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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Shire of Tambellup Municipal Inventory was prepared by Helen Burgess, Historian and Research Consultant, Douglas R G Sellick, Churchill Fellow and Heritage Consultant, and Philip Bennet, Architect, to satisfy the requirement s of the <u>Heritage of Western Australia Act (1990)</u> (The Act). The Act requires that all Local Authorities in Western Australia compile an inventory of local places which are significant or may become significant. The Act also requires that the Municipal Inventory be updated every 12 months and reviewed every four years.

The Municipal Inventory was compiled with proper community consultation. The Corner Shop Museum Committee and the Shire of Tambellup were also involved in the development of the inventory.

The Municipal Inventory comprises of a Thematic Matrix and an Historic Framework of the Shire of Tambellup, as well as a list of sites identified and nominated by the Shire of Tambellup, the local community and the Corner Shop Museum Committee. A total of 58 sites have been assessed by the consultants, and the level of significance for each of these sites has been determined and recommendations have been made for conservation strategies where appropriate. However, there are additional sites included with this inventory, although they have not, as yet, been assessed. These sites have been identified by the community, the shire and the committee as having varying degrees of cultural heritage significance and will be assessed and considered during the required update and review of this first inventory document.

The Municipal Inventory may, in future, include sites which have been entered on the State Register of Heritage Places (Heritage Council of Western Australia) and/or classified by the National Trust. In addition, those sites included in the inventory which are considered by the consultants to be of state or national significance have been identified and noted. Sites of national significance can be nominated by the shire for entry into the Register of the National Estate under the Australian Heritage Commission Act. Sites of state significance can be referred to the Heritage Council of Western Australia by the shire or members of the community for inclusion on the State Register of Heritage Places.

It is important for any sites nominated on the national or state register be included in the Shire of Tambellup's Municipal Inventory to guarantee their protection under the <u>Town Planning and Development Act 1928.</u>

INTRODUCTION

The Shire of Tambellup is located in the Great Southern Region, 328 kms south of Perth, and covers an area of 1,437 sq kms.

The Shire of Tambellup's Thematic Matrix and Historic Framework is a thematic and chronological overview of developments within the shire form the time of white settlement to the present day [1997]. However, some reference is made to early discovery and exploration of Western Australia, but only as a precursor to settlement in the Shire Tambellup. An overview of developments after the time of this study will be addressed in the required updating and review of the inventory document.

Aboriginal history is not covered in this document except as a brief introduction to the region prior to white settlement and the interaction between the two races when and as settlement occurred.

The Thematic Matrix offers a summary of the history of the shire using thematic categories. The Historic Framework follows a chronological format divided into the six main themes of:

- 1. Population
- 2. Transport and Communication
- 3. Occupations
- 4. Social and Civic Activities
- 5. Outside Influences
- 6. People

The compilation of this historic framework endeavours to highlight the most significant events, people and places which make up the history and development of the shire.

The Thematic Matrix and Historic Framework are intended to form the basis of a Municipal Inventory of historically significant places within the Shire of Tambellup. It is a guide for the establishment of a comprehensive list of significant buildings, features and other sites which reflect the history of the shire and its people. The community may wish to protect or mark these sites for the pleasure and education of current and future residents and visitors.






1. DEMOGRAPHIC SETTLEMENT AND MOBILITY

Why people settled; Why they moved away; The things they left behind.

Subtheme

Exploration and Surveying, Land selection and allocation, Settlements, Government Policy, Land/Resource Exploitation and depletion, Depression and boom times.

- 1791: Captain George Vancouver RN charts and names King George 111 Sound and The Princess Royal Harbour.
- 1801: Lt. Matthew Flinders RN charts south coast and circumnavigates continent.
- 1803: Nicholis Baudin of French expedition explores south coast.
- 1817: Philip P King RN, completes survey of south coast.
- 1824: Name "Australia" officially adopted.
- 1826: Major Edmund Lockyer arrives from Sydney to select a site for setttlement, the British Government fearing French occupation.
- 1827: Captain James Stirling RN explores Swan River.
- 1829: Perth named capital of Western Australia colony. British Government passes first WA Constitution Act for Government of Settlements in WA.

First colonists land.

- 1830: John Septimus Roe begins exploratory expeditions.
- 1831: King George 111 Sound Settlement, taken over by the Swan River colony, named Albany.
- 1835: John S Roe discovers and names Gordon River.
- 1840: Kojonup established
- 1842: John Hassell from Albany explores district.

- 1848: Roe explores district.
- 1849: Transportation of convicts to WA begins.
- 1850: Williams established.

 Kangaroo hunters and sandalwood cutters in district.
- 1851: Philip Chaungey surveys district.
- 1852: John Hassell buys first land in district at Toolbrunup.
- 1857: William Jefferies, a shepherd recorded as working in the district.
- 1870: John Hassell leases more land in the district.
 Over 25,000ha recorded as being leased.
- 1871: Alexnader Forrest explores large areas of WA.
- 1873: George and Josiah Norrish settle near Tambellarup Springs on land cleared by William Graham who had built a hut there in 1861.
- 1875: Norrish Family builds homestead, stable, yards and well.

 Charles Eades acquires land at Toolbrumup builds dam.
- 1876: William Carrol and William Ruse build dam.
- 1880: Norrish Family holdings increased to 12,000ha and 3,000 sheep.
- 1882: CD Price and A Forrest survey along and around the proposed railway.
- 1889: WA Government establishes "Agriculture Area" to encourage farming.

 Railway Siding marked on maps as "Tambellup".
- 1890: Hugh Climie leases land and builds fence on Gordon River. Fence later dismantled and used by other settlers.

1891 - 1919

1. DEMOGRAPHIC SETTLEMENT & MOBILITY

Why people settled; Why they moved away; The things they left behind.

Subtheme

Exploration and Surveying; Land Selection and Allocation; Settlements; Government Policy; Land / Resource Exploitation and depletion; Depression and boom times.

- 1893: Homestead Act gives impetus for closer settlement.
 Norrish family operating 8,000ha.
- **1894:** Government establishes first Agricultural Bank to provide rural credit on long term loans.
- 1897: Survey of District by WH Angrove. District land opened for selection.
- 1898: Settlers, Mr and Mrs William Hams and twelve children establish at Toolbrunup. They bring with them strippers, stump jump ploughs, working horses, fowls, hand winnowers, furrow ploughs, bees, Angora Rabbits, a pet cat called "Bobby", corrugated iron, tents.

Katanning established.

1899: Government and Gazette No. 40 Friday, 8 September announces formation of a townsite on the Great Southern Railway to be known officially as "Tambellup".

Consolidated Land Act becomes law, making it advantageous for settlers to acquire land in the district.

1902: Owen Saggers appointed Land Agent for district.

Thirty families recorded as farming throughout district. Some homes made of tin and railway sleepers.

1903: Tambellup Progress Association formed. Aims at establishing separate Roads Board District. Meeting held in Railways Goods Shed.

Many selectors wait for ten weeks for confirmation of Land Applications.

Surveyors overwhelmed by work.

More settlers take up land - notably Frederick Carl Bessen and William Crosby.

James Mooney takes up land west of Tambellup.

James Crawford appointed a Surveyor for Tambellup and takes up land at Warrenup.

1904: Record number of settlers arrive from Goldfields and South Australia.

Tambellup noted for its progress and prosperity.

Mr BC Crosby takes up land bringing with him from South Australia nine horses and much farming implements.

Sale of town lots reported.

Attention made by Government Lands Office to good acres of land still available in the District.

1906: Land settlements slow down.

John Hassell had now sold off all his land in the district.

1907: Government introduces first land tax in Western Australia.

1908: All the best land in the district taken up.

A number of farms abandoned.

Minister for Land, James Mitchell visits the district and notes potential for good agriculture and good fencing.

1909: Land examined between Tambellup and Gnowangerup for farming, roads and possible railway.

1910: Sir John Forrest, the Premier visits the district.

Tambellup becoming a mixed farming district.

1913: Nicholas Anderson takes up land south east of town.

Joe Green takes up 1,000 acres for wheat growing.

1914: Severe drought. Many leave land and join up for War Service.

How People and Goods Moved; How People Communicated and Exchanged Information and News.

Subtheme

Railways; Roads; Mail Service; Types of Vehicles; Radio and TV; Telephone.

1891: Standard colonial postage stamp design accepted by all Colonies.

1896: Government takes over Albany / Perth railway.

Many settlers arriving from the Eastern States by passenger train from Albany.

1899: Land resumed for road to Dartnall.

1900: Railway Goods Shed built at the WAGR siding.

1901: "Great Southern Herald" begins publication in the region.

1902: Road work begins between Tambellup and Toolbrumup.

1903: Farmers complain of shocking road conditions over which they must transport goods to and from farms.

"Allowance" Post Office established.

1904: Parliament passes Motor Car Act, requiring owners to carry number plates.

Petition to Perth made for improvements to WAGR yard platform, weighbridge crane required for the increase in passenger and freight. Record number of settlers arrive from the Goldfields and South Australia.

1905: Building the bridge over Gordon River making good progress.

Roads in deplorable state, dangerous for night travel. Improvements made to the Railway Station, a grain shed erected, extra line installed, platform and station offices erected. First load of mallet bark carted by horse and dray to Tambellup.

----- beyond the town.

A Coffee Palace opened for Railway passengers.

1906: WAGR appoint Stationmaster.

1910: Railway and Road route surveyed from Tambellup to Gnowangerup / Ongerup.

1912: "Tambellup Times" published.

Tambellup / Ongerup WAGR contracted to Vincent Bros.

1913: WAGR to Gnowangerup opened.

Tambellup becomes an important railway junction.

Post Office opened.

1916: More people from the district, it is recorded, travel to the Perth Royal Show than ever before.

1917: There are only three motor vehicles in the district.

Trans Australia Railway opened.

Roads reported to be in very bad condition, cars and carts frequently bogged. Stumps litter roads making progress for vehicles most difficult and dangerous. Many accidents.

New elevator installed at the WAGR siding to convey bagged wheat to rail tunnels.

3. OCCUPATIONS

What people did for sustenance; or to add quality to life; paid and unpaid jobs in towns and on farms.

Subtheme

Farming; wheat and sheep; farm buildings in which they worked; rural industries; local food crops; shops and service industries.

1893: Norrish family working over 8,000ha.

1900: Heinrich Bessen starts first Blacksmith Shop.

Gilbert Trathan opens districts first Saddlery.

Railway Goods Shed built at Siding.

Government legalised Trade Unions.

1902: Henry Cowan opens small corrugated iron General Store on site of Co-op.

Thirty families recorded as working land throughout the district.

Navies employed to build road from Tambellup to Toolbrunup.

1903: Sundah Singh opens store on Garrity Street. Tin walls and roof.

1904: William MacArthur opens a store.

First Hotel built of tin - opened 10 March.

First load of mallet bark carted to Tambellup.

New settlers from South Australia arrives with nine horses and farming implements.

Agricultural, Pastoral and Progress Association formed.

Mr Bessen recorded as being the Wheel Wright and Blacksmith. Over the railway line Mr Trathan has a Saddlery Agency for F & C Piesse, Katanning and he also ran the Post Office.

1905: Paddy Henry opens first Bakery.

Nathaniel Phillips buys the Cowan's shop and builds a store room onto it.

1906: Mallet Bark Mill reported to be working.

1907: Sheep sales reported to be increasing, farmers increasingly interested in sheep, a consignment of Border Leister rams arrive. First sales by Messrs Arnold Piesse held. Yards to be erected.

1908: Builder, Arthur Backhouse starts business in and around district is responsible for many homes and buildings.

1910: Tambellup becoming a mixed farming district.

Brick kiln established by Samuel Taylor and Owen Saggers. Bricks used for local buildings.

Westralian Bank Agency opens.

1911: W Woodares opens Tambellup Book Store and Hairdressing Saloon between Railway Station and Post Office; massage a speciality!!

First tractor acquired by farmer J Hawke.

Police Station established.

1913: Farmers and Settlers Association formed at Moonies Hill.

Stud and working horses imported into district.

1914: Delaware potatoes grown successfully on the Balston and Cowan Farm - 2.5 - 3 tons per acre reported.

Severe drought. Many leave the land and join up for War Service.

1916: Mr Nathaniel Phillips store being built by Backhouse almost finished.

1917: New elevator installed at WAGR Siding to convey bagged wheat to rail trucks.

Royal Commission meeting in Tambellup regarding local labour and marketing problems.

1918: Nathaniel Phillips sold his store to Tambellup Farmers Co-op.

Grain Storage Shed being built WAGR yards.

Subtheme

1895: Government abolishes state aid to churches.

Primary education becomes secular.

First Golf Club formed in WA.

1897: Dingoes become a menace to all Farmers.

1898: State School Teachers Union of WA established.

Katanning established.

1899: WA Library established.

1900: Church services and Socials held in new Railway Goods Shed.

First Methodist Church Service held, conducted by Rev. Richard Dunstan of Albany.

1901: Compulsory Secular Primary Education becomes free.

1902: Owen Saggers elected to Broomehill Roads Board.

First district wedding at the Norrish Family Homestead.

1903: First School at Toolbrumup. Fire place built of local stone by Alf Aylmore.

Tambellup Roads Board proposed by the newly formed Tambellup Progress Association at meeting. Broomehill agitated by proposal.

Tambellup Progress Association proposals made for Recreation Ground, Agricultural Hall, Cemetery, Public School and an attendant at the WAGR Siding.

1904: Toolbrumup School closed.

First concert and dance organised and held in goods shed at the WAGR Station.

Huge picnic arranged as community outing. 200 attend.

Tambellup now considered important centre as population and jobs increase. A school is needed for the 30 / 40 children in the district.

An Agricultural, Pastoral and Progress Association form.

1905: Toolbrunup School re-opened.

Nathaniel Phillips buys Cowan's Shop. Builds store room which is used for social gatherings and concerts.

One room school built at Tambellup, opened 19 July - 40 children.

Methodist Church opened.

The King's Birthday celebrated by a sports meeting on Railway Reserve.

Coffee Palace opened for railway travellers.

Tambellup Orchestra formed.

Concert and dance held in Nathaniel Phillips storeroom. Proceeds going to State meeting to arrange the formation of a Branch of the WA Producers Cooperative Union Ltd.

1906: Tambellup Roads Board established first meeting 7 April, 1906 at Macleod's Hotel.

School at Moonies Hill opened.

A brick church built by Baptists, First Service.

Recreation Ground cleared. Football and Cricket team organised.

First Race Horse meeting held.

First Anglican Service in Tambellup by Rev. WC Caton.

First Local Government Election held.

Farmers carting bricks for the Agricultural Hall.

"Great Southern Herald" burns down in Katanning.

1907: The brick Tambellup Agricultural Hall opened and considered one of the finest on Great Southern Railway.

St. Peter's Anglican Bush Shelter Church opened at Pindellup, site opposite present Church.

1908: Pine trees planted main street of Tambellup by school children on Arbor Day.

Methodist Church build quarters for the travelling Minister.

Tambellup Progress Association reformed.

Major bush fires sweep district east of Tambellup. Method of fire fighting causing friction among some settlers for the first time.

1909: School opened at Ornabullup.

Tambellup Tennis Club formed.

Empire Day celebrated by combined schools of Tambellup, Ornabullup and Toolbrunup Sports Day. Seniors played tennis and organised picnic for school children.

1910: Roman Catholic Church buys Baptist Chapel.

New site of St Peter's Anglican Church, Pindellup blessed by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

First Sports Day and regatta at swimming hole on the Gordon River.

Police Station opened.

1911: Anglicans served monthly by the Bush Brotherhood of S. Boniface from Williams. Services held in Agricultural Hall, Tambellup.

First wedding at St. Peters Pindellup. (Stacey / Bradshaw)

Police Constable appointed.
