The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday 15 September 2022 commencing at 4.30pm, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETINGS

The agenda for the July Ordinary Meeting was packed, with the following matters considered by the Council:

- The Council provided feedback to the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) in relation to WALGA's policy position regarding the future role of local government and management of bush fire brigades. The Council's preferred position was that the current arrangements for Local Government Management of Bush Fire Brigades be continued, with additional support provided by the State Government with respect to increased funding and better access to training resources and other support. The Shire's Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades have been advised of this decision.
- The Plan for Animal Welfare in Emergencies was endorsed.
- The quarterly Corporate Business Plan report for the period April – June 2022 was received.
- The following local laws were adopted:
 - Activities in Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Amendment Local Law 2022
 - Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2022
 - Health Amendment Local Law 2022
 - Waste Amendment Local Law 2022
 - Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2022
- The Council considered submissions in relation to the draft Local Planning Policy No 1 on Sea Containers, and determined to adopt the policy. A copy of the new policy is available on the Shire's website.
- The Disability Access and Inclusion Plan Progress Report for 2021-2022 was endorsed.
- The Broomehill Playgroup's request for the Council to waive hire fees for the Broomehill Hall was approved.
- The 2022-2023 Annual Budget was adopted.
- The Council supported a Great Southern Zone WALGA proposal to develop a Great Southern Designated Area Migration Agreement (DAMA), and agreed to contribute financially to the project development. A DAMA is a labour agreement allowing businesses/employers to sponsor skilled and semi-skilled overseas workers to fill labour shortages in specific areas that cannot be filled with Australian workers.
- The Council granted delegated authority to the CEO to grant an exemption from the need for planning approval for temporary works (not exceeding a 12 month period).
- Submissions to the recently advertised proposal to amend the Shire of Tambellup Town Planning Scheme No. 2 to re-zone Lot 5 (13) Crowden Street,

Lot 6 (11) Crowden Street and Lot 19 (19) Taylor Street, Tambellup from 'Special Use' zone to 'Town Centre' zone were considered. The Council determined to adopt the proposal without modification, for final approval by the WA Planning Commission. This is the site of the old Bowling Club and will allow for the development of a caravan park in Tambellup.

- A request by the developers of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm, Enel Green Power, to access road reserves and support a clearing permit application was supported.

The August Ordinary Meeting agenda was much shorter, with the following matters considered:

- Voting delegates were appointed for the WALGA Annual General Meeting, which is being held in conjunction with the Local Government State Conference in October 2022.
- A rates concession was granted to the Tambellup Golf Club for 2022-2023.
- The Council adopted the Annual Report for 2020-2021 and determined that the Annual Electors Meeting would be held on Thursday 15 September commencing at 6.00pm, at the Council Chambers in Tambellup. Copies of the Annual Report are available from the Shire Administration Offices, and on the Shire's website.
- A development application for an agricultural shed at Lot 30 (No. 1840) Warrenup Rd, Broomehill West was approved with conditions.
- The Traffic Management Plan and Bush Fire Management Plan submitted for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 were approved by the Council.

2022/2023 ANNUAL BUDGET OVERVIEW

The Annual Budget for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup was adopted by Council on 28 July 2022.

Local Government continues to operate in a financially challenging environment, with increased pressure from Federal and State Government to deliver more with limited resources. The Shire is the custodian of a large number of assets made up from Infrastructure (roads, footpaths, kerbing, signs) Drainage, Land, Buildings, Parks and Reserves, Plant and Equipment. When making decisions in relation to these assets, the Council is committed to the philosophy of renewal of existing

assets before acquiring new assets. In addition, and only where possible, rationalising existing assets that are no longer used or do not meet the agreed level of services.

This year's budget totals \$12.9m, representing \$7.1m in operating expenditure and \$5.8m in capital expenditure. This budget is highlighted by several exciting community projects, including the construction of a Caravan Park in Tambellup, improvements at the Tambellup Youth Centre (The Zone) and the townscape improvements currently under construction at the Journal Street intersection in Broomehill.

Major widening works on Tieline Road and new seal on a gravel section of Warrenup Road are the biggest jobs in a \$1.85m road construction program, up from \$991,000 last financial year. The Shire is fortunate to receive funding from the Regional Road Group, State Black Spot and Roads to Recovery programs, which assists in meeting the costs in completing the planned projects.

The 2022/2023 financial year will see a major review undertaken of the Shire's long term planning processes, commencing with a new Strategic Community Plan, the Shire's key document to set the direction for the next ten years. Community members are encouraged to get involved in the consultation that will be undertaken to formulate this plan. Once the new ten year direction is set, Shire staff will then complete a new Corporate Business Plan, a four year operational plan that sets the implementation of the strategies contained within the ten year plan. Both documents will be available on the Shire's website when completed.

In addition to these two important planning documents, 2022/2023 will be used to scope improvements to major community facilities, including the Broomehill Recreational Complex, Tambellup Youth Centre, Tambellup Main Street & Railway Precinct and the Tambellup Caravan Park. All input and ideas for these areas are welcomed and the Shire will be working closely with user groups to develop these important future directions.

The Council has identified in its Long Term Financial Plan that an increase in rate revenue of at least 5% per annum was necessary in order to continue to meet its obligations for provision of services to the community, maintenance of existing assets and creation of new assets. After a review of competing priorities and demands, the Council has included a 4% increase in rate revenue from all UV (rural) and GRV (town site) properties. This generates additional revenue of \$108,400. Modest increases in rate revenue are necessary each year to ensure the Council is in a position to continue to provide the range of services and facilities the community has come to expect and enjoy.

The early payment discount of 5% will continue to be offered, as will payment by either the two instalment or four instalment plans.

Refuse and recycling charges levied annually on town site properties have also increased by 4%, the first increase in these charges since 2011.

Budget Highlights

Youth Services

The Shire is partnering with Albany Youth Support Association, Youth Great Southern and the Tambellup Noongar Land Association to continue to deliver the Youth Worker program with the Youth Worker operating from 'The Zone' in Tambellup 3 days per week. The Council has allocated grant funding in 2022/2023 towards building improvements at the youth centre to make this a more accessible and user friendly facility.

Townscape Projects

Footpath upgrades in Tambellup will continue on Crowden Street with the possible inclusion of new street trees along this road.

Works at the Journal Street and Great Southern Highway intersection are well underway. The intersection will be widened and works include new kerbing, paving and street furniture.

Holland Track Interpretive Centre

The interpretation panels remain to be installed at the new gazebo in the grounds of the Broomehill Museum. Signage for a new walk trail will also be placed around Broomehill which will be led from the Interpretive Centre.

Tambellup Caravan Park

The former Bowling Club in Tambellup was purchased by the Shire in 2017/2018 with the view to development of the site into a Caravan Park. A business plan is in the initial stages of being prepared along with concept drawings for the proposal. Grant funding has been allocated to this development, and the Tambellup Cropping Group has committed funding towards construction of cabins.

Mosquito Management

A Contiguous Local Authority Group (CLAG) has been formed with the Shires of Gnowangerup and Katanning for mosquito management and control. The Department of Health supports the CLAG with funding, education and training to achieve the outcomes of the group.

Reserve Funds

The Shire is holding approximately \$1.79m in its Reserve Funds, which is set aside for specific purposes. Reserve funds are being utilised in 2022/2023 for plant replacement, townscape works and building improvements. The Reserve Funds are estimated to be \$1.86m at the end of the financial year.

Loans

No new loans are proposed to be raised during the year. The opening balance of loans at 1 July 2022 was \$1.81m and the closing balance at 30 June 2023 is estimated to be \$1.68m.

Plant Replacement

Council continues to strive to maintain a modern fleet of vehicles and equipment. To assist with attaining this objective, a 10 Year Plant Replacement Program has been developed and refined over a number of years. Optimum changeover times have been identified for plant and equipment, ensuring Council receives best value for money and to minimise the impact on annual budgets.

Funds are held in the Plant Reserve which is used to achieve all changeovers and purchases included in the Plant Replacement Program. Any savings realised throughout the year on plant and equipment changeovers is retained in the Reserve for future requirements. Major items scheduled for changeover in 2022/2023 include the Mack truck BHT125, Caterpillar loader TA281, Isuzu light tipper BH009 and a Toro mower.

Conclusion

The 2022/2023 Budget provides for the operations of the Shire for the coming financial year and is a financially responsible budget that ensures services and facilities continue to be provided at the level ratepayers and residents have come to expect, while providing renewal of essential road and community assets for the enhancement of the whole Shire.

WORKS

We are pleased to welcome Phil Pink to the Shire. Phil has taken on the role of part time Building Maintenance Officer, and has hit the ground running with the new budget being adopted by the Council at the July meeting. Welcome Phil!

The rain through August has been most welcome, and ensures that our dams will be carrying good levels

through to the warmer months. There have been drawbacks, however, with some waterlogging appearing on the Broomehill Oval, and the road construction and maintenance program being brought to a standstill for a period. Plans are in place to remedy the oval water logging as soon as the on ground conditions are suitable, and now the rain has stopped, the maintenance grading program is in full swing to grade as many roads as possible while the rain holds off.

The new construction program will kick off as soon as conditions are suitable, with the reconstruction and sealing of a 2.5km section of Chillicup Rd being the first project to be tackled. This project will extend the seal from the Broomehill townsite out to the Brassey Rd intersection.

The townscape works on Journal St in Broomehill are progressing, with new kerbing installed, limestone block walls constructed in the Museum forecourt, and paving on both sides of the street underway. These works have necessitated the closing of Journal St from Great Southern Highway to India St for an extended period, to allow the contractors to work safely. We appreciate the patience of residents and visitors in this regard.



61 GARRITY ST TAMBELLUP

The Council has recently taken ownership of the vacant lot at 61 Garrity St, and we are interested in hearing the community's views on how the block should be managed into the future. COMMUNITY INPUT INVITED

As noted in the Budget Summary, the Shire is about to commence the review of its key long term planning document, the Strategic Community Plan. This document sets the ten year direction for the Council, and is informed by the community. We will be promoting community sessions to be held on 13 and 14 September 2022 – please keep an eye out for this

information, come along and share your ideas.

We have also commenced the review of the Shire's Municipal Inventories. These documents list our heritage places, and were developed in the late 1990's by the former Shires of Broomehill and Tambellup. Laura Gray, Heritage Consultant, has been appointed to undertake the review, and last week she met with the Council and community members in both towns to explain the review process. Community submissions are welcome, and more information on how to do this will be provided in the near future. We appreciate the funding provided by the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage that has assisted us in undertaking the review.

VIETNAM VETERANS DAY – 18 AUGUST 2022

Vietnam Veterans Day commemorates all the battles fought by Australians in Vietnam, from large-scale operations to platoon and section-level encounters, the sailors of the Royal Australian Navy who supported land operations, and members of the Royal Australian Air Force who served in combat and transport roles.

A ceremony was held at the Tambellup Cemetery to commemorate the day with the laying of a poppy tribute at the grave of Private Brian Walters, who was killed in action on 17 February 1967.

ROAMING LIVESTOCK

The Shire's Ranger Services have recently noted an increase in roaming livestock in the area, mostly lambs and ewes after the recent lambing season. It is vital that together we make our roads as safe as possible for all motorists.

If you see stray livestock on verges, roads or reserves, please report this to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup on 9825 3555 immediately. It's important that you don't place yourself at risk while you're waiting for Ranger Services to arrive.

INFORMATION FOR STOCK OWNERS

It is the responsibility of all landowners to ensure that when placing stock into paddocks adjacent to any roads that the fencing is of an adequate standard to keep the stock enclosed. Under the *Highways (Liability for Straying Animals) Act 1983*, owners and occupiers of grazing properties are liable for any damages or injuries that may occur as a result of stock wandering outside the property boundary.

It is an offence under Section 484 of the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960* for livestock to stray. The penalty for straying stock is currently \$200.00 per animal. If the stock is impounded by the Shire, additional impound fees are also payable upon release.

Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

- **Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.** They provide important information so you can take action to protect yourself and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of a bushfire. You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to assess your level of bushfire risk and decide what actions to take.

The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) levels are:

Moderate: Plan and prepare.

Most fires can be controlled. Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area.

High: Be ready to act.

Fires can be dangerous. Decide what you will do if a fire starts.
Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.

Extreme: Take action now to protect your life and property.

Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. Put your bushfire plan into action.
If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early.

Catastrophic: For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions and if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.

- When there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to '**No Rating**'. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.

Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

➤ **When a bushfire starts, things can change in a matter of minutes so it's important to stay up to date through official information sources.**

During a bushfire, emergency services will provide you with as much information as possible, but no system is foolproof. If you believe you are in danger, act immediately to stay safe and do not wait for a warning.

If you see smoke or flames call Triple Zero (000) and put your Bushfire Plan into action immediately.

Bushfire warning levels change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property, and the decreasing amount of time you have until the fire arrives.

The warning levels for bushfires are:

Advice	Watch and Act	Emergency Warning	All Clear
			
A fire has started but there is no immediate threat to lives or homes. Be aware and keep up to date.	There is a possible threat to lives or homes. You need to leave or get ready to defend – do not wait and see.	There is a threat to lives or homes. You are in danger and need to take immediate action to survive.	The danger has passed and the fire is under control. Take care and remain vigilant in case the situation changes.

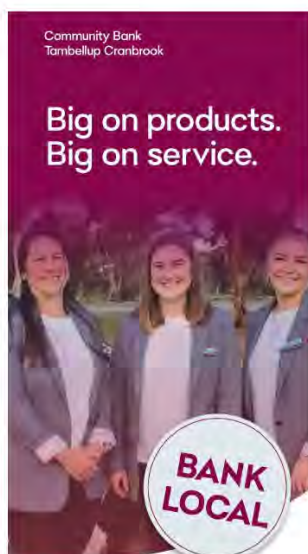

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One – Monthly Project Update.

Enel Green Power (EGP) acquired the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One Project from the West Australian renewable energy developer, Moonies Hill Energy in April this year.

The project is located, approximately 35 km southeast of Kojonup, spanning the Kojonup Shire and the Broomehill Tambellup Shire Local Government Areas. The project will comprise of 18 Vestas wind turbines (approximately 75 megawatts) and related civil and electrical infrastructure.

The estimated construction timeframe for the plant is expected to be approximately 18 months while the plant's operational life is estimated at approximately 30 years.

Preconstruction planning for the project is currently underway, with construction still targeted to commence in quarter three (Q3) of this year.

Enel Green Power is committed to a Creating Shared Value (CSV) approach during the construction and operation of the Project. EGP intends to work closely with the local community to enhance the economic and social conditions in the local area and proactively share benefits within the local community.

EGP is also committed to local sourcing throughout the Project's operational and construction phases, where feasible. It is expected that the project will create significant local employment and supply opportunities during construction.

The relevant Development Approvals for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm have been obtained from the Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup Shire Councils. The planning approval sets out conditions for the project, including management plans which have now been presented to Council for approval prior to construction activities commencing. Management systems will be in place to ensure compliance with all conditions covering construction, operation, decommissioning, and

administrative matters.

EGP will manage the construction works for the project and has engaged the following main contractors for major work packages for the project construction phase. EGP will work closely with the main contractors to identify capability and capacity in the local area and maximise opportunities for local contractors and suppliers to participate in the project through goods and services provision to both the project site and workforce.

Main contractors and scopes of work:

- Vestas to provide the wind turbine generators. This scope of work includes the manufacture of wind turbine components, transportation of the components to the project site and the installation of wind turbines.
- West Force Construction to provide the Civil Balance of Plant. This scope of work includes all the civil works for the project, such as internal access roads and supply and installation of the permanent Operations and Maintenance building.
- RJE to provide Electrical Balance of Plant. This scope of work includes all the electrical works for the project, such as underground cabling and installation of an on site substation.
- Western Power to provide the connection to the grid
