STAFF UPDATE

At the end of June, the Council was pleased to welcome new CEO Anthony Middleton to the Shire. Anthony comes to us with broad experience gained from working in a number of local governments, most recently the Shire of Kojonup where he was the Manager of Corporate and Community Services. He is looking forward to getting out and meeting members of the community in due course.

With Anthony's commencement, we also farewelled our Acting CEO, Rob Stewart. Rob very generously put his retirement on hold in January this year to come and work with us as we went through the CEO recruitment process. Much has been achieved in the past six months, and Councillors and staff have appreciated Rob's knowledge and experience. Rob and his partner Alison have some travels planned in the near future and we hope they are able to do this before Rob gets called up for another Acting CEO role! Best wishes Rob!

FROM THE JUNE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council considered a complaint from a local resident regarding allegations of disused material being stored on a lot on Reilly St. Following inspection of the property by the CEO and Manager of Works, Council resolved to serve notice under the Shire's Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Material Local Law 2020 requiring the owner or occupier to clear the property of disused materials within 21 days.
- The Shire's Fire Break Order and Information Booklet was reviewed and endorsed. This will be distributed to all residents in coming weeks.
- The Council agreed to enter into a lease agreement with the Tambellup Community Resource Centre Inc. for the use of the premises at 34 Norrish St.
- The Council considered and supported a number of planning applications, including a subdivision of Lot 7734 Etna Rd to create a homestead lot, alterations and additions to a building on Lot 205 North Greenhills Rd, and alterations and additions to a building on Reilly St.

WORKS

Heavy rain experienced during June resulted in the Shire's construction program drawing to a halt. The break in the program allowed all works staff to participate in training,

including White Card refresher, traffic control, and the use of the new traffic lights which the shire has recently purchased.

Maintenance works have continued, with an asphalt overlay being completed at the Tieline Rd/Moulyerup Rd corner and gravel sheeting on sections of Paul Valley Rd and Jam Creek Rd. Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads: Norrish Rd, Eureka Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Thompson Rd, Beejenup Rd, Pindellup Rd, Fletcher Rd, Collins Rd, Sorrento Rd, North West Rd, Bessen Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, and Lovegrove St.

With the development of the new financial year's budget underway, costings for the road construction and plant replacement programs have been finalised, and work has commenced on the funding submissions for the following year's road construction program.

PUBLIC HEALTH PLANNING – WE NEED TO HEAR FROM YOU!

With the introduction of the new *Public Health Act 2016*, local governments are required to develop a Public Health Plan which is incorporated into its Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Plan. The Shire has contracted Mr Llew Withers to undertake this work.

The initial Health Profile Report for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup was presented to the Council at the May Council meeting. The next stage requires input from the community, and to enable this feedback to be gathered, a survey has been developed. The survey has been promoted through the Shire's Facebook page and website, and is available online at the following link: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/B-TPHPSurvey2022

Printed copies of the survey are available at the Tambellup Community Resource Centre, Tambellup Post Office and the Broomehill and Tambellup Shire Administration Offices.

The information gathered will contribute to planning for facilities and services in our community into the future. The survey is open to all residents to complete. We are aiming at getting responses from a broad cross section of our community, including our youth, so parents and care givers, please encourage your young people to get online and complete the survey as well.

The survey is open until 31 July 2022.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES PROGRAM PROJECT UPDATE

Two projects funded by the Drought Communities Program are still underway, and will be making significant progress in coming weeks and months.

The Broomehill Townscape Project, which initially was a fairly straightforward program to upgrade paving, street furniture and plantings at the Journal St/Great Southern Highway intersection, grew in scope when it became apparent that the intersection was not compliant with current requirements for heavy vehicles. This has resulted in a redesign to widen the intersection, including full construction of the extra road surface to RAV7 requirements. The intended paving replacement on both sides of the intersection will be undertaken, as well as redesign of the area in front of the Broomehill Museum, installation of new street furniture and street plantings. It is anticipated that these works, once complete, will enhance this area as befitting the entry point to the Broomehill townsite.

We anticipate contractors will be onsite in the near future, and they will be working to keep the disruption to traffic to a minimum. We do ask however that people travelling in the vicinity of these works observe all traffic control and direction that is on site.

Running alongside this project, the **Holland Track Interpretive Centre** is taking shape. Residents may have noticed the new gazebo being installed next to the Museum. The gazebo will house three information panels, containing historical information relating to the development of the Holland Track, and current information about driving the Holland Track and Holland Way. The information on these panels has been researched by a consultant researcher who is working with the Broomehill Heritage Group, and makes interesting reading.

The second part of this project is the development of signage to form a townsite heritage walk trail. The Shire is working closely with the Broomehill Heritage Group and the researcher to develop content that reflects the significance of various sites in the Broomehill townsite.

FUNDING SUCCESS

The Shire was recently advised that an application to a new charitable foundation, YOUTH Great Southern, for funds to support the continuation of our Youth Worker Program, was successful. Since mid-2021 the Shire has been working with Albany Youth Support Association Inc. (AYSA), who provide the services of a qualified youth worker in Tambellup three days per week. The Youth Worker operates from, and opens, the Tambellup Youth Centre 'The Zone' and works with agencies to provide support and assistance to our young people aged 12-25 years in a wide range of areas, including obtaining I earners permits, Medicare Cards and other documentation, education, training and employment, and referral to other support agencies if required.

The funding granted by the YOUTH Great Southern Quick Grants Scheme, in conjunction with contributions from the Tambellup Noongar Land Association and the Council, will allow us to continue this valuable and much valued program as we work with AYSA to secure longer term funding. Thank you YOUTH Great Southern!

2022 BLOOM FESTIVAL

The Great Southern Treasures Bloom Festival, which is held during September and October each year, is in the planning stages again, and the call has gone out for Expressions of Interest for local events to be included in this year's program. Last year we had two wildflower walks, the opportunity to peruse a collection of plant and garden themed books with coffee, an orienteering event and a nostalgic trip into the past at the Toolbrunup School. Art Chatter Gallery Exhibition - Tribute to Ellis Rowan

Art Chatter Gallery is hosting a series of exhibitions featuring the artists who are gallery regulars.

Vicki Brown will kick off the series with a Tribute to Ellis Rowan. Rowan was an exceptional naturalist watercolour artist born in Melbourne in 1847, she painted fauna and flora across Australia, New Zealand, New Guinea and the UK.

After discovering Rowan in preparation for an earlier project, Vicki says "I've become a bit obsessed with Ellis and her paintings, even more so when I learnt she has visited Albany and painted here and throughout WA".

The works replicated for this *'Tribute to Ellis Rowan'* feature bird and wildflower paintings from 1887 - 1911. Although the originals were in watercolour and gauche, those hanging in the gallery inside Strike Me Pink in Mt Barker are in oil on canvas boards.

When the idea for the feature series came about, and who would go first, Vicki voiced her desire to share her interest in Rowan and the connection to the Great Southern.

DOG ATTACK ON LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

Every year, sheep, goats and other animals die or suffer injury after attacks by wandering domestic dogs. This causes both financial loss and emotional distress to livestock owners. Most attacks can be avoided if owners properly manage their dogs and stop them from wandering. The following information outlines what you can do as a dog owner to prevent your dog attacking neighbours' livestock.

DEFINITIONS

The Dog Act 1976 interprets an "attack" to be:

- a) aggressively rushing at or harassing any person or animal; or
- b) biting, or otherwise causing physical injury to, a person or animal; or
- c) tearing clothing on, or otherwise causing damage to the property of, the person attacked; or
- d) attempting to attack, or behaving in such a manner toward a person as would cause a reasonable person to fear injury.

DISPELLING THE MYTHS

All dogs have an instinct to roam and hunt. Many owners believe their dogs are incapable of attacking livestock, but even friendly domestic dogs that would never attack a person will often attack livestock if allowed to wander unsupervised. Packs of wild, savage dogs are rarely responsible. Research shows that in rural areas most attacks involve one or two dogs from small properties nearby.

HOW TO PREVENT YOUR DOG ATTACKING LIVESTOCK

- Fence your dog in. A secure fence will prevent your dog roaming. This eliminates the opportunity for your dog to attack livestock. If necessary, restrain your dog. Dogs can be trained to accept restraint or confinement. However, if restrained a dog must have sufficient exercise during part of the day.
- Don't be careless. Some owners claim their dogs escape despite efforts to restrain them, but this is a myth. Most dogs walk out through open gates, under or through insecure fences or over low ones. Many dogs that roam are unrestrained on properties without fences, or their owners forget to restrain them.
- Take care releasing dogs for exercise. Many owners deliberately release their dogs in the morning for exercise. This is when many attacks occur. The dog may be absent for less than an hour but this is sufficient time to kill livestock nearby.

- Prevent night-time roaming. Many dogs sleep at the back door and are there in the morning but that doesn't mean the dog has stayed home all night.
 Dogs often roam after owners have gone to bed and return before they rise. In this time they can attack neighbours' livestock.
- Sterilise your dog. Roaming is normal dog behaviour, particularly in male dogs as they mature. Dogs will roam in search of food or bitches on heat, then attack livestock. Roaming may be reduced by sterilisation.
- Keep your dog and family safe. Allowing your dog to wander puts its health at risk - and can even endanger yours. Every year hundreds of pets are shot, poisoned and impounded for attacking livestock.
- Be a responsible dog owner. Dogs need more than feeding and watering; they have to be trained, controlled, vaccinated, registered and exercised.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK

In Western Australia, the *Dog Act 1976* covers the registration, ownership and control of dogs. The Act states "it is an offence for any dog to attack or chase any person, or any animal owned by, or in the charge of another person, whether or not an injury is caused". As a dog owner, you are legally responsible for your dog's behaviour. In relation to attacks on livestock, the *Dog Act 1976* is administered by the Shire, not by the Police.

FINES AND PENALTIES

Dog owners can be fined up to \$10,000 if their dog attacks. Livestock owners are permitted to destroy or capture any dogs they observe attacking livestock on their land, however the setting of baits for dogs is illegal.

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One – Monthly Project Update.

Enel Green Power acquired the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One Project from the West Australian renewable energy developer, Moonies Hill Energy in April this year.

The project will comprise of 18 Vestas wind turbines (approximately 75 megawatts) and related civil and electrical infrastructure. The relevant Development Approvals for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm have been obtained from the Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup Shire Councils. The Approvals set out conditions that must be complied with in undertaking the development. The conditions cover construction, operation, decommissioning, and administrative matters. To enable optimum development and efficient operation, several amendments to the Approvals have been obtained, with the most recent amendments approved by the relevant consent authorities in late 2021.

The project is located, approximately 35 km southeast of Kojonup, spanning the Kojonup Shire and the Broomehill Tambellup Shire Local Government Areas. Preconstruction planning for the project is currently underway, with construction targeted to commence in quarter three of this year.
