Don't know what a 3D printer can do for you??
We can print almost anything from figurines to parts for your drone.

YOUR IMAGINATION IS THE LIMIT!

So far our printers have been used by both the Broomehill and Tambellup Primary Schools to print 3D models and cookie cutters that the kids designed at school.

Our 3D scanner can scan any object in the real world, to then recreate it fully, digitally.

Thanks to this process, the object can then become a 3D model, printed with a 3D printer.

Imagine being able to copy not just a document on paper but 3D models as well

The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on <u>Thursday 16 June 2022 commencing at 4.30pm</u>, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings, however physical distancing requirements limit the number of people able to be present. If you plan to attend a Council meeting, we encourage you to contact the Shire on 9825 3555 to register before the meeting.

FROM THE MAY COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council confirmed that the recruitment process undertaken recently for the appointment of a new CEO had been undertaken in accordance with the Model Standards for CEO Recruitment, Performance and Termination.
- A review of delegations under the Dog Act (1976) was completed.
- Legislative requirements for the proposal to develop a caravan park in Tambellup were considered by the Council. With estimated capital expenditure expected of at least \$600,000 to develop the facility, in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* the Council is required to classify the proposal as a major business undertaking and prepare a business case for endorsement prior to advertising the proposal.
- The Council reviewed a number of policies, including 'Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Logo', "Financial Assistance for Legal Services for Elected Members', 'Customer Service', and 'Independent Living Seniors Accommodation Housing Allocation'. No major amendments were made to these policies.
- A planning application for an outbuilding at Lot 3 (248) Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd was approved with conditions.
- The Council considered and endorsed the Adverse Events Plan, which is a requirement of the Drought Communities Program funding.

WORKS

Road construction projects across the Shire are at varying stages of completion as we head towards the end of the financial year. On Toolbrunup Rd, the works have been completed to bitumen seal stage, with the bitumen seal to be applied during summer when weather conditions have warmed up. The Tieline Rd projects are underway and being completed as weather conditions permit. Repairs to the seals in sections of Tambellup West Rd and Broomehill-Kojonup Rd are continuing. With the availability of a contractor recently, the opportunity was taken to repair sections of asphalt on Taylor St and Norrish St.

The maintenance graders have been on the following roads during May: Chillicup Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Norrish Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Batchelor North Rd, Tieline North Rd, Poonawarriup Rd, Hillman Rd, Bignell Rd, Withams Rd, South Batchelor Rd, McGuire Rd, Mindora Rd.

COVID-19 continues to impact staffing levels on our outside crew, however once again, staff have been flexible in their work areas to ensure the works program is able to continue.

From the Ranger's Corner

Cats in the community

Did you know that all cats that have reached the age of six months are required by law to be:

- Microchipped;
- Sterilised (desexed);
- Registered with the relevant local government (Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup)
- Wear a collar and registration tag to ensure they can be easily identified and returned to you if they become lost.

Our State Cat laws are about encouraging responsible pet ownership and reducing the number of unwanted cats in the community and the number that are euthanized each year.

The State regulations state that:

Cats to be registered

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is registered with the local government in whose district the cat is ordinarily kept. Penalty: a fine of up to \$5,000.

To register you cat please attend the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Administration office where our Customer Service team will be able to assist you.

Cats to be microchipped

- (1) The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is microchipped, unless the cat is exempt from microchipping. Penalty: a fine of up to \$5 000.
- (2) A cat is exempt from microchipping if a certificate given by a veterinarian stating that the implantation of a microchip in the cat may adversely affect the health and welfare of the cat applies in respect of the cat.

My Cat Is Very Old – Do I Still Need To Have It Sterilised?

Yes, our legislation applies to all cats of all ages. However, your vet can issue an exemption certificate if sterilising your cat is likely to have a negative impact on your cat's health and welfare.

How Does Legislation This Affect Cat Breeders?

The legislation requires that a person who chooses to breed cats must apply to their local government for a permit.

What Concessions Or Assistance Will Be Available For Pensioners Or Low Income Earners?

The government has provided funding to assist and provide low cost sterilisation for cats owned by pensioners and people on low income. To find out if you are eligible for financial assistance to sterilise your cat, visit this website: National Desexing Network - Discounted Desexing (ndn.org.au)

Pensioners will also receive a discount on registration fees.
