the maximum limit on an unbraked trailer is 750kgs. This weight also includes the tare weight of the trailer which generally reduces this amount significantly. If your combination is weighed on Main Roads the fines can be very costly as the fine increases by the percentage over the maximum weight allowed.

Further, when transporting firewood, the driver needs to ensure the load is secured to the trailer to ensure it does not fall from the vehicle. Tarpaulins generally should not be used unless they have a load restraint rating. The best practice is to have a load-rated cargo net with ratchet straps holding it to the trailer.

Tambellup ANZAC Day 2022

Once again the Tambellup Lions Club hosted the ANZAC ceremony in Tambellup. The ceremony focused on the 100th anniversary of our war memorial. In his address, Michael White expanded on the original dedication in November 1921 as well as some insight into some of those whose are remembered on the memorial.

Winton Nazzari recited the very moving poem "Not a Hero" by Clyde Hamilton.

This was followed by Andrew Bradshaw singing the song he wrote "Bring Them Home".

We are lucky to have such talent in our community.

After the service it was time to adjourn to the CWA rooms to enjoy a cuppa and an ANZAC biscuits. There were 11 entries in the "ANZAC Bakeoff" which was awarded to Janine Sadler for her very tasty, crunchy biscuit.

Thanks to Annie at the Shire for the brochure production and Pam for getting the lettering on the memorial spruced up.

Thanks also to all those who were able to attend. A great community effort and get together.

Let's hope that it will not be necessary to add another theatre of war to our memorial.

THE CORNERSHOP MUSEUM OF TAMBELLUP PRESENTS.....

The initial story of Our Tambellup Oval

Written by Geoff O'Neill (Date unknown)

“ The Tambellup Football Club had a big problem after several wet seasons at the Showgrounds. It was very clay ground and had been graded for years for stinkweed. As a result, it was a bit saucer shaped, so we played in water for most part of the year. Owen Saggars dug drains to the Main West Road from the centre of the ground, some 6 inches deep. This worried me because I was secretary of the club and ran the Accident Fund. We all paid sixpence a match and I could see that someone was going to break a leg in those drains, and we would have been in big financial trouble. We decided to look for a new ground. We looked at the old Showgrounds, Cow Dung Flat behind the old Police Station, that had been used before, the flat behind Nurse Turner's and the “A” Class Reserve near the tennis courts. All looked hopeless.

I got my father Joe O'Neill who was a dam sinker for many years, to have a look at the "A" Class Reserve to see if it was possible to shift the sandhill into the gully. He said he thought it could be done but would take a hell of a long time and the cost would be enormous. He was thinking of doing it with horses. We approached the Road Board and got nowhere. I thought that it could be done with tractors and scoops, hopefully with working bees. We were fortunate to get Bert Cuneo to do a survey and advise us. He said it could be done but there were hundreds of thousands of yards of sand to be shifted and would cost a lot of money and we did not have any.

I was on the Board and used to help the Community Centre to raise funds for district improvements. They were right behind us, as were Bill and Doris Clapp, Minnie Saggars, Pam Watts, and Isobel who comprised the Board. It was later extended and Doris Clapp who ran the Community Centre Catering for weddings, parties, functions, etc. said that they would use that to finance the project.

For six weekends, six of the football team cleared the Yate trees in the gully. Burnt down the bigger ones along with the Jam trees and then came the big working bee.

Twelve tractors pulling scoops of all sorts and sizes and one pulling an old grader. I think it was Mr Fairweathers. After four weekends it was pretty level. Photos taken at the time were sent to the Western Mail and were lost. There are a few left in existence. George Burrridge had his tractor scoop and the grader levelling for ages. He used to come to me and say "what do I do next".

The Community Centre paid for the power kerosene used by the tractors and that cost about 2,000 pounds. We could not possibly have done without their support. We tried planting couch grass in the yellow sand which was silica. What did grow, the rabbits ate and dug up. So, Joe Budisilich (Charcoal Joe) and Col. Birt put up a rabbit proof fence around the oval. The yellow sand would not grow anything and needed support. Bill Clapp carted hundreds of tons of loam & sheep manure and they spread it. It cost them a lot of money. We had a lot of opposition at the start for wasting public money they said. It was heart breaking at times when everything seemed to be going wrong. I felt at times that perhaps we had made a mistake and we were wasting money. But Len King one of my greatest stalwarts said, "stick with it, we can do it" and we did!

We ran community concerts and Col. Birt was our compere, we had a mock wedding to raise funds. We made 100 pounds from the mock wedding which was a hell of a lot of money in those days. It was held in the Tambellup Hall and was packed. I will never forget it. I was the beautiful blushing bride and Pat Burrridge was the bridegroom. George Burrridge took us away in his Humber Super Snipe. Ribbons, cans, and boots all flying. When I look at that sports ground today I feel a certain amount of pride that anybody who had anything to do with this magnificent oval should be justly proud. I think that it was a wonderful achievement.




