FROM THE JULY COUNCIL MEETING

Unfortunately the July Council meeting had to be rescheduled to 28 July 2022 due to Councillor absences, and at time of writing, a summary of Council decisions from that meeting was not available. This will be reported along with the August Council meeting outcomes in the next edition of Topics.

WORKS

With the construction program complete for the year and the new budget still to be adopted, July presented a perfect opportunity for staff training. In recent weeks, works crew members have taken the opportunity to complete training in areas including White Card, and Traffic Management. The Shire has recently purchased a set of traffic lights that will be used in traffic control at our worksites, and staff have undertaken the necessary training in how to control a worksite using this new method.

Staff leave (annual and long service leave, and COVID-19 absences) over July has seen adjustments to the daily works program, with time being spent on maintenance activities including signage replacement at various sites, and grading, gravel sheeting and culvert repairs on Pallinup Rd, Beejenup Rd and Jam Creek Rd. The maintenance graders have been on the following roads during July: Flat Rocks Rd, Eureka Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Gillespie Rd, Warrenup Rd, Wray Rd and Johnston Rd.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION TIP PASS EXPIRY EXTENDED

Residents will be aware that the current tip passes expire on 31 July 2022. New passes for 2022/2023 will be distributed to all residents in conjunction with the issue of rates notices early in August. To ensure residents are still able to access the Waste Transfer Stations until new passes are issued, the expiry on 2021/2022 tip passes will be extended to 31 August 2022.

HERITAGE INVENTORY REVIEW

The Shire will be undertaking a review of its Municipal Inventories during the next few months, with the assistance of Heritage Consultant Laura Gray. Community consultation is a key part of the review process, and we will be arranging for community sessions to be held in Broomehill and Tambellup, tentatively on Thursday 18 and Friday 19 August. All members of the community with an interest in our heritage are welcome to attend these sessions. We will provide more information in coming weeks, however queries in the interim can be directed to Pam at the Shire on 9825 3555.





Women in Farming Seminar Update

If you are keen to come along to our Women in Farming seminar at the Cranbrook Sporting Club on Wednesday August 31, get your tickets quick as they are selling fast.

Our seminar promises to fill your cup and inspire you with our theme being 'Find Your Voice, Find Your Passion'.

Our keynote speaker is Bec Bignell from Cockatoo Co.Lab and Rural Room and she will be showing us parts of Homespun, which was filmed in Kojonup and will be commercially released later this year. Louise O'Neill from Farm Life Fitness will be talking about how important physical and mental wellbeing is. Every ticket holder will receive exclusive access to pre-recorded physical and mental health exercises from Louise.

Other event speakers include grain marketing expert Chris Tonkin from Ten Tigers talking on how to fine tune grain marketing, reduce stress and avoid costly mistakes at harvest. 

Enel Green Power (EGP) acquired the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One Project from the West Australian renewable energy developer, Moonies Hill Energy in April this year.

The project is located, approximately 35 km southeast of Kojonup, spanning the Kojonup Shire and the Broomehill Tambellup Shire Local Government Areas. The project will comprise of 18 Vestas wind turbines (approximately 75 megawatts) and related civil and electrical infrastructure.

The estimated construction timeframe for the plant is expected to be approximately 18 months while the plant's operational life is estimated at approximately 30 years.

Preconstruction planning for the project is currently underway, with construction targeted to commence in quarter three (Q3) of this year.

Enel Green Power is committed to a Creating Shared Value (CSV) approach during the construction and operation of the Project. EGP intends to work closely with the local community to enhance the economic and social conditions in the local area and proactively share benefits within the local community.

EGP is also committed to local sourcing throughout the Project's operational and construction phases, where feasible. It is expected that the project will create significant local employment and supply opportunities during construction.

The relevant Development Approvals for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm have been obtained from the Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup Shire Councils. The planning approval sets out conditions for the project, including management plans. Management systems will be in place to ensure compliance with all conditions covering construction, operation, decommissioning, and administrative matters.

EGP will manage the construction works for the project and has engaged the following main contractors for major work packages for the project construction phase. EGP will work closely with the main contractors to identify capability and capacity in the local area and maximise opportunities for local contractors and suppliers to participate in the project through goods and services provision to both the project site and workforce.

WHAT IS THE SHIRE DOING?

The works will include:

- Narrowing of the footpath areas outside the Imperial Hotel and Broomehill Museum, to provide a wider road surface to accommodate heavy vehicles using this route;
- New paving to the footpaths around the Imperial Hotel and Broomehill Museum corners;
- Modifications to drainage on site;
- New forecourt design to the Museum corner;
- New street furniture, including bench seating, bike rails and rubbish bin surrounds;
- Garden beds and street trees to both sides of Journal St and south side of Great Southern Highway adjacent to the Museum
- Parallel parking to both sides of Journal St.

WHY IS THE SHIRE DOING IT?

The Journal St intersection with the Great Southern Highway provides a direct route to and from the Albany Highway, and is used by a large volume of traffic daily. It can be the first impression that a visitor has of our community, and over the years, the streetscape had become tired.

With the announcement in 2020 that Drought Communities Program funding was to become available, the Council determined that this corner was in need of some TLC.


It became apparent during planning of the streetscape upgrade that the width of the intersection did not comply with current guidelines for access by heavy vehicles. Revised planning has seen the footpaths reduced by a small amount, and new kerbing and road markings to be applied will allow for safe turning circles to be achieved by heavy vehicles to and from Journal St.

The works coincide with the development of the new Holland Park playground, Holland Track Interpretive Centre and townsite walk trail, and the acquisition of the Imperial Hotel by the Broomehill Village Cooperative.

We anticipate all works will be complete by mid-September 2022. Traffic management will be onsite for the duration of the works. Motorists are asked to take care when travelling in the vicinity.

You do not need to be at home for there to be a house fire

West Australians are urged to not leave e-Rideables (e-scooters, e-stakeboards) and other household items containing lithium-ion batteries charging overnight or when they are not at home due to their potential to overheat and cause devastating home fires.

Batteries can overheat when left on charge or when they are faulty. Once the battery explodes, it can end up metres from where it was charging and a small fire can spread quickly engulfing an entire home in just minutes.

Fire investigators are seeing a rise in the number of fires caused by lithium-ion batteries where the home has either been significantly damaged or completely destroyed.

Here are a few things you can do to protect you and your home from a house fire:

- Check electrical items and cords for signs of wear and tear before using them. Don't use damaged or dented equipment.
- Never leave batteries charging when no one is home, or in unsupervised areas such as garages.
- Make sure when charging batteries they are placed on a hard surface, and are not left charging on bedding, couches, carpets or clothing.
- Don't leave batteries charging once they have reached 100% as they can overheat.
- Take care when purchasing batteries or devices online or second-hand. Replacement batteries and electrical cords should only be purchased from reputable companies.

Batteries are classed as hazardous waste and should never be placed in your kerbside bins. You can find your nearest battery recycling bin by contacting your local government or visiting recycleright.wa.gov.au.
